DAILY PROCEEDINGS.

Tuesday Evening Meeting.

The Champlain Annual Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Connection (or Church) of America convened at Macomb, N. Y., for its eighty-third session at 7:30 P. M., April 22, 1924. Rev. A. J. Allen, the President, called the Conference to order. Song, "All Hail the Power of Jesus' Name," was sung. Richard Palmer, Florence Baxter and G. D. Jock offered prayer. President made some remarks and read 2 Cor. 6:1-10 for a lesson, after which a number of testimonies were given and songs were sung. This proved to be a gracious service. Benediction by O. G. Wyman.

Wednesday Morning Meeting.

Devotional service in charge of Rev. William N. Osgood. Song, "Glory to His Name," was sung. Ed Curtis, C. A. Heath and Brother Osgood offered prayer. Scripture lesson was read from 2 Tim. 3rd chapter. "In the Sweet By and By," was sung. The presence of God was manifest in this service.

The roll was called to which eleven elders, two licentiates and nineteen delegates answered to the call of their names. The bar of the Conference was fixed to include the first five rows of seats.

Rev. H. J. Bullock was called to the chair while the President read his annual report. The same was accepted as read. (See Report No. 1.)

The time for opening and closing was fixed as follows: Devotional, 8:30 A. M.; business, 9; closing, 11:30; opening, 1:30 P. M.; closing by vote.

Moved to adjourn to give place for Committee work.

Benediction by E. D. Carpenter.

Wednesday Afternoon Meeting.

The devotional service was led by G. D. Jock. Song, "What a Friend We Have in Jesus," was sung. Sister Addie Hill, Harry Miller and Brother Jock offered prayer. Scripture lesson, 2 Tim 2, was read.

The roll was called. Thirteen elders, three licentiates and seventeen delegates responded to the call of their names. The minutes of the morning session were read. The same was adopted.

The Committee on the Orders of the Day made their report. The same was adopted as follows: Wednesday 2 P. M., to hear the Tithing Secretary; Thursday 9:30 A. M., election of Conference Officers; Thursday, 10:30 A. M., Connectional Representative, Rev. E. F. McCarty; Thursday 2 P. M., Sunday School Secretary; Friday 9:30 A. M., Superannuated Ministers' Aid Association; Friday, 10:30 A. M., President J. S. Luckey; Friday evening, Missionary meeting, in charge of the Woman's Home and Foreign Missionary Society.

The hour of the day having arrived, Rev. C. L. Hill and Robert Flanders sang a duet, "My Sheep Know My Voice." Rev. H. S. Hill preached a very helpful sermon on tithing. A five minutes' recess was enjoyed by all. Rev. A. J. Allen read a number of brief lessons from the Word of God, and preached a very helpful sermon from the topic, "The Call, the Preparation, the Commission."

The names of E. D. Carpenter, J. J. Davison, F. L. Presley, Floyd E. Banker, A. E. Moses and T. A. Moses were called and characters passed.

Voted that the Secretary write letters in behalf of the Conference to all on the Superannuated list.

Vote was taken by roll call as to whether tobacco should be a test of membership. Twenty-four votes in favor of making it a test, eleven against.

Voted that the vote should be taken in the local churches before September 1, 1924, and that the pastors should forward the account to the Conference Secretary.

Order of the Day arrived, Rev. E. F. McCarty presented the publishing interests, said many encouraging things about the blessing of the Lord being upon the publishing interests, missionary and Sunday School work.

Thursday Afternoon Meeting.

Devotional service was led by Florence Baxter. Song, "Unsearchable Riches," was sung. Scripture lesson was read from the twelfth chapter of Romans. Prayer was offered by Pearl Hill and Miss Baxter.

The roll was called. Thirteen elders, two licentiates, nineteen delegates responded to the call of their names.

Minutes of the morning session were read. The same was adopted.

Moved that the President write letters in behalf of the Conference to Rev. F. L. Presley and Sister Martha Curtis. Brothers H. R. LaVere and E. D. Carpenter offered prayer in their behalf.

Names of G. D. Jock, E. L. Elliott and S. A. Green were called and characters passed.

Order of the Day arrived. The Conference Sunday School Secretary made his annual report. The same was approved. (See Report No. 4.)

Brother Lewis read a very interesting and helpful paper on "Sunday School Work."

Rev. E. F. McCarty brought a very helpful message from the Word found in Phil. 2:5, "Let this mind be in you which was also in Christ Jesus," and 1 Cor. 2:16, "For who hath known the mind of the Lord, that he may instruct him? But we have the mind of Christ."

Thursday Evening Meeting.

Songs, "He Ransomed Me," and "Make Christ King," were sung. Prayer was offered by Rev. H. C. Shares. Special song by Mrs. Edith Stevenson, Florence Baxter and Pearl Hill, "A Sinner Made Whole." Scripture lesson was read from the seventh chapter of Judges.

Rev. H. J. Bullock brought the evening message from the text found in seventh verse of the chapter read, "And the Lord said unto Gideon, By the three hundred men that lapped will I save you, and deliver the Midianites into thine hand; and let all the other people go every man unto his place."

An altar call was made. Some honest souls felt their need and came for the best the Lord had for them. This was a very gracious meeting.

Friday Morning Meeting.

The devotional service was in charge of C. A. Heath. Songs, "What a Friend We Have in Jesus," and "My Jesus, I Love Thee," were sung. Scripture lesson read, John 15:1-11. Prayers were offered by William N. Osgood, R. Palmer and C. E. Hill. The blessing of the Lord was upon this service.

The roll was called. Fifteen elders, two licentiates and eighteen delegates answered to the call of their names.

The minutes of the afternoon and evening sessions were read. The same was adopted.

first Sunday in each month shall be known as Home Mission Sunday and the Sunday School offering shall be given to Home Missions, and should be sent to the Conference Treasurer.

The Committee on Courtesy introduced Prof. J. S. Luckey, of Houghton College, who made some very encouraging remarks about the great work that the Lord had called him to do.

Names of O. G. Wyman and W. F. Lewis were called and characters passed.

Order of the Day arrived, that being the meeting of the Superannuated Ministers' Relief Association. See report of the same. (Report No. 5.)

Invitations from four charges were extended to entertain the next Annual Conference.

The roll was called and voted to accept the invitation from Long Lake, N. Y. Time to convene should be Tuesday, 7:30 P. M., preceding the last Sunday of April, 1925. Voted that the President should preach the opening sermon. Rev. William N. Osgood was elected alternate.

Voted that if for any reason the Long Lake church couldn't entertain the Conference that it should be left to the President and Advisory Board to secure a place.

The hour of the day arrived and Prof. J. S. Luckey presented the work of education. He spoke of the division that was coming in all of the churches, that the division was surely coming, those that believe the Bible, and those that believe not; that it was as important to have educated people in the pew as in the pulpit, that the School has more to do with moulding of character than the Church has. At the close of the talk an offering was taken that put the Champlain Conference over the top.

"Praise God, From Whom All Blessings Flow," was sung.

Motion was made that the matter of Brother I. A. Hamlette to be referred to the Committee on Itineracy and Orders.

Moved that the President be authorized to secure help for the preaching in the afternoon and evening of the next conference.

Moved that the President be authorized to appoint the Chairman of the Committee on Tithing.

Moved that the Sunday School Secretary should be provided means to circulate Sunday School literature not to exceed ten dollars.

Moved that the President and Rev. E. D. Carpenter and C. E. Hill be appointed to look after the chapel property at Lisbon, N. Y. Adjourned by limitation.

The minutes of the morning session was read and adopted after a slight correction.

The following petition was adopted:

Resolved, That the offer of Daniel D. Hutchinson for the purchase of a lot of land situate in town of Macomb, County of St. Lawrence, and State of New York, belonging to the Champlain Annual Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Connection of America, be accepted.

Resolved, That an application be made to the Court for permission to sell and convey said property, namely: All that tract or parcel of land situate in the town of Macomb, County of St. Lawrence, State of New York, and described as follows: Beginning at the junction of the Depeyster running by Olds-Miller road to the State road in the town of Macomb, thence along the center of the Depeyster road north $73\frac{3}{4}$ degrees, east four chains and five links, thence north 56 degrees, east four chains, thence at right angle with said road five chains, thence parallel with said road north westerly to the center Olds-Miller road, to the place of beginning, containing three acres and one-fourth of an acre of land, be the same more or less, being a part of a lot contracted by Edwin Dodge to Peter Miller.

Resolved, That when securing an order of the Court for such sale that Alamanson J. Allen, President of the said Champlain Annual Conference, be and is authorized and empowered to execute and deliver to said Daniel D. Hutchinson, the deed of the Champlain Annual Conference quit claiming all their title to said lot.

Moved to excuse Rev. W. F. Lewis and Rev. William N. Osgood from the Saturday sessions.

Names of William N. Osgood, H. S. Hill, C. E. Hill and D. W. Summers were called and characters passed.

Rev. H. C. Shares offered prayer and brought the message, using for his text words found in Genesis 24:58, last clause, "I will go."

Rev. A. J. Allen to travel the Conference.

We recommend that he shall receive a salary of \$1,000 and traveling expenses with a vacation of three weeks.

E. D. Carpenter, Secretary of Connectional Boards, also to engage in general evangelistic work, preference being given to calls from the Champlain Conference.

H. C. Shares, general evangelistic work.

We recommend that the President shall devote his time to the holding of quarterly meetings and the work of church extension in the Conference, either opening new work or in evangelistic services on fields already established as the best interests of the work may demand.

We further recommend that tent meetings shall be held during the summer months under the direction of the President and his Advisory Board. We also recommend that the Conference shall pay Rev. Richard Palmer \$50 as soon as he moves into the parsonage at Stony Creek; \$50 more within three months, and \$50 more later in the year if he deems it necessary.

Resolution No. 2.

Resolved, That Standing Rule No. XI be changed to read as follows:

"The first Sunday in each month shall be known as Home Mission Sunday and the Sunday School offering of that day be given to Home Missions."

STANDING RULES.

At the session of Conference the following Standing Rules of Conference were adopted:

I. The Standing Rules of Conference shall be printed in the Conference Minutes each year.

II. All visiting members of our own or other churches in harmony with our principles shall be invited to honorary seats in the Conference.

III. The Conference President shall receive \$20.00 per year for postage and stationery; also any needed traveling expense. At any time the President be required to travel the Conference, his duties and pay shall be defined by the Conference.

IV. The Conference Secretary shall receive \$15.00 per year for his labor and incidental expenses.

THE CHAMPLAIN CONFERENCE

V. The Conference Treasurer shall receive \$10.00 per year for his services in caring for the funds.

VI. In making his report the Conference Treasurer is authorized to close his books April 15th of each year. The Treasurer of the Ministers' Relief Association shall also close his books April 15th.

VII. In our Camp Meeting work, after the expense of the camp meeting has been paid by the Camp Meeting Committee or by the person whom they may designate, any unexpended balance shall be turned over to the Conference Treasurer.

VIII. All monies disbursed by the Conference Treasurer during the interim of Conference shall be upon order of the President, except in case of payment to the President, when such order shall be issued by the Vice-President. It is understood, of course, that any payment ordered by the Conference direct may be paid by the Treasurer without an order as directed above.

IX. No monies shall be loaned by the Conference Treasurer except by order of Conference or by consent of the President and his Advisory Board.

X. Each elder shall make his engagement as pastor with the understanding that if he be elected Conference President he shall be released in his pastoral engagement.

XI. Moved that the Standing Rule No. 11 be changed to read, the first Sunday in each month shall be known as Home Mission Sunday and the Sunday School offerings shall be given to Home Missions and should be sent to the Conference Treasurer.

XII. That in securing Evangelists for the Camp Meeting work that those of the Wesleyan Methodist Church be secured if this can be done.

XIII. That the Camp Meeting Committee be composed of the Conference President as Chairman, and three ministers and three laymen, all to be elected by ballot after the Conference of 1923, the term of office to be three years, the time of one minister and one layman expiring each year.

XIV. Pastors shall state financial items in their statistical reports in even dollars, except in items affecting the Budget, and so far as possible are requested to report all budget items in even dollars. When such rule is not followed the Statistical Secretaries are authorized to drop decimals except as provided above.

PLAN OF WORK FOR LOCAL SOCIETIES.

2. The Camp Ground Dormitory is in need of sheets, pillow cases, quilts and mattresses. Each society is requested to furnish such of these articles as is possible, and send the same to Mrs. Mae LaVere, West Chazy, N. Y.

3. Our contributions to the Hephzibah Orphanage having been so well appreciated in the past, we urge continuance of this good work.

4. We recommend the sending of useful articles of clothing to the South Carolina mountain work.

5. Watch the Missionary Magazine for suggestions from our General President or Foreign Secretary for any special needs, and comply with the same as far as possible.
