CONFERENCE RESOLUTIONS

- I. The Resolutions of Conference shall be printed in the Conference Minutes each year.
- II. All visiting members of our own, or other Churches in harmony with our principles, shall be invited to honorary seats in the Conference.
- III. The Conference President shall receive twenty dollars (\$20) per year for postage and stationery; also any needed traveling expense. At any time the President be required to travel the Conference, his duties and pay shall be defined by the Conference.
- IV. The Conference Secretary shall receive twenty-five dollars (\$25) per year for his labor and incidental expenses.
- V. The Conference Treasurer shall receive twenty-five dollars (\$25) per year for his services in caring for the funds.
- VI. In making his report, the Conference Treasurer is authorized to close his books one week before the Conference session. The Treasurer of the Superannuated Ministers' Relief Association also shall close his books one week before the Conference session.
- VII. In our Camp Meeting work, after the expense of the Camp Meeting has been paid by the Camp Meeting Committee, or by the person whom they may designate, any unexpected balance shall be turned over to the Conference Treasurer.
- VIII. All monies disbursed by the Conference Treasurer during the interim of Conference shall be upon order of the President, except in case of payment to the President, when such order shall be issued by the Vice-President. It is understood, of course, that any payment ordered by the Conference direct may be paid by the Treasurer without an order as directed above.
- IX. No monies shall be loaned by the Conference Treasurer except by order of Conference, or by consent of the President and his Advisory Board.
- X. Each elder shall make his engagement as pastor with the understanding that if he be elected Conference President he shall be released in his pastoral engagement.

- XI. The first Sunday in each month shall be known as Home Mission Sunday, and the Sunday School offerings shall be given to Home Missions, and should be sent to the Conference Treasurer.
- XII. In securing Evangelists for the Camp Meeting work, those of the Wesleyan Methodist Church shall be secured, if this can be done.
- XIII. The Camp Meeting Committee shall be composed of the Conference President as Chairman, and three ministers, and three laymen, all to be elected by ballot after the Conference of 1923, the term of office to be three years, the time of one minister and one layman expiring each year.
- XIV. Pastors shall state financial items in their statistical reports in even dollars, except in items affecting the Budget, and so far as possible are requested to report all budget items in even dollars. When such rule is not followed, the Statistical Secretaries are authorized to drop decimals, except as provided above.
- XV. The offerings for Superannuated Ministers shall be taken within sixty days after Conference, and forwarded to the Treasurer of Superannuate Society.
- XVI. That the Committee on Credentials secure the necessary credentials as provided by our Discipline, from each delegate, with the post office of the same.
- XVII. That the closing Sunday of the Conference year be the Sunday following the beginning of the Annual Conference. That the pastors' salary on this closing Sunday be paid by the church of which he is pastor. The first Sunday of the Conference year be paid by the charge to which he is going.
- XVIII. Newly elected Conference Officers shall take office after the close of Conference Sunday.

DAILY JOURNAL OF PROCEEDINGS

The ninety-eighth annual session of the Champlain Conference, of the Wesleyan Methodist Connection (or Church of America) convened on the campground at West Chazy, N. Y., Tuesday night at 7:30 o'clock July 11th, 1939, with the President, Rev. G. D. Jock, in the Chair. Rev. Irwin Enty led the congregation in singing several numbers after which there was a season of prayer, Rev. Miller and Rev. Shares praying. Announcement of the business meeting for Wednesday morning at 8:30, was made by the President. Rev. and Mrs. Enty sang a duet after which Rev. K. D. Livingston, pastor of the Schenectady Church, brought a message based on scripture found in Isaiah 61st chapter. Also Matt. 4:8, 9.

Wednesday Morning

Devotional service was in charge of Rev. W. F. Lewis. Brother Lewis read scripture from the Gospel of St. John, the 8th chapter. Prayer by Rev. F. H. Wright and Rev. Leon Barse.

The business meeting was called to order by the President at 8:45. The roll was called. The Committee on Credentials made a partial report. Motion was carried that other names be added to complete the roll, without a vote of Conference. The Bar of Conference was fixed by vote, same to include the first five rows of seats across the tabernacle. Conference proceeded to fix the time of opening and closing for Conference Business, as follows: Opening at 8:30 a. m., closing at 11:30. Afternoon, open at 1:30, closing by vote. The President's Annual Report to Conference was called for and given. Report was accepted. See Report.

Rev. E. D. Carpenter introduced his wife, Mrs. Minnie Carpenter, to the Conference, with appropriate remarks. Committee on Character was elected as follows: Rev. H. S. Miller, Mrs. Wurley. Committee on Pastoral Relations: Elders, Reginald Hewitt, W. F. Lewis, C. R. Stopp. Lay members, Henry W. Elliott, Harry Hall, Wilbur Dayton.

The Conference Treasurer's report was called for and given. See Report. It was accepted. Conference gave way to an Order of the Day, the meeting of the Superannuate Society. See Report. Rev. Spencer Moon, the incoming pastor for West Chazy was introduced to Conference. Brother Stopp, having been elected at the last session of Conference to investigate Ministerial Group Insurance, gave a report. By consent the matter was deferred to a later date. Conference adjourned by vote. Benediction by Rev. O. M. Finch.

Wednesday Afternoon

Devotionals at 1:30 were conducted by Rev. C. C. Murray. Singing, "'Tis Burning in My Soul" and "Bless Be the Tie that Binds." Scripture reading, 1 Peter, fifth chapter. Prayer by Brother Henry Elliott.

Business was called by the President. Roll was called and minutes read and approved.

Following names were called and passed: Rev. E. D. Carpenter, Rev. O. M. Finch, Rev. Mary Robinson, Rev. Floyd Banker, Rev. C. L. Hill, Rev. C. C. Murray.

The Committee on Itineracy and Orders gave a partial report, presenting a recommendation to Conference in regard to Rev. Spencer Moon, being received by the Conference, to take the Course of Study and travel under its direction. Recommendation was voted by Conference.

Conference gave way at this time for an Order of the Day, that of hearing the Conference Sermon. Rev. E. D. Carpenter was elected to preach the Conference Sermon this year. Rev. Stopp led the congregation in song. Rev. Mattoon and Rev. Jock offered prayer and Rev. Lewis read the scripture from Job, first chapter. Rev. Carpenter took his text from the 19th chapter of Job. This date was the fiftieth anniversary of his entering the ministry. Brother Carpenter brought a very worthwhile message which was both enjoyable and profitable. May the dear Lord give him many more years of service to God and the Champlain Conference.

At the close of the message, many gathered around the altar for a season of prayer, praise and rejoicing in the Lord. Benediction by Rev. H. C. Shares.

Wednesday Night Service

The service began with a rousing song service, with Brother Willard Smith of Houghton as song leader. Rev. John Waitman offered prayer. Rev. C. I. Armstrong sang a solo "I'd Rather Have Jesus Than Anything." Rev. H. C. Van Wormer brought the message. A message on prayer, text, Acts 4: 31.

Thursday Morning Meeting

Business was called at 8:45. Roll was called and minutes of former meeting read and approved. Rev. F. H. Wright was introduced to Conference and made remarks concerning his relationship with the Conference and his work at Houghton. Rev. F. R. Eddy, Connectional Agent, was introduced to Conference.

A partial report was given by the Committee on Itineracy and Orders, in which H. H. Chapman was recommended to Elders Orders. Report

was accepted. Motion prevailed that the morning prayer meeting be held at 6 o'clock. Conference Treasurer gave his report of the camp meeting work. See Report. The following names were called and passed: D. A. Chadwick, J. J. Davison, C. A. Dayton.

Rev. H. C. Van Wormer, our Camp Meeting Evangelist, was introduced to Conference. Motion was carried that Conference Resolution No. 16 be rescinded. Time for an Order of the Day having come, business gave way to hearing the Conference Sunday-school Secretary's report. See Report. See Report. Report was accepted.

The time set for hearing our Connectional Agent, Rev. F. R. Eddy, having come, he made his report, which was both inspiring and encouraging. Conference adjourned by vote.

Benediction by Rev. J. J. Davison.

Thursday Afternoon

Devotionals were conducted by Rev. H. C. Shares at 1:30. Brother Stopp led in singing, "Throw Out the Life Line." Also "The Cleansing Wave." Scripture read was Revelation 5th chapter. Prayer was offered by Rev. J. J. Davison, and Rev. F. C. Taylor.

Business: Conference was called to order at 1:45 by the President. Roll was called and minutes of the morning meeting were read and approved.

Committee on Itineracy and Orders gave its report, which was accepted. See Report.

Conference voted a resolution to be known as Standing Resolution No. 18. The resolution follows:

Friday Morning

Devotions were in charge of Rev. D. A. Chadwick. "Feasting with My

Lord" was sung. Scripture reading from the 11th chapter of Hebrews. Prayer by Rev. C. A. Dayton.

Brother Eddy urged us to have real Spirit-filled lives and not to be so interested in what will become of the Heathen, but concerned about our own souls if we fail to carry the gospel to them, and to keep our hearts warm with prayer.

The greatest opportunity in history is at present.

Brother Eddy made the appeal for funds which resulted in pledges amounting to \$400.00.

STANDING RULES

- 1. The Standing Rules of the Conference Missionary Society shall be printed in the Conference minutes each year.
- 2. In making her report, the Conference Treasurer is authorized to close her books one week before the Conference session.
- 3. One of the two statistical blanks sent to each society, after being carefully filled out, is to be given to the Statistical Committee at the beginning of the Conference, the other is to be retained by the delegate and later read to the local society. Receipts and disbursements must be made to balance before being placed in the hands of the Statistical Committee.
- 4. All money raised by the society shall be used for missionary work, and no money shall be paid out without a vote of the society.
- 5. The Conference President shall receive annually \$5.00, the Treasurer \$3.00, and Secretary \$2.00 to defray expense of postage and writing material.
- 6. The voting body shall be composed of the Conference officers, Presidents of local societies, one delegate from each local society, Y. M. W. B. Superintendents, pastor's wives and lady pastors.

REPORTS

Report No. 1

PLAN OF WORK

The Committee Recommends:

1. That each local society shall have some Missionary Study or Program at each meeting to broaden our vision and inspire us to pray definitely for our work and workers. Aids to this are the Missionary Magazine, a Study book, and planned monthly correspondence with our missionaries.

- 2. That each society shall have at least one public, well advertised meeting, in which missionary needs shall be emphasized. Try to attract people to the meeting who do not ordinarily come.
- 3. That we observe special days such as Harvest Day, "Wesleyan Missionary Day" and World Day of Prayer.
- 4. That each society elect a solicitor for the Wesleyan Missionary to keep the Magazine in circulation.
- 5. That the President, the Secretary and the Treasurer be subscribers to the Wesleyan Missionary and the Wesleyan Methodist, and that fifty per cent of the membership be subscribers to the Wesleyan Missionary.
- 6. That each local society continue sending \$6.00 to Southern Mountain Work, and \$5.00 for Hepzibah Orphanage. This should be sent through the Conference Treasurer, and applies on Budget.
- 7. That each society send \$.50 per member dues to the Conference Treasurer, one-half of which is to be retained in the Conference for expenses and the other to be forwarded to the General Treasurer.
- 8. That we continue sending supplies to the various mission fields as requested by the workers in charge.
- 9. That instead of buying clothing for children at Hepzibah as in the past, we send an additional cash offering which may be used as most needed on arrival. Our societies may do much to see that the church raises its entire budget for Hepzibah.
- 10. That we make special effort to can things for the Camp Meeting dining hall, and to make and send pillows and quilts for the dormitories.
- 11. That the societies have one District Missionary Service each year, the Chairman of each District to be appointed by the Conference Missionary President. It is recommended that the services of a returned missionary be secured by the Conference Missionary President for each of these district meetings; and that she notify each Chairman early in the Conference year when to arrange for the service. That a general Missionary offering be taken of which the cash shall be given to the missionary, and all pledges shall be accredited to the charge from which they came.*
- 12. That each delegate report to her society at the first meeting after Conference the proceedings of the Conference Society and spread the information gained concerning the work.
- 13. That the Plan of Work be read aloud at the first meeting after Conference and again at least two times during the year. That the Standing Rules be read aloud at one of the last meetings of the year before Conference.

14. That each society be responsible for making and sending one Missionary Poster (preferably about 3'x3½') to the Young People's Convention in the fall.
