DAILY PROCEEDINGS

OPENING OF CONFERENCE

Minutes of the sixty-first annual session of the Dakota Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Connection (or Church) of America for the year of 1941 and 1942 was held in Aberdeen, South Dakota, June 2-8, 1942.

Conference Sermon—The opening service was held in the tabernacle on the campground at eight o'clock in the evening. The service opened with a good song service followed by prayer. Rev. H. W. Cretsinger, pastor of the new church at Butte, Montana, preached the sermon from the book of Esther using as a text, "Who knoweth whether thou art come to the kingdom for such a time as this," Esther 4, first part of verse 14. The Lord gave liberty and unction to our brother as he reviewed before us the world conditions with the need of our message of God and salvation as the answer to the great need of the nation and the world.

Wednesday Morning

Devotionals—Devotions were conducted by Rev. A. M. Wiley reading and commenting from Psalm 1.

Business-President called the Conference to order.

Roll Call—The roll was called to which twenty-seven preachers and twelve delegates answered.

Report—The Program Committee read their report and it was adopted with the name of John Hunter being substituted for A. C. Buell as Chairman of the Railroad Expense Committee.

Nominating Committee—A Nominating Committee of five members was elected as follows: W. D. Shelor, L. D. Harris, R. D. Reisdorph, Mrs. C. E. Griffiths, Bartin Enos.

Recess—President declared a recess for Nominating Committee to prepare their report.

Called to Order—President called the session to order for election of Conference Committees.

Report—The report was read and adopted. (See Report No. 1.)

Election—The committees were elected as read.

Adjournment-Adjourned for committee work.

Wednesday Afternoon

Devotionals—Devotions were conducted by Rev. J. E. Spry, reading and commenting from Romans 6: 10.

Roll Call—Roll was called to which nineteen preachers and fourteen delegates responded.

Minutes—Minutes were read and approved.

Greetings—President read greetings from Rev. W. O. Howard who is holding meetings in the Oregon Conference, Rev. W. W. Jeffers and Rev. Charles Carter missionary elected to Africa.

Motion—Motion prevailed to have 350 copies of the minutes printed at our Publishing House.

Passage of Character—Discussion and instruction was given to the Committee relative to some of the items on passage of character.

Adjournment-Adjourned to the call of the Chair.

Thursday Morning

Devotionals—Devotional service was conducted by Rev. Marvin Jones reading Ephesians 5:10.

Roll Call—Roll was called to which twenty preachers and twelve delegates answered.

Minutes-Minutes were read and approved.

Courtesies—Rev. Julius Miller, pastor at Ipswich, South Dakota, was introduced and spoke briefly. Rev. and Mrs. Kenneth Shelley were introduced and gave short testimonial talks.

Reports—The Camp Meeting Treasurer read his report and it was adopted. (See Report No. 2.)

The President read his report and it was adopted subject to Auditors report on financial items. (See Report No. 3.) This was done with a rising vote of thanks, singing the Doxology.

The Secretary of Ministerial Relief Fund read his report and it was adopted. (See Report No. 4.)

The Committee on Passage of Character read their report and it was adopted. (See Report No. 5.)

Leave of Absence—Brother Hunter was extended leave of absence on account of his mother's death.

Substitution—J. C. McGovern was elected to Pastoral Relations and Orders to fill vacancy of John Hunter.

Message of Condolence—President authorized to convey message of sympathy to Mr. Hunter and also to Brother August Wegner whose daughter passed away.

Change in Orders of the Day—On account of funeral of Mrs. McFarland at 2:30 p. m., the Connectional address was changed to 1:15 p. m. instead of 1:30 p. m.

Motion—Moved to adjourn at close of Connectional address until 3:45 p. m.

Adjournment—Adjourned for Committee work.

Report No. 3 PRESIDENT
