STANDIKG RULES

- Conference President. Resolved,

 1) That the Conference President be required, authorized and appointed to travel the Conference as President, having general supervision of the spiritual interests and benevolences thereof, holding at least one service at each church during the year under such date as he may announce in advance;
- 2) That he shall raise funds to meet the demands of the Conference work, assisted by the pastors, and he shall receive contributions for Missions, Education and Superannuated Ministers, where there are no pastors;
- 3) That he shall have general supervision of the church property, and shall inquire into the titles of the same to see that no property is loosely held, and shall look after the rental of Conference property, and see that the rent is turned into the treasury, and he shall investigate the possibility and feasibility of the sale of property not in use, and report his findings to the Board of Trustees and 'to the next Annual Conference;
 - 4) That he shall be authorized to grant letters to disbanded classes:
- 5) That he shall be required to write non-resident members of Conference asking them in case they cannot attend, to write the Conference a letter of greeting and state the condition of their religious experience:
- 6) That he shall devote as much time as possible and as occasion may afford in evangelistic and other meetings in the Conference;
- 7) That he may engage such help from time to time, as may be available, and as he may consider properly qualified to assist in holding Evangelistic and quarterly Meetings, such help to be reminerated from the Conference Missions Fund.
- Resolved, that the duly-elected and qualified Trustees of the Annual Conference are hereby authorized and directed to sign for the purchase, sale, mortgaging and conveyance of real estate recommended by the Conference Missionary Board during the interim between the meetings of Annual Conference, and that all such action or actions shall be deemed to be legal and binding upon the Annual Conference, and of as full force and effect as they would have been if such actions on the part of the Trustees had been specially authorized by the Annual Conference.
- III. Missionary Board. Resolved, that the Missionary Board is hereby authorized to pay out all monies from the Conference Missions Fund, and during the interim between Conference sessions to act as a Committee on Finance.
- Annual Conference. 1) Date. Resolved, that the Camp Meeting begin on the first Monday after the 20th of July; that Conference open on Friday afternoon at 3:30 o' clock for committee organization; that the Camp Meeting close on Sunday night; that Conference close on Tuesday.
- 2) Fiscal Year. Resolved, that the Conference Fiscal Year close July 15th; that each local church fiscal year close June 30th; that all monies shall be in the hands of the proper Treasurers on or before July 7th; that immediately thereafter each pastor shall submit to the Conference Treasurer his oudget check sheet with receipts covering same, and his statistical blank completed except for the budget section.
- Resolved, that a competent auditor shall be appointed each year by the Committee on Finance to audit the books of the conference.
- 4) Budget Items. Resolved, that all Treasurers shall mark receipts "Budget" or "Not Budget".
- 5) Statistics. Resolved, that the Conference Treasurer fill in the budget items on the statistical blanks that are correct, and check those that are incorrect with the pastor when he registers; that these statistical blanks be turned over to the Statistical
- Secretary by the Conference Treasurer not later than Wednesday noon of Camp Meeting.

 6) Committee on Statistics. Resolved, that a standing Committee on Statistics be elected, consisting of a Conference Statistical Secretary and one other ministerial member; that two lay members be elected at the opening of Conference.
- 7) Sunday Schools. Resolved, that each additional Sunday School under the pastoral oversight of a wesleyan Methodist pastor shall be reported on a separate annual Statistical Report blank, provided each Sunday School has been recognized by the Conference Missionary Board.
- 8) Minutes. Resolved, that the Conference Secretary bill each church for the number of Annual Conference Finutes ordered by that church, and that the Conference Secretary bill the Conference Fund for those minutes not ordered by the individual churches.
- 9) Leave. Resolved, that no member shall leave Conference session without permission of the President.
- 10) Conference Officers. Resolved, that the Officers be installed during Conference at a public service amounced in advance; office to take effect at the rise of Conference.

- V. <u>Camp Meeting</u>. 1) <u>Authorization</u>. Resolved, that there be held an annual Camp Meeting and that it be under the direction of a Camp Meeting Committee elected by the Annual Conference, and that the Conference President, the Conference W.Y.P.S. President and the Conference W.M.S. President be members ex-officio of said Camp Meeting Committee.
- 2) Committee Duties. Resolved, (a) That Campgrounds and buildings be under the care of the Camp Meeting Committee; (b) That the Camp Meeting Committee shall have power to engage workers beyond the present year.
- to engage workers beyond the present year.

 3) Camp Meeting Fund. Resolved, (a) That all pledges and cash received during the sessions of conference and Camp Meeting be placed in the Camp Meeting Fund unless otherwise designated; (b) That the incidental expenses of the Annual Conference while in session be paid from the Camp Meeting Fund.
- VI. <u>Hinisters</u>. 1) <u>Pastor's Report</u>. Resolved, that each ministerial member of our Conference shall report to his Quarterly and Annual Conferences the number of sermons preached, prayer meetings attended, homes visited and calls made, and that the annual report be written on the last page of the Conference Statistical Blank.
- 2) Pastor's Support During Conference. Resolved, that it be our plan that all pastors remain on their charges for one Sunday after Conference and that the church's financial obligation to the pastor, whether he be leaving the field or not, be extended through that Sunday.
- 5) Moving Pastors. Resolved, that each charge make provisions for the moving expense of the incoming pastor immediately after the Annual Conference adjourns.
- 4) Illness or Death. Resolved, that the Conference Secretary be notified by the local church secretary in case of critical illness or death in a minister's home, and that he shall send cards at once to each pastor.
- 5) <u>Minister's Vacation</u>. Resolved, that the Conference President and all pastors be given a two-weeks' vacation with pay, with one Sunday's absence from their pulpits.

JOURNAL OF DAILY PROCEEDINGS

First Meeting -- 2:45 p.m., Friday, July 28, 1950.

Opening -- The first annual session of the Illinois Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America was held on the Free Methodist Camp Grounds, 901 Farmington Road, Peoria, Illinois. The President, Rev. Wm. H. Dyer, called the first meeting to order at 2:45p.m., CDT, and Rev. D. C. Durey led the song service. Rev. C. E. Olander offered a prayer of thanksgiving and of petition for God's blessing and guidance.

Conference Sermon -- Rev. L. G. Anderson challenged the conference with a message based on 2 Kings 2:9-11. He drew a parallel between Elijah's request for a double portion of the

Spirit, and our Illinois Conference aspirations for the coming year.

Opening of Conference Business Session -- The conference sang the gospel song, "To The Work", after which Rev. Anderson, on behalf of the Peoria Church, extended cordial greetings and appropriate words of welcome. In response, Rev. Durey of the Rockford charge expressed the delegates' appreciation for the labors of the Peoria pastor and members in preparing for the camp meeting and conference.

Conference Bar -- The first three rows of seats at the front center of the auditorium

were designated the conference bar.

Roll Call -- Four elders and two conference preachers answered the initial roll call. Organization of Committees -- The following committees were formed by proper action of the conference: Credentials, Rev. L. G. Anderson and Rev. O. E. Price; Courtesy, Rev. L. G. Anderson and Rev. D. C. Durey.

Report of Credentials Committee -- The credentials of four delegates were presented as a partial report of the committee. On motion, the report was adopted and delegates were

seated. (See Conference Roll.)

Nominating Committee -- Motion to limit the Nominating Committee to three preachers and two laymen was carried. Rev. W. H. Dyer, Rev. A. L. Bray, Rev. C. E. Olander, Lr. H. Ray Dyer and Mr. W. F. Tice were elected to the committee by acclamation.

Conference Reporter -- Rev. C. E. Clander was elected conference reporter.

Report of Orders of the Day Committee -- The committee submitted its report, which was

Courtesy Committee -- The committee presented Rev. and Mrs. U. P. Jones, East Peoria Free Methodist Church; Rev. W. H. Wineinger, supply pastor of the Creve Coeur W.M. Church; and Rev. R. D. Reisdorph, General Sunday School Editor and denominational representative, who also was serving the Illinois Camp Meeting as evangelist. These guests addressed greetings to the conference.

Auditing Committee -- Rev. D. C. Durey and Rev. C. E. Olander were constituted an audit-

ing committee by vote of conference.

Conference President's Report -- The vice president, Rev. A. L. Bray, was called to the chair as the conference president gave his report, which by vote was received for referral to the auditing committee. (See Report No. 1.)

Report of Missionary Board -- The report of the Missionary Board was presented by Rev. Dyer, and was referred to the auditing committee by vote of conference. (See Report No.2)
Report of Conference Tressurer -- The conference treasurer, Mr. Wm. F. Tice, presented his report, which had been audited by a certified public accountant. The report, upon motion, was adopted by the conference, and a rising vote of thanks was extended to hr. Tice for his efficient handling of accounts during the fiscal year. (See Report No. 3.)

Committee on Itineracy and Orders -- The committee, in a partial report, recommended the Rev. Orville Ernest Price to the conference for ordination. The report was adopted by

Adjournment -- A motion prevailed to adjourn for committee work, subject to call of the Chair. Rev. Reisdorph led in closing prayer.

Adjourned Meeting -- 7:45 a.m., Saturday, July 29, 1950.

Opening -- An adjourned meeting of the conference was called to order by the president in the dining hall at 7:45 a.m., July 29, 1950.

Report of the Nominating Committee -- Committee submitted its report. Motion prevailed that it be adopted. (See Report No. 4.)

Adjournment -- Motion to adjourn carried.

Second Meeting -- 9:00 a.m., Saturday, July 29, 1950.

Opening -- The second meeting was called to order by the president, who led the confer-

Report of Credentials Committee -- Credentials of the Oak Lawn and Oak Park delegates were presented by the committee. Report was adopted by vote. (See Conference Roll.)

Illinois Conference

Report of Conference Sunday School Secretary -- Mr. J. J. Blaine submitted a report of his activities during the year. Conference voted to accept the report for referral to the auditing committee. (See Report No. 5.)

Sunday School Service — Orders of the Day called for a Sunday School Service at this

hour. Rev. Bray presided over the meeting and conducted a workshop discussion. Reports from superintendents of the conference Sunday Schools were heard. Denominational School Editor and Secretary, Rev. Reisdorph, gave an informal report on trends in material and answered questions regarding denominational policies.

Recess -- Conference was adjourned by vote for a brief recess.

Orders of the Day - Meeting was reconvened by the president at 10:30 a.m., at which time the Orders of the Day called for the first ordination service to be celebrated by the Illinois Conference.

Opening -- Mrs. R. D. Reisdorph led the conference in singing "On Christ the Solid Rock I Stand" and "There He Leads He I Will Follow". Hr. S. C. Puyear, conference trustee, led

in prayer. Mrs. Reisdorph sang a song of consecration, "Shut in with God".

Ordination Sermon — Rev. R. D. Reisdarph, after leading in preyer, addressed the congregation on the subject, "Joshua's Ministry". From scripture found in Joshua 1:1-9, he spoke of 1) Joshua's call, 2) His commission, 3) His conquest, 4) His consolation. The promises made to Joshua come down to us with the added emphasis of Christ, "Io, I am with you alway, even unto the end of the world".

Ordination Coremony -- The Rev. Orville Ernest Price became the first elder to be ordeined in the new Illinois Conference. Accompanied by his companion in the Lord's work, he presented himself at the tabernacle alter. The service was conducted by the conference president, Rev. W. H. Dyer, assisted by Rev. D. C. Durey, Rev. C. E. Olander and Rev. A. L. Bray. Rev. Reisdorph offered the prayer of consecration, following which there was a period of fellowship in which the congregation participated.

Adjournment -- The conference was adjourned by limitation of time.

Third Meeting -- 2:30 p.m., Saturday, July 29, 1950.

Opening -- The meeting was opened by the president. Rev. Durey led the song service. Mr. Ronald Mullen led the congregation in prayer. A period of testimony followed, in

which many bore witness to the blessing of God in the Mesleyan fellowship.

Denominational Address -- In a thought-provoking study from the life of Meheniah, Reisdorph, denominational representative, drew witel lessons pointing the direction to achievement in the Wesleyan Methodist movement. His address, Wold Patterns and Hew Projects", recounted Nehemiah's deep interest in the plight of ruined Jerusalem, his labor to rebuild the walls, his opposition, and his accomplishments. The speaker made pertinent applications of the truths in this well-known account to the problems facing the church today, and left a challenge in the hearts of the listeners to proceed with renewed vigor to the work of saving lost souls and building God's kingdom.

Adjournment -- Rev. Bray led in a fitting prayer as the meeting was adjourned.

Fourth Meeting - 9:00 a.m., Monday, July 31, 1950.

Opening -- The president called the fourth meeting of the conference to order at 9:00 o' clock Monday morning. In the devotional service, Rev. Durey led in singing "There He Leads I'll Follow". Rev. W. H. Dyer read and commented appropriately on Psalms 125 and 126 and led the conference in prayer.

Roll Call -- Right ministerial and six lay delegates were tallied in the roll call. Minutes -- Minutes of the first three meetings of the session were read and approved as

corrected by the conference.

Credentials, and Courtesy Committees - The credentials committee, in a partial report, submitted credentials for the Hoopeston and Princeton delegates. The Chair recognized the presence of the Conference Sunday School Secretary, Mr. J. J. Blaine, and of Rev. W. H. Wineinger and Mr. Glenn A. Thompson, representatives of our Creve Coeur mission church, who were invited to be seated within the conference bar.

Report of the Smeranmated Ministers' Fund - Mrs. Grace B. Stuber, treasurer of the pension fund, submitted her annual report, which was accepted by vote of conference and

referred to the auditing committee. (See Report No. 6.)

Recess -- Upon motion, conference was recessed for committee work until 10:15 a.m. Report of the auditing Committee - Meeting was reconvened by the president. The auditing committee made its report, which was adopted by proper action of conference. (See Report No. 7.)

Report of Passage of Character Committee -- Report of this committee was adopted by vote.

(See Report No. 8.)

Report of Committee on Minutes -- The committee gave a partial report which was adopted. (See Report No. 18.) The question of publication of W.L.S. and W.Y.P.S. minutes was referred back to the committee for study and recommendation.

Committee on Courtesy -- The committee made a partial report, presenting the following visitors to the conference: Rev. and Mrs W. S. Freeborn, of Miltonvale College; Mr. Francis Davis, student at Asbury Seminary and member of the Chicagoland church.

Report of Committee on Itineracy and Orders -- The committee reported the following conference preachers as eligible to vote in the election of officers:-- Rev. L. G. Anderson, and Rev. C. C. Mc Carty. The report was adopted by action of conference.

Election of Conference Officers -- Orders of the Day called for the election of officers. Rev. R. D. Reisdorph was invited to the Chair. Rev. Glenn Dyer and Mr. G. A. Thompson were appointed counting tellers, and Mr. Ronald Mullen distributing teller.

A motion prevailed that all ballots, including the first, be electoral ballots. The fol-

lowing elections resulted from the balloting:

Tice; Nominee Alternate Member Local Board of Miltonyale Wesleyan College, Rev. A. L. Bray.

Motion prevailed that election of remaining officers and committees proceed by acclamation, and the following offices were filled: Sec'y .- Treasurer Superannuated Ministers' Fund, Mrs. Grace B. Stuber; Sunday School Secretary, Mr. J. J. Blaine; Statistical Secretary, Rev. D. C. Durey; Tithing Secretary, Rev. C. C. Mc Carty; Secretary of Education Mr. S. H. Paine, Jr.; W.M.M.L. Promotional Secretary, Rev. O. E. Price.

Report of the W.Y.P.S. -- The slate of officers of the W.Y.P.S. was presented. Report

was adopted by vote of conference. (See Report No.9.)

Sixth Meeting - 8:30 a.m., Tuesday, August 1, 1950.

Opening - The president convened the sixth meeting at 8:30 a.m. Tuesday morning. Rev. Durey led in the singing. The Men's Missionary League Promotional Secretary, Rev. C. S. Price, led in devotions, speaking from Matthew 28:18-20. After appropriate comments, Rev. Price led the assembly in prayer.

submitted. Motion to adopt was passed. (See Report No. 14.)

Conference Sermon -- By appropriate action Rev. C. B. Clauder was appointed to preach the Conference Sermon at the second annual session of the Illinois Conference. Rev. A. L. Bray was made alternate appointee.

<u>Conference Paper</u> — It was moved that the Illinois Conference undertake to publish a monthly conference paper. Motion carried, amended to make the paper a quarterly issue. Rev. Durey was appointed editor and publisher by action of conference, and the president was empowered to appoint two other persons to assist Rev. Swauger, General Home Missions Secretary; and New. Boy S. Micholson, General Conference President.

School District -- Previous action of the conference was rescinded by a motion to discuss school district assignment as a committee of the whole, motion carried.

It was neved and accorded that the Illinois Conference patition General Conference to include the Illinois Conference territory in the Marion School District. A further nation carried that the vote on school district preference be by ballot. The vote resulted in seven beliefs for inclusion in Marion District, abs for inclusion in Miltonyale District.

Seventh Beating - 6:30 p.m. Thursday, Amoust I. 1950.

Conference Boundaries -- Motion was presented to conference that we petition General Conference to include in Section VIII of the Discipline a paragraph defining the boundaries of the Illinois Conference as follows:

"The Illinois Conference shall comprise that part of the State of Illinois north of the Wabash Railway running from the Indiana state line east of Danville, Illinois, to Hannibal Missouri."

An amendment was introduced defining conference boundaries to include the entire state of Illinois. The amendment did not carry. Main motion was adopted by action of conference.

Committee on Courtesy -- The committee presented to the conference Mr. A. L. Platte, of Peoria. Brother Platte brought greetings, and told of the blessing of the Lord visited upon the work of child evangelism to which he has been called in Peoria.

Pastors' Reports -- The pastors from Oak Lawn, Wyanet, and Oak Park read their statistical reports before conference. (See Report No. 15.)

Church Extension Service -- The Orders of the Day called for a church extension service at 7:45 p.m. Motion pictures of the Haitian mission field were shown, after which the officers of the W.M.S. and W.Y.P.S. and of the Illinois Conference for the year 1950-1951 were presented at the front of the auditorium for recognition and greetings.

First Meeting -- 2:30 p.m. Friday, July 27, 1951.

V. THE SUFFICIENCY AND FULL AUTHORITY OF THE SCRIPTURES.

12. The Holy Scriptures contain all things necessary to salvation; so that whatsoever is not read therein, nor may be proved thereby, is not to be required of any man, that it should be believed as an article of faith, or be thought requisite or necessary to salvation. In the name of the Holy Scriptures, we do understand the books of the Old and New Testaments. These Scriptures we do hold to be the inspired and infallibly written Word of God, fully inerrant in their original manuscripts and superior to all human authority.

The canonical books of the Old Testament are: (From this point on the Article reads as given in the 1947 Book of Discipline.)

- 9. That we emphasize the work of the Y.M.W.B., giving hearty support to the Conference Y.M.W.B. Superintendent.
- 10. That each society have a Men and Missions service in November, besides the regular monthly meeting, striving for an increase in honorary membership. Send the offering to the Conference Missionary Treasurer to apply on Foreign budget.
- 11. 'That each Society send an offering for the support of medical missions which will apply on Foreign Missions budget. Also contribute \$3.00 or more to the Medical Student Fund, not to apply on budget.
- 12. That the monies be sent to our Conference Missionary Treasurer quarterly, using the blanks, and enclosing cash receipts that the pastor may have for Home and Foreign Missions and for Education which are to be credited to the Missionary Society.
- 13. That two report blanks be sent to each society to be carefully filled out, one to be sent to the chairman of the Statistical Committee two weeks before Conference.
- 14. That we forward promptly all Sunday School Charts and cards to our foreign mission fields, enclosing the charts in their original pasteboard rolls with one inch cut off each end; or to Home Mission stations and hospitals for crippled children.
- 15. That each society organize Prayer Partner Circle Groups with a secretary to keep records of the membership and report the number to the Conference Prayer Partner Corresponding Secretary.
- 16. That the "In Remembrance" folders be used by the societies. Money should be sent to the Conference Missionary Treasurer, and the folders to the family.

17. That each society send three dollars to the Conference Treasurer on the project of

- sending a missionary evangelist to the foreign fields, not to apply on budget.
- 18. That we issue an award to the societies that qualify according to the following points: a) Making a grade of 125 points or more in the Efficiency Standard. Securing magazine subscriptions equal to the active membership of the society. c) Elect a Prayer Partner Circle Secretary, reporting her name and the number of members to the Conference Prayer Partner Secretary by October 1st. d) Pursuing the Mission Study Course, sending name of local secretary to Conference Mission Study Secretary. e) Sending newly elected W.M.S. President to the Annual Conference Session.
- 19. That at the assigned monthly fast and prayer day each member lay aside the price of a meal for the support of two native workers in Africa, not budget.
- 20. That the W.M.S. cooperate with the church in sponsoring Child Evangelism classes in each church.

21. That each society promote the Penny-A-Meal plan.

- 22. That as far as possible each society provide the following camp necessities: 1) 12 dish towels. 2) 12 dish cloths. 3) 1 quilt. 4) 1 pair pillow cases. 6) 1 Turkish towel and cloth. 7) 2 sets salt-and-pepper shakers. 8) 6 8) 6 stainless steel teaspoons.
- 23. That each society send one dollar to the Conference Treasurer for the purchase of Conference Treasurer's and Secretary's books.

W.M.S. Plan of Work for Local Societies.

We, your Committee on Plan of Work, submit the following recommendations:

Standards of Efficiency.

1. That arrangements be made with the pastor for one missionary prayer meeting each month.

2. That a minimum of ten meetings be held during the year in which prayer is given prominent place and business is transacted (5%) and at least one public meeting (5%).

3 We recommend the formation of prayer partner circles in each society with a prayer partner secretary to keep record of the same and report to the conference prayer partner secretary, to be sent not later than sixty days after the rise of annual conference.
4. That the president, secretary, treasurer and 75% of the active membership be sub-

scribers to the Wesleyan Missionary.

- 5. That a solicitor be elected for the Wesleyan Missionary, gaining not less than two subscriptions a year.
- 6. That a delegate be elected to the annual conference of the W.M.S. (5%), and that the delegate be instructed by the local society regarding the amount to be pledged by that society at the annual conference session (5%).
- 7. That the dues \$1 per member be sent directly to the conference treasurer, 50¢ of which shall be divided by her as specified and applied on budget, (5%); and that all monies and vouchers be sent to the conference treasurer at least quarterly (5%).
- 8. That we secure every woman in the Church as a member of the society, or bring about a ten per cent gain in total membership.
- 9. That each local society pay annually an amount equal to 25¢ per active member to be used as a general administrative fund, not to apply on budget.

10. That the Efficiency Standard be read in the society at least once a year.

(Ten per cent credit shall be given for each of the above items, and all societies making a grade of eighty per cent shall be placed on the Honor Roll.)

 8. That three report blanks be sent to each society, two of which should be carefully
- filled out, one to be sent to the chairman of the statistical committee two weeks before

- 9. That the "In Remembrance" folders be used by the societies. Money should be sent to the conference missionary treasurer, and the folders to the family.
