DAILY PROCEEDINGS

The forty-second annual session of the Alabama Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America convened in the Tabernacle at Camp Eden in St. Clair County, Alabama, August 14, 1951 at 3:00 P. M. The opening song service was led by A. L. Deason followed with prayer led by Rev. H. A. Johnson. The President fixed the bar of the conference to include the first five seats in front of the platform.

The meeting was called to order and the Secretary read the roll call. Eighteen Elders and six Conference Preachers answered the roll call. Credentials were read and seventeen lay delegates were enrolled.



PRESIDENT'S REPORT

To the members of the Alabama Conference assembled in the forty second annual session: Greetings in the Name of our Risen Lord.

"Hitherto hath the Lord helped us" and we are privileged to meet once more in an annual session of the conference. We have had the priceless opportunity of laboring for the Master another year. In these most eventful days one never knows whether it shall be our privilege to meet in another session like this or not. Therefore let us give our utmost to the work of Christ and souls. for "the night cometh when no man can work."

I submit the following report of the third year as your servant in the capacity in which you have asked me to serve.

ACTIVITIES

I have conducted about 80 services in the churches of the conference in the performance of the duties of conference president. I regret that I was not able to complete the last round of quarterly conferences due to sickness. In addition to the services listed above I have held three one-week revivals and one tent meeting in the conference. I served as youth worker for one camp, held one revival, and one youth-week revival outside the conference. Immediately following the last session of the conference I had to give supervision for several weeks to the Cordova church as they were without a pastor for some time.

I attended the conference W. Y. P. S. Convention, one District Missionary Rally, participated in the Conference Ministerial Institute. As your representative I attended the Area meeting of Presidents and Vice-Presidents at Charlotte, N. C. in March and served as one of your ministerial delegates to the General Conference, at Fairmount, Indiana in June.

I have served as chairman of the Conference Missionary

Board and as Editor of the Conference Reporter.

At the request of the church and in keeping with what I deemed the best interest of the cause I assumed the oversight of the Birmingham Church when they were left without a pastor, due to the call of Rev. Warren into active duty as Chaplain in the United States Army. I have not accepted a full salary from either the church or the conference for the time I have been so engaged.

January 25, 1951, granted Rev. Harry D. Clark to pastor a

church of another denomination.

Received the resignation of Rev. Mrs. Frances Allred as pastor of Springdale Church to be effective April 22.

Appointed Ponder Frederick pastor of the Springdale church to be effective June 3.

On August 4th, I received the transfer of E. L. Shigley, Jr.,

an elder, from the South Carolina Conference.

Following what I believe to be the will of God, I am accepting a call to the pastorate of the Birmingham Church and therefore would request that you elect someone else as conference president for the coming year. It has been a real joy to serve in this capacity. These have been the greatest years of my life. My heart is in the work of the Alabama Conference. You have been kind, and cooperative and I deeply appreciate the fellowship we have had together. I have tried to give the work my best by the help of the Lord. I only wish the service rendered had been more efficient.

REPORT OF SUNDAY SCHOOL SECRETARY

As Sunday School Secretary it has been my privilege to endeavor to promote the Sunday School interest of our Conference by sending to each church all report blanks and available material from time to time.

Realizing the need for a better trained leadership in our Sunday Schools, we recommend the following teacher training course; Basic Bible Survey; Bible Study by books; Sunday School Methods; Sunday School Teaching, and any other books the Sunday School Board may see fit to include.

As a standard of achievement, we recommend the following: A ten per cent increase in enrollment, ten per cent increase in average attendance, conversion of scholars, worker's meeting at least quarterly, one teacher training unit each year, and a Daily Vacation Bible School. Each school achieving these goals shall be given a penant to be kept for one year and reawarded each year as the schools continue to meet this standard.

The Talladega North Street Sunday School having the highest percentage of the goals, is awarded the banner for the following year.

We have as a conference a Sunday School enrollment of 2,456, Average Attendance 1,787. Ten churches had ten per cent increase in enrollment; twelve churches had ten per cent increase in average attendance; three churches held Teacher Training Course with a total enrollment of 25; nine churches held Daily Vacation Bible Schools with an enrollment of 465 and an average attendance of 362.

STANDING RULES

1. Opening of Conference. Resolved that all meetings open at 8:45 except the opening day of conference, and that at 3:00 P. M.

- 2. Conference President. Resolved that the conference president be required, authorized and appointed to travel the conference as president, having general supervision of the spiritual interest and benevolence thereof, holding at least the first, second and fourth quarterly meetings at each church during the conference year under such dates as he may announce thirty days in advance and according to the following schedule: The first quarter to close by November 30, the second quarter to end by February 28, and the fourth quarter to begin not earlier than May 1. We further recommend that the first quarterly meeting consist of two services. if possible. (2) That he assist the pastor in raising funds to meet the demands of the conference work. He may receive contributions for the budget in churches where there are no pastors. (3) That he devote as much time to the promotional work of the conference as possible.
- 3. Committee Reports. Resolved that all reports of committees be made in writing, at the adoption of the conference, and handed to the secretary at the adoption of the conference.
- 4. Sunday Schools. Resolved that Sunday School be held at the Camp on Sunday and those attending the camp ground counted as attending Sunday School in their respective churches. That all Sunday Schools under the supervision of Wesleyan Methodist pastor be counted in their statistical reports.
- 5. Quarterly and annual conference report. Resolved that each ministerial member of our conference report to his quarterly and annual conference: number of sermons preached, prayer meet-

ings attended, homes visited and pastoral calls made. All treasurers shall give a written itemized report of all receipts and disbursements at each quarterly conference.

6. Credentials. Resolved that each annual conference preacher present his credentials at the conference for their renewal and proper signature. And that Paragraph 170 subdivision (2) of the discipline shall be adhered to in renewing authorization of annual conference preachers.

7. Death or illness. Resolved that the secretary be notified by telephone in case of death or critical illness in a minister's home and that he shall send cards at once to each pastor, and that each church and each pastor send at least \$2 to the stricken family.

8. Financial year. Resolved that the financial and statistical year of each church close with the second Sunday preceding the opening of the annual conference session and that all receipts and budget money be mailed to the Conference Treasurer on the following Monday, with the pastor's report completely filled out.

9. Moving pastor. Resolved that each church make provisions for the moving of the incoming pastor, either by paying mov-

ing expenses or providing way to move him.

10. Ministerial labors. Resolved that the pastor's labors terminate with the Sunday following the close of annual conference session.

- 11. Vacations. Resolved that the conference president and all pastors be given a two weeks vacation with pay, with one Sunday absent from their pulpits.
- 12. Conference entertainment. Resolved that each member and each visitor to the annual conference be required to pay two dollars for entertaining purposes, and that children from 6-12 one dollar.
- 13. Resolved that the Board of Trustees of the Alabama Conference be empowered and authorized to make and execute such contracts, mortgages, deeds, and other instruments of writing as may be necessary in making sale, exchange, securing loans, or other transfers of any local church property or properties belonging to the conference when such sale, transfer, mortgage, or exchange is recommended and concurred in by the local board of trustees and congregation of any local church within the conference, and consent of the President and his Advisory Board.
- 14. Marriage. Resolved that no minister may perform a marriage involving a divorcee except in cases where thorough investigation reveals that the divorce has been on Scriptural grounds. This does not prohibit the remarrying of persons who have been divorced from each other.
- 15. The Alabama Conference interprets the Discipline of the Wesleyan Methodist Church in its General Rules, Paragraph 45. and Special Rules, Paragraph 51, as forbidding the wearing of ornamental jewelry, including the wedding ring and all other rings, on the part of the members of the Church and forbids the reception of any into full membership until they have left off the wearing of such ornaments.

We do hereby reaffirm our wholehearted support of this position and be it resolved that our pastors and churches be diligent in observance of these principles.

REPORT OF PLANNING COMMITTEE

We, the Planning Committee, wish to submit the following report:

Resolved: That the President and the Executive Committee make plans for the State-wide Youth Convention to be held during Thanksgiving holidays at the First Wesleyan Church in Birmingham.

Resolved: That the President receive a salary of \$25.00 per year to be paid by the end of the second quarter. This amount is

to be raised by the Treasurer who will assess each society according to membership.

Resolved: That the President visit each society during the year upon invitation from each society and that an offering be taken for his expenses.

We recommend that each active member be assessed \$1.25 to be divided as follows: \$.50 General dues; \$.50 church extension and \$.25 conference dues. The associate member be assessed \$.75 to be divided as follows: \$.50 church extension and \$.25 conference dues.

(within 2 weeks)
6. Attendance at each Quarterly Convention or a letter of
protest to the district chairman and Confer-
ence President if not held 25 points
7. Each dollar raised for support of Mary Pat
Nicholson 10 points
8. Annual report correct and on time 100 points
9. A bonus of 100 points is offered to each society who secures
YOUTH subscriptions equal to twice the number of active members:
A bonus of 50 points for each Youth Crusade, jail service, street
meeting or special prayer meetings; and 100 bonus points for each
society reporting a gain in their amount spent for foreign missions.
