

Journal of Daily Proceedings

The California Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church convened for its Twenty-eighth Annual Session in the auditorium of the Pacific Bible College of Azusa, California at 8:30 a. m. on the 6th of August, 1952. Rev. D. H. Scott led in the singing of "How Firm a Foundation" and "Faith of Our Fathers" and bringing some lessons from the book of Joel.

The Conference was called to order by the President Rev. G. A. Thomas.

The roll was called.

Dr. Swauger, the Denominational Representative, was invited to preside over the Conference.

The bar of Conference was set as the first eight rows of seats across the auditorium and the platform.

Keith McRoberts, D. H. Scott and Arthur Depew were elected ministerial members of the Nominating Committee. Wm. Marshburn and Louesa Starr were elected lay members.

The time for meeting was set at 8:30 a. m. to 10:45 a. m. and 2:00 p. m. to 3:30 p. m.

The Conference recessed to meet at the call of the chair.

The Conference was called to order.

The Committee on Nominations read its report. A motion carried that its report be adopted. (See Report No. 1.)

The President read his report. A motion carried to adopt it by a rising vote of thanks. (See Report No. 2.)

A motion carried to adjourn until 2 o'clock.

Second Meeting, Wednesday p. m.

The devotions were conducted by Rev. George Hawley.

The roll was called.

The Committee on Itineracy and Elders Orders read a partial report. It was adopted.

The Ministerial Character read a partial report. It was adopted.

The Courtesy Committee introduced Rev. Sherwood Eddy and Rev. and Mrs. DeVere Wilson.

Third Meeting, Thursday a. m.

Esther Depew conducted the devotions and also spoke of the activities of the W.C.T.U. and the necessity and means of combating the liquor evil.

The roll was called.

The minutes were read and approved.

The Orders of the Day, the election of Conference Officials, was taken up.

Keith McRoberts, Sherwood Eddy and Elzie Gordon were appointed tellers.

The Missionary Board read its report. It was adopted. (See Report No. 10.)

The Camp Meeting Committee read its report. It was adopted. (See Report No. 11.)

A motion carried that the Camp Meeting Treasurer give his annual report to the President and his Advisory Board for approval. This report to be included in the minutes. (See Report No. 12.)

The secretary reported that the local churches had voted on the amendment of Article 5 of the Article of Religion and that the vote had been unanimous in favor.

The Board of Trustees read a report. It was adopted. (See Report No. 13.)

Pastor's reports were given by Roma Acuna, Viola Bondehagen, Arthur Depew, Esther Depew, John Henley, T. Y. Miller, Harold Taylor, Pearl Taylor, G. A. Thomas and Sherwood Eddy. Communications from D. O. Beach, O. F. Grimsley, Harry J. and Myrtle M. Sension were read and their character passed as well as that of F. L. Berkebile, Pauline Ludwig and W. A. Oates. The report of Vern Pate was read by the Chester delegate.

A motion carried that the secretary write a letter of appreciation to the Marshburn brothers for their aid in financing the new church at Whittier.

A motion carried that the President and his Advisory Board be authorized to purchase a typewriter for the use of the secretary.

The Courtesy Committee introduced Dr. Llewellyn Davis. He brought greetings as a fraternal delegate from the Free Methodist Church and representative of Los Angeles Pacific College.

Standing Rules

- 1. The Conference shall convene at the call of the Chair. The president shall announce the date of its meeting sufficient time before the opening in conformity with the Denominational Board.
- 2. As soon as possible after the last Quarterly Meeting on each charge the pastor shall forward the Delegate's Credentials to the conference secretary. The secretary shall then compile the roll of Conference to be ready for the opening of each session.
- 3. The quorum of this Conference shall be twenty-five per cent of its possible enrollment. Ministerial or lay members of the Conference must not leave the bar of the Conference without the consent of the Chair, nor withdraw from the Conference session permanently without consent of the Conference.
- 4. The Conference shall elect a Nominating Committee which shall bring in nominations for the Sessions and Standing Committees.
- 5. All recommedations to study, to travel, to receive Elders Orders or to be received on credentials shall be handed to the secretary as early as possible and he shall pass them to the proper committee without vote of the Conference.
- 6. Pastors shall not drop any of their appointments without consent of the president and his Advisory Board.
- 7. All charges shall pay the moving expenses of the incoming pastor within the bounds of the Conference.
- 8. While we believe in and will practice ministerial courtesies yet it is the sense of this Conference that our churches shall not be opened to other denominations to maintain a regular appointment as such is likely to scatter the flock.
- 9. It shall be the duty of the pastors to see that all property is properly insured. Failing to do so the Conference will do it and in event of fire collect the monies.
- 10. No person making application for membership on letters of dismissal shall be received until impediments in the way of granting a letter of good standing shall have been removed by proper adjustment.
- 11. The fiscal year of the Conference shall close two weeks before the opening of Conference and the Conference treasurer shall close the Conference books on that day. The local treasurers shall close their books at the same time and have their statistical reports made out and in the hands of the statistical committee at least five days before Conference.
- 12. Examinations on the Course of Study shall be taken before an Elder of the Conference unless permission is obtained from the Chairman of the Committee on Itineracy and Elders Orders to do otherwise.

- 13. The president and his Advisory Board are to be the Board on Church and Parsonage Location and Plans.
- 14. The president and his Advisory Board are designated as a Deed Examining Committee for the Conference. When deeds to Conference Church or Parsonage property are received, before being recorded, they shall be submitted to this committee for examination and the insection of such disciplinary clauses as necessary to make the property safe for the Conference.
- 15. The Committee on Religious Services for the Conference shall be composed of the President and his Advisory Board, the President of the W.M. Society and the President of the Conference W.Y.P.S.
- 16. All pastors are required to subscribe to THE WESLEYAN METHODIST and THE WESLEYAN MISSIONARY.
- 17. The Conference secretary and treasurer shall each be reimbursed to the amount of \$25.00 for each year's labor.
- 18. Each church shall adopt and practice the storehouse tithing plan as set forth in the Bible and Discipline.
- 19. The Camp Meeting Committee is empowered to employ evangelistic help up to and including three years in advance.
- 20. The Camp Meeting Committee shall be composed of four elders, elected in rotation for a term of four years each, and two laymen, elected in rotation for a term of four years each, with the president of the Conference, the president of the Woman's Missionary Society and the president of the Wesleyan Young People's Society members ex-officio.
- 21. Pastors shall read the following items when giving their pastor's report:
 - Item I Pastor's Labors, Time employed
- Item II Periodicals, Wesleyans, Wesleyan Missionarys and Wesleyan Youths taken
 - Item III Membership, Present number and Gain or Loss
- Item IV Sunday Schools, Average Attendance and Total Number in Sunday School
- Item V Church Property, Value of Church Buildings, Value of Parsonages and Cash or Other Values on Hand
 - Item VI Contributed for Pastor, Total Pastor's Receipts
 - Item VII Contributed for Church, Total for Church
 - Item VIII Contributed for Budget, the entire item
 - Item IX Contributed for Benevolences, Total for Benevolences
 - Item X Contributed Totals, Total for All Purposes

Rev. Keith McRoberts brought some commending remarks about the progress that has been made with our young people, the work of the W. Y.P.S. officers and gave us a challenge to endeavor to accomplish more in the future.

It was moved and supported that the president contact the local societies to promote the work of the Conference W.Y.P.S. as he sees fit. The motion carried.
