STANDING RULES

First:—The Committee on Audit shall be a Standing Committee.

Second:—The Conference Treasurer shall have full right to refuse any

pastor's financial report that is not completely filled out.

Third:—The offering taken on the first three nights of the Annual Conference shall be applied to the expenses and entertaining of Conference, and that the balance, if any, shall be applied to the printing of the Minutes. The offering taken on Conference Sunday morning shall be given to the pastor on whose charge the Conference is held. The Sunday evening offering shall be applied to meet the remuneration set by Conference for the Conference Treasurer's services.

Fourth:—The Conference President and the pastor on whose charge the Conference is held shall be a Committee on Religious Services.

Fifth:—That all Conference Books shall be closed 30 days before the rise of the next Conference.

Sixth:—That each pastor shall present both copies of his statistical report with receipts and all items carefully recorded, with exception of the budget, not later than fifteen days before commencement of Conference. The Conference Treasurer shall fill in budget items and one copy be returned to the pastor with the other sent to the chairman of statistics.

Seventh:—That this Canada Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America, having become part of the Superannuation Pension Plan of the Wesleyan Methodist Church, will not feel any obligation to any of the Conference Ministers or their families, when such ministers retire because of physical inability, or in case of death to support their widows or children, if said ministers have neglected to become members of the Superannuation Plan, whose laity make provision for such periods of need. All members of the Superannuation Pension Plan are to make their payments on assessed incomes and file reports according to regulations.

Eighth:-That the Conference President be Record Clerk.

Ninth:—That the member of the Board of Managers for Houghton College also be Conference Educational Secretary.

Tenth:-That the Pastoral Vote be taken prior to February 15th.

Eleventh:—That the Churches grant each pastor two weeks vacation with pay at a time agreeable to the pastor and congregation.

Twelfth:—That only the following items of the Minister's Statistical Report be read on Conference floor:—Item 1. Appointments; Item 2. Wesleyan Methodists, Wesleyan Missionaries, Wesleyan Youth; Item 3. Present Number, loss or gain, number of family altars; Item 4. Total Number in Main School, average attendance, Wesleyan Young People's Societies—both parts; Item 5 & 6—to be read in full; Item 7. Total for Church; Item 8. To be read in full; Item 9. Total for Benevolences; Item 10. To be read in full.

Thirteenth:-Those who travel on Conference Assignments or to Con-

ference gatherings where travelling expenses are remunerated:—The following will be observed:—

1. Where possible and convenient, clergy rates will be paid.

- 2. The expenses of meals and room, when necessary and travel to and from trains
- When it is judged best to travel by train, where one has come by car, clergy rates by train will be paid.
- 4. When travelling by car, a basis of five cents per mile will be paid.

Fourteenth:—That the Committee on Itineracy and Orders decide on those who shall receive the benefit of payment or over-payment of our Conference Educational Budget.

Fifteenth:—The Secretary of the Canada Conference be the Committee on Credentials, and all Lay Delegates' parchments to the Conference be mailed to him one week previous to the opening session of the Conference.

Sixteenth:—The ex-officio members of the Board of Directors and Conference Trustees shall be the Conference President, the Vice-President, the Conference Treasurer, and two Elders, namely, the Conference Secretary, and the Wesleyan Youth President, if an Elder.

REPORTS

REPORT NO. 1

CONFERENCE PRESIDENT'S ANNUAL REPORT

May 4, 1957

To the Members of the Canada Conference now in session: Fellow-labourers in Christ's vineyard:

Cordial Christian greetings in this the Diamond Jubilee Year of our Canada Conference! For Sixty Years this Conference has sought to exalt Christ by Sacrificial giving and loyal service to the doctrine and experience of full salvation. Our chequered history has not been marked by any great degree of progress; but God has been pleased to help us make some indelible impression upon past generations, and raise up witnesses whose testimony and service have blessed our entire denomination. To the loyal men and women who have won the crown of life, may we who have entered into their labours, be as faithful to the Lord Jesus Christ in our day as they were in their day.

During the past year, one of these devoted servants of Christ and worthy example of the Wesleyan doctrine and standards, in the person of Mrs. Leila Summers, passed to her eternal rest. With her husband, the late Rev. D. W. Summers, she gave many years of sacrificial labours to the work of this Conference with marked success.

This past Conference Year has seen much activity and investigation to help in the enlargement of the work. In North Bay a new property was bought for the re-locating of the work, and the pastor and his family are now in this new home. The Ottawa church is now busily engaged in the erection of a new edifice. Toronto church has its plans completed for the erection of a new church, and hopes to begin this year. Brockville church has been in an undecided position as to location and plans of a much needed building to worship in. A house, with sufficient land for a church, has been purchased at Madoc, Ontario, where a society of eleven (11) members was organized on April 23rd, which we now present to this Conference. At Silver Lake, near Maberly, Ontario, over forty (40) acres has been purchased, and is presently being developed, as a Conference Camp site. Our people have been quite enthusiastic over this project, and there is a good measure of interest in its success.

These developments are costly from a financial viewpoint, and will require careful planning to meet future obligations. By these statements this Conference has found it necessary to borrow money to aid us in the purchasing of these properties. The present position warrants excellent possibilities of no undue pressure upon our ability to meet this demand.

While we are encouraged with these forward steps of advanced outreach, yet our only hope of survival as a Conference lies at the local level, as well as taking advantage of every open door, in the bringing of individuals into a definite relationship to Christ, and aligning them with our church in its teaching and standards, if we are going to develop as we should.

We appreciate the financial support each church has given in aiding us to help Miss Bertha Major to fulfill her call of God as a missionary. We do not have an accurate account of the money on hand at this time of writing. If this Conference can meet her need, she will be the first mis-

sionary from among our youth, to be directly supported by us. Let us continue our prayers and financial support to see that she is sent this year to the field.

In the month of April seven (7) of the holiness denominations in Canada, represented by their denominational leader and one representative, met in the City of Ottawa to consider the possibilities of Church Union. The recommendation from this unofficial body will be presented in due course to this Conference for its consideration and decision.

Our sincere thanks to all the ministers and laity for their co-operation and support. We have sought to give our best to the work entrusted to us, trusting that the decisions we have made, and the forward steps we have endeavoured to pursue, may be avenues of greater blessing that we have ever anticipated. Wherein we have failed, we plead His merit, and earnestly desire for the cause a real moving of His Spirit in revival.

Dear Friends:

The needs of the S. S. continue to be as great, if not greater than at any other time in our history. May God help us to rise to the challenge.

A survey of our record for this year shows both gains that encourage and losses that ought to disturb. The overall figures show a very slight gain in average attendance. Rally Day totals are down from last year. The Thanksgiving offering was \$380.12, a good gain over last year.

Waltham, for the second year in a row, showed the best percentage gain—approximately 21%. Ottawa had had about 18% gain. Belleville and North Bay both showed significant increases of about 10%. However, these four increases were offset by the losses of other churches. Let us examine our records and make some real plans for this year.

The Teachers Training film strips have not been used this year. Perhaps one reason for our lack of advancement is found here. At present there is 154.91 in the treasury and this may allow us to carry on some special S. S. work this coming year.

The S. S. board recommends that the Conference make definite use of our Child Evangelism Sec. and that when she travels for the Conference, that her travel expense be paid according to the Conference rates, out of the Conference S. S. treasury. We would also recommend that when the local church is able it ought to be responsible for such travel expense.

REPORT OF BOARD OF DIRECTORS AND CONFERENCE TRUSTEES

The Board of Directors and Conference Trustees of the Corporate Body of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America in Canada met at Fairknowe in Brockville, Ontario on May 23, 1956, for a special meeting at 7.00 p.m.

It was moved and seconded that we accept the offer of purchase from Mr. John R. Dodge as submitted by Owen R. Davis and Co. Ltd. for the Brockville property of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America in Canada, as contained in Appendix "A" No. 6. which reads as follows:-"The purchaser has agreed to the Vendor keeping as a site for church and parsonage the lands described under Article No. 2. above, but in consideration of the loss to him of this valuable corner site which was included in his offer, stipulates that the amount of this offer be accordingly reduced from \$35,000.00 to \$32,000.00. The purchaser is however willing to leave his offer in the amount of \$35,000.00 if the vendors are agreeable to retain as a site for church and parsonage instead of the corner as described in Article No. 2; the corresponding corner on the North East corner of the property being 150 feet on the North and South limits and 150 feet on the East and West limits as defined in Sketch, Appendix No. 2. and marked in blue on the Northeast corner of the sketch. Should the Church accept the North East corner as described he will similarly be willing to give them the first refusal of lands adjoining their premises should these lands be offered by him for sale" and this Board of Directors and Conference Trustees of the Corporate Body gives the Local Trustee Board of the Brockville Wesleyan Methodist Church the privilege to choose either the North East Corner Lot or North West Corner Lot as sketched in Appendix "B" for the purpose of erecting a church and parsonage.

The property is described as follows:-

HOLINESS LEADERS CONFERENCE (Held at Ottawa, April 9-11, 1957)

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON FINDINGS:

In view of the fact that this is an unofficial gathering of the Leaders and Delegates of seven of the holiness denominations in Canada, and as such it does not possess any legislative powers. Nevertheless the spirit in which the discussions have been held has revealed a desire on the part of all concerned to work toward the goal of ultimately uniting our testimony.

There are some immediate steps which might be taken with benefit in working toward that end: (1) In the field of Christian Education—at Christian High School and Bible College level; (2) In the matter of overlapping and competition in new fields, in camp meetings, and in the local churches area

Therefore, we recommend that a Committee be formed, composed of elected representatives of the co-operating denominations:

(1) To further explore the possibility of union.

(2) To endeavour to promote closer co-operation in the field of Christian Education.

(3) To give consideration to the formation of a Body of Councillors to which problems of competition, or overlapping of our efforts might be referred for mediation and adjustment.

The session was closed with the singing of "A Charge To Keep I Have"; and Miss Watts closed with prayer. Offering \$4.95.

RELIGIOUS SERVICES

The Friday evening service of the Annual Conference was opened with a song service led by Mr. Ira Spearman of Belleville. After the opening hymn, "Work for the Night Is Coming," Rev. Brentlinger of Ottawa led in prayer. After announcements the hymn "I'll Go Where You Want Me To Go" was sung and the offering taken.

Dr. Reisdorph and Rev. Brentlinger gave us a very interesting sermonette on the Bible story of Zacchaeus. Dr. Reisdorph spoke in the English

language and Rev. Brentlinger interpreted in the Haitian language.

The Belleville Choir favoured us with a special song, "Hear Ye the Master's Call", after which Dr. Reisdorph showed us his pictures of Haiti and South America and gave us a very interesting account of each. Some were taken seven years ago while he and Mrs. Reisdorph were on their world tour and some were taken on their recent trip to Haiti and Columbia. The comparison in some cases was very interesting. Dr. Reisdorph closed with a plea to pray for our missionaries as we have never prayed before.

After the conclusion of Dr. Reisdorph's pictures, Rev. Kielty showed a few pictures of Miss Bertha Major's graduation day at the Civic Hospital when she graduated as a nurse. He presented her to us as our first Missionary from the Canada Conference and she will be leaving shortly for Africa. He asked us to remember to support her in the years while she is on the field, not only in finances but with our prayers.

The hymn, "What a Friend We Have In Jesus" was sung and Rev.

Weaver closed with prayer. Offering amounted to \$19.83.

The Sunday afternoon service was opened with the hymn, "Jesus Saves", led by Mr. E. Wilson of Brockville. Mrs. Ruby Walker led in prayer after which the Executive Members were introduced to the congregation.

Mrs. Rae Helmer, the Y.M.W.B. Superintendent, presented the certificates to the 100% bands and the pennant will be sent each quarter to the respective bands.

Miss Phyllis Hudson favoured us with a solo, "Here Am I Send Me",

and an offering was taken to aid in Miss Bertha Major's support.

Mr. Carl Green then sang, "Let Me Burn Out For Thee" after which Dr. Reisdorph, our Denominational Representative, brought the message of the afternoon, basing his remarks taken from the Scripture lesson, Matt. chapter nine, verses thirty-five to thirty-eight. Said Dr. Reisdorph, this Scripture lesson covers all home and foreign missionary programs, in fact every program to get the message of salvation out to the world. He divided his message into four topics, namely, first, The Master's method of teaching and preaching, second, His motivation, He was moved by compassion, third, His observation, and fourth His instructions which He gave. "He went." Our commission is to go into all the world. As a result we have missionaries around the world. We must have a greater measure of Divine compassion to fulfill the vision. Dr. Reisdorph, speaking of his world tour and his recent visit to Haiti, told us that in the seven years between his visits to Haiti, National students have attended Bible School and are now ready to be ordained. We also have ordained Nationals in Africa and India. They are also being taught English and how to print the gospels in their own language. All this is being done so that if the time ever comes that the missionaries have to leave the field, the Nationals will be able to carry on, also a well trained National is more effective to his own people than foreign missionaries.

Dr. Reisdorph also spoke of the great part that Doctors and Nurses have in missionary work and said how very happy he was to know we are sending a missionary, namely Miss Major, to Africa to help in the work there. At present the work in the hospital in India is at a standstill, but he urged us to pray that the door may be opened. In his closing remarks Dr. Reisdorph spoke of the great need for more missionaries. Nationals in many places who have turned to the Lord, are despised and disowned by their own people and hence they need the friendship and the guidance of the missionary. We need to as a church pray and give more to the support of our missionaries. It will mean sacrificial giving but we will be well rewarded by our God, both in basket and store. We need a greater measure of Divine compassion as we continue to work and pray and sacrifice for the cause of missions.

The hymn "A Passion for Souls" closed our afternoon service and Rev. Kielty pronounced the benediction. Offering amounted to \$48.87.

"It is a tragedy for one to miss God's first thought for their life." Then we heard of David's courage and victory. David had the promises of God. "When our only aim and desire is to be more like the Master—no foe can defeat." Prayer is our Success.

REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

The following recommendations were made at meetings in August 1956, January, March and May, 1957.

1. In the event that the Board of Directors and Conference Trustees purchase property in Madoc, Ontario, for the purpose of opening up new work that we grant them \$1000. from the Pioneer Fund.

- 2. We recommend that the fee for the full week at camp be \$12.00. For those who eat at the dining hall but have their own private cottage to sleep in—the fee is \$10.00. For those eating and sleeping in their own private cottages but taking in camp activities the fee is \$5.00.
 - 3. Minimum age being thirteen years.
- 4. We recommend that up to \$1000. be made available from the Conference W. Y. Church Extension Fund for the possible purchase of dormitory cottages for our Silver Lake Camp. Rev. Kielty and Mr. Athol Dale to be a Committee to negotiate the same.
- 5. That for Item 8 of the Efficiency Standard we study the First Epistle of John.
- 6. That for Item 9 of the Efficiency Standard, Psalm 19 be memorized. READING: "Of Men and of Angels", by Lon Woodrom.
- 7. We recommend that the teen-agers participate in the Houghton Area Bible Quiz and Bible Reading Contest. For the Bible Quiz that the Book of Ruth be studied. Each contestant would choose their own Bible reading, which should be from ten to twelve verses.

8. In view of the possibility of new openings in our Conference we recommend that the W. Y. Executive, in the interim of Conference, be given authority to dispense the Church Extension Fund as they deem it justifiable, in regard to the proposition presented by the Senior Conference, and that we continue the Church Extension Budget and that this money be placed in the bank for future developments.

9. We recommend that each local society set a goal for missions and that it be equally divided between the support of Miss Bertha Major (Mis-

sionary elect to Africa) and Conference Missions.

10. We recommend that the Conference Youth Treasurer pay thirty dollars (\$30.00) to the Rev. J. H. Weaver for Conference entertainment.
