### DAILY PROCEEDINGS

Tuesday, July 19, 2:00 p. m.

The fifty-seventh session of the South Carolina Annual Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America convened in the tabernacle on the grounds of the Wesleyan Camp Meeting Association at Greer, South Carolina at 2:00 p. m., July 19, 1949. Devotions were conducted by the Rev. R. C. Kendrick.

Conference was called to order by the President, Rev. R. C. Kendrick, who declared the Conference Bar to consist of the platform and the first six benches in the three middle tiers of seats.

The roll was called and 31 elders and 11 conference preachers answered to roll call.

The Conference was called to order by the Vice-President.

The roll was called and the minutes were read and approved.

Committee on Apportionment—The Committee on Apportionment reported, recommending that the Conference endorse the denominational budget which is as follows per member: foreign missions, \$2.00; home missions, \$1.00; education, \$2.00; orphanage, \$.25; administrative expense, \$.25; general conference expense, \$.20; superannuate pension plan, \$1.50; denominational Sunday school work, \$.05 per member enrolled in main school; also that the Conference budget be as follows per mem-

ber: president's salary, \$1.50; conference work, \$.40; conference missions, \$2.50; conference entertainment, \$.40; minutes, \$.15. The report was adopted. (See Report No. 19.)

Itineracy and Orders—The Committee on Itineracy and Orders made a partial report. The partial report was adopted. (See Report No. 5.)

Reports—Reports were read by D. G. Matheny, O. B. Stewart, E. L. Shigley, Jr., C. M. Elrod, Douglas Heffner, H. M. Stewart, Fred Hughes, C. W. Little (character passed by vote of Conference due to report being late).

A motion prevailed to grant a letter of standing to Rev. J. W. Jones, Sr. and to instruct the President to write him a letter of recommendation to whatever church he wishes to go.

Ministerial Meetings—The Committee on Ministerial Meetings in Western District reported. Report adopted. (See Report No. 11.)

The Committee on Fifth Sunday Holiness Convention reported that there had been no convention during the year for lack of a suitable date.

On motion the Conference voted to have the Committee on Pastoral Relations list the churches by districts in its report.

Conference recessed to the orders of the day.

Conference was called to order at eleven o'clock for the orders of the day.

Denominational Address—Dr. F. R. Eddy, Denominational Representative, gave a very interesting and challenging denominational address.

Conference adjourned by limitation of time.

Boards on Church and Parsonage Building and Location—The President nominated and the Conference elected the following Boards on Church and Parsonage Building and Location: Central District: E. L. Gunby and G. C. Summey; Spartanburg District: C. M. Elrod and J. T. Chandler; Columbia District: J. A. Giles and Dan Gambrell.

Ministerial Meetings—J. A. Giles and W. S. Allred were elected a Committee on Ministerial Meetings in the Columbia District.

Evangelism—V. A. Mitchell resigned as Secretary of Evangelism in the Central District. The Conference voted to accept his resignation. E. L. Shigley, Jr. was elected to fill the vacancy. W. S. Allred was elected Secretary of Evangelism of the Columbia District.

Prayer League Secretary—Curtis Harris was elected Prayer League Secretary of the Columbia District.

Trustees—The Board of Trustees reported. Report adopted. (See Report No. 6.)

Conference adjourned to the orders of the day.

Assistant Secretary—The Secretary nominated and the Conference elected F. B. Williams as Assistant Secretary.

Treasurer—The Conference Treasurer reported. Report adopted. (See Report No. 17.)

The conference passed the following resolution:

Resolved, that Mr. Talmage Evatt, Treasurer of the South Carolina Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America, be and he hereby is authorized to sign United States bonds held by the South Carolina Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America.

The Conference instructed the Committee on Statistics to report to the President.

Pastoral Relations—The Committee on Pastoral Relations gave its final reading. Report adopted. (See Report No. 2.)

Mr. Talmage Evatt testified that he had been present at conference for every session during the last thirty years and that this had been the most harmonious session he had ever attended.

Itineracy and Orders—The Committee on Itineracy and Orders gave the balance of its report. This partial report was adopted. (See Report No. 5.)

The minutes were read.

On motion the Conference voted the minutes for the entire session of conference.

The Conference voted to adjourn sine die.

### STANDING RULES AND RESOLUTIONS

- 1. That no member of the Conference shall have his character passed who fails to carry out all the rules and orders of this Conference, unless providentially hindered, except upon a three-fourths vote of the body.
- 2. That we affirm our faith in the soundness of the position taken by the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America in denying any of its members membership in any secret society. Hence we as a Conference require that our pastors and churches shall not elect, or suffer to be elected, superintendents if they hold membership in secret societies.
- 3. That we earnestly urge all our Licentiates not receiving any appointments to pastoral or evangelistic work to preach at least once a month, and also to hold if possible a two-weeks' revival during the year.
- 4. That the Committee on Public Worship consist of the President of the Conference, the pastor of the charge where the Conference is held, and the pastor's delegate.
- 5. That no person be licensed to preach who does not tithe his income; that all our liceniates be required to faithfully tithe their income; and that the license of no preacher be renewed, who fails to tithe.
- 6. That it is the sense of this Conference that our houses of worship shall not be opened to any evangelist or minister of any other Church to hold a series of meetings or to maintain a regular appointment for another congregation; provided, however, that usual denominational courtesies be extended to other ministers in occasional appointments.
- 7. We recommend that all charges and stations to which the pastor moves pay the moving and transportation expenses of said pastor, the same to be done in addition to his salary.
- 8. That the pastors be required to raise their Minute Money and send to the Conference Treasurer within sixty days after they receive their Minutes.
- 9. That this Conference elect a Tithing Secretary, as provided for in our Discipline, whose duty it shall be to visit each charge at least once a year, if possible. Each church visited shall raise at least the traveling expenses of the Secretary at the time of his visitation.
- 10. That each local church or charge elect a Tithing Secretary, whose duty it shall be to thoroughly canvass the membership of the church or charge each quarter and labor most earnestly to induce each member to strictly tithe his income and to place the same in the church treasury for

the purpose of meeting all the claims of the church, both locally and generally. The Secretary shall report at each Quarterly Conference the percentage of the membership who are tithing in keeping with this plan, the percentage who are giving in other ways, and the percentage who are not giving at all. Each pastor and church shall co-operate with these Secretaries in every possible way in order to make the entire membership of this Conference strict tithers.

- 11. That we as a Conference put forth every possible effort through education, pulpit, preaching, voting, and other means to advance the cause of temperance and to secure legislation for abolishing the sale of beer, wine, and whiskey for beverages.
- That the Trustees of the South Carolina Annual Conference, together with the President of the said Conference, be and they hereby are empowered to execute all necessary papers, mortgage deeds, and papers of a like character, when necessary to secure loans to the South Carolina Annual Conference or to any church needing funds to liquidate Conference, church, or parsonage indebtedness, provided that the party or parties requesting such action shall set forth in writing the true nature and purpose for which the loan is requested (and that the Trustees and President of said Conference are satisfied that the object for which said loan or loans is sought is both necessary and desirable. And the Trustees of said South Carolina Annual Conference are also hereby empowered to sign any or all deeds and papers for the transfer of real property that is now or herafter may be held in trust by said trustees, where the sale of Conference, church, or parsonage or other real estate has been approved or authorized by the President of the Conference with the concurrence of his entire Advisory Board.
- 13. During the interim of Annual Conference the Missionary Board shall be duly authorized to draw on the funds for Conference Work, Church Extension and Conference Evangelism, and General Conference Travel, as it deemed best for the interest of the Conference, and the Treasurer shall be authorized to make payments from these funds upon written order signed by the President and at least one half the other members of the Missionary Board, or signed by the President in behalf of the Missionary Board.
- 14. Any church which engages in a building or remodeling project or which purchases a parsonage, church building or a lot on which a church or parsonage is to be constructed, regardless of whether the property is to be owned by the local church or the Conference, is required to have the plans approved by the Conference Board on Church and Parsonage Building and Location.

Any church which secures aid from the Conference must have its property deeded to the Conference Trustees, as is required by our Discipline; and any church which engages in a building or remodeling project must have the plans approved by the Conference Board on Church and Parsonage Building and Location, according to the requirements of our Discipline, if said church is to receive aid from the Conference for these building projects.

- 15. Any Superannuated Elder shall receive not more than one dollar (\$1.00) per month for each year of service he has given in the Conference. The widow of an Elder or Conference Preacher shall receive not more than fifty cents (\$.50) per month for each year of service which she and her husband have rendered together in the Conference. It is understood that these are the maximum amounts and dependent of course upon whether or not sufficient money may be available from the fund for Superannuated Ministers.
- 16. All pastors shall have their Statistical reports in the hands of the Statistical Committee by 8:00 a. m. Wednesday of Conference.
- 17. The salary of the outgoing pastor shall close on Sunday preceding the opening of Annual Conference and the church is required to include the week of Conference in the incoming pastor's salary.
- 18. Each charge is to give its pastor the privilege of being away from his church, or churches, for two meetings per year, and no pastor is to be away from his charge for more than two meetings per year without getting the consent of his church, or charge.
- 19. In the ordination of ministers to Elders' Orders, it shall be the policy of this Conference to ordain only those ministers who have passed the course of study as required by our Discipline.
- 20. All officers and committees shall take up their duties immediately upon election.
- 21. Conference shall convene each year on the first Tuesday after July 14.

### REPORTS OF COMMITTEES

## Report No. 1 PRESIDENT'S REPORT

To the members and friends of the South Carolina Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America now assembled in the fifty-seventh session, greetings;

We are thankful to the Almighty God for His providential care and guidance through another year. His presence has been very real. Many of the quarterly conference occasions have been owned and blessed of God. We give God the praise for this. He has blessed the ministry of our pastors and evangelists in giving some very gracious revivals in a number of the churches. The indications now are that we will have a substantial gain in membership. One new church with eleven members has been organized and added to the conference.

During the year we have lost a few members by death. On February 8, 1949, Rev. S. J. McCurry, the pastor at Buck Creek, passed to his final reward. He died in the triumphant faith, leaving a testimony that is a challenge to all who are left in the battle. September, 23, 1948, Miss Mary K. Elrod passed to her final reward. She was pastor in the conference for a number of years. My advice to all is to take courage, for the future is as bright as the promises of God.

This has been one of the best years of my life in the ministry. I could not have asked for better co-operation. Each pastor has been very thoughtful and considerate, but due to my age and limited strength, I will ask you not to vote for me again as your conference president. I pledge my support to my successor and my love and co-operation to all the saints in promoting the cause of the Lord.

#### **Improvements**

Anderson Church has sold their old parsonage, bought another joining the church property, and have remodeled it for the pastor.

Carlisle Church has installed a Hammond Organ and Chimes.

Central First Church has bought new pews and pulpit furniture.

Davis Chapel is adding new Sunday-school rooms to their church.

The Glenwood Mill Company has improved one of its six room houses and is furnishing it to the pastor of the Glenwood Church rent free.

Graham Chapel has finished a new brick church and had their formal opening on October 10, 1948.

Golden Grove has added three Sunday-school rooms, brick veneered the building, reworked the interior, and installed new pews and a gas heating system. Greenwood has bought a very desirable lot and the people are planning to re-locate the church.

North Charleston is building five new Sunday-school rooms and two rest rooms to their church.

Oakway has remodeled their church to the extent of several thousand dollars, with no indebtedness.

Piedmont has finished their church and they now have one of the nicest buildings in the Conference.

Williamston has remodeled their church, added four Sunday-school rooms, and reworked the interior. The entire building has a very attractive appearance.

Columbia has added two rest rooms to their church.

Greenville Second Church has done a very commendable paint job. It has added much to the appearance of the property.

Tuckaseegee has had a complete paint job on both church and parsonage, and have installed new lights in the church.

Buck Creek, Mount Olivet, Liberty, Mountain View, Mount Calvary, Alice Mill and Rock Hill have each made some needed improvements.

Calhoun and Mount Olivet have purchased parsonages and are planning for full-time pastors in the future.

# Report No. 3 MISSIONARY BOARD, 1949-1950

The Missionary Board submits the following report: We recommend:

- 1. That the President receive \$55.00 per week salary, parsonage rent, moving expense and five cents per miles traveling expense.
- 2. That he be given the privilege of holding two meetings outside the Conference without affecting his salary.
- 3. That he hold two quarterly meetings on each charge, one of which shall be the fourth and work in needy churches and open work in new fields within the bounds of the Conference.
- 4. That the President advise with the Boards of Stewards of local churches for the purpose of encouraging and devising methods and plans for the better payment of pastors.
- 5. That the Statistical Committee be paid \$10.00 from funds for Conference Work.
- 5. That the Secretary's salary and Treasurer's salary be \$100.00 each to be paid from Conference Work.
- 7. That the President be authorized to draw on funds for Conference Work for the purpose of printing blanks and other such incidentals.
  - 8. That we pay the Florence Church \$15.00 per week.
  - 9. That the North Charleston Church be paid \$15.00 per week.
  - 10. That we keep up the payments on the Columbia parsonage.
  - 11. That we pay Rev. J. A. Giles \$20.00 per week as Pioneer Secretary.
- 12. That the Trustees be authorized to visit the North Charleston Church with power to act with regards to securing a loan for same.
- 13. That Rev. R. C. Kendrick be authorized to purchase as many venetian blinds as he leaves in the parsonage and send bill to the Treasurer.

- 14. We recommend that we be responsible for \$1000.00 with interest, on the indebtedness of the new church at Greenwood.
- 15. We recommend that the resolution of the Sunday School Board be adopted with the exception of item 10.
- 16. We recommend that when you invite the Sunday School Secretary for a service that an offering be lifted for him.
- 17. We recommend that items 4 and 5 be eliminated from recommendations of Pioneer Secretary.
- 18. We recommend all churches receiving help from conference funds be self-supporting as soon as possible.
- 19. We recommend that if possible we buy a new tent or portable tabernacle.

# Report No. 4 MISSIONARY BOARD, 1948-1949

On August 27, 1949 the Missionary Board met at Greer Camp and authorized some needed repairs at the President's parsonage, namely, repairing hot water system, putting a drain in the basement, paying for installing telephone and any other repairs that were deemed necessary by the President.

Some days later we met in Columbia, South Carolina to consider the purchase of a new parsonage. A nice six (6) room brick veneer residence at 2229 Gadsen Street was purchased of Mrs. Mamie White at a cost of \$9,250.00.

Rev. J. A. Giles was instructed to advertize for sale the property at 1107 Anthony Avenue.

About September 8, 1948, we advised the borrowing of \$2,600.00 from Rev. W. D. Correll to help finance the new property at Columbia.

On February 1, 1949, we met at the parsonage in Greenville and transsacted the following business: Since the property at 1107 Anthony Avenue had not been sold, we authorized Rev. J. A. Giles to get an estimate of repairing this property and report to the President.

At this meeting we also authorized the installing of an electric water heater at the President's parsonage, since the old system was not giving satisfaction. This was done at a cost of \$107.21.

A little later we authorized repairs on the Anthony Avenue property to the amount of \$225.00. This was carried out.

About May 25, 1949, we authorized the sale of this property at \$6,750.00.

To finance this we signed a first mortgage to Federal Saving and Loan Association of Columbia for \$6,114.38, a second mortgage to Clarence Richard for \$537.50, and a plain note to W. D. Correll for \$2,600. Money from the sale of Anthony Street property satisfied the said note.

December 1, 1948, we signed papers for the refinancing of the Columbia Church to get additional funds for building rest rooms for the church.

In February 1949, we received deed to lot in a good location in Greenwood. This lot was purchased with a view of building in a better location.

June 9, 1949, we signed deed to property on Anthony Street in Columbia.

July 2, 1949, we signed a note to Mrs. Emma Kelley for \$350.00 to ray off the second mortgage on the Gadsden Street parsonage at Columbia.

July 18, 1949, we received deed to the Community Church property in Berkley County.

In May 1949, we signed a release to the Highway Department giving permission to widen the street in front of the president's parsonage.

# Report No. 13 SUNDAY SCHOOL BOARD

The Sunday School Secretary has been very active in promoting the interest of the Sunday School. During the year he visited 46 Sunday schools, traveled 3535 miles and received \$457.27 for his expenses and service. In many places he found the Sunday school functioning well and making progress.

#### Recommendations

- 1. That every Sunday school plan well and work hard to make Rally Day a real success and that the attendance be reported to the Conference Sunday School Secretary.
- 2. That real effort be made to put your Sunday school on the Gold Star List for the Thanksgiving Offering and that the amount be reported to the Conference Sunday School Secretary.
- 3. That each school increase its average attendance by at least 10% over last year.
- 4. That a Daily Vacation Bible School be conducted in each Sunday school.
- 5. That each scholar be urged to bring his or her Bible to church and Sunday school.

- 6. That real effort be made by parents, teachers, officers and pastors to induce each scholar to remain for the preaching service.
- 7. Take your Sunday school to the community by advertising, by home visitation and by every means possible.
- 8. That each Sunday school catch the vision and assume the responsibility to start a new Sunday school in the adjacent territory of your church in order that the impact of our Church may be felt through out the state.
- 9. That the Conference be divided into three Sunday School Districts to be known as the Eastern, Western and Southern Districts. The Eastern District be composed of the churches east of the Saluda River. The Western District be composed of the churches west of the Saluda River. The Southern District be composed of the following churches: Laurens, Whitmire, Greenwood, Columbia, Florence, Community and North Charleston. It is further recommended that at least one District Sunday School Rally be held each year in these districts. It is also recommended that each of these districts be represented by one member on the Sunday School Board.
- 10. That when you invite the Sunday School Secretary to visit your Sunday school he be paid twenty-five cents per your average attendance of last year. This will make it possible for the Secretary to visit the small Sunday schools as well as the large ones without placing undue financial burden on either.

## Report No. 15 SECRETARY OF PIONEER EVANGELISM

The Lord has been gracious to your servant this past year for which he desires to give thanks publicly. My health was very poor the past conference, but God has greatly strengthened me. Today I feel like asking for the privilege of taking a mountain for my Lord!

The burden to take the message of full salvation to those who have never heard increases yearly. There is a Spiritual romance in pioneer work but at times it tests the very moral fibre of those engaged in it.

During the past year we have traveled approximately 3500 miles. We have kept in close contact with the Greenwood work, led them in Evangelistic services for 13 nights and God gave us some gracious results. We have assisted in raising money to build a new house of worship there, also helped to secure a building lot and advised with them about future plans for the work.

We have visited the Charleston work two times during the year and helped them to get going toward a new Sunday-school plant and brick-veneering their church. By encouraging them they took an additional \$5.00 per week off conference for pastor's salary.

In early fall by request of our good Conference President we went down near Moncks Corner in the country and organized a fine group of 11 people into a Wesleyan Methodist Church. We have a nice group of folks there now. A good Sunday school and a church free of debt. This came through the good influence of Rev. Curtis Harris' radio program. We have made one other trip to this new work this year and found they are making some real progress.

It has been our good pleasure to make three trips to Florence this year. One time we did not contact the pastor as he was away. It is our firm conviction that there has been some sound progress made at Florence this year.

Our work at Columbia has made some real progress as our report will show. We raised some \$8000.00 for all purposes. We built a Sunday-school building costing us about \$1800.00 and owe \$100.00 on it. We put in rest rooms at a cost of nearly \$1000.00 by refinancing the church. We brought our Sunday school up 35% and our membership of the church about 65% net increase. Two revivals were held and a number of precious souls found God in pardon and purity. We have paid \$300.00 on the second mortgage of our church. We only owe \$250.00 second mortgage now and hope to pay that in September coming. Too, we bought a fine 6 room brick-veneer parsonage located just three city blocks from our church and it has given us a real place in the hearts of the community. Just recently we closed the deal that sold the old parsonage property at 1107 Anthony Avenue.

It has been our regret that we have not been able to visit our pioneer work in Greenville (Second Church). We have learned of good results there.

#### We recommend:

- 1. That as soon as possible a full time secretary be put in the field to supervise, co-ordinate and build a sound home mission foundation.
- 2. That pioneer mission rallies be held at least each quarter in strategic points and monies be raised to sponsor a new tent project next tent season.
  - 3. That if possible we buy a new tent or a partable tabernacle.
- 4. That until we can put a full time secretary in the field; the pioneer secretary keep in close contact with the new churches to encourage, instruct and help Wesleyanize them. (Of course all this to be in close harmony with the Conference President and Missionary Board.)
- 5. That we encourage all new pioneer churches to take as much responsibility as soon as possible and that we set a limit to length of time that we support them.
