The Conference elected Miss Sally Evatt to write letters of greeting to Malcolm E. Ellis, Miss Virginia Hooker, and Mrs. Harriett E. Miller.

By vote the Conference passed the character of Oscar D. Bowling, K. W. Bauer, C. V. Marchbanks, Jr., and W. T. White.

The Conference voted by the necessary two-thirds majority to amend Standing Rule 8 by striking out the word "second" and inserting the word "third;" thus making the rule read: "Conference shall convene on Monday, 7:30 p. m., following the third Sunday in July." (See Report No. 20)

The Conference voted by the necessary two-thirds majority to amend Standing Rule 17 by striking out the words "8:30 a. m. Wednesday" and inserting the words "1:00 p. m. Tuesday;" thus making the rule read: "All pastors shall have their Statistical Reports in the hands of the Statistical Committee by 1:00 p. m. Tuesday of Conference."

A motion prevailed that the Conference offer its apologies to Oscar D. Bowling for inadvertently omitting his name from the Conference Appointments for the year 1959-60.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS—A motion prevailed that the President and his Advisory Board be authorized to take care of any unfinished business after adjournment of Conference.

EDIT THE MINUTES—The Conference voted to authorize the Secretary to edit the minutes.

CHURCH AND PARSONAGE BUILDING—The Committee on Church and Parsonage Building and Location for the Central District reported. Report adopted. (See Report No. 18)

The Secretary reported that the vote of the local churches in adopting the new constitution as handed down by the Annual Conference was 496 yeas, 12 nays.

The Conference voted to recess to the call of the Chair.

Conference was called into session at 6:30 p. m. by the President.

CHURCH AND PARSONAGE BUILDING—The committee on Church and Parsonage Building and Location for the Columbia District reported. Report adopted. (See Report No. 18)

COMMITTEE ON ITINERACY AND ORDERS—The Committee on Itineracy and Orders gave its report with recommendations. Report adopted. (See Report No. 5)

COMMITTEE ON CHURCH EXTENSION AND EVANGELISM—The Committee on Church Extension and Evangelism reported. Report adopted. (See Report No. 4)

BOARDS ON CHURCH AND PARSONAGE BUILDING AND LOCATION—The President nominated and the Conference elected the following as Boards on Church and Parsonage Building and Location:

Central District: K. W. Johnston (Ex-Officio), E. L. Gunby, G. C. Summey.

Columbia District: K. W. Johnston (Ex-Officio), E. L. Alexander, W. T. Hughey.

Greenville District: K. W. Johnston (Ex-Officio), P. C. Lusk, Ross E. Gilstrap.

Spartanburg District: K. W. Johnston (Ex-Officio), A. D. Horton, J. T. Chandler.

PRESIDENT'S ADVISORY BOARD—The President nominated and the Conference elected the following as the President's Advisory Board: Elders—E. L. Gunby, C. T. Bryant, L. L. Jarrard; Laymen—Dan H. Gambrell, W. T. Hughey, R. A. Taylor.

TRANSFER—The Conference voted a letter of Transfer to Robert D. Earley.

PASTORAL RELATIONS—The Committee on Pastoral Relations gave its final reading. Report adopted. (See Report No. 2)

A motion prevailed that the Conference Officers be a committee on Conference agenda for the next conference year and that the agenda be published in "The Challenger" before conference.

The Minutes were read and approved.

The Conference voted to adopt the Minutes of the entire session.

Conference adjourned sine die at 7:45 p. m.

Standing Rules

1. That no member of the Conference shall have his character passed who fails to carry out all the rules and orders of this Conference, unless providentially hindered, except upon a three-fourths vote of the body.

2. That we as a Conference put forth every possible effort through education, pulpit, preaching, voting, and other means to advance the cause of temperance and to secure legislation for abolishing the sale of beer, wine, and whiskey for beverages.

3. That the Trustees of the South Carolina Annual Conference, together with the President of the said Conference, be and they hereby are empowered to execute, all necessary papers, mortgage deeds, and papers of a like character, when necessary to secure loans to the South Carolina Annual Conference or to any church needing funds for an expansion program or to liquidate Conference, church, or parsonage indebtedness, provided that the party or parties requesting such action shall set forth in writing the true nature and purpose for which the loan is requested (this writing is to become a part of the permanent records of the Trustees) and that the Trustees and President of said Conference are satisfied that the object for which said loan or loans is sought is both necessary and desirable. Whenever money is borrowed for use of a local church the local church shall agree to and be responsible for its payment.

4. That the Trustees of the South Carolina Annual Conference be and they hereby are empowered to sign any or all deeds and papers for the transfer of real property that is now or hereafter may be held in trust by said trustees, where the sale of Conference, church, or parsonage or other real estate has been approved or authorized by the President of the Conference with the concurrence of two-thirds of his Advisory Board.

5. During the interim of Annual Conference the Missionary Board shall be duly authorized to draw on the funds for Mountain Missions and Conference Missions, for the purpose for which each was raised, as it deems best for the interest of the Conference, and the Treasurer shall be authorized to make payments from these funds upon written order signed by the President and at least one-half the other members of the Missionary Board, or signed by the President in behalf of the Missionary Board.

6. Any church which engages in a building or remodeling project or which purchases a parsonage, church building or a lot on which a church or parsonage is to be constructed, regardless of whether the property is to be owned by the local church or the Conference, is required to have the plans approved by the Conference Board on Church and Parsonage Building and Location.

Any church which secures aid from the Conference must have its property deeded to the Conference Trustees, as is required by our Discipline; and any church which engages in a building or remodeling project must have the

plans approved by the Conference Board on Church and Parsonage Building and Location, according to the requirements of our Discipline, if said church is to receive aid from the Conference for these building projects.

7. All officers and committees shall take up their duties at the close of the sitting of conference in which they are elected.

8. Conference shall convene on Monday, following the third Sunday in July. (1960)

9. The books of the Conference Treasurer shall close two weeks before Conference.

10. The Conference Secretary shall be the Committee on Credentials.

11. L. L. Jarrard, Treasurer of the South Carolina Conference of The Wesleyan Methodist Church of America, or his successor, is authorized to sign United States bonds held by the South Carolina Conference of The Wesleyan Methodist Church of America.

12. The President shall appoint an Auditing Committee in time for it to audit the books of the treasurers before conference.

13. If a pastor desires to resign his work during the interim of Annual Conference, he shall give the President and his Advisory Board notice at least two weeks before the effective date of his resignation. However, if the President and his Advisory Board deem the cause for his desire to resign sufficient, they may accept the resignation immediately.

14. Certificates of Citation are to be presented to ministers who have given 25 years of active ministerial service in God's Kingdom (20 years in case of retirement or death) while he is a member of the South Carolina Conference. At the close of each succeeding ten years the old certificate is to be returned and a new one given; and at retirement or death a certificate is to be given recognizing the total period of active service. An evangelist must hold ten meetings during the year to receive credit for a year of service. The Citation Committee is to be composed of the President and the Secretary. (1953)

15. During the interim of the Annual Conference, the Committee on Finance shall be duly authorized to draw on the funds for Conference Work, Minutes, Conference Entertainment, Conference Parsonage, and President's Salary for the purpose for which each was raised, as it deems best for the interest of the Conference; and the Treasurer shall be authorized to make payment from these funds upon written order signed by the President and at least one-half the other members of the Committee on Finance or signed by the President by order and in behalf of the Committee on Finance. (1957)

16. The local church officers shall be elected within thirty days of the close of the fiscal year of the local church, and they shall take office at the beginning of the fiscal year. (1958)

17. All pastors shall have their Statistical Reports in the hands of the Statistical Committee by 1:00 p. m. Tuesday of Conference.

18. Anyone employed by the Board on Church Extension and Evangelism shall not be a member of the Board. (1959)

Standing Recommendations

1. That we earnestly urge all our Licentiates not receiving any appointments to pastoral or evangelistic work to preach at least once a month, and to hold if possible a two weeks' revival during the year.

2. That all ministers faithfully tithe their income and that any minister failing to do so shall be considered delinquent in his duty. (1959)

3. That all charges and stations to which the pastor moves pay the moving and transportation expenses of said pastor, the same to be done in addition to his salary.

4. The salary of the outgoing pastor should close on Sunday preceding the opening of Annual Conference and the church is requested to include the week of Conference in the incoming pastor's salary.

5. Each charge should give its pastor the privilege of being away from his church, or churches, for two meetings per year, and no pastor is to be away from his charge for more than two meetings per year without a vote of his church, or charge, giving permission; and it is recommended that each church or charge give its pastor a two-weeks vacation, with pay, each year.

6. When a church engages in a building or remodeling project at least one-half of the estimated cost of the project should be on hand before said project is undertaken unless other satisfactory arrangements are made. If other arrangements are made the Board of Trustees must approve them before they are considered satisfactory.

7. A church which is not on a charge with other churches may keep only one record book for church and quarterly records and the Church Clerk serve as Quarterly Conference Clerk.

8. We urge all pastors to seek earnestly to raise a full budget and that first consideration be given to the Pension Plan Budget. (1959)

9. That we adhere to Paragraph 132 (2) of our Discipline as long as there are ministers in our Conference who are qualified and who are available to take work. (1959)

10. Any pastor, or church, desiring to invite a convention or rally group other than Wesleyan groups should first secure the approval of the President and his Advisory Board. (1959)

Reports

REPORT NO. 1

President's Report

Greetings in the name of Jesus to the members of the Sixty-Eighth Annual Session of the South Carolina Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America.

We come to this session of the Annual Conference with a consciousness of our utter dependence upon God in the work that He assigns to us. The accounting of our stewardship to God is a humbling experience for we realize that we are unprofitable servants. The repeated manifestation of God's help during the year brings us to this hour with an awareness that He is a never-failing source of strength. We pray for this session of the Conference, not only that a spirit of harmony will prevail, but that a Holy Spirit directed aggressiveness shall grip us.

A SURVEY OF THE FIELD

South Carolina, though comparatively small in area and population, offers many opportunities for Church Extension work. A consideration of Church Extension must also include a look at some of our older churches. Some have been affected by a shifting population which has reduced their potential. Others are located in areas where industry has moved out. Still others stand to gain by being in the pathway of the expanding suburban areas of some of our growing cities. In planning for progress, therefore, we must consider entering new towns and cities, possible relocation, and an outreach into the communities where our established churches are located.

Our methods for establishing new churches have, generally speaking, been as follows: (1) building around a nucleus from one of our churches, this work being supported partly by the Conference; (2) a nucleus from one of our churches organizing in a new locality without any financial help from the Conference; (3) going into a population center where we have no Wesleyans, this work being financed entirely by the Conference.

We are all aware of the need. We hope soon to be able to reach out, but when you realize that our giving for Church Extension this year fell about \$1,300.00 below our giving for the same item last year, you recognize that any program of advancement has been slowed down.

PROSPECTS

Whether the next chapter in the history of the South Carolina Conference records a period of progress depends upon our implementing one or more of the above mentioned plans or an adaptation of them. We have the field and we have

the message. God's power is just as great and just as available as ever. We have the potential finances and enough spiritual personnel to make an impact on many new areas if we will just throw all of our reserves into the effort and back it up with our means. Much depends on our getting beyond the talking point. Great momentum could be given to such a program by new bands of intercessory prayers springing up all over the Conference and by all means all of us realizing that soul-winning is the business of the total church.

FINANCES

The Treasurer's report will show that this has been a difficult year financially. The over-all budget contributions are a little more than \$1,000.00 above last year. However, the increase should have been \$7,500.00 in order to do as well percentage-wise as we did last year. The Superannuate Minister's item fell 8 per cent below the budget asking. This means that the pensions of our Superannuated Ministers will be cut that much unless we take steps to make up the deficit. The Conference pledged \$37,404.00 toward the Central Wesleyan College Development Program.

MATERIAL IMPROVEMENTS

EDEN has painted the church building inside and out and has put a new roof on the building.

KNIGHTON CHAPEL has acquired two acres of land and is planning to build a new church.

GLENVILLE has put asbestos siding on the parsonage, painted inside and out, and laid a tile floor in the kitchen.

EASLEY, ALICE has installed and paid for a new gas furnace in the parsonage and has laid a carpet in the church.

GREENWOOD has installed new pews and a gas furnace in the church and has insulated both the church and parsonage.

PIEDMONT has paid off the indebtedness and purchased an electric organ.

BETHANY has put celotex on the ceiling, sheetrocked the walls, and put a new floor in their church.

COMMUNITY has completed the exterior of their new church building by putting on asbestos siding. They have also sheetrocked and painted the interior.

CLIFTON has completed an attractive new church building, and the sanctuary is beautifully furnished with colonial type, mahogany and white, pews with matching pulpit furniture.

PELZER was given a house which they have moved to their property. They have brick-veneered and remodeled it, and it makes an attractive parsonage. It has six rooms and two baths.

MOUNT OLIVET has installed new pews and laid a carpet at a cost of about \$3,200.00.

WELCOME has installed new pews, purchased metal folding chairs for the choir, and laid a hardwood floor at a cost of about \$2,100.00.

WESTMINSTER has provided additional Sunday School space and a Pastor's Study by building a basement unit under their present building. They have also installed a combination heating and air-conditioning unit. The cost was approximately \$5,500.00.

For other improvements we refer you to "The Challenger."

RECOMMENDATION

That Standing Rule Number 8 be amended to read "Conference shall convene at 7:30 p. m. on Monday following the second Sunday in July with the Conference Sermon being preached at this time."

Death has taken its toll in our ranks. We are conscious of our loss in the homegoing of Reverends J. R. Garrett and B. C. Roberts. Mrs. S. J. McCurry, the widow of Rev. S. J. McCurry, was also called home. At 4:30 p. m. on Thursday, there will be an appropriate Memorial Service for these and others.

July 27, 1959—I granted Rev. William Ward permission to do supply work in the Tennessee Conference.

August 20, 1959—Rev. M. Paul Rampey resigned as pastor of the church at Belton, and his resignation was accepted on September 2, 1959.

August 28, 1959—I granted a letter of transfer to Rev. M. Paul Rampey to the Virginia Conference and Rev. Walter F. Johnson to the Tennessee Conference.

September 15, 1959—Upon recommendation of the Conference Pension Board and at his request, Rev. D. G. Matheny was appointed to superannuated relations to the Conference.

October 31, 1959—We approved the request of the State Highway Department for an easement of eight feet along the parsonage property on Woodside Avenue, Greenville, S. C.

December 27, 1959—We appointed Rev. Mack Thompson as pastor at Belton.

January 8, 1960—I granted a letter of transfer to Rev. Paul Wilcox to the Ohio Conference.

February 23, 1960—We approved the request of the Glenville church to sell a certain specified part of their land. The proceeds from said sale were to be used to repair their buildings.

June 28, 1960—I appointed Rev. R. L. Newton and Rev. J. C. Byars to audit the books of the Conference treasurers.

REPORT NO. 4

Church Extension And Evangelism

ITEM I.

WE RECOMMEND:

1. That when it becomes necessary for the Conference to aid new churches financially, the amount of aid shall be determined by the Church Extension and Evangelism Committee and such aid may be discontinued at the discretion of said committee. We further recommend as long as a church receives aid from the Conference, it shall consult the Church Extension and Evangelism Committee before calling a pastor.

2. That the pastor of any church securing aid from the Conference shall secure permission from the Committee before he can conduct more than two revivals away from his said church during the year.

3. That a pastor who is serving a church receiving aid from the Conference and who desires to move or to live away from said church or change his relation to the charge in any way must first consult the Committee.

4. That the salary of the pastor at Sans Souci Church be supplemented in the amount of \$20.00 per week, living quarters, and pay utilities.

5. That we pay the amount due monthly on the Sans Souci parsonage.

6. That when the Church Extension and Evangelism Committee is making payments on loans of church property, the payments shall be made directly to the mortgagee.

7. That we continue the payments on the loan on the North Charleston Church.

8. That Douglas Heffner be designated as Sales Manager of the Conference History Book.

9. That we renew the balance on the note of \$1,000.00 with Rev. L. L. Jarrard on the Sans Souci parsonage for one year from date due, and pay interest due.

10. That we pay the Belton pastor \$50.00 per month for rental allowance and utilities.

11. That by a concurring vote of the Committee on Church Extension and Evangelism, the Conference Board of Trustees, and the President's Advisory Board, moneys in the Conference Church Extension and Evangelism fund, if available, may be used temporarily to aid churches which, in the opinion of the committees, are faced by dire emergency.

12. That each Sunday School be asked to contribute to Conference Church Extension \$1.00 per person in average attendance.

13. That we pay the pastor at Buck Creek and Rock Bridge Mission \$30.00 per month, and the pastor at Tuckasegee \$30.00 per month to be paid from the Mountain Mission Fund.

14. That the Conference launch a program that will lead to the eventual

establishment of an Allen Mitchell Memorial Church.

Standing Rules and Recommendations

1. We emphasize the need of much prayer and intercession in these evil days, and that fasting and self-denial be observed as well.

2. The W. M. S. dues for this Conference will be one dollar and fifty cents (\$1.50) per member. Fifty cents (50c) of this is to be retained in the Conference treasury for Conference working fund.

3. The Y. M. W. B. dues will be fifty-six cents (56c) per member for this Conference. Fifty-two cents (52c) is to be used for Foreign Missions, two cents (2c) for desk expense, and two cents (2c) for General Conference travel expense of the Y. M. W. B. Superintendent.

4. The annual report blanks must be in the hands of the Conference Statistician by July 1, of each Conference year.

5. We urge each local society to have an alert Magazine Solicitor, an active Mission Study Group, and a large Women's World Fellowship Circle.

6. We urge the use of the Standard of Efficiency so that each society may work to be placed on the honor roll.

7. The Executive Board will serve as a nominating committee to nominate secretaries and committees as deemed necessary before the opening of Conference.

8. Each district will elect the following officers: Chairman, Secretary, Magazine Solicitor, Mission Study Promoter, and Y. M. W. B. Superintendent.

9. Each district should plan at least three district meetings annually—one each quarter in which workshops will be held for: local presidents, treasurers, magazine solicitors, Women's World Fellowship secretaries, and Y. M. W. B. superintendents.

10. It shall be the duty of each District Superintendent to supervise the interests of the societies in her district. This may be done by visitation, correspondence, the holding of conventions and rallies, the organizing of societies and bands where none exists, and giving of her time as she deems needful. Each society or district is to bear her expense on said visits.
