Standing Rules

- 1. The clerk of each local society is to place the deed of the local church property in the hands of the Conference President, who is custodian of the deed and who is empowered to rent a safety deposit space for the preservation of deeds, abstracts, and other valuable papers. The Conference shall pay for rent on space.
- 2. The President and his Advisory Board are designated a deed examining committee. Deeds for churches, parsonages, or other Conference property are to be submitted to them for examination before recorded, to make sure that such disciplinary clauses are included as are needed to make such property secure to the Conference.
- 3. The Conference shall convene annually on Monday following the last Sunday of July, subject to the approval of the board of administration. The Conference sermon shall be preached Monday night, with the business session beginning Tuesday morning. Campmeeting shall begin on the following Thursday evening, continuing through two Sundays.
- 4. The local church fiscal year shall end June 30. The Conference treasurer shall close his books July 10.
- 5. Near the end of the fiscal year the Conference secretary shall forward one copy of each pastor's statistical blank to the Conference treasurer, who after closing his books will fill in Item No. 8, "Dispersed for budget", forwarding the same to each pastor. The pastor shall complete the report in full, make a second copy and be ready to read it the first day of Conference.
- Pastors are required to report number of calls at the time of reading their report.
- 7. The following items of the Pastor's Statistical report shall be read each year on the Conference floor: Pastor's calls; Wesleyan Methodist, Wesleyan Missionary, and Wesleyan Youth subscriptions; present membership, gain or loss; Average Sunday School Attendance; number of church Buildings, Value and Insurance; Item VI Complete; Total Contributed for Church; Item VII complete; Total Benevolence; and the Contributed totals.
- 8. Each local church is responsible for paying the moving expense of the pastor whom they have called.
- 9. The Conference Secretary and Treasurer shall each be paid ten dollars annually from the Conference Treasury.
- 10. No Treasurer is allowed to pay out funds without proper authorization.
- 11. The Standing Rules of the Conference are to be included in the Conference Minutes from year to year.
- 12. The Superannuate Pension Fund Treasurer shall be a member of the Superannuate Pension Plan Committee.

- 13. The Campmeeting Board shall consist of seven members: The President of the Annual Conference, W.M.S. President, Wesleyan Youth President, and Campmeeting Treasurer who will be members by virtue of their offices; and that the other members be elected from the floor after the election of Conference officers.
- 14. The Conference Wesleyan Youth President and the Conference Treasurer will be members of the Missionary Board by virtue of their offices.
- 15. The pastor of each charge shall send to the Conference President written notice of the names of each delegate-elect from his church, said notice to be sent immediately following the official election of said delegate or delegates.
- 16. There shall be a Nominating Committee whose duty shall be to present nominations for all the regular session committees of the Conference. This Nominating Committee shall be elected as follows: Before the close of each Annual Session three elders of the Conference shall be elected as ministerial members by nominations from the floor. From the list of delegates-elect supplied by the pastors to the Conference President as provided in Standing Rule 15 above, the Conference President and his Advisory Board shall appoint two lay members thus completing the Nominating Com-This Nominating Committee shall meet prior to the opening of each Annual Session at a time and place designated by the President, who may sit with the Committee in an advisory capacity if he deems it wise.
- It is understood that the Nominating Committee shall make nominations only for Session Committees, which nominations shall be ready for presenting to the next Annual Session of the Conference.

This Committee shall be continued until the rise of Annual Conference for whose Session Committees it made nominations, and may serve to nominate special committees as the Conference may request during its Annual Session.

- 17. All who are taking the Course of Study shall acquaint themselves with the requirements thereof, and the Conference officials and all pastors shall keep these regulations in mind in helping their young people plan this important preparation for service.
- 18. The bar of conference shall consist of the first four rows of seats in the tabernacle and the platform.
- 19. The time of meeting for the conference sessions shall be as follows: mornings 9:00 a.m. to adjourn at 11:30 a.m. Afternoons 1:30 p.m. to adjourn by motion.
- 20. The time for the election of conference officers shall be set for 9:00 a.m. the first Wednesday of Conference.

Report No. 2

Conference President

To the members of the Sixty-fourth session of the Oregon Annual Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America. Dear Brothers and Sisters in the Lord:

It is with real joy that I bring greetings and this report to you at the close of a year's work together. We thank the Lord for His blessing and presence with us and joyfully give Him the praise and honor and glory for the progress that has been made.

This past year has seen the completion of the Conference parsonage with the total sum of \$8,145.00 invested in this project. The church at Seattle, Washington has taken a great step forward in purchasing a building and moving to the new location. building was the former Crown Hill Community Hall and was obtained for \$19,950.00. It is well equipped with the pastor's apartment in the daylight basement. Attendance has increased and the work is indeed prom-The total indebtedness is \$7,435.22. Approximately \$2,000.00 worth of improvements have been made on the camp ground. The new church at Holgate is nearly completed. On March 3, 1957, the church at Chehalis, Washington, was organized with eight full members and four junior mem-This group was meeting and conducting an independent church in the school building in Forest, Washington. The Conference Board of Trustees has completed negotiations and this group is anticipating remodeling and occupancy of a building in llis. The purchase price was A down payment of \$2,000.00 south Chehalis. \$21,000.00. has been made.

I have held the first and last quarterly meetings in the churches, and attended the School Board meeting in Miltonvale, Kan-sas. I have traveled 19,593 miles by car and truck in the fulfilling of the conference duties and assisting in the Holgate, Seattle and Chehalis projects.

Letters of transfer for Archie Stevens from Dakota Conference; Herman Smith from Canada Conference; and Helen Smith from Canada Conference have been received.

The Conference Treasurer has paid me the president's salary of \$3,200.00.

The spirit of unity, which has been in our midst, has made the labors of the year most enjoyable and causes us to look forward with optimism for the blessing of the Lord and the prospering of His cause in our Conference. We give Him thanks for His wonderful goodness to us.

Report of the Committee on Resolutions

The pastor shall complete the report in full, make a second copy and be ready to read it the first day of conference." This be placed as number five.
- 4. That the word "all" be deleted from number four. This be placed as number six. The remaining standing rules be numbered in their respective order.
- 5. That the word "that" be deleted from number eight, and that the wording "be responsible" be changed to read "is responsible".
- 6. That the wording of number nine be changed to read: "The conference secretary and treasurer shall each be paid ten dollars annually from the conference treasury."
- 7. That the wording of number eleven be changed to read: 'No treasurer is allowed to pay out funds without proper authorization.' This be placed as number ten.

- 8. That the following be added as standing rules:
 - 18. The bar of conference shall consist of the first four rows of seats in the tabernacle and the platform.
 - 19. The time of meeting for the conference sessions shall be as follows: Mornings 9:00 a.m. to adjourn at 11:30 a.m. Afternoons 1:30 p.m. to adjourn by motion.
- 20. The time for the election of conference officers shall be set for 9:00 a.m. the first Wednesday of Conference.
- 9. We recommend that the Moral Resolutions submitted last year be continued in the minutes of this year, and that they be adhered to by all our members.
