JOURNAL OF DAILY PROCEEDINGS

Tuesday, 2:00 p. m.

The Tennessee Annual Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church convened for its twenty-first annual session on the campground at 2 p. m., Tuesday, July 11, 1950.

The Rev. D. P. Denton, President, called the Conference to order. The Rev. N. C. Hoggle, Vice-President, led in prayer. Roll was called with 12 Elders, 9 Conference Preachers and 20 Delegates answering the call of their names. (See Roll). Mrs. Edward Schade, Alternate Delegate of the Nashville Charge was seated as a Delegate.

By vote the following were elected to serve on the Nominating Committee: C. F. Smith, Chairman; N. C. Hoggle, A. L. Lowrance, W. T. McMahan, J. F. Biddle. The Committee was excused for Committee work.

It was voted that the first four benches and the space forward be made the Conference Bar. The hours of session were fixed as follows: Convene at 8 a.m. and close at 11 a.m. for the Religious

Service; reconvene at 2 p.m. and adjourn at 5 p.m. Meals at 7 a.m., 12:30 p.m. and 5:30 p.m.

The time for Special Orders of the Day was set as follows: Election of Officers, Wednesday, 9 a.m., Conference Sermon, Wednesday, 2 p.m.. Educational Address. Thursday, 11 a.m., General Address, Thursday, 2 p.m.

Miss Imo Sanders, of Hephzibah Orphanage was introduced to the Conference, and she spoke on the work at the Orphanage, bringing out many interesting and heart-touching facts emphasizing special prayer in their behalf. A special offering was taken for their needs.

The Vice-President was called to the Chair and the President made a partial reading of his Annual Report, which was accepted as read. This report was discussed regarding Official Acts, slightly altered, and after the reading of his Financial Report, was adopted in full. A love offering was taken in appreciation of his faithful and untiring service to the Conference. (See Report No. 1.)

Adjourned.

Wednesday, 8 a.m.

Devotions by the Rev. W. G. Harwell, prayer by Rev. J. F. Biddle. Roll was called and the following Delegates seated: Mrs. George Akers, Honorary, Fairview Mission, and Bob Harvey, alternating in the place of Mrs. John Green. It was voted to have only one reading of the Minutes daily. Minutes for previous session read and approved.

The Committee on Courtesy presented the Rev. R. D. Reisdorph, General Representative, who took the Chair, and Officials and Standing Committees were elected. (See page of Conferenc Officials.)

The Conference Treasurer read his report, which was referred to the Auditing Committee. (See Report No. 2.) Motion carried that the Auditing Committee audit the books of the Treasurer of the Superannuated Minister's Fund.

The President nominated three Lay Members to serve on the Committee on Itineracy and Orders: J. E. Comer, Mrs. Pearl Grow, Bob Harvey.

Adjourned by vote for committee work.

Wednesday, 2 p. m.

The time for Orders of the Day having arrived, the Chairman of Religious Services took charge. The Conference Sermon was preached by the Rev. D. P. Denton, Conference President, his text being "Power to Prevail Against the Enemy," taken from Rev. 12:10-12.

Conference was called to order. The Committee on Courtesy presented Mr. and Mrs. Carl Cox, Rev. Bob Morrell, Margaret Van-Huss, Vestal Broyles. Each gave words of testimony.

The Missionary Board were excused, and the Rev. R. D. Reisdorph was asked to preside. It was voted that provisions be made to have the Conference Minutes printed. The Missionary Board were empowered to take the necessary steps to carry out these provisions.

The Committee on Itineracy and Orders read a partial report, which was adopted. It was voted that James U. Bender and John V. Smith be elected to Elder's Orders.

The President returned to the Chair to hear the reading of pastor's reports. It was voted that pastors read only designated items on their statistical report. The following pastors reported: C. K. Crawley, O. H. Crabb.

It was voted that the Scarborough Memorial Wesleyan Methodist Church, Route 1, Harriman, Tennessee (Roane County) be accepted into the Conference as a new church. Mrs. J. L. Johnston, delegate, was seated. W. L. Scarborough, pastor, then read his statistical report.

The Committee on Courtesy presented the following: Rev. and Mrs. Frank McClure, Mr. and Mrs. Allen Rice, Mrs. Vestal Broyles, Mrs. Lucile Swafford and Mrs. Mareda Neal. Each gave words of testimony.

Adjourned by limitation of time.

Thursday, 8 a.m.

Devotions by the Rev. George Akers. Prayer by R. E. Rice. Roll was called, and the following delegates seated: Mrs. W. C. Trivette, Bristol, and Rhyne Bush, Honorary, Mountain View. Minutes were read and approved.

The Missionary Board gave their report, which was adopted. The Statistical Committee read their report. Motion carried that this report be held open until a correction be made before its adoption.

The Committee on Itineracy and Orders read their report, which was adopted. (See Report No. 3.) The Rev. Edward Schade, pastor of the Nashville church read his statistical report, and was excused from further sessions of the Conference.

The Auditing Committee gave their report, stating that the books of the Treasurer of the Superannuated Minister's Fund and the Conference Treasurer had been audited and found to be in perfect order. This report was adopted.

Adjourned for committee work until Orders of the Day— 11 a.m.

Thursday, 11 a.m.

The time for Orders of the Day having arrived, the service was under the direction of the Chairman of Religious Services. Mr. D. L. Jones, Field Representative, Central College, presented the educational interests, announcing August 16 as a day of fasting and prayer for Central College.

Miss Mary Baker, Field Representative, Brainerd Indian Training School, Hot Springs, S. D., very interestingly presented the Indian work. The services closed with prayer by the Rev. W. G. Harwell.

Thursday, 2 p. m.

The Rev. R. D. Reisdorph, brought the General Address, his text being "A Wesleyan Advance." He based his remarks on the Book of Nemehiah.

Conference was called to order and the roll was called. Mrs. Voreta Houser was seated as a delegate.

The Pastoral Relations Committee gave their first reading. This committee was excused and the Rev. R. D. Reisdorph was asked to preside.

The Committee on Prohibition read their report, which was adopted. (See Report No. 4.) The following pastors and evangelists read their statistical reports: C. E. Harwell, N. C. Hoggle, Charles Haire, W. T. McMahan, R. E. Rice, George Akers, E. L. Robinson, E. B. Carnes, Henry Sellers (report read by delegate), J. F. Biddle, Dortha Shook, James U. Bender, Mildred Thomas, Kate Taylor, Mrs. Juanita Tollefson.

The statistical report of the Women's Missionary Society and the W. Y. P. S. President's report were read. (See W. Y. P. S. and W. M. S. Minutes.) Adjourned.

Friday, 8 a. m.

Devotions by the Rev. Frank McClure. Prayer by J. V. Smith. Roll was called and minutes read and approved. The Treasurer of the Superannuated Pension Fund read his report, which was adopted (See Report No. 5).

The Pastoral Relations Committee gave their second reading. This committee was excused and the Rev. R. D. Reisdorph was asked to preside. The following pastors read their statistical reports: A. L. Lowrance, C. F. Smith, J. A. Cassady, M. L. Arnold, Frances Harwell (report read by Conference Secretary).

The Apportionment Committee gave their report, which was adopted. (See Report No. 6.) Adjourned until Special Orders of the Day—11 a. m.

Friday, 11 a.m. - Memorial Service

The Memorial Service was conducted by the Rev. J. A. Cassady. The service opened by singing "In the Sweet Bye and Bye." The Rev. A. L. Lowrance led in prayer. The Rev. A. L. Lowrance spoke concerning Rev. George Patterson. The Rev. N. C. Hoggle paid beautiful tribute to the memory of the Rev. Ida Sellers and Mrs. Sarah Dockery. Fitting tribute was spoken in behalf of the Rev. W. F. Sammons by the Rev. D. P. Denton. The Rev. J. A. Cassady spoke concerning the life of Mrs. Morrell of Nashville.

Conference was called to order, and the Sunday School Board read their report, which was adopted (See Report No. 7). The Committee on Resolutions gave their report, which was adopted after amendments were made. This Statistical Committee read the correction to their report. This report was then adopted. Reports were given by Willa E. Harvey for H. A. and Willa E. Harvey. General Evangelists. Adjourned.

Friday, 2 p. m.

The Ordination Service was held when James U. Bender and John V. Smith were ordained to the office of Elder in the Wesleyan Methodist Church. The following Elders assisted: D. P. Denton. C. F. Smith, J. A. Cassady, M. L. Arnold, A. L. Lowrance. The service closed by singing "Blest Be the Tie That Binds."

Conference was called to order. Roll was called. The following pastors read their reports: Grady Harwell, Thomas Hampton. The following were not present but it was voted that their characters be passed: Grace Winebarger, Jennie Whitaker, George Bross, Earl Seibers.

It was voted that the next Annual Session of the Tennessee Conference be held on the second Tuesday in July, 1951. By motion, the President and his Advisory Board were authorized to take care of any unfinished business of the Conference. It was voted that the Conference President work with the Secretary in editing the Minutes.

Recessed until call of the Chair.

Following recess Conference was called to order. The Committee on Courtesy presented Mr. and Mrs. Jones and Mr. and Mrs. Meredith. Each gave their testimony.

By request of himself, Rev. E. L. Robinson was granted a letter of standing from the Conference.

The Pastoral Relations Committee read their final report, which was adopted as amended. (See Report No. 8.)

Motion carried that we have a Conference Bulletin, and that the Conference President assess each church with the cost of printing. It was voted that D. P. Denton be Editor of the Conference Bulletin, and C. F. Smith Assistant Editor. It was voted that the pastors send a monthly report to the Conference President.

The President read the following recommendations to the Conference, which were adopted:

(1) The President shall nominate at each session two persons who, with him, shall comprise a committee to promote the Annual Ministerial Convention. Election of this committee shall be by vote of the body.

It was voted that Mrs. N. C. Hoggle and M. L. Arnold serve on this committee.

(2) For the past three years we have been inviting a Missionary speaker to tour the Conference in the interest of some phase of mission work. This year we recommend that the President be authorized to arrange a team of our own Conference workers who shall visit the Churches as far as possible, either in District Groups or in local Churches, in the interest of our own Pioneer program of Church extension. Offerings shall be taken at these meetings, and all offerings above the actual expenses shall be used in Pioneer work in the Conference. These offerings to be over and above the regular Pioneer askings.

The Committee on Thanks gave their report, which was adopted. (See Report No. 9.)

Minutes were read and approved. Upon motion the Conference adjourned sine die. Benediction, Rev. R. D. Reisdorph.

RESOLUTIONS AND LAWS OF THE TENNESSEE CONFERENCE

We, the Committee on Resolutions, submit the following report: Be it resolved, that these articles shall become the standing rules and law of this Conference:

- 1. Before a local building committee proceeds with a building plan or program that they be required to have all plans approved by the President and his Advisory Board and the Missionary Board; and further that no financial obligation be assumed without the consent of the Conference Trustees.
- 2. That the Board of Conference Trustees be, and they are hereby, empowered to sign all papers necessary for the sale or transfer of Conference, Church or Parsonage property, providing the said sale or transfer is authorized by the President and his Advisory Board and shall not violate the spirit of paragraphs 386, 387 of our book of Discipline.
- 3. The Board of Conference Trustees are hereby authorized to execute papers to secure funds for the liquidation of Conference, Church or Parsonage indebtedness, providing that the Churches set forth in writing the amount and the purpose for which the loan is to be used; and that no funds so secured shall be used for any other

purpose than that set forth in the notice to the Trustees of the Conference.

- 4. When a deed for Conference, Church or Parsonage property is received and before it is recorded it shall be referred to the President and his Advisory Board who are hereby designated as a Deed Examining Committee whose duty shall be to examine the deed and see that there are such disciplinary clauses included as may be necessary to make the property secure to our Church. Said Committee shall have power to engage such legal advice as may be needed to insure the proper steps regarding the reception or transfer of the property. See paragraphs 388, 389 of present book of Discipline.
- (A) Any Elder of the Conference shall be eligible to be Conference President. The President's salary to remain at (B) \$1500.00 per year, plus traveling expenses for Quarterly meetings, said expenses to be paid from the Conference Fund. (C) And each pastor is urged and expected to receive a love offering at the first and last Quarterly Conference for the President, the Conference to pay for the President's expense. The President must send to the Conference Treasurer his report of traveling expenses. that each pastor take at least ONE fifth Sunday offering to supplement the 35c Conference Fund Budget. And each pastor is to explain to his congregation that this is necessitated by reduction of the Conference Fund from \$1.75 to 35c to care for the Pension Fund. This prevents a raise in total budget; and the Conference Treasurer is hereby authorized to remit the President's salary semi-monthly.
- 6. We shall proclaim with voice and pen and holy living the Gospel of full salvation, recognizing our dependence upon, and need of the indwelling power and presence of the Holy Spirit.
- 7. Because of the alarming increase in worldiness, immorality, drunkenness and Sabbath desecration, as well as the tendency to shallow living among the people professing holiness, we pledge ourselves to an uncompromising stand against such evils and implore God's presence by the maintenance of the family altar in our homes.
- 8. We urge all Conference Preachers and Elders to become members of the Women's Missionary Society, and that the pastors attend each meeting and encourage the women, this being one of the strong arms of the Church.
- 9. Each Church shall make a special effort in behalf of, and loyally support the Church Extension Card Call Plan.
- 10. Each pastor, or charge, shall have in the hands of the Statistical Secretary not less than five days before the Annual Conference one copy of his statistical report in full. This report shall be accompanied by a statement from the Conference Treasurer giving the amounts paid on budget under item VIII in the pastor's statistical report, and the pastor's report must check with that of the Conference Treasurer.
- 11. The Conference Treasurer's books shall close on June 30 of each year and no credit shall be given on the Budget for that fiscal year for money received after this date.

- 12. The President's, Secretary's and Treasurer's correspondence expense shall be paid from the Conference Fund by the Conference Treasurer.
- 13. The fourth Sunday in October shall be known as Educational Sunday and pastors shall emphasize and take offerings for the same.
- 14. Minutes of this Conference shall be published through arrangements made by the Missionary Board and delivered to the pastors in numbers equal to 50% of their Church membership.
- 15. Preachers and Delegates shall remain throughout the entire Conference session unless providentially hindered or excused by the Conference.
- 16. All Elders received from other denominations shall be required to pass examination on our Book of Discipline, and must have passed a course of study which is equivalent to our course for ordination, and harmonize with our theological views. They shall give special attention to the requirements found in paragraph 171 of our book of Discipline.
- 17. Copies of these resolutions together with the apportionments and the addresses of the President, Secretary and Treasurer shall be in the hands of each pastor within two weeks of the close of the Annual Conference. The Conference Secretary be authorized to carry out this resolution.
- 18. Pastors shall mail all Delegate's credentials to the Conference Secretary not less than five (5) days before convening of Conference.
- 19. The Conference Budget shall be raised and remitted monthly to the Conference Treasurer.
- 20. All monies which are reported through the Conference Treasurer shall be sent to him either as cash or receipts and he shall give Conference Treasurer's receipt for each item, and no money shall be listed paid out by the Treasurer except by check, on order of the President, and he shall be required to present cancelled checks and vouchers for each bill paid.
- In order to promote a progressive program of Pioneer Evangelism, we recommend (a) That the Churches of the Conference shall support this program by raising a sum of not less than 10 cents per month for each scholar in main school of Sunday School as reported on Statistical blank, and this money shall be remitted monthly with the regular Budget to the Conference Treasurer, who shall hold in trust all such money thus designated; and shall pay out of this fund only at the time and in the amounts ordered by the Missionary Board. (b) This money shall be wisely and carefully used for Pioneer work, and for those places and pastors where there is a definite prospect of establishing a prosperous Wesleyan Methodist Church, or any other purpose in the Home Mission work of the Conference that the Missionary Board sees fit to use it. All monies to be raised by the Churches and Missions for expense, such as Pioneer work, Minutes, etc., shall be placed in the Minutes with the Apportionment Committee's report.

- 22. Those wishing to take examinations in the Course of Study for credit during any year, shall write for questions before May 31 of that year, and shall have the answers in the hands of the proper instructor before June 30 for credit for that year. The Committee on Itineracy and Orders shall not be expected to send out questions or accept papers after these dates.
- 23. In view of our disciplinary stand on the matter of jewelry and our interpretation of the Scriptures in regard to it, we do not think it consistent with our standards for a Wesleyan Methodist minister to use the ring ceremony in performing a wedding. Therefore, preachers of this Conference shall be asked to refrain from performing a ring ceremony.
- 24. It shall be a standing rule that the Secretary shall be remunerated the sum of \$50.00 for each session of Conference. We recommend that the Conference Treasurer be given \$25.00 per year for services.
- 25. We recommend that when the Conference President labors as an evangelist in any of our churches he be paid as other evangelists are paid.
- 26. Each unorganized work which is being run under the direction of the Conference and served by a member of this body, shall be allowed to elect an honorary delegate who shall be permitted to sit with the Conference and speak on matters of business, but not allowed to vote.
- 27. The Conference President shall be required to hold Quarterly Business Meetings at all unorganized works that are under the Conference Missionary Board or within the Conference, and the pastors of these works shall receive an offering quarterly to be sent to the Conference Treasurer and used toward the President's salary. Treasurer's of these unorganized works shall be members of some Wesleyan Methodist Church unless otherwise approved by the Conference Missionary Board.
- 28. The Committee on Nominations is not elected as heretofore, in view of the fact that this Committee is elected immediately upon the opening session of next Conference.

REPORT OF COMMITTEES REPORT I

PRESIDENT'S REPORT TO THE TENNESSEE CONFERENCE 1950

Beloved in Christ:

We praise God for the blessings of His Spirit that rests upon us right now, and for the presence of the Holy Ghost that has been manifest among us during the past year. This year shall go down in the memory of many of us as a year of pernicious problems, strenous struggles, and extra-ordinary opposition from the enemies of Bible Holiness. But in spite of all the efforts of the enemy, God has brought us through as individuals and as a Conference with abounding blessings, glowing glories and unusual unction. For all this we give Him the praise, and ask simply that in the future He shall lead the way for the advancement of His cause and kingdom.

For the sake of brevity, we list only necessary information in this report.

My Official Acts

The last Conference session left us with some Churches without Pastors. We filled these thus: Byrd's Chapel—E. L. Robinson; Temple—After some months was supplied with C. K. Crawley; Erwin—W. F. Sammons; Liberty—Remained all year without a Pastor; Green Mountain—Was abandoned by the Missionary Board but still holds possibilities for us; Mt. View—Has remained without a Pastor.

- In December, 1949, I accepted the resignation of W. G. Harwell as Pastor of Rockdale, and in March of 1950, I appointed Francis Harwell as Pastor of that Church, at the request of the Church.
- In December, 1949, I appointed C. E. Harwell as Pastor at Erwin, succeeding W. F. Sammons, whose health had failed, and who later passed into glory.
- I have traveled more than 26,000 miles in the interest of the work this year.
- We have visited each Church twice or more, but have not held all the Quarterly Conferences required, due to the pressure of time, money and health.
- Last fall when it become evident that funds were not to be available for printing our Conference Minutes, we published them in our own shop, thereby saving the Conference more than \$100.00.
- As instructed by the last session, we arranged for our General Home Mission Secretary, Rev. J. R. Swauger, to visit the Conference for a series of District Rallies and Dedications. This was done with successful meetings most of which we attended with him.
- In January we helped to arrange for the annual Ministerial Convention which was held at Bristol and was a great success.
- Following the burning of our Camp building last July 26th, we spent many weeks in laboring on the Camp. Cooperation in this has been good, and God has blessed in the rebuilding. In this matter, we wish to pay our respects to Rev. R. E. Rice who personally, as the State Representative of the Camp Association, has raised most of the money spent this year.
- On January 8, 1950, we tentatively organized the Little Mission, Route, 1, Harriman, Tennessee, into the Scarborough Memorial Wesleyan Methodist Church, and this Church seeks admission into the Tennessee Conference at this session. Rev. W. L. Scarborough was appointed Pastor.
