Paper Submitted by Leroy Logan, 811 Danner Avenue, Dayton 8, Ohio JOSEPH, the Son of Jacob and Rachel

Joseph was a son beloved of his parents. The son of their old age. It was in the city of Horon that Joseph was born to Jacob and Rachel. He had one other whole brother whose name was Benjamin. Rachel died and was buried in Bethlehem while her sons were of a tender age. Jacob loved the sons of Rachel more than the sons of his other wives. He made Joseph a beautiful coat of many colors. This made his brothers jealous and they hated him. When Joseph was 17 years of age he would help his brothers to bind sheaves. When he was finished in the field he would return home and tell his father of their evil report.

God revealed himself unto Joseph in dreams. He related this dream to his family: For behold, we were binding sheaves in the field, and lo my sheaf arose and stood upright and my brothers' sheaves stood around about and made obeisance to my sheaf. He also dreamed that the sun and moon and eleven stars made obeisance to him. This made his brothers hate him the more.

Joseph's brethren were feeding their father's sheep in Skechenm, Jacob sent Joseph to enquire of their welfare. He found them in Dothon. When they saw him coming and despised "that old dreamer." They plotted to kill him but the oldest brother, Ruben, pleaded with them to "shed no blood." They stripped him of his beautiful coat and put him in a pit.

A company of Ishmaelites from Giliad came by on their way to Egypt, Judah suggested that Joseph be sold. And they sold him to the Ishmaelites for twenty pieces of silver. They took his coat and dipped it in the blood of a kid and took it to their father. Jacob mourned many days with sack cloth on his loins for his son thinking some beast had devoured him.

Joseph was sold by the Ishmaelites in Egypt to one of Pharoah's officers, named Potiphar, who promoted him to overseer of his house. The Lord was with Joseph and he prospered him. As a young man Joseph was tempted but yielded not. Potiphar's wife tried to force him to lie with her, he refused. One day as he was busy about the house she tried to force him. Joseph fled leaving his coat in her hands. She falsely accused him to her husband and he was put in prison. There the Lord prospered him and he became keeper of the prison.

While in prison Joseph interpreted dreams for Pharoah's butler and baker who were also in prison. After three days the butler was restored. He promised to remember Joseph when he became free but forgot. (The baker was hanged.)

After two full years Pharoah dreamed a dream and sought interpreters among the wise men of Egypt, but none could interpret it. The butler then remembered Joseph and told Pharoah of him and he had him brought from the prison.

Pharoah saw in his dream seven fat kine and seven good ears of corn on a stalk. He also saw seven lean kine and seven ill favored ears. Joseph's interpretation was that there would be seven years of plenty and seven years of famine. Pharoah promoted Joseph and made him chief captain over Egypt. Joseph gathered and stored away food during the years of plenty and when the famine came Egypt was well supplied with food. Joseph was now 37 years of age had a wife named Asenath who bore him two sons, namely Manassah and Ephram. The famine was sore in the land and Jacob sent his ten sons into Egypt to buy corn but Benjamin, the younger, he kept at home fearing mischief might happen to him as it did to Joseph.

Joseph knew his brethren but they knew him not. He spoke roughly to them and called them spies. He put them in ward three days and demanded that one of them be left until they go and bring Benjamin, the younger son. Simeon was left. On their way home they discovered their money had been put back in their sacks and they were so frightened. Also their father was frightened and afraid to let Benjamin go. Ruben persuaded him and said he could kill his two sons if he didn't bring him back alive.

The sons returned to Egypt to buy more corn. They took Benjamin along. Joseph invited them to lunch. When he saw Benjamin he went into his chamber and wept. He commanded his steward to put their money in their sacks with their corn and put his silver cup in Benjamin's sack. When they were on their way home Joseph sent his steward to follow them and arrest Benjamin for taking his silver cup. Judah pleaded to Joseph to let Benjamin go. Joseph wept bitterly. He commanded everyone should go out from him but his brethren and he made himself known unto them.

He enquired of his father and his welfare. His brothers were troubled at his presence. He was 39 years old when he made himself known unto them. He sent his brothers home to bring Jacob down to Egypt. Pharoah was happy when he heard the news. Each brother was given a change of garment but Benjamin was given 300 pieces of silver and fine changes of raiment. There was much joy and weeping when Jacob came out of Canaan into Egypt. Jacob blessed Pharoah and he gave him and his sons the land of Goshen to dwell in for they were herdsmen.

'When Jacob was old and stricken in years Joseph took his two sons to him and he blessed them. When he died they carried him to Canaan to be buried. Joseph's brothers thought he would hate them after Jacob died but he said, "Fear not for I am with the Lord, you thought evil against me." Joseph saw the third generation of his second son, Ephram. Joseph died being 110 years old. They embalmed him and put him in a coffin in Egypt. So was the life of Joseph.

Joseph had two great accomplishments: first he restored joy to his father and household; secondly he preserved life throughout the land. He lived a Godly life; a moral life. He made peace with his enemies and forgave them. When the temptation was too great to stand and face he fled. One thing outstanding about his life was: He always did the right thing and God prospered him in all his undertakings. God was with him.
