Journal of Daily Proceedings

Conference Sermon—Rev. Harry L. Johnson, pastor of the Baraboo Wesleyan Methodist Church, brought to us the Conference Sermon, Monday evening, July 20th, 1953.

The Lord laid on his heart, the theme of "Going Forward with God"—Reading from God's Word-Exodus 14:10-21; using as a text a portion of verse 15—"Speak unto the children of Israel that they go forward."

Rev. Johnson made the statement in his introduction, "Courtesy is not holiness. BUT Holiness is courteous."

He mentioned that Israel was a "Great People" because they were God's people—They made a "Desperate Cry"—"Reason for the Cry"—"They were to go forward" and then he brought to us, "The Real Reason why we should go forward."

Rev. Johnson mentioned that the real reason why we should go forward is because the Gospel has been brought to us at a tremendous price—

- 1. A Life was given that we might have eternal life.
- 2. Because of the long list of those found in the 11th chapter of Hebrews.
- 3. Because of the Great sacrifice of our forefathers.
- 4. Because of the Relay of the Gospel.

After the conference sermon we met around the tables and partoook of the Communion Service—surely God was in our midst setting His seal of approval upon our fellowshipping together—truly a precious beginning for our Annual Conference Session.

Royal Bailee, pastor of the Milwaukee Work read from God's Word, stressing the thought of "Dwelling in the House of the Lord—"One Thing Have I Desired"—challenging us with the question "What do YOU want?"

Business Session—Call to order by our Conference President, The Rev. Loring Peterson.

Roll Call-of the Ministers showed 27 ministers present.

Committee on Credentials—Our Conference President appointed Rev. Robert Mattke and Rev. Harold Keller to act on the Committee—Motion to adopt their report as given.

Bar of Conference—By motion the first 10 rows of seats in the center section was set as the bar of conference.

Time of Conference—By motion time of Conference is to be 9:00 a. m.

until 12:00 Noon; and 2:15 p.m. until 5:15 p.m.

Vice President, Rev. Robert Mattke, was called to the Chair, and Rev. Loring Peterson, Conference President, gave a partial report. Motion to adopt the partial report as given.

Nominating Committee—gave their report—Motion carried to adopt report as given.

Courtesy Committee—presented: Rev. Layland Smith, Pastor of Eau Claire Wesleyan Church; Rev. and Mrs. Joe Reed from Kansas; Rev. and Mrs. John Heavilin from Gull Lake; Thankful Clawson and William Oaks from Pennsylvania.

Secretary reread the report of the Nominating Committee.

Adjourned to the Call of the chair. Adjourned by limitation of time.

- 2. We reaffirm our stand against intoxicating liquors and 11 Narcotics or habit forming drugs. - 4. We again request that the signs "NO SMOKING PLEASE" be placed in conspicuous places on our Conference Camp Meeting grounds.
- 5. Since it is the plan of God through the Gospel to make of one blood all Nations of men for to dwell on all the face of the earth, we feel keenly our Christian duty to live, love, work and pray toward the eliminating racial class distinction.

- 9. That each society elect a Mission Study Director and that the Mission Study Book be used. That the Program Calendars be used when possible.
- 10. That each Society encourage the reading of the selected books of the reading course, and that the number co-operating be reported to the Conference Study Director.
- 11. That every member be a subscriber to the WESLEYAN MIS-SIONARY, and that yearly gift subscriptions be encouraged. A magazine solicitor to be elected who will faithfully endeavor to obtain all renewals and to gain new subscriptions. An annual program for the promotion of the magazine is urged in each local society.
- 12. That each society be represented in conference by the new president and a delegate.
- 13. That all monies be sent in quarterly in round numbers; all budget items to Rev. E. Friebel, Stone Lake; non-budget items and membership dues to the conference W.M.S. treasurer.
- 14. That all books close by the 15th of June and that report blanks be filled out and sent to the Conference treasurer immediately following this date. Send returned blank with conference treasurer's signature immediately to the statistical committee. (Use items listed in the minutes

- 18. That we observe Harvest Home Day and that an offering be taken for Miltonvale Wesleyan College at this time.
- 19. That each local society pay annually an amount equal to \$.25 per member for the general administrative fund of the W.M.S., not applying on the budget.
- 20. That each society endeavor to raise at least \$5.00 for Hephzibah Orphanage.
- 21. That each Society endeavor to raise at least \$10.00 for Conference Missions for Evangelism.
- 22. That each society remit 50 cents per member for Conference Table, and that canned goods or garden vegetables be sent when possible.
 - 23. That \$3.00 or more be sent for the Medical Student Fund.
- 24. That the use of "In Remembrance Folders," the penny-a-meal jars, and Thank offering boxes be urged among the local society members. (Penny-a-meal money specifically for foreign Missions.)
