Opening—The thirty-sixth session of the Oklahoma Annual Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Connection, or Church, of America convened at the tabernacle located in the 900 block, East Main Street, Enid, Oklahoma, 9:00 a. m., Tuesday, August 15, 1939, with the President and Secretary present.

The song service was in charge og G. C. Cockrell. Earl Ritchey led in prayer. John E. McGraw read with comment the second chapter of Galatians.

#### CONFERENCE PRESIDENT

  - 7. Use the Study Book.
  - 8. Read the Plan of Work and Efficiency Standard once each quarter.

- 9. Go definitely against tobacco advertisements in the papers, and its uses, also alcoholic drinks.
- 10. Pay twenty-five cents per member for General Conference Delegate expense. (Permanent unless otherwise voted.)
- 11. Contribute at least five dollars to Hephzibah Orphanage, the same to be sent to our Conference Treasurer, also fill a gift box after learning the needs
