The thirty-fourth session of the South Carolina Annual Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Connection, or Church, of America met in the Westminster Wesleyan Methodist Church, November 23rd, at 2:00 P. M.

The devotional exercises were conducted by Rev. W. D. Correll, who read Psalm 91.

After a season of prayer and a few appropriate remarks, the Conference was called to order by the President.

The Secretary called the roll and 9 Elders and 8 Conference Preachers answered to their names.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT.

In the name of Jesus Christ, the Head of the Church, I do hereby submit my official report as President of the South Carolina Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America for this thirty-fourth annual session ending November 28th, 1926.

My Dear Brethren:—Faith and confidence in the God of our Bible and in the faithful saints of the Church whom we love, has made it possible for us to see this another session of our Annual Conference. To God be the praise. We have found this 1926th year a time that has tried the loyalty and genuineness of both the love and faith in the various arms of the work. The School underwent a most grave and critical test, perhaps the worst that it has ever passed through. When it was learned that Mr. A. E. Wachtel had overstepped his rights granted by both the local board of managers and the Board at Syracuse, and had involved the Institution in several thousand dollars of debt, the condition was such that brought to the best of us a severe shock, which will take much time yet to fully recover from. The droughts, banks closing and the low price of cotton has given us a most severe blow. Now in behalf of the Conference we beg mercy, and trust that grace may be extended to us by the various Connectional Representatives for our shortage if there be any in your arm of the work. We wish now to commend our faithful and humble supporters for their willingness and courage to stand by the cause to the extent of sacrifice and self-denial. Praise God for these, the salt of our Conference.

We rejoice to see the marked improvement that some of our churches have made. I do not take any credit for this, but rejoice because I have a clear conscience in that I have tried to build a work for tomorrow, and that when I see Him whom I have served I shall be rewarded for faithfulness rendered.

We were called upon by the local Board, and appointed by the Book Committee to the office of Treasurer of Central College December 7th, 1925 and served until June 7th, 1926. In the face of the most trying difficulties we were privileged to help hold things together until Rev. J. J. Coleman came and began to build the walls of confidence that had been completely destroyed in the Commercial

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World and a great part of the Church. Through the faith of those who stayed and prayed the Institution received strength and "there sprang one (School) as good as dead."

Rev. J. R. Green resigned his work December 9th, 1925, and Rev. J. E. Simpson was appointed to take this work January 8th, 1926.

In April the pastorate of the Gaffney church was transferred from Rev. J. E. Simpson to Rev. L. F. Lance.

Rev. J. R. Davis was appointed to Mount View church April 6. Rev. W. L. Miller resigned this work because he had more work than he could care for.

Rev. A. F. Connor was transferred to the North Carolina Conference November 12, 1926.

The Liberty Church was sold for debt on sales day in May to the highest bidder. This property can be bought again. I learned

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that the church was to be sold about one week before sales day, but was unable to borrow the money.

REPORT OF MISSIONARY BOARD.

We, the Committee recommend: (1) that the thirty per cent of the Home Missionary money be paid to the Home Missionary Secretary, Rev. T. P. Baker.

RESOLUTIONS.

Resolutions Adopted in 1898.

Resolved, 1st. That as a body in Conference assembled, we will not allow our pulpits or churches to be used by those who do not give evidence of being sound in the doctrines of the Wesleyan Methodist Church and true to our polity.

2nd. That as ministers and laymen we will use our best endeavors to prevent the promulgation of doctrines or usages not in accord with the Wesleyan Methodist faith.

Resolutions Adopted in 1905.

Resolved, 1st. That the law with regard to complaints or violations of orders and resolutions found on page 37 of our Discipline, and beginning with the words, "When the President," shall apply to all cases of the violators of our Discipline, and no charges shall be entertained by the Judiciary Committee without said previous investigation and labor.

2nd. That no member of the Conference shall have his character passed who fails to carry out all the rules and orders of this Conference, unless providentially hindered, except upon a three-fourths vote of the body.

Resolutions Adopted in 1907.

Resolved, 1st. That we affirm our faith in the soundness of the position taken by the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America in denying any of its members membership in any secret society.

2nd. That we believe that the preaching of Holiness that does not include a clear and distinct opposition to all secret societies is seriously lacking in the essential elements and must be more or less displeasing to God.

3rd. That we believe that the right type of Holiness preaching and teaching is the most effective means by which to induce men to separate themselves from all lodge entanglements; therefore, we will do our best to double our diligence in this line of effort.

4th. That we affectionately admonish our people to avoid all compromise with secrecy. Hence we as a Conference require that

our pastors and churches shall not elect, or suffer to be elected, superintendents or teachers of any Sunday Schools that are held in our churches if they hold membership in secret societies; furthermore, those belonging to secret orders shall not be allowed to hold services in our churches.

5th. That we seriously urge upon all our brethren and sisters that they may be careful to maintain a consistent, but radical, attitude of opposition to all organizations, secret or open, which are opposed to Jesus Christ and His doctrine and principles of righteousness.

Resolutions Adopted in 1914.

Resolved, 1st. That all of our Licentiates not receiving any appointments to pastoral or evangelistic work be required to preach at least once a month, or twelve times during the Conference year.

2nd. That in addition to the above resolution, we earnestly request all preachers not receiving a regular appointment by the Conference, except those attending school preparatory to the ministry, to hold, if possible, a two weeks' revival during the year.

3rd. That all preachers unemployed by the Conference during the coming year be urged to select a fellow-laborer with whom they can work harmoniously, and go out and try to build up new works as they may have opportunity, and revive the desert places.

4th. That in order that the foregoing resolutions may have the greatest effect possible, and that each preacher may have a higher estimation of the dignity of his calling, and that the burden for souls may be increased, and that they may feel the sympathy of the Church to which they belong, we urge each charge to pass like resolutions.

5th. That it is not only the duty, but binding on each Circuit preacher of our Conference, to receive whomsoever the Conference may designate as Quarterly Meeting Evangelist, and give him their hearty support and co-operation.

Resolution Adopted in 1919.

Be it Resolved, That the Committee on Public Worship consist of the President of the Conference, the pastor of the charge where the Conference is held, and the pastor's delegate.

Resolutions Adopted in 1921.

Regarding the Orphanage.

Resolved, 1st. That we as a Conference continue W. D. Correll as Committeeman until next Annual Conference; also to act as Manager of the institution from this Conference.

2nd. That we meet the balance of \$7,000 on the purchase price of the property. We suggest that \$1.00 per member be asked for throughout the Conference, for 1924.

3rd. That a Committee of two be elected to associate with W. D. Correll as Committeeman.

4th. That this Committee appoint such financial agents or agent as necessary to carry on this work throughout the Conference, and that said agents be secured on such terms as can be agreed thereon by Committee and agents.

5th. That a special effort be made between now and the first of January by the pastors and Financial Agents to collect the amount subscribed during this Conference, and to add to it, if possible, thereby saving interest and deferred payments.

6th. That the Conference Treasurer handle all cash and receipts on both the up-keep and the purchased price of the Orphanage; and that the produce be sent directly to Miss Bettie Tyler.

Resolution Adopted in 1922.

Regarding Tithing.

Resolved, That no person be licensed to preach who does not tithe his income; that all our licentiates be required to faithfully tithe their income; and that the license of no preacher be renewed, who fails to tithe.

Resolutions Adopted in 1923.

Resolved, 1st. That it is the sense of this Conference that our houses of worship should not be opened to any evangelist or minister of any other church to hold a series of meetings or to maintain a regular appointment for another congregation; provided, however, that usual denominational courtesies be extended to other ministers in occasional appointments.

2nd. We recommend that all charges and stations to which the pastor moves pay the moving and transportation expenses of said pastor, the same to be done in addition to his salary; provided this shall not interfere with previous arrangements between pastor and charge.

Resolution Adopted in 1926.

Resolved, That the pastors be required to raise their Minute Money and send to the Conference Treasurer within sixty days after they receive their Minutes.
