JOURNAL OF DAILY PROCEEDINGS

Burr Campground, July 19,

1949

The first sitting of the Seventy-Ninth session of the Wisconsin Annual Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America convened in the tabernacle of the Burr Campground at 9:15 AM, Tuesday, July 19, 1949.

DEVOTIONAL PERIOD--The song service was in charge of Rev. Clarence Titus, pastor of the Gull Lake, Chittano churches. Sister Titus presided at the piano. Rev. Lloyd King, Vice-President of the Conference led us to the Throne of Grace.

CONFERENCE SERMON--Rev. Loring Peterson, Pastor of the Baraboo Charge brought us the Conference Sermon--He read to us from the Book of Ephesians, the 4th chapter. He directed our thoughts to the theme of "THE REQUIREMENTS OF A WORTHY WALK". Surely God laid the message on the heart of our brother and he brought it to us freighted with the unction of the Holy Spirit. He spoke briefly from the negative standpoint--then from the positive, basing his remarks on Paul's letter to the Ephesian Church--then brought us the Results of a Worthy Walk. We were made to examine ourselves in the light of God's Word.

COMMUNION SERVICE--Following the message, Bro. O.G. Wilson took charge of the Communion Service--God truly met with us and gave us the assurance of His help and Presence as we begin this session of Conference.

ADJOURNED for Committee work to the call of the Chair. Adjourned--limitation of time.

REPORTS OF COMMITTEES

President's Message.

To the Members and friend of the Seventy-Ninth Session of the Wis. Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church:

We are thankful to God for His providential care and guidance through another year, Friends, God has been good to us.

God has manifested Himself in our churches in various ways. Most of the churches have had one revival and several have had two or more. His blessings have been in the regular and in the special services. We as a people have been lifted again and again as the Presence of God was felt in the services.

Our laymembers have shown a wonderful spirit of cooperation. Never have I seen a more faithful and sacrificial group. They have cooperated in and supported every phase of the program. They are easy to work with. They have set for we ministers a goal hard to reach.

According to I Cor. 13:13 "Now abideth faith, hope, love, these three; but the greatest of these is love." Again we read, "Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart soul and strength, and thy neighbor as thyself." One of the characteristics of the early church and also of our day is, "Behold how they love one another."

Christ has set the example for us in that He loved us with a sacrificial love.

Supervision of the Work.

I entered into the work assigned me by the Conference immediately following conference. I have been to all of the churches four times conducting quarterly meetings. I have also been to our missionary points two or more times throughout the year. I feel that I have faithfully fulfilled every duty assigned me. The work with the various churches has been enjoyed throughout the year. While there have been a few problems they have been reduced to a minor number because of the splendid spirit of co-operation in each church. I preached 162 times, attended the Northern Camp in August, Youth Camp in June and attended revivals and prayer meetings when possible.

New Undertakings for the Year

We instituted a fellowship and praise service in each district for the laymembers and ministers. These were held for the spiritual blessing and to bring a better understanding. These were held once amonth.

We instituted the Pastor's Adjusted salary which has been a source of revenue. Thanks for the splendid cooperation.
