In Memoriam



REV. S. IRVING KEELER

Rev. S. Irving Keeler was born in 1869 and was converted at the age of 17. He was called to preach at the age of about 20. He received his first appointment in the South Carolina Conference in 1909 and spent 32 years in the active ministry of the Conference. During that time he served as president of the Conference for four years (1914-1918), 20 years in evangelistic and Bible Conference work, and 8 years in the pastorate, serving as pastor of the following churches: Central (First), Piedmont, Greenville (First), Pelzer, Williamston, Golden Grove, Smith Chapel, Mount Olivet, Martin Grove, Pickens View, Calhoun and Tuckasegee. He also served in the South Georgia Conference and other churches. He retired in 1943. On August 12, 1954, he answered the summons to be with his Lord whom he loved so fervently.

Journal of Daily Proceedings

First Sitting, Tuesday, July 19, 2 p. m.

The sixty-third session of the South Carolina Annual Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America convened in the tabernacle on the grounds of the Wesleyan Camp Meeting Association at Greer, South Carolina at 2 p.m., July 19, 1955. The President stated that he felt that the first action taken in the new tabernacle should be the offering of prayer and called on Rev. R. C. Kendrick to lead the congregation in this prayer. For devotional meditations, the President read the book of Jude.

Conference was called to order by the President, Rev. V. A. Mitchell. The roll call revealed that 30 Elders and 13 Conference Preachers

Standing Rules and Resolutions

- 1. That no member of the Conference shall have his character passed who fails to carry out all the rules and orders of this Conference, unless providentially hindered, except upon a three-fourth vote of the body.
- 2. That we earnestly urge all our Licentiates not receiving any appointments to pastoral or evangelistic work to preach at least once a month, and to hold if possible a two weeks' revival during the year.
- 3. That no person be licensed to preach who does not tithe his income; that all our Licentiates be required to faithfully tithe their income; and that the license of no preacher be renewed, who fails to tithe.
- 4. We recommend that all charges and stations to which the pastor moves pay the moving and transportation expenses of said pastor, the same to be done in addition to his salary.
- 5. That we as a Conference put forth every possible effort through education, pulpit, preaching, voting, and other means to advance the cause of temperance and to secure legislation for abolishing the sale of beer, wine, and whiskey for beverages.
- 6. That the Trustees of the South Carolina Annual Conference, together with the President of the said Conference, be and they hereby are empowered to execute, all necessary papers, mortgage deeds, and papers of a like character, when necessary to secure loans to the South Carolina Annual Conference or to any church needing funds to liquidate Conference, church, or parsonage indebtedness, provided that the party or parties requesting such action shall set forth in writing the true nature and purpose for which the loan is requested (this writing is to become a part of the permanent records of the Trustees) and that the Trustees and President of said Conference are satisfied that the object for which said loan or loans is sought is both necessary and desirable.
- 7. That the Trustees of the South Carolina Annual Conference be and they hereby are empowered to sign any or all deeds and papers for the transfer of real property that is now or hereafter may be held in trust by said trustees, where the sale of Conference, church, or parsonage or other real estate has been approved or authorized by the President of the Conference with the concurrence of two-thirds of his Advisory Board.
- 8. During the interim of Annual Conference the Missionary Board shall be duly authorized to draw on the funds for Conference Work, and Conference Missions, as it deems best for the interest of the Conference, and the Treasurer shall be authorized to make payments from these funds upon written order signed by the President and at least one half the

other members of the Missionary Board, or signed by the President in behalf of the Missionary Board.

9. Any church which engages in a building or remodeling project or which purchases a parsonage, church building or a lot on which a church or parsonage is to be constructed, regardless of whether the property is to be owned by the local church or the Conference, is required to have the plans approved by the Conference Board on Church and Parsonage Building and Location.

Any church which secures aid from the Conference must have its property deeded to the Conference Trustees, as is required by our Discipline; and any church which engages in a building or remodeling project must have the plans approved by the Conference Board on Church and Parsonage Building and Location, according to the requirements of our Discipline, if said church is to receive aid from the Conference for these building projects.

- 10. All pastors shall have their Statistical reports in the hands of the Statistical Committee by 8:00 a.m. Wednesday of Conference.
- 11. The salary of the outgoing pastor shall close on Sunday preceding the opening of Annual Conference and the church is required to include the week of Conference in the incoming pastor's salary.
- 12. Each charge should give its pastor the privilege of being away from his church, or churches, for two meetings per year, and no pastor is to be away from his charge for more than two meetings per year without a vote of his church, or charge, giving permission; and it is recommended that each church or charge give its pastor a two-weeks vacation with pay each year.
- 13. All officers and committees shall take up their duties at the close of the sitting of conference in which they are elected.
 - 14. Conference shall convene each year on the Tuesday nearest July 15.
- 15. The books of the Conference Treasurer shall close two weeks before Conference.
 - 16. The Conference Secretary shall be the Committee on Credentials.
- 17. W. T. Hughey, Treasurer of the South Carolina Conference of The Wesleyan Methodist Church of America, or his successor, is authorized to sign United States bonds held by the South Carolina Conference of The Wesleyan Methodist Church of America.
- 18. When a church engages in a building or remodeling project at least one-half of the estimated cost of the project must be on hand before said project is undertaken unless other satisfactory arrangements are

made. If other arrangements are made the Board of Trustees must approve them before they are considered satisfactory.

- 19. A church which is not on a charge with other churches may keep only one record book for church and quarterly records and the Church Clerk serve as Quarterly Conference Clerk.
- 20. The President shall appoint an Auditing Committee in time for it to audit the books of the treasurers before conference.
- 21. If a pastor desires to resign his work during the interim of Annual Conference, he shall give the President and his Advisory Board notice at least two weeks before the effective date of his resignation. However, if the President and his Advisory Board deem the cause for his desire to resign sufficient, they may accept the resignation immediately.
- 22. Certificates of Citation are to be presented to ministers who have given 25 years of active ministerial service in God's Kingdom (20 years in case of retirement or death) as a member of the South Carolina Conference. At the close of each succeeding five years the old certificate is to be returned and a new one given; and at retirement or death a certificate is to be given recognizing the total period of active service. An evangelist must hold ten meetings during the year to receive credit for a year of service. The Citation Committee is to be composed of the President and Secretary. (See Minutes of 1953)

Reports of Committees

Report No. 1

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

We greet the sixty-third Session of the South Carolina Conference in the Name of Him "Who loved us, and washed us from our sins in His own blood." This year has been filled with the delightful and the difficult; with the thrilling and the trying; with victory in some quarters and defeat in others. However, all in all it has been a good year.

We are grateful to God for His grace which has sustained us; His mercy which has protected us; His anointing which has blessed us. We are indebted to the people who have received us; who have co-operated with us; and who have labored with us in the cause of God and His church.

A Busy Year

A:tendance at the General Conference was a part of the year's schedule. It was, in my opinion, the best General Conference in a number of years. The religious services were great and the spiritual tone was good. Issues upon which differences of opinions were held were discussed in a Christian manner. When the issues were settled by vote the matter was ended in mutual understanding. This is as it should be!

The proposed "Merger" with the Free Methodist Church was one of the most discussed items considered. The report and recommendations of the Commission on Merger was not adopted by a vote of 96 to 62 which had the effect of rejecting merger and discontinuing the committee. However, the Fraternal Delegate of the Pilgrim Holiness Church expressed an interest on the part of the said church to discuss merger with us. A motion prevailed that the Board of Administration elect a committee so that if and when the Pilgrim's approach us we will be prepared to discuss it with them. Before its passage the amendment, "And continue study of merger with the Free Methodist Church" was added. Therefore, if and when the Pilgrim's approach us a three way discussion will result.

An appeal of the Ohio Conference on a Conference Resolution was heard. The resolution in question was, "We understand paragraph 51 in the Discipline to require that no one be received into membership of our local churches unless they have left off wearing of gold including the wedding ring. Be it further resolved that paragraph 52 regarding modest apparel be strictly adhered to." The General Conference President ruled the resolution "to be null and void". The Board of Appeals sustained him. It was pointed out that Paragraphs 41 (3) (a), 69 (1) and 71 gives the local church the right to determine who its members shall be and therefore it is left up to the local church. The Annual Conference cannot pass a resolution restricting membership since the local church determines who its

members shall be. This ruling, which was sustained by vote of the General Conference, does not change our church law nor conditions of church membership. The Local church can bar membership to anyone. This has been a principle of our church through its history.

Moving our International Headquarters was referred to the Board of Administration with power to act. Where it shall be built and the details of the building will be worked out by the Board of Administration.

The Pension Plan was improved. Conference Preachers are now eligible for benefits. If one ceases to be engaged in work covered by the penson plan he may discontinue paying assessments and upon retiring receive benefits on the number of years he participated in the plan. These and other improvements make it imperative that each one who is now eligible become members of the plan within two years because after that date one forfeits his right to become a member of the plan. Inasmuch as our Superannuate minister and widows are paid in proportion to the amount of budget paid we cut their salaries when we fail to raise a full budget. Inasmuch as we raised only 85% of this budget item Brother Kendrick and our other retired veterans of the Cross will receive 15% less income than they would had we paid a full budget. If those churches which failed will get busy and make up this deficit within two months, I believe, the Treasurer of the Pension Plan will give full benefits. all, we MUST RAISE A FULL BUDGET ON THIS ITEM.

The calling of a pastor for more than one year was referred to the Board of Administration with power to act. Before, or if and when, this becomes law you will be notified.

Much time has been consumed relative to the erection of the Conference parsonage. A beautiful lot at 1300 West Poinsett Street was purchased and a nine room parsonage consisting of four bedrooms, living room, dining room, kitchen, and a two room office is nearing completion and will cost approximately \$29,000.00 including the lot. While the building is more elaborate than first anticipated and thus, the cost greater, yet we feel that it is a parsonage you will appreciate and be grateful that we have it. The building is well arranged and substantially constructed. It is expected that the new location and the adequate parsonage will enable the conference president to better serve the conference.

This Session of conference is being held in the second largest tabernacle in the denomination and in the nicest. Many hours have been given to this project. The first plan was to erect an open building but the committee soon became convinced this was unwise. A cement block building was later considered but the committee decided this was not what we needed nor what you wanted. This present building was designed with you in mind. The cost will be near \$36,000.00. If all of our people will give \$10.00 each, with what we receive from outside sources, we can pay for it. A corner-stone laying ceremony is planned during this.

session of conference and a special service of dedication is planned for the first Sunday afternoon of Camp meeting.

State of the Work

Financially:

Even though farm income has been off for the last three years due to the severe drought, and even though the peach crop was a total loss this year in South Carolina, yet the over-all income of our churches has increased. Our pastors are better paid and the budget contributions on each item except Foreign Missions, Orphanage, General Conference Travel and Mountain Missions was greater than last year. This, plus the added item on Conference Parsonage, gives a substantial increase in total budget contributions. The total contributed for all purposes likely will be at an all time high.

Materially:

Along with the improvement of the camp meeting property and the erection of the conference parsonage the following churches have made major improvements:

Pelzer has built the largest church in the conference. The auditorium is 40 x 76 with full basement and balcony. The "T" is three stories and provides 16 Sunday school rooms-24 when other partitions are run. The Kendall Mills donated the lot and \$10,000.00. Rev. A. C. Legg, who became pastor after the project was begun, and his people donated 15,000 hours of free labor. The building is valued at \$80,000.00. Piedmont dismantled the old parsonage and replaced it with a beautiful seven room parsonage and full basement which is one of the nicest in the conference valued at \$28,000.00. Walhalla replaced their church building with a beautiful stone building of English design with the interior beams exposed. It is different to anything we have in the conference and is valued at \$50,000.00. Williamston has added five additional rooms to their church, installed rest rooms, and brick-veneered the entire church. Road has completed their new cement block church valued at \$25,000.00. The auditorium is 32 x 55 with full basement. Ariail (Easley) refinished the pews, laid a carpet, installed rest rooms and a nursery. Startex has installed new pews and erected a vestibule. Liberty has added Sunday school rooms in their basement, installed rost rooms, replastered the auditorium, placed celotex over head and plans to refinish the floors and pews and install a natural gas heating system. Anderson paid the balance due on the indebtedness of the parsonage, redecorated the interior of the church, and installed new pews without additional indebtedness. Lyman, Davis Chapel, and Walhalla have installed an electric organ. For other improvements you are referred to the pages of the "Challenger".

Numerically:

in A number of churches report splendid gains in church membership,

Others showed a loss. It is hoped that a net gain will be reported. While no spiritual minded person is interested in numbers for numbers sake yet all spiritually minded persons are concerned that we are not winning more people to the Lord and church. Dear people, this is our mission! Failure here is tragic. Our financial and material progress is a means to an end and not an end within itself. A revival is our greatest need. Let us return from this conference gathering to experience revival in our hearts and in every church.

Spiritually:

The spiritual tone is good. We have noble preachers and laymen. However, there is room for improvement. The spirit of fellowship and good will among us is gracious. May it ever be thus.

Prospects:

Our prospects were never brighter. We are in a position to accomplish more for God than ever before. However, this will require an allout effort. We will have to spend our energy on advancing the cause of Christ and cease spending it on our own cause. The challenge was never more urgent; the need never more desperate, and the opportunity never greater. Since 1934, it is rported more than 58 million children have been born in America. This group under 21 years of age makes America the greatest missionary field in the world. The unreached in South Carolina in the communities where we have established churches as well as in the vast territory we have not entered affords an opportunity for advancement, and confronts us with a responsibility for our failure to advance as rapidly as we should have. Let us forge ahead in 1956!

Death Takes One of Our Ministers

On August 12, 1954, Rev. S. I. Keeler was summoned to his eternal reward. We miss this soldier of the cross but his passing reminds us that we too shall be called from time to eternity. A Memorial Service is planned Thursday Afternoon at 4:00 o'clock.

July 22, 1954, I granted letters of transfer to the Ohio Conference of Rev. and Mrs. G. I. Norman.

August 27, 1954, E. M. Turner surrendered his credentials as an Elder in the Weslevan Methodist Church.

September 24, 1954, I granted a letter of transfer to the Alabama Conference of Rev. L. J. Cherryholmes.

September 25, 1954, received transfer of Rev. John Cole an Elder from Kentucky Conference.

November 13, 1954, We approved the request of the Walhalla Board of Trustees to sell the parsonage, the proceeds to be used in erecting the new church. Living quarters for the pastor was provided in the church

basement.

December 2, 1954, We appointed Rev. Harold Nicholson supply pastor of the Greenwood church to serve until conference or until a pastor is secured.

December 2, 1854, We approved and authorized the Board of Trustees to deed one-half undivided interest in our property at Florence to the Local Trustees at the request of the Trustees of the Florence church.

December 15, 1954, We voted to authorize the India Conference to ordain Rev. Edwin Cowart an Elder for us. This was done upon consultation with Dr. F. R. Birch and upon recommendation of the Committee on Itineracy and Elders Orders. The ordination was held on January 23, 1955.

December 15, 1954, I granted a letter of standing to Rev. R. M. Morgan as an Elder who later united with the Southern Methodist Church.

January 7, 1955, We approved the petition of the Greer Church to deed the house known as the Eddie Henderson House to Mr. and Mrs. R. W. Bridwell. The said house had been deeded to the Conference by Brother and Sister Bridwell for the use of the Greer Church, the grantors reserving a life-time use of the building. The said grantors requested this action be taken.

March 1, 1955, Rev. C. V. Marchbanks Sr. returned to us as an Elder from the Pilgrim Holiness church and was appointed conference evangelist.

June 10, 1955, We granted permission to the Providence church to vote on the name of Rev. J. M. Merrill as pastor for another year.

June 12, 1955, I appointed Rev. A. W. Padgett and Mr. George A. Fowler to audit the Conference Treasurer's books.

July 11, 1955, We approved and authorized the sale of the Conference parsonage at Central to Prof. M. J. Elliott.

July 19, 1955, I granted a letter of transfer of Rev. S. D. Herron to the Tennessee Conference.

MISSIONARY BOARD, 1955-1956

We recommend:

- 1. That the Conference President receive \$75.00 per week salary, parsonage rent, utilities, and six cents per mile traveling expense, and he is to choose his own mode of travel, and that he be given two weeks vacation with pay.
- 2. That he be given the privilege of holding two meetings outside of the Conference and retain offerings from two meetings.
- 3. That he hold one quarterly meeting or visit each charge at least once during the year, and at other times as often as he is able.
- 4. That he advise with the stewards of local churches for the purpose of encouraging and devising plans for better payment of pastors.
- 5. That the Statistical Committee be paid \$10.00 each from Conference Work Fund.
- 6. That the Secretary's salary and Treasurer's salary be \$150.00 each, to be taken from Conference Work Fund.

- 7. That the President be authorized to draw on funds of Conference Work, for secretarial help, printing blanks and other such items.
- 8. That the Missionary Board be privileged to formulate plans for Church Extension Work for the following year.
- 9. That when it become necessary for the Conference to aid new churches financially, the amount of aid shall be determined by the Missonary Board and such aid may be discontinued at the discretion of said Board. We further recommend that as long as a church receives aid from the Conference, it shall consult the Missionary Board before calling a pastor.
- 10. That the pastor of any church securing aid from the Conference shall secure permission from the Board before he can conduct more than two revivals away from his church during the year.
- 11. That a pastor who is serving a church receiving aid from the Conference and who desires to move or live away from said church or change his relation to the charge in any way must first consult the Board.
- 12. That the salary of the Pastor at Sans Souci Church be supplemented in the amount of \$30.00 per week, and living quarters.
- 13. That we continue the payments on the loan on the North Charleston Church.
- 14. That we make the payments of \$40.00 per month on the Seneca Loan, the same to be applied on the commitment of the \$2,000.00 cost of the portable tabernacle.
- 15. That Rev. W. C. Young be designated as sales manager for the Conference History Book.
- 16. That we pay the Pastor of Buck Creek and Rock Ridge Mission and the Pastor of Smokey Mountain Mission the salary of \$30.00 per month, to be paid from Mountan Mission Fund.
- 17. That our Sunday Schools pay 10¢ per member for the total enrollment in the main school to the Christian Action Council; this is to be sent to the Conference Treasurer. We further recommend that the second Sunday of September be designated as the day for this special offering.

Standing Rules and Recommendations

- 1. We emphasize the need of much prayer and intercession in these evil days, and that fasting and self-denial be observed as well.
- 2. The W.M.S. dues of one dollar (\$1.00) per member are to be divided as follows; Foreign Missions, \$.25; Home Missions, \$.25; General Fund, \$.25 and Umspecified, \$.25.
- 3. The Y.M.W.B. dues are fifty-five cents (55¢) for our Conference. The fifty-two cents (52¢) is to be used for foreign missions, one cent (1¢) desk expense and two cents (2¢) for General Conference travel expense of Y.M.W.B. Superintendent.
- 4. The annual report blanks must be in the hands of the Conference Statistician by July 1st of each conference year.
- 5. Each local society should pay annually an amount equal to twenty-five (25¢) per active member to be used as a general administrative fund, not to apply on budget.
- 6. We urge each local society to have an alert Magazine Solicitor, an active Mission Study group and a large Prayer Partner circle.
- 7. It shall be the duty of each District Superintendent to supervise the interests of the societies in her district. This may be done by visitation, correspondence, the holding of conventions and rallies, the organizing of societies and bands where none exists and giving of her time as she deems needful. Each society or district is to bear her expenses on said visits.
- 8. We urge the use of the Standard of Effeciency so that each society may work to be placed on the Honor Roll.
- 9. The Executive Committee will serve as a nominating committee to nominate committees as deemed necessary before the opening of conference.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

During the year I have endeavored to give proper attention to every detail of the work.
