Standing Rules

- 1. The Conference fiscal year close June 30, and that the local church fiscal year close June 15th; that all money shall be in the hands of the proper Conference Treasurers within one week following June 15th; that immediately thereafter each pastor shall submit to the Conference Treasurer his budget check sheet with receipts covering same, and his statistical blank completed except for the budget section; that the Conference treasurers upon completion of the Budget section forward the statistical forms to the statistical secretary—said forms not to be returned to the Pastors until the Conference Session.
- 2. That the President of the Woman's Missionary Society and of the W.Y.P.S. be members of the Missionary Board by virtue of their office.
- 3. That a Nominating Committee composed of four elders and the President, ex-officio, be elected by ballot and that this group upon arrival at conference select 2 properly elected delegates elect to serve with them; and that they bring their report at the first session of the ensuing annual conference.
- 4. Regarding time and place of the Annual Conference. The Annual Conference of the Wisconsin Wesleyan Methodist Church shall convene the Third Monday in July at 8:00 P.M. in the Tabernacle of the Burr Campground—located 7 miles west of Hillsboro on Highway 33.
- 5. That the Election of the Conference Officers be Wednesday morning, 10:00 of Conference Week.
- 6. The Superannuate Ministers' Board be elected for a term of three years. The first members be elected for one year, the second member for two years, and the third member for three years.
- 7. The Missionary Board shall hold a business meeting during Conference and on the first Tuesday of October, January, and April. Any business should be transacted at the call of the Chairman.
- 8. Each church permit its pastor a two weeks vacation with pay, to be absent on vacation over one Sunday.
- 9. If the Missionary Board calls a pastor to hold a revival on a Mission point that his church give him two weeks leave with pay.

Journal of Daily Proceedings

Conference Scrmon—Rev. Carl Holder, pastor of the Buelah Weslevan Methodist Church at Gillingham, Wisconsin brought to us the conference sermon, Monday evening, July 19th, 1954.

The Lord laid on his heart the thought of "Moving Northward"—reading from the Holy Scriptures—Deut. 2:1-7. His text from Deut.

2:3—The Direct Commands of God. "Ye have compassed this mountain long enough: turn ye northward."

Rev. Holder made the statement that "God's commands are His enablings." $\ensuremath{\mathsf{H}}$

From V. 5—the command "Meddle not with them"—We are going somewhere, we are not to stand still.

V. 6 "Ye shall buy meat of them for money, that ye may eat; and ye shall also buy water of them for money, that ye may drink." We are to pay our way—we are not to expect just because we are God's ministers that we are to be given things, rather "we are to pay our way."

V. 7 "For the Lord thy God hath blessed thee in all the works of thy hand."

V. 14 16 the thought of TIME—God's clock keeps perfect time, and when God says, "Ye have compassed this mountain long enough, turn ye northward"—then it is about time for God's people to move out for Him. Our hearts were challenged again and again as Rev. Holder brought to us the thoughts God gave him.

After the message, we met around the tables and partook of the emblems representing the broken body and shed blood of our Lord Jesus Christ. Surely God met with us and as we begin another Conference Session, we are reminded that alone we can do nothing, but "With Christ all things are possible."

The first sitting of the eighty-fourth session of the Wisconsin Annual Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America convened in the tabernacle of the Burr Campground at 9:10 A.M., Tuesday, July 20th, 1954.

Vice-President—David Peterson was called to the Chair and the President gave a partial report of his labors during the Conference Year—This partial report was adopted—and the Brethren whose names appeared therein were given a seat in Conference.

Committee on Credentials—appointed by the President—Royal Bailie and Floyd Titus—Motion carried to adopt the report of this committee.

Roll Call of Church Delegates showed 26 Delegates present.

Bar of Conference—Motion carried that the first 10 rows of seats in the center section of the tabernacle and the rostrum be considered seat of Conference.

Time of Conference—Motion as amended—TIME to be from 9:00 to 12:00 noon—and 1:00 to 4:30 P.M.

Recess—for Nominating Committee to complete their report.

Business Session called to order at 10:30 by the Conference President.

Report of the Nominating Committee read and adopted as a whole. Courtesy Committee—presented the following pastors: Each gave their testimony. Joseph Reid—Rice Lake; Michael Schell, Mt. Pisgah and Oak Ridge; John Clarke—Hillsboro; Mr. and Mrs. Bennett—Wisconsin Rapids; Virgil Eldred—Burr and Valley.

Roman Catholicism is trying to become the predominating factor in the world today. Communism says the state is supreme. Materialism says self is supreme. Catholicism says the Church is supreme. But the DOCTRINE is supreme. It needs to be put into practice today by the millions of professed Christians. God IS supreme—it is to God that we owe our allegiance—we need to take God and holiness into every part of our living.

Summing up Dr. Birch's main points we find: Strategy of a Remnant requires:

- 1. Reevaluation
- 2. Orientation
- 3. Getting rid of our fears
- 4. A return to THE BOOK. Preach the great doctrines of the Church.
 - 5. MUST stress the fundamentals.
 - 6. Must be a planned strategy.
 - 7. Must carry the doctrine of holiness into every part of our lives.
 - 8. Must be extrovert instead of introvert.
 - 9. Must be evangelistic instead of reformatory.
- 10. There needs to be a movement back to Pentecost, with the unity of pentecost.
 - 11. We ought to stress plans for advancement.
- 12. We must get it all clear between ourselves and God, in order that He can use us to His glory.

- 1. That our annual W.Y.P.S. Conference be held during our annual youth camp; Conference to convene on Tuesday, June 14th at 1:00 p.m.; and that all W.Y.P.S. books close June 1st.
- 2. That each society pay at least \$5.00 of the \$9.00 registration fee for each delegate or representative.
- 3. That the election of officers and committees be Orders of the Day following the seating of Delegates.
- 4. That the W.Y.P.S. Conference continue to be divided into the three districts.
- 5. That there be a convention in each district sometime during the fall for which the district chairman be responsible.
- 6. That a Conference tour be made by the Conference W.Y.P.S. President, and a youth worker; this tour be held during Holy Week if possible.
- 7. The Executive Committee shall present to the Annual W.Y.P.S. Conference a slate of candidates from which the districe chairman be elected.
- 8. That each society observe Youth Week in so far as possible and where there is no organized society this week be used as a time of promoting Youth interests.
 - 9. That the 1955 Youth camp be held at Burr Camp.
- 10. That each society raise \$2.50 per member for special projects, (Burr Camp improvements); that the offering of the third Sunday of each month be used for this.
- 11. That the members of each society volunteer to evangelize their local communities; and that each society stress revival, and personal work on the local level.

12. That the 1st week-end of the Annual Camp be designated as Youth Convention, plans to be worked out by the Executive Committee, with the approval of the Camp Board.
