Daily Proceedings

OPENING OF CONFERENCE

Minutes of the Sixty-Fourth Annual Conference of the Dakota Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Connection (or church) of America, held at Aberdeen, South Dakota, June 5th through 11th, 1945.

The opening service of the Sixty-Fourth Annual Conference was held the evening of June 5th, with Rev. L. D. Harris delivering the Conference Sermon. A fine representation of ministers and delegates was present for this initial service.

WEDNESDAY MORNING, JUNE 6, 1945

Rev. S. J. McIntyre conducted the devotional service for this first session of Conference.

The Conference was called to order by the President, the Rev. J. F. Simpson, of Ipswich, South Dakota.

A motion prevailed that Ed. Hildebrandt be seated as the delegate from the Rapid City Church.

The report of the Conference Program Committee was submitted and on motion was accepted.

The motion passed that the first ten rows from the front of the tabernacle in the center section constitute the Bar of Conference.

The following were elected as a Nominating Committee: H. W. Cretsinger, Chairman, S. J. McIntyre, L. D. Harris, C. W. Reisdorph and David Robertson...

A brief recess was declared by the Chair to allow the Nominating Committee to bring a report to the floor. We were then called together again to receive said report.

The report of the Nominating Committee was accepted with the following changes being made: The Rev. Marvin Jones resigned from position of Chairman of Auditing Committee and the Rev. H. W. Cretsinger was elected to that position.

Because of Disciplinary requirement Rev. W. O. Howard was elected Chairman of Passage of Character Committee. See report number 1 for complete report.

The Secretary voiced verbal greetings from the following Elders and Conference Preachers: J. E. Spry, Ralph Helle, Ralph Howard, Walter Simpson.

Motion prevailed that we elect a Fraternal Delegate to the South

Dakota Conference of the Free Methodist Church. W. D. Shelor was elected as our Fraternal Delegate.

The President appointed the following lay-members to the Committee on Itineracy and orders: Mrs. Florence Arms, Thomas Edwards, Mrs. George Gore.

A motion prevailed that we not include any item in Benevolences in the Connectional Budget on Statistical Blanks and that all Statistical Reports be changed to agree.

Brother Arthur Calhoun, Brother and Sister Yonally, Robert Bateman, Sister Meyer and Sister Eldinger were introduced to the Conference and each testified to God's glory.

W. C. Brannon brought greetings to the Conference from the Rev. Claire Harris of Billings, Montana.

Mrs. W. J. Leyh brought greetings from R. J. Eling and James Harris. The last two brethren had sent greeting by Mrs. R. J. Eling to the Enid, Oklahoma Area Missionary Rally.

Adjourned for committee work.

WEDNESDAY AFTERNOON, JUNE 6, 1945

The devotionals were conducted by the Rev. W. O. Howard reading and commenting on the first chapter of book of Job.

The President called the meeting to order. The Minutes were read and approved.

The Committee on Courtesies introduced the Rev. F. R. Birch, Foreign Missionary Secretary, and Connectional Representative, to the Conference. Brother Birch spoke briefly to the Conference.

The Rev. Kelly was introduced and spoke briefly.

The motion prevailed that the next Conference begin the evening of the second Tuesday of June, 1946.

A motion prevailed to reconsider above motion in regard to time of next year's Conference.

Motion carried that a committee be elected to consider time of Conference. Committee elected as follows: J. F. Simpson, H. W. Cretsinger, W. O. Howard, A. L. Mudgett, R. J. Sausoman.

Motion prevailed that a Committee of three members be elected to look into the matter of printing of Conference Minutes.

The Conference President introduced the idea of a Church Library containing books that would be acceptable for our Young People to use for book reports in High Schools.

Motion prevailed that a committee of three members be elected as a Conference Library Committee.

Adjourned for committee work.

THURSDAY MORNING, JUNE 7, 1945

The Rev. Arthur Reisdorph led the devotions reading from and commenting on I Cor. 15:1-10.

The roll call was made after which the Minutes of the last session were read and approved.

A partial report was made by the Auditing Committee. See report number 2 for complete report.

The President gave his report, including his Financial Statement, and said report was accepted. See report number 3.

The Rev. S. J. McIntyre was asked to lead in a prayer of Thanksgiving for God's blessing on the Conference over the past year, then the Doxology was sung.

The report of the Conference Treasurer was read and adopted. See report number 4.

The Committee on Railroad Expense read their report. Motion was made and passed that the report be referred back to the Committee on Railroad Expense.

A motion prevailed that Kenneth Shelly be added to the Statistical Committee.

Adjourned subject to call of the chair.

THURSDAY AFTERNOON, JUNE 7, 1945

The Connectional Address was delivered by the Rev. F. R. Birch, Foreign Missionary Secretary.

The Auditing Committee read its completed report and it was accepted. See Report Number 2.

The Committee on Passage of Character read its report and it was accepted. See report number 5.

The Committee on Church and Parsonage Building and location gave its report and it was accepted. See report number 6.

The Committee on Railroad Expense read its report and it was accepted. See Report Number 7.

Adjourned for committee work, subject to ce air.

FRIDAY MORNING, JUNE 8, 1945

The devotional period was conducted by the Rev. William Ward.

The session was called to order by the President. The roll was called, after which the Minutes were read and approved.

The motion prevailed that the Orders of the Day be temporarily set aside to allow the Committee on Itineracy and Orders to make a partial report.

The Committee on Itineracy and Orders gave a partial report and it was accepted. See Report Number 8.

The Committee on Itineracy and Orders read its completed report and the report was accepted. See report Number 8.

The motion prevailed that the Conference Program Committee consist of The Conference President, Pastor of the Aberdeen Church, and the Conference President of the W. H. & F. M. S.

The motion prevailed that the Young People be given a service during Conference similar to that of Sunday School service.

The motion prevailed that the W. Y. P. S. President be a member of the Conference Program Committee by virtue of office.

The Committee on Resolutions gave its report and it was accepted. See report number 10.

The special Committee to set dates of next Conference read its report and the report was not accepted.

A motion to reconsider the action taken on the above report was made and carried.

The report of the Special Committee to set dates of next Conference was then reread and on motion was adopted. See report number 11.

The President read a letter of greeting to the Conference from A. C. Buell.

The motion passed that a special Blank be formulated by the Book Committee for a report by the Unstationed Elders and Conference Preachers to their Annual Conference, and that in the event such a blank is not ready by our next Annual Conference that the Conference President and the Conference Secretary formulate such a blank for the next Conference gathering.

The motion prevailed that all books in the Course of Study be ordered by the Conference Secretary. (Books for examiners and books in the Reading Course.)

The Treasurer of the Ministerial Relief Fund read his report and it was accepted. See report number 12.

A motion prevailed that we elect a Committee of three elders and two laymen to bring in a recommendation regarding some plan to help support the ministers on Pioneer Fields.

The following were elected to this committee: H. W. Cretsinger, L. D. Harris, S. M. Yonally, M. Kingslien, Walter Shook.

Adjourned by limitation of time.

SATURDAY MORNING, JUNE 9, 1945

The devotional period was conducted by the Rev. Thomas Bailie reading and commenting on the third Chapter of Exodus.

The President called the session to order, and the roll was called.

The Camp Meeting Treasurer read his report and it was accepted.

See report Number 13.

The report of the Statistical Committee was given and adopted. See report number 14.

Adjourned for orders of the day.

SATURDAY AFTERNOON, JUNE 9, 1945

The President called the meeting to order, after which the Minutes for the two preceding sessions were read and accepted.

The Committee on Itineracy and Orders gave a partial report

and it was adopted. See complete report number 8.

A motion prevailed that the Conference Minutes Committee be empowered to act in regard to the printing of the Annual Minutes.

The President read a letter of greeting from W. W. Jeffers to the Conference.

A motion prevailed that letters of greeting be sent to all ministers who have sent greetings to the Conference, and that a cable-gram of greeting be sent to Chaplain Reisdorph in Paris, France. Also that greetings be sent to Sister Martha Jenkins and Brother Adolph Olander, pioneer layman of the Dakota Conference.

The following persons were introduced to the Conference and spoke briefly: Duane Janssen, Chester Reed, Rev. and Mrs. Kline of Wessington Springs Junior College, Rev. C. D. Oderman, Fraternal delegate from the Free Methodist Church, South Dakota District.

A motion prevailed that the Secretary and the President draw up a telegram voicing our appreciation to the President of the United States for his stand on moral issues and on prayer.

The special Committee to recommend measures to support men on new fields brought a report. Motion prevailed that action on said report be postponed to another session of this conference.

The Conference Library Committee read its report and it was adopted. See report number 15.

A motion prevailed that a Committee of two members be elected to Constitute a Conference Library Committee, they to select a list of recommended books for local Church use.

The following were elected to Library Committee: J. F. Simpson, Marvin E. Jones.

A motion prevailed that the above committee represent this Conference in this matter with the State Superintendent of Public Instruction of the various states comprising the Conference, (This book list is to contain books of high moral value that will be acceptable to school authorities for the purpose of book reports in High Schools.)

Adjourned by motion.

MONDAY MORNING, JUNE 11, 1945

The Rev. Gordon Goodsell conducted the Devotional service by reading from II Peter 1:1-11 and commenting on the same.

The President called the session to order. The Minutes were read, corrected and then approved.

The special committee on support of pastors on Pioneer fields read their report and it was adopted. See report number 16.

A motion prevailed that at any time the Missionary Board feels that the local Church, receiving help from the fund above mentioned, fails in its obligations the contract shall be terminated by the Missionary Board.

A motion prevailed that the Conference Treasurer receive ten dollars as an honorarium for his services, and this be made a Standing Rule.

The General Conference President of the W. H. & F. M. S., Sister Ruby Reisdorph, brought greetings from this Connectional organization. Sister Reisdorph also read a letter of greeting from Chaplain Rufus Reisdorph.

Adjourned subject to call of Chair.

MONDAY EVENING, JUNE 11, 1945

The Committee on Pastoral Relations read their report and it was adopted. See report number 17.

The Missionary Board read their report and it was adopted. See report number 18.

The President nominated W. J. Leyh and H. B. Engle to his Advisory Board. They were elected.

The Minutes of this session were read and approved.

Adjourned by motion.

REPORT NO 3. PRESIDENT

It is a pleasure to be able to come to you at the close

of another Conference year, which has passed so rapidly. This year has been a historic time in the nations of the earth and we trust that some constructive history has been made in our Conference.

Many gracious revivals have been conducted in our midst during this year which speaks to us the fact that it is possible to have revivals of religion in these times of chaos. Larger plans are being made by our churches for evangelistic campaigns the coming year. It is our desire that all of our pastors will stress the importance of evangelism until fires of revival will break out in all our churches. It is the hope of the growth and establishment of the work which God has committed to us. Other denominations are dying and closing their doors in many places because of the loss of faith and emphasis on the importance of revivals.

If we are to enter open doors God has placed before us it will be necessary to stay by the pattern given to the early Church.

We wish to congratulate our pastors and churches for the splendid way in which they have sought to reduce their indebtedness. We are hoping that the time will soon come in which all the indebtedness on our properties will be liquidated, and then more attention can be given to a better supported ministry. This will give our pastors more time to devote to the building up of the work. We appreciate the fact that our pastors have a consecration deep enough to serve a church when the support is not sufficient to maintain their family, even though it seems necessary for them to work some at manual labor.

This is a noble spirit, but we are praying that the time will come when all of our churches will be self-supporting and our pastors will be able to devote all their time to the work of the Ministry.

We acknowledge the help of the Lord in providing ways and means to purchase six church buildings and three parsonages this year.

There is much land ahead to possess. There are gracious opportunities open to us of entering centers of population with the message of life. Church properties have been listed to us at a fraction of their original cost. It seems that now is the time for the Wesleyan Methodist Church to arise and claim her inheritance, even though there are many barriers in our path. History proves that there have always been many barriers in the way of God's people coming into possession of that which was provided for them. God is wanting men and women in the Dakota Conference who will laugh at seeming impossibilities and cry it shall be done.

The hand of death has taken one of our senior Ministers, Rev. J. C. McGovern. He was a pioneer in every sense of the word. Our prayer is that God will raise up others to take his place and carry on the work which was so near to his heart.

REPORT NO. 18, MISSIONARY BOARD

The Missionary Board was called to order by the Conference President, Rev. J. F. Simpson.

We recommend the following appropriations:

Koth.

That \$10.00 per month be continued to Rev. C. K. Thompson from the Superannuated Minister's Fund.

That \$250.00 be paid by Conference Treasurer on Rapid City Church lumber bill.

That the payment of \$10.33 monthly be continued to the Forsyth, Montana Church.

That the Conference Treasurer send \$10.00 monthly to the Watertown Church to apply on a note.

That the Conference President's salary be \$35.00 per week, with \$15.00 per month toward house rent, and travelling expenses.

That the payment of \$25.00 monthly on Rapid City note be continued.

That the balance of \$5.48 on Loan number Three from Superannuated Minister's Fund to Conference be paid, and that \$100.00 on Loan number Two be paid to the above-mentioned Fund.

That the Conference Treasurer pay \$15.00 monthly to the Flandreau Church on parsonage rent.

That we recommend that the Camp Meeting Board take steps to secure funds for Church Extension, and that the pastors who are devoting their time to a building program be given consideration, as well as evangelistic campaigns in home Mission territory.

CONFERENCE STANDING RULES AND RESOLUTIONS

FINANCIAL PLAN FOR CONFERENCE WORK

Money for Conference Fund shall be obtained by each Church (local) paying 7½% of all money raised for all purposes, this to include local treasury, Sunday School, W. H. & F. M. S., W. Y. P. S., and Y. M. W. B., with the exception of finance for building and repairs. One-third of this Fund shall be used for Church extension within the boundaries of the Dakota Conference, and the balance, two-thirds, shall constitute the regular Conference Fund.

This amount is to be sent to the Conference Treasurer once a month.

The amount for Railroad Expense is \$9.00 per charge, and it is requested that this amount be sent to the Conference Treasurer by August 1, 1945.

BY-LAWS

The Conference President, the Presidents of Conference W. H.& F. M. S., W. Y. P. S., The Camp Meeting Treasurer, and the Pastor of the Aberdeen Church are members of the Camp Meeting Board by virtue of office.

The Local Church File, presented by Wilbur Drown, is to be left with the local church by the out-going pastor so that the incoming pastor will have the data contained there-in provided immediately

upon his arriving on the new field. This file is to be open to the inspection of the members of the local church.

The Emergency Extension Fund is sanctioned by the Conference, but it is understood that the plan is not obligatory. This Fund is secured by the pastors sending one-half their tithe each month to the Conference Treasurer, indicating that the amount sent in is for the Emergency Extension Fund.

Characters of pastors will NOT be passed unless the Superannuated Minister's Fund has been raised on their Charge.

All churches will be instructed at the beginning, and again at the close of the Conference year regarding their obligations to the Conference, relative to the Budget askings and amount due on Budget.

All officers hold office until the close of the Conference sessions in which they are retired.

All treasurers of the separate Funds are instructed to close their books seven days before the date of the opening of Conference.

The Conference Secretary is to be paid \$10.00, and allowed \$5.00 for stenographic help, each year. The Conference Treasurer is to receive \$10.00 each year for his labors.

No person shall receive Ordination, in the future in the Dakota Conference who does not intend to engage in definite Christian work.

MINISTERIAL RELIEF FUND

Purpose: To provide financial assistance for Conference Elders and preachers in times of serious illness, or death, in their families.

All Ministers and Licentiates shall become members on payment of first assessment. Those who desire to become members later, may do so by paying up all assessments made previously during that Conference year.

The Secretary-Treasurer shall make four assessments each year, or more if emergencies arise, in the following manner: Each Minister on the Conference Roll shall be assessed one dollar on due notice from the Secretary, except when both husband and wife are preachers. In such case, only one is assessed. Each pastor shall collect one dollar from his church or charge each time an assessment is made, except Ministers not serving as pastors in the Conference. These are to pay \$1.50 for each assessment.

Disbursements: The Secretary shall, upon the receipt of the worthiness of the case, pay out of the Treasury forty percent of the amount of the actual expense incurred, provided the expense is more than twenty dollars, and further provided that no payment

shall exceed fifty dollars to any one family during the Conference year, possible exceptions being made in extreme cases with the approval of the Conference President, his advisory Board, and the Treasurer of the Ministerial Relief Fund. (Normal maternity cases excepted.)

In case of death the maximum of \$100.00 will be paid the beneficiaries. The assessment in such an instance shall be one dollar.

Members who are delinquent in the payment of the last two assessments prior to claims for help, shall be ineligible. In case one is delinquent in two, or more, payments no benefits will be paid in emergencies by paying of delinquent assessments. If assessments are paid by check, please add service charge.

In case the Secretary is in doubt as to the worthiness of a case, he shall advise with the Conference President.

Postage and necessary expense shall be deducted from the fund.
