The forty-third annual session of the Alabama Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America convened in the Tabernacle of the campgrounds at Camp Eden in St. Clair County, Alabama, August 12, 1952 at 3:00 P. M. The opening song service was led by A. L. Deason and followed with the President reading a Scripture lesson from Luke 10, 25-33 and John 4:4, followed with prayers by S. A. Lowery and W. B. Hill.

Roll was called. Quorum present.

The Bar of the conference was fixed to include first five seats in front of the tabernacle and the platform.

The President read his annual report which was by vote adopted as read. (See Report No. 1).

The following recommendations were received and by vote referred to the Committee on Itinerancy and Orders for persons to study and travel under the direction of the conference; J. C. Hopper from the Mentone Church; Albert Payne from the Birmingham First Church, B. F. Pope from the Talladega First Church.

The following resolution was read and by vote adopted:

Resolved that the report of the Committee on Resolutions be read to the Conference body and posted in a convenient place in the tabernacle and no action be taken upon it until a following meeting. Resolved further that any resolution offered by any indi-vidual to this conference, proposed as a standing resolution shall be presented and treated in like manner.

The Order of the Day was called for the Conference Sermon which was preached by Rev. Rendel Cosand from the text found in Ephesians 5:18, using as a subject "Be filled with the Spirit."

Adjourned by motion.

Second Meeting, Wednesday, 8:45 a.m.

AUGUST 13, 1952

The Conference was called to order by the President. The roll was called. Devotions were conducted by Rev. G. B. Vernon followed by the report of the Tithing Secretary. The report was by vote adopted. (See Report No. 2).

The report of Rev. H. Robb French, General Evangelist was read by the Conference Secretary and adopted by vote.

A letter in the form of a report from Chaplain Frank W. Warren now stationed in Tokyo, Japan was read by the Secretary. The Secretary was by vote of the body instructed to reply to the letter expressing the appreciation of the church for the work that is being done by him in serving our boys in the armed forces. A Resolution relative to the purchase, mortgaging or sale of

property belonging to the church or conference, was read.

The Order of the Day was called and the Conference proceeded to the election of Conference Officers, resulting as follows: The first ballot for President was only a nominating ballot. On second ballot, Rev. J. A. Treese was elected President, receiving 43 out of 60 ballots cast. E. L. Shigley, Sr., Vice-President, receiving 33 out of 61 ballots cast. W. E. Hobson, Jr., receiving 52 out of 63 ballots cast. Trustee, Layman for three year term, A. L. Deason 50 out of 62 ballots cast. Trustee, Ministerial for three year term, H. Frank Pair receiving 43 out of 62 ballots cast.

Reports were read by the following pastors, V. O. Agan, J. L. Averett, Fred T. Brazier, Finn M. Crowe, Leon Dean, G. C. Frederick.

Committee on Courtesies introduced Rev. Claud Hicks pastor of the church at Covington, Ga. to the conference body and he was voted honorary privileges.

The Committee on Courtesies introduced Rev. George E. Davis, Superintendent of Hephzibah Orphanage Home at Macon, Ga. and Mrs. George Davis to the Conference. He having transferred his membership to the Conference was seated within the conference bar. Rev. Gaines Ross and Mrs. Gaines Ross of Greensboro, Ala-

bama and recently from Marion College were introduced by the Courtesy Committee to the Conference, also Dr. R. C. Mullinax, President of Wesleyan Methodist College, Central, S. C. They were both granted honorary privileges in the conference.

He gave an outline of the doctrines of the Wesleyan Methodist Church, the position and progress being made by the different departments of the church activities. A rising vote of appreciation was given him by the body.

Adjourned by motion.

THIRD MEETING WEDNESDAY 1:30 P. M. AUGUST 12, 1952

Devotions were conducted by Rev. Fred T. Brazier. The roll was called. Following the roll call the report of the Sunday School Secretary was read. Report was adopted. (See Report No. 3.)

O. A. Marchant resigned as a member of the Pastoral Relations Committee due to his necessity to leave the conference. W. O. Finnen was elected to fill the vacancy.

The Auditing Committee read a partial report which was accepted.

The Conference Treasurer reported. Report was by vote adopted. (See Report No. 5).

By motion adjourned for a one hour recess.

Called to order by the presiding officer at 3:00 p.m.

The election for Conference Treasurer gave Arthur L. Deason 50 out of 52 ballots cast. He was declared elected.

A. L. Deason, S. D. Herron and W. E. Hobson, Jr., were elected as Pension Plan Committee.

The President nominated Rev. E. L. Shigley and A. L. Deason as his Advisory Board. By vote they were elected.

The Camp-Meeting Secretary read the names of those nominated by the Camp Association to be its officers for the next year as follows: President, Rev. E. L. Shigley, Sr.; Vice-President, Chas. R. Tegen; Secretary-Treasurer, Finn M. Crowe; Committee Members, 1st. W. O. Finnen; 2nd S. D. Herron. By vote they were elected.

Editor of the Alabama Wesleyan, Rev. J. A. Treese; Associate Editor, Preston S. Spruiell, Jr.; Business Manager, Fred T. Brazier. It was voted that the publication be issued monthly, except July and August. A motion to have it printed quarterly was lost by vote.

A motion carried to request the pastors to continue submitting monthly reports to the President.

The Sunday School Secretary read the following recom-mendations for Sunday School promotional activities during the year. That there be district Sunday School meetings held Quar-terly. These meetings to include all Sunday School workers and pastors of the district. These to be under the direction of the Sun-day School Secretary for the promotion of Sunday School leadership. These are to be one evening convention, unless the attending group desires to change time and length of their meetings.

That a Sunday School convention be planned in cooperation with the Spring Missionary Convention, the time and place and workers to be suggested at this conference announcing full details in the Alabama Wesleyan. By vote this was approved.

The Sunday School Secretary nominated C. R. Tegen and S. D. Herron as members of the Sunday School Board. By vote they were elected.

Rev. E. T. Meacham was nominated by the Southern District a member of the Conference Missionary Board. By vote he was elected.

The Chairman of the Pension Plan Committee read a very interesting report of the work of the Pension Plan, and urged all pastors to raise the full amount of the Pension budget. And that all those eligible should not fail to become members of the Pension Plan and enjoy its benefits when needed. By motion the report was unanimously adopted. REPORT No. 10

MORAL REFORM

In view of the widespread criminal activities of underworld racketeers and professional gamblers as recently disclosed by the Kefauver Crime Commission, the rebellion of many teen-age boys and girls against all authority, the drunken wet-politicians led parade of over 60 million Americans liquor consumers, ten million of whom are classified by the Yale report 'hard drinkers' and one million of whom are alcoholics; the too frequently presented frivolous, vulgar and immodest programs which are shown on television, an industry which is apparently controlled to a large extent by a monopolistic stranglehold of the liquor, beer and tobacco trusts; the efforts of some of the leaders of our State supported institutions of learning to encourage, even to the extent of coercion and intimidation the students to dance and appear in public indecently dressed; the thousands of dance halls, road houses and other dens of iniquity which blot the face of our nation; the loss of respect for womanhood; the diabolic and determined (and largely successful) efforts of the tobacco trusts to place a cigaret between the lips of every person in America; the hellish Hollywood theatrical industry with its loose morals, its fallen stars, its glamourizing of sin and its popularization of divorce and debauchery, the unwholesome and unchristian radio programs which seek to invade the sanctity of our homes; the secularization of the Lord's day; the refusal of the average American to recognize God by paying the tithe; the brazeness with which God's name is taken in vain; the willingness of the American people to blindly follow any leader or line which promises greater revenue or remuneration; the utter corruption in government circles; the overwhelmingly preva-lent tendency of the American people to place party above principle; and the lack of consecration, convictions and concern among the

professed followers of the Lord. America and the world at large is morally sick and is in imminent danger of being purged by the judgments of a holy God who loves righteousness and hates iniquity. In order that our country and loved ones may be spared the jude ment which has already been pronounced upon all nations that forget God.

Mathematical

We, your Committee on Moral Reform would most earnestly urge the entire constituency of the Alabama Conference to take an active part in opposing the entrenched evils of our day by using every weapon of spiritual warfare, especially our rights and privil-eges in balloting, which is granted by a beneficient God and by the Constitution of the United States; not forgetting to place an increasing reliance on God who through the inspired prophet wrote "not by power nor by might but by my Spirit, saith the Lord" knowing that where the fires of holy sacrifice and divine unction leap high, the vision is clarified and enlarged to see both the danger (sin and the possibilities of grace; the soul is purified from all the affection for that which is trifling or trashy; the heart is melted with a divine compassion; and the purged lips are prepared to carry the message of true moral reform - moral reformation born of soul transformation. Such was the moral reformation which swept through England like a fire driven by a mighty wind in the Wesley-an revival of the eighteenth century, a revival which gave England back her sabbath, closed the grog shops and dens of iniquity, improved social conditions, emancipated slaves, restored decency and transformed the proud, the trifler, the passionate, the lover of the world and the man of pleasure into paragons of purity and piety.

It was a revival of a healthy discipline where license had prevailed, of light and power where darkness and weakness had reigned, and of a 'confirmation to the spirit of the apostolic precept."

Such a spirit-born 'moral reform' also produced a social reform which drove even the atheistic rabble-rousing fore-runners of modern Communism to seek more honorable employment and saved England from a bloody revolution such as swept France. God still stands anxious to prove his divine sufficiency over all moral and spiritual problems if we will but seek His favor and then stand uncompromisingly in whatever gap he may choose to place us.

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to the second 1. Opening of Conference. Resolved that all meetings open at 8:45 a. m. except the opening day of conference, and that at 3:00 p. m.

p. m. 2. Conference President. Resolved that the conference president be required, authorized and appointed to travel the con-ference as president, having general supervision of the spiritual in-terest and benevolence thereof, holding at least the first, second and fourth quarterly meetings at each church during the conference year

under such dates as he may announce thirty days in advance and according to the following schedule. The first quarter to close by November 30, the fourth to begin not earlier than May 1. We further recommend that the first quarterly meeting consist of two services, if possible. That he assist the pastor in raising funds to meet the demands of the conference work. He may receive contributions for the budget in churches where there are no pastors. That he devote as much time to the promotional work of the conference as possible.

3. Commtitee Reports. Resolved that all reports of committees be made in writing, and handed to the secretary at the adoption by the conference.

4. Sunday Schools. Resolved that Sunday School be held at the camp on Sunday and those attending the camp ground groups be counted as attending in their respective churches. That all Sunday Schools under the supervision of Wesleyan Methodist pastors be counted in their statistical reports.

5. Quarterly Conference Reports. Resolved that all treasurer's books shall be audited quarterly and that all treasurers shall give a written itemized report of all receipts and disbursements at each quarterly conference.

6. Credentials. Resolved that each annual conference preacher present his credentials at the conference for their renewal and proper signature. And that paragraph 170 subdivision 2 of the Discipline shall be adhered to in renewing authorization of annual conference preachers.

7. Death or Illness. Resolved that the secretary be notified by telephone in case of death or critical illness in a minister's home and that he shall send notices at once to each pastor, and that each church and each pastor send at least \$2.00 to the stricken family.

8. Financial Year. Resolved that all pastors have settled with the conference treasurer and that the conference treasurer's books be closed by midnight Tuesday of the week preceding the meeting of the annual conference session and that all pastors and evangelists statistical reports be in the hands of the statistical committee not later than 5:00 p. m. of the first day of the annual conference.

Be it further resolved that the chairman of the statistical committee be elected at the annual conference session preceding the one in which he is to serve and that he be privileged to nominate his associates.

9. Moving Pastor. Resolved that each church make provisions for the moving of the incoming pastor, either by paying moving expenses or providing way to move him.

10. Vacations. Resolved that the conference president and all pastors be given a two weeks vacation with pay, with one Sunday absent from their pulpits.

11. Conference Entertainment. Resolved that each member and each visitor to the annual conference be required to pay two dollars for entertainment purposes and that children from 6 to 12 years of age pay one dollar.

12. Trustees. (A) Buying church property.

Resolved that all property purchased by a local congregation shall be taken in the name of the Alabama Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church, a corporation doing business in the State of Alabama.

Be it further resolved that: The following paragraph be

- 22

inserted in every deed: "That this property is taken in the name of the Alabama Conference exclusively for the benefit of the Wesleyan Methodist Church subject to the direction of its local Board of Trustees with the pastor and the Annual Conference with its Board of Trustees."

If the said local church shall cease to exist as an organizaized Wesleyan Methodist Church, the conference, at the direction of the President and his Advisory Board, with the approval of twothirds of the conference Board of Trustees, either separately or in session, shall have authority to do as it deems advisable in the local situation, and if any money is received from the sale of said property, it shall be used as Conference Missions Fund to establish another new church.

(B) Mortgaging Church Property.

1. Resolved that the Conference Trustees be empowered and requested to sign and execute a mortgage in behalf of any local church or church group. When the said church or church group shall request it at a business meeting, announced at each regular meeting for at least 8 days prior to the meeting and further provided that at least two thirds of the eligible local church voters are favorable. A copy of the said minutes of the local meeting shall be presented to the conference trustees together with a suitable mortgage properly drawn up for their approval and signatures.

2. That the local church property only shall be security for the mortgage in question.

(c) Selling Church Property.

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Resolved that if at any time the local church, at a public business meeting, which has been announced by the chairman of the local Board of Trustees at each public meeting for at least 8 days previously, shall if a two-thirds vote of the eligible voting membership, desire to sell, transfer, or trade the local church property, or any part thereof, that a copy of the minutes of this meeting be presented to the Chairman of the Annual Conference Trustees together with a warranty deed properly drawn, and that he be instructed to take into consideration the request together with the dead and if there is no moral issue involved, they shall sign the deed and thus convey a clear title to the said property.

13. Marriage. Resolved that no minister may perform a marriage involving a divorcee except in cases where thorough investigation reveals that the divorce has been on scriptural grounds. This does not prohibit the remarrying of persons who have been divorced from each other.

14. Resolved that the Alabama Conference of the Wesleyan Church assembled this 13th day of August 1952, go on record as emphasizing the importance of our people observing, both by precept and by example, the Bible principles of modestry and simplicity of dress and adornment; and that, as proper occasion affords, we admonish all Christians to refrain from the wearing of rings and other superfluos adornments for Jesus' sake. I Tim. 2:8-10. I Peter 3:1-5.

The Alabama Conference interprets the Discipline of the Wesleyan Methodist Church in its General Rules, Paragraph 45, and Special Rules, Paragraph 51, as forbidding the wearing of ornamental jewelry, including the wedding ring and all other rings, on the part of the members of the Church and forbidding the reception of any into full membership until they have left off the wearing of such ornaments.

15. Nominating Committees. Resolved that the nominating

Committee consisting of the Conference President, as chairman, two Elders and two Laymen be elected at each annual conference session for the purpose of nominating the session committees for the next following annual conference.

16. Resolved that each pastor see that the budget of his church is paid in full, and that when this is not paid the pastor involved must have his character passed by vote of the conference after satisfactory explanation is made to the body.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON GOALS

The Committee on Goals wish to submit the following re-

port: 1. We recommend that the members of the W. M. S. stress the importance of the Spirit-filled life and every society have a prayer band this following year.

2. We recommend that the president not only read the efficiency standard at the first meeting after conference, but also express the importance of Hebrews 6:12.

3. We recommend that each society of the W. M. S. strive with the "Help of our Lord" to have a gain of ten per cent in membership, helping to create a model society.

4. We recommend that each Society strive for an increase in Wesleyan Missionary subscriptions and that each local solicitor send a monthly report to the District Solicitor, who in turn will report to the Conference Solicitor monthly.

5. We recommend that each local society cooperate 100 per cent in the project of building a Guest House on the Campground to the sum of \$300.00.
