# DAILY PROCEEDINGS

### Tuesday-A. M.

The Seventy-Sixth Session of the Iowa Annual Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church, or Connection, of America met in the tabernacle at Charles City, Iowa, at 9:30 A. M., August 20, 1929. The President, Rev. C. S. Weigel, presiding in the chair.

Opened by singing "Faith of Our Fathers" and "A Charge to Keep I Have."

The President read the fourth chapter of 2 Corinthians. He gave a very helpful exposition of the chapter as applied to practical Christian experience, after which prayer was offered.

The roll call was answered by nine elders and seven annual conference preachers. Seven delegates were later added to the roll.

B. J. Hoover and Lester Fletcher were appointed a Committee on Credentials.

The President announced the first eight rows of seats in the two center sections as the Conference Bar.

The Fairview Church requested that the name of their church be changed to "Marengo." The request was granted.

The Committee on Credentials reported the names of Katrina Ruse from Wyanet, H. H. Fiser from Tuttle Grove, Clifford Hull from West Union, George Ebling from Bennezette, Laura Conkling from Wyanet, W. W. Howlett from Marengo, and Sadie Hoover from West Bureau as duly elected delegates. Accepted.

Mary Dodd and F. B. Andrews were appointed on the Itineracy and Orders Committee.

The Conference Treasurer tendered his report. Referred to the Auditing Committee.

R. Wesley Pryor, C. H. Barnett, George Ebling and B. J. Hoover were elected on the Nominating Committee.

day morning.

The President read a communication from S. W. Bond regarding his Christian experience and labors. He requested the privilege of choosing his own field of labor. The request was referred to the Committee on Pastoral Relations.

The name of F. B. Andrews was reported as delegate from the Charles City Church. The delegate was seated.

W. L. Braman moved to rescind the action placing the request of S. W. Bond in the hands of the Committee on Pastoral Relations, and to grant him the privilege of choosing his own field of labor. Carried.

Rev. F. R. Eddy, Connectional Representative, was introduced.

Miss Grace Davis, of the Kansas Conference and Missionary on furlough, was introduced.

The roll was called and the minutes were read, corrected and approved.

The report of the Committee on Moral Reform was read and adopted. See Report.

The Committee on Resolutions submitted its report. A motion prevailed that it be adopted and sent to the Wesleyan Methodist for publication.

The report of the Auditing Committee was read and adopted. See Report.

The Auditing Committee tendered their report regarding the funds in the bank failure. Adopted. See Report.

The Committee on Sunday Schools tendered their report. Adopted. See Report.

The report of the Committee on Itineracy and Orders was read and adopted. See Report.

President W. F. McConn of Miltonvale Wesleyan College presented the Educational Interests. He brought a very interesting message, in which the various problems, plans and spiritual life of the school were mentioned.

Communications from Rev. A. B. Gould and Rev. Melvina Johnson were read. The Secretary was instructed to send greetings to these members.

A motion carried that the minutes be apportioned the same as last year and that if any change in the number for any church is desired the same be reported to the Secretary.

A motion prevailed that the Minutes be sent to the Wesleyan Methodist Publishing House for publication; that the W. H. & F. M. Society Minutes be included, and that the expense be met from the Conference Fund.

Adjourned for Committee work. Benediction by Rev. Huffman.

The Committee on Pastoral Relations read its report.

Adjourned by limitation of time.

Opened by singing, after which Rev. C. R. Belknap conducted the devotions.

The roll was called and the minutes were read and approved.

The report of Committee on Pastoral Relations was adopted. See Report.

The report of the Committee on Post Office Addresses was read and adopted. See Report.

A vote of thanks was given Miss Ethel McGraff for work done on the 1927 Conference Minutes.

A motion prevailed that the Treasurer pay the bills for repairs on the Camp Ground property before leaving town.

A motion prevailed to create a library containing the books in the Course of Study, for use by the Conference Preachers. It was voted to place this in the hands of the Committee on Itineracy and Orders.

A letter of standing was granted Rev. R. Wesley Mack.

August 19, 1930, was fixed as the time for the next Conference and Camp Meeting to begin. The place was fixed at Charles City, Iowa.

Adjourned sine die.

# STANDING RULES

- I. On page 3, Vol. 3, of the Conference Records, the following is found: "On motion of Rev. S. A. Gilley, all resolutions of this Conference in annual session so far as adopted at previous meetings are hereby repealed."
- II. "Ordered that until further notice Annual Conference shall convene on Tuesday and not on Wednesday as heretofore."
- III. "Resolved, (1) That the President of the Conference shall be continued as permanent chairman of the Committee on Religious Services; (2) That the pastor and the first delegate of the charge at which the next Conference is to be held constitute the remaining members of the Committee for that session."
- IV. "Resolved, That all Sunday Schools under the pastoral oversight of Wesleyan Methodist pastors may be included in the Statistical report of the pastor having such school in charge."
- V. "Resolved, (1) That the time of opening and closing the meetings of the sessions be fixed as follows: Forenoon meetings open at 9:30 and close at 11:30; afternoon meetings open at 1:00 and close at the discretion of the body; (2) That the bar of the Conference be fixed and announced by the President; (3) That all visiting brethren and sisters in harmony with our doctrines and principles are invited to honorary seats in the Conference."
- VI. "Resolved, That the Conference tents be in charge of the President, who shall see that they have proper care and storage. He may rent the same, when not in use, to outside parties as opportunity affords and his judgment directs, and on such terms as he and the desiring parties may agree upon, the rental to be placed in the tent fund."
- VII. "Resolved, That all-papers and documents read before this Conference be referred to their respective Committees."
- VIII. "Resolved, That the Missionary Board is hereby authorized to pay out all moneys to be paid from the Conference Fund."
- IX. "Resolved, That all reports of Committees be made in writing, complete and ready for the printer, and handed to the Secretary at earliest possible date after such report is made."

- X. "Resolved, That the Conference Officers be not seated until the close of the Conference session at which they are elected."
- XI. "Resolved, (1) That the Conference be required, authorized, and appointed to travel the Conference as President, having general supervision of the spiritual interests and benevolences thereof, holding at least one service at each of the churches during the year, under such date as he may announce in advance; (2) He shall raise funds to meet the demands of the Conference work, receive contributions for missions, education, and superannuated ministers where there are no pastors and assist the pastors in raising the same where desired; (3) He shall have general supervision of the Church property within the bounds of the Conference, and shall inquire into the titles of the same to see that no property is loosely held, and shall look after the rental of Conference property, and see that the rent is placed in the Conference treasury; and shall investigate the possibility and the feasibility of the sale of Conference property not in use, and report his findings at the next annual Conference; (4) He shall devote as much time as possible and as occasion may afford in evangelistic and other meetings; (5) That he may engage such help from time to time as may be available and that he may consider properly qualified to assist in holding evangelistic and quarterly meetings; such help to be remunerated from the Evangelistic Fund; (6) That the pastors shall raise the Conference Budget and be assisted by the President when desirable; (7) He shall be paid from the Conference Budget the sum of one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) and expenses of travel and correspondence per year for his services, the same to be paid in advance quarterly."
- XII. "Resolved, That the Committee on Itineracy and Orders be ordered to furnish a list of the Conference Preachers and Licentiates entitled to vote at each Annual Conference as provided by the Discipline."
- XIII. "Resolved, That an elder on the stationed list holding Church and Conference membership in this Conference and residing without its bounds, the local church to which he belongs is entitled to a delegate for that elder."
- XIV. "Resolved, That the President be authorized to grant letters to members of disbanded classes."
- XV. "Resolved, That the pastors take an offering on their charges each year to pay for the Conference Minutes."
