## Journal of Daily Proceedings

The seventy-ninth session of the Champlain Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Connection of America, convened at Horicon, N. Y., April 20, 1920, at 7:30 P. M.

The meeting was called to order by the President, the Rev. E. D. Carpenter. Song, Let the Lower Lights be Burning, was sung. The President made some brief but interesting remarks. The Rev. C. E. Hill offered a very fervent prayer freighted with thanksgiving and praise to God for the many blessings He had bestowed upon us since the last session.

The Rev. J. J. Davison, read part of the sixth chapter of Ephesians, and brought the message of the evening from the text found in I. Samuel 15:22. The subject was Obedience. This message was the keynote for the occasion. At the close a rumber testified to the great victories gained by obedience. Praise God from Whom all Blessings Flow was sung. Benediction by the Rev. E. L. Elliott.

#### Wednesday Morning Meeting.

This meeting was in charge of the Rev. G. D. Jock. Song, Dwelling in Beulah Land, was sung. The Rev. W. S. Osgood and L. M. Hayes offered prayer. Scripture lesson read from II. Cor. 5. God's presence was felt in this service. The President taking the chair, the meeting was called to order. The roll was called, to which 14 elders, 2 licentiates and 15 delegates responded.

The Committee on Credentials gave his report. The same was adopted with the understanding that the future names be added without vote. The bar of the conference was moved and carried to be the first five rows of seats.

A Committee on Pastoral Credentials was elected as follows: The Revs. E. D. Carpenter and E. L. Elliott, and I. L. Prouty.

Motion made and carried that the time of opening and closing the sessions should be as follows: Open at 9 A. M. and close at 11:30 A. M. Open at 1:30 P. M. and close by vote. The Rev. C. E. Hill was called to the chair. The President made his annual report. The same was adopted. See Report No. 1.

The Committee on Pastoral Relations was elected as follows: Elders, J. J. Davison, A. J. Allen, H. S. Hill; Laymen, A. J. Howard, A. K. Chapman, G. C. Spoke.

It was moved and carried that all visiting members who are in harmony with our principles shall be welcome to honorary seats.

The Committee on Courtesy introduced the Rev. E. F. McCarty, Executive Secretary of the Forward Movement Commission, of Syracuse, N. Y.; the Rev. T. P. Baker, Missionary Secretary, from Indiana; Mrs. Edith Lee, Organizer of the Eastern District; the Rev. George H. Clarke, in the interest of the Y. M. W. B., the Rev. James Elliott, Missionary for South America. Each made remarks that were very interesting and helpful.

The Committee on Orders of the Day reported as follows.

Thursday at 9:30 A. M., Report on Forward Movement and Education, the Rev. E. F. McCarty and J. S. Luckey.

Thursday at 2 P. M., Meeting of the S. M. A Society Friday at 9:30 A M., Election of Conference Officers.

Friday evening, Missionary meeting. Saturday at 10 A. M., reports by Connectional and Conference Sunday-school Secretaries, I. F. McLeister and H. S. Hill. Preaching each day at 3 P. M. if time permits.

The above report was submitted by the Conference officers.

Motion made and carried to adjourn. Benediction by the Rev.

#### Wednesday Afternoon Meeting.

The devotional service was in charge of the Rev. G. N. Wyher. Song, I Walk with the King, was sung. Scripture lesson was read from the fourteenth chapter of Isaiah.

The roll was called, to which 17 elders answered to the call of their names; I licentiate and 17 delegates were present.

The Rev. I. F. McLeister, Connectional Sunday-school Secretary, from Syracuse, N. Y., was introduced to the conference and made brief remarks.

The Rev. C. E. Hill was called to the chair, and the name of the Rev. E. D. Carpenter was called and character passed. Order of the Day having arrived, the Rev. T. P. Baker spoke in behalf of the Publishing interests, and said many good and encouraging things.

Names of A. J. Allen and W. F. Lewis were called and their character passed. Song, All Hail the Power of Jesus' Name, was

The Rev. E. F. McCarty was the preacher of the hour. The

lesson was read from a portion of God's Word found in I. Peter, part of the first chapter. L. M. Hayes offered prayer. Florence Baxter sang a beautiful solo entitled, His Face Will Outshine them All. The text was found in I. Cor. 6:19, 20. This proved to be a gracious hour when our hearts were blessed.

At the evening service the Rev. A. J. Allen brought the message to us from Ezekiel 33;11.

#### Thursday Morning Meeting.

The song service was in charge of D. W. Summers. A number of prayers were offered. The Spirit of the Lord was present.

The Roll was called to which 17 elders, I licentiate and 20 delegates answered to the call of their names.

The minutes of the afternoon session were read and adopted. Moved and carried that the Committee on Evangelism, should at once correspond with the Rev. David Scott, to see if he could be secured as evangelist to work in our conference this conference year.

Statistical Report was read from the Macomb charge.

Professor J. S. Luckey, of Houghton, N. Y., was introduced, and made some very welcome remarks. The name of A. F. Lent was called and character passed.

The Order of the Day having arrived, the Rev. E. F. Mc-Carty and Professor J. S. Luckey spoke on the interests of the Forward Movement and Education. Their talk was very interesting, encouraging and helpful. At the close many of the people present felt like the spies of old, Joshua and Caleb, that we were well able to go forward and possess the land.

Session closed by limitation. Benediction by W. N. Osgood.

#### Thursday Afternoon Meeting.

The devotional service was in charge of F. E. Wood. The Scripture lesson was read from the seventeenth chapter of St. John.

At the call of the Roll 17 elders, I licentiate and 20 delegates responded to the call of their names.

The minutes of the morning meeting was read and approved. The Committee on Courtesy introduced the Rev. Ralph H. Houseman, of Saratoga Springs, N. Y., Superintendent of Division No. 9 of the New York State Sunday-school Association. He gave a very interesting talk on the work of the Sunday-school.

The Order of the Day was the meeting of the Superannuated Ministers' Relief Association. See Report No. 2 for the same.

The preaching hour having arrived, Rock of Ages was sung. F. H. Wright offered prayer. The Rev. E. F. Wood sang a solo, My Father is at the Helm. The Rev. I. F. McLeister was the preacher of the hour. Scripture lesson was read from II. Kings 6. His subject was The Lost Axe. Many good things were said. If we are to succeed we must have the spirit of enterprise that grips our hearts and gives us a vision. Brother Carpenter exhorted the people to accept Christ and flee from the wrath to come.

The name of V. D. Otis called and character passed.

Statistical report read from Long Lake. The names of A. E. Moses, T. A. Moses, Richard Palmer, G. N. Wyher, J. F. Wright, O. G. Wyman were called and characters passed. The Rev. G. N. Wyher requested the conference to excuse him from the remaining part of the conference session. His request was granted.

Moved and adopted to adjourn. Benediction by T. P. Baker.

Conference Sunday School Secretary, the Rev. H. S. Hill. Associate Helpers: The Rev. F. H. Wright was elected for the Northern District; the Rev. W. F. Lewis for the Southern District.

Committee on Itinerancy and Orders: F. H. Wright to succeed himself; the Rev. E. L. Elliott, elected to fill the vacancy of E. D. Carpenter.

Committee on Presidency: E. L. Elliott, W. F. Lewis, D. W. Summers, Elders; Laymen, I. L. Prouty and L. A. Stafford.

Judiciary Committee, J. J. Davison, C. E. Hill, E. Trowbridge and F. E. Weed.

Tithing Secretary, the Rev. W. F. Lewis.

It was voted that the President should nominate the Advisory Board.

Committee on Missionary Board, President A. J. Allen, E. L. Elliott, L. M. Hayes and the President of the W. H. & F. M. Society.

Camp-Meeting Committee, President A. J. Allen, and the pastors of West Chazy, Mooers, West Plattsburg; Laymen, L. A. Stafford, Steven Wright and Dr. W. A. Stevenson.

Invitation to entertain the next session of the Conference, was extended from the Corinth and Lisbon Center churches. The place decided upon was Lisbon Center. The Time Committee should request of the Board that it should be the week of the last Sunday of April, 1921.

The Rev. E. D. Carpenter was appointed to preach the opening sermon, the Rev. C. A. Heath, alternate.

Brother Carpenter and Brother Allen spoke of the pleasaut association they had had in the many years they had labored together. At the close of the talks, the Rev. C. E. Hill offered a fervent prayer that the blessing of God should rest and remain upon the Champlain Conference.

The congregation stood and sung, Blest be the Tie that Binds. Binds.

By virtue of the fact that A. J. Allen was elected President, E. D. Carpenter was kept on the Committee on Pastoral Relations.

Moved and supported that the matter of uniting the Wesleyan Conferences of New York State should be considered, and a joint committee was appointed as follows: Chairman, E. D. Carpenter, A. J. Allen and E. L. Elliott.

Moved and supported that the Champlain Conference accept the action of the Forward Movement to the best of its ability.

Song, All Hail the Power of Jesus' Name, was sung. Adjourned by limitation. Benediction by C. A. Heath.

#### Friday Afternoon Meeting.

The devotional service was led by H. S. Hill. Prayer was offered by C. A. Heath. A number of testimonies were given. This was a precious service. The dews of heaven fell upon our souls.

The Rev. E. D. Carpenter offered a prayer of thanks to God in the way He had raised up our Connectional Agent, the Rev. J S. Willett, and that he might be spared for many years.

At the calling of the Roll 15 elders, I licentiate and 17 delegates answered to the call of their names.

Minutes of the morning session were read and approved after slight correction.

Moved that our President, Brother A. J. Allen, write a letter in behalf of the Conference greeting Brother Willett.

The Conference elected E. L. Elliott a Committee of Resolutions in the absence of F. H. Wright.

The Rev. A. J. Allen was elected Chairman of the Camp-Meeting Committee, to fill the vacancy of E. D. Carpenter. Moved and carried that the President should nominate the Advisory Board, which he did as follows: H. S. Hill and S. H. Miller.

The Committee on Pastoral Relations gave their report. The same was adopted as read. See Report No. 5.

Moved that the President be authorized to secure help to preach in the afternoon of the next annual session.

The names of C. E. Hill, E. L. Elliott, H. S. Hill and D. W. Summers were called and characters passed.

The order of the day having arrived, Marching to Zion was sung. C. E. Hill offered prayed. C. L. Hill and Florence Baxter sang a duet.

The Rev. T. P. Baker was the preacher. The text was the 8th, 9th and 10th verses of the 15th chapter of St. Luke. Subject, The Lost Coin. Many searching truths were brought before us. If we are to derive from the Scriptures what the Lord expects, we must get beneath the surface of ourselves. God is the King of his kingdom. He is the supreme ruler, and we cannot be excused of what the King demands of us, for He will deal with us at His coming. God knows our ability and will not require the impossible. He is not only our leader, He is our protector.

Motion to adjourn. Benediction by D. W. Summers.

#### Friday Evening Service.

At the calling of the Roll 15 elders, I licentiate and 15 delegates responded to the call of their names.

Minutes of the afternoon session were read and the same were adopted.

Committee on Resolutions gave their report. The same was adopted, with the understanding that the Resolution on Entertainment should be read Sunday morning. See Resolution No. 1.

Committee on Evangelism reported and the same was approved.

Moved and carried, that the securing of an evangelist be left with the Missionary Board with power to act.

Moved that the Conference Budget should be 25 cents. Motion was carried.

E. D. Carpenter was called to the chair while A. J. Allen made the Treasurer's Report. See Report No. 8.

Moved that the Champlain Conference extend an invitation to the Wesleyan Methodist churches of the Canada Conference to unite with our Conference. The Rev. E. D. Carpenter was appointed Committee on Resolutions of the same. See Resolution No. 2.

The names of G. D. Jock, J. J. Davison, E. Trowbridge and F. E. Wood were called and characters passed.

The Order of the Day having arrived, All Hail the Power of Jesus' Name was sung. The Conference Sunday-School Secretary gave a brief talk. In his remarks he said that he had presented the work of the Sunday-school in 13 different churches during the last conference year. See Report No. 9.

The Rev. I. F. McLeister, Connectional Sunday-school Secretary, presented the great work that the Sunday-school is doing in the different conferences. One of the good things he said was that many of the great men of our nation had been made such through the efforts of the Sunday-school, and that we not only wanted big Sunday-schools but that we wanted better schools, and that success is in keeping in the main lines of the teaching of salvation.

Moved to adjourn. Benediction by W. N. Osgood.

## PRESIDENT'S ANNUAL REPORT FOR CONFERENCE YEAR,

#### 1919-1920.

I. Gave an order on the Treasurer in favor of O. G. Wyman for \$5.50, being for the purchase of a new Conference Record book, May 21.

2. Gave A. O. Northrup, a licentiate, a transfer to the Lock-

port Conference. Date, June 13, 1919.
