JOURNAL OF DAILY PROCEEDINGS.

The Lockport Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Connection, or Church, of America convened for its fifty-second annual session in the Wesleyan Methodist Church at Houghton, Allegany Co., N. Y., April 2, 1913, at nine o'clock A. M. The previous even-

ing a farewell meeting was held for Sisters Hattie Crosby and Florence Yorton, outgoing missionaries to Africa.

The Conference was called to order by the President, Rev. C. W. Smith.

The devotions were conducted by Rev. H. J. Bullock and Rev. H. C. Bedford.

The roll was called and ten elders and four licentiates responded to their names.

The Committee on Credentials was constituted as follows: J. E. Bathurst, Clayton Ball.

The Committee on Credentials made a partial report. The report was adopted and the names were ordered placed on the roll.

The bar of the conference was fixed for the first four seats in front of the pulpit.

Rev. C. B. Whitaker, of the Indiana Conference, and pastor of Houghton charge, was introduced to the Conference.

Rev. J. J. Coleman, of the Indiana Conference, and Professor of Theology in Houghton Seminary, was introduced to the Conference.

Miss Gladis Gates and Miss Mable Morris, of the Olean Mission, were introduced to the Conference.

The Rev. F. S. Lee resigned as Secretary. On motion the Conference proceeded to elect a Secretary. The President appointed W. A. Hazlett and E. L. Carnahan as Tellers. The Conference proceeded to ballot for Secretary. The whole number of ballots cast was twenty-seven, of which H. C. Bedford received twenty-four, C. L. Smith received two, H. W. McDowell one. H. C. Bedford received a majority and was declared Secretary.

Rev. T. S. Simpson, pastor of the Free Methodist Church at Rushford, was introduced to the Conference.

The time for the opening and closing of the conference was fixed as follows: The morning session to open at eight-thirty and close at eleven-thirty; the afternoon session to open at one-thirty and close by motion.

The Conference proceeded to ballot for Secretary. Whole number of votes cast thirty-four, H. C. Bedford receiving thirty-

two. F. S. Lee one, C. L. Smith one. H. C. Bedford received a majority and was declared elected.

The Conference through its Secretary cast the ballot for W. S. Crandall for Assistant Secretary. W. S. Crandall was declared elected

The Conference proceeded to ballot for the Treasurer. Whole number of ballots cast thirty-five, H. R. LaVere receiving thirtyfour, E. B. Houghton one. H. R. LaVere received a majority and was declared elected.

The Conference proceeded to ballot for Sunday School Secretary. Whole number of votes cast, thirty-three. R. E. Rindtuzs thirty-two, I. S. Luckey one, R. E. Rindfusz received a majority and was declared elected.

The Conference through a teller cast its ballot for Henry R. Barnett for Tithing Secretary.

REPORTS.

Report No. 1 .- The President's Report.

Dear Brethren and members of the Lockport Conference:— Through the kind providence of God we are permitted to assemble in the fifty-second annual session of Conference. Harmony and peace reign supreme among us. To the God of all grace belongeth the praise. While death has not invaded the ranks of the ministry yet a great loss has been sustained by the Church in the death of Sister Minnie McConnell, wife of the Rev. R. McConnell.

Sustaining as we do a pastoral relation we have felt it our duty to confine ourselves more to pastoral work than during the previous year hence we have not been in as close personal contact with the charges and cannot report as fully from observations, but through the correspondence good work has been done by the pastors, several of whom have had excellent additions to their churches. All reports indicate that a deeper type of spiritual preaching has been presented and its effects are being manifest in the churches. More than ordinary efforts have been put forth during the year by the pastors for the salvation of men which in most instances have been attended with visible results. In our annual report of last year your attention was called to the pressing need of efficient evangelism. We are yet confronted with this serious problem, not that we do not have men of the right type and ability, but the need of pastors is so great that our ministers are held by pastoral relations which forbid outside evangelistic work only in a limited sense.

In these days of worldliness, apostasy and lack of church attendance one of the greatest dangers lies in the lack of fullest cooperation on the part of our people in the maintenance of church attendance. Lack of interest at this point means a depreciation along all other lines of Church activity. In consideration of the needs herein stated it is fitting that we renew the Apostolic covenant that "We will give ourselves continually to prayer and to the ministry of the Word," praying the Lord of the harvest to send forth laborers into his vineyard.

The work of the year and the general condition of the Conference is as follows:

I. In reference to the tent meetings, only one was held in which the results were very gratifying. The conference not having

an evangelist in the field and the Missionary Board not being able to secure more than one (the Rev. D. H. Scott, singing evangelist) we had to dispense with further meetings.

- 2. The Missionary interests of the Conference are in an en-Under the faithful labors of the Rev. C couraging condition. Leslie Smith and wife the city missionary work in Bradford is in the best condition we have known. Bethesda Home was reopened in June and under the faithful labors of the matron, Miss Grace Cole, is receiving the attention and co-operation of the people of the city. In our judgment conditions warrant the addition of an assistant matron in the Home which until now the Missionary Board has not been able to secure. With the addition of an assistant we believe the work can be made nearly if not quite self supporting outside of the salaries of the workers. Under the consecrated efforts of Miss Stella Crosby the Olean Mission has maintained its interests. The Missionary Board were fortunate in securing the services of the Misses Mable Morris and Gladis Gates, who came to us highly recommended and have done excellent work, At a proper time the missionary interests of the Conference will be presented by the workers.
- 3. The Camp-meeting interests have had unusual consideration by our people and the largest attendance in recent years. Weadvise special consideration be given this part of our work at the time the Camp-meeting Committee reports.
- 4. Referring to the duplex envelope system for Church finance which was adopted at the last session of the Conference, we beg leave to report, that as far as we have been informed the charges using the same have been highly gratified with the results. We strongly advise all of our charges to use it the coming year. If properly worked we believe the annual obligations of the charges for all purposes will be raised in full.

Let us emphasize Sunday School work. If the young people of our Church, congregation, and community are not in-

terested or are more so in another Sunday School than in our own, the future of our Church is in jeopardy and the result easily foretold.

We have too long neglected the methods of up-to-date Sunday School workers and are glad that our denomination is urging upor, us the organization of our schools to conform to the plan presented.

A few of the churches of our conference are paying especial attention to their Schools. At Hess Koad the School has been graded into the different departments with added interest and increased attendance. Houghton has greatly increased the attendance, and also efficiency, special attention being given to getting the scholars to be on time.

Cattaraugus has also increased in membership and is striving for the "Front Line" standard as outlined by the State S. S. Association and hopes to receive in June at the State Convention a certificate.

May God bless every effort put forth to increase the efficiency of our Sabbath Schools and the coming year be a most successful one, as the result of co-operation between the pastors and superintendents of the Lockport Conference.

Permit me to offer the following suggestions:

- That a sufficient appropriation be made to provide blanks for statistical reports and necessary expense of the secretary.
- 2. That a uniform Teacher's Training course be adopted for the conference. I would recommend the following course:

Outline Studies in the Old Testament, Outline Studies in the New Testament, by Jesse L. Hurlbut, D.D.; Primer on Teaching, Sabbath School Methods, One to Twenty-one.

- 3. That a time be set apart during the annual campineeting for the presentation and discussion of Sunday School interests; the program to be arranged by the conference Sunday School Board.
- 4. That we earnestly urge all pastors and Superintendents to bring the Sunday School to the standard as outlined in the discipline.

His exceptional ability as an editor and writer, his rare power as a preacher of the Gospel, and his strong and winning personality have won the highest esteem from our people and have made for him a host of friends in other denominations. We therefore deeply deplore the fact that his physical condition has necessitated his resignation from the position which he has so long and so ably filled. We hereby extend to him and his family our sincere sympathy and assure him that our prayer will be for his speedy recovery to health and for many added years of service to the Church.

Report No. 18. Committee on Budget.

I. The Connectional budget for education is \$825, and all money paid for current expenses of Houghton Seminary, all money paid on Educational pledges, and all interest (but not principal) paid on Educational notes may count towards this budget.

2. The Connectional budget for Home and Foreign Missions is \$825, and all money paid for the current expenses of Home and Foreign Missions, all money appropriated to this purpose by the W. H. & F. M. Society, and all money paid by the Y. M. W. B. may be counted toward this budget.

- 3. We recommend that the amount of the Conference budget be \$1000, that nothing but cash may count toward this budget, and that this amount shall cover all Conference expenses except the fund for superannuated ministers.
- 4. We recommend that the charges shall raise all three budgets as a whole, that this total budget shall be raised and paid over quarterly, that for all money not paid to the Conference treasurer, a duplicate receipt shall be given, which receipt shall be given to the Conference treasurer, that it shall be optional with each charge to divide this total budget or to pay it over undivided, and that undivided parts must be paid to the Conference treasurer.
- 5. If a charge divides its total budget, we recommend that this rule be followed: all money designated by the donor shall be placed in the fund designated, but all money not designated by the donor shall be so distributed that, as far as possible, each fund, including the sums designated for that fund, shall have the same per cent of its apportionment. This rule shall apply till each fund is complete; after that the charge may divide as it shall see fit.
- 6. We recommend that the Conference treasurer shall place all money designated and all the receipts in the fund designated, and that at the end of each quarter all undivided money shall be so distributed that each fund, including the sums designated for that fund, shall have the same per cent of its apportionment.
- 7. We recommend that the Conference treasurer shall pay to the proper persons at the end of each quarter all Connectional funds in his possession.
- 8. We recommend that no charge shall receive credit on its budget except for cash or receipts sent to the Conference treasurer.
- 9. We recommend that each pastor shall include in his statistical report these items: Total Budget Assigned and Total Budget Raised, that the second item shall not be filled in till the pastor has settled with the Conference treasurer, and that the amount placed in this second item shall be the amount reported to the pastor by the Conference treasurer.
- 10. We recommend that Bradford be excused from all apportionment, that Cameron, Delevan and Machias, Higgins, Short Tract, Wyoming and Holland be rated at half membership, and that the total budget be then apportioned pro rata. On this basis the apportionment is as follows:
