PUBLIC SERVICES

Tuesday, 7:30 p.m., August 6, 1963

The Tuesday evening service opened with Rev. Raymond Powers, Jr. leading the congregation in singing, "At the Cross" and "My Redeemer." Prayer was offered by Mr. W. B. Boles. The Conference President, Rev. Earl T. Gentry, presided at the service. Rev. Paul Rampey, president of the Buckingham Tabernacle Association, presented the camp meeting program, IPTAY. Special music for the service was presented by the Central Wesleyan College Quartet. Rev. Michael Terifay, pastor at Washington, D. C., preached the conference sermon choosing as his subject. "My Church." His message was based on scripture from Galations 5:25, Mark 11:11, and Matthew 16:13-18. He stressed that Christ loved the church enough to die for it, that He built the church, and that He inspected the church. Rev. Terifay stated that the primary purpose of the church is the salvation of souls. He emphasised that the church belong to Jesus Christ, not to us as individuals. In closing Rev. Terifay raised the question. "What have we contributed to the church?" Following the service an all-night prayer vigil was begun at 10:30 p.m. lasting until 6:00 a.m.

Wednesday, 7:30 p.m., August 7, 1963

Mrs. Earl T. Gentry, president of the WMS, presided at the public missionary service. She introduced Mrs. Betty McKinley. WMS conference music director, who led the congregation in singing, "Our Best" and I Love to Tell the Story." Mrs. Gentry introduced Rev. and Mrs. Crosby, missionaries to Colombia. South America, who had just returned to the United States, Mrs. Crosby introduced two of their children who were with them. Steve and Susie. The daughter, Susie, then recited the first Psalm in Spanish. Mrs. Crosby was in charge of devotions reading from Roman 10 and leading in prayer. A ministers' double quartet sang, "Soul's Desire." Three ladies from the Welcome Church presented a skit entitled, "Mr. and Mrs. I'm A Body." A ladies chorus sang, "Speak My Lord." Rev. Crosby spoke on "How beautiful are the feet of them that preach the gospel of peace" from Romans 10:15. In his message he gave a brief survey of the work in Columbia. The Wesleyans had an increase of 44 members last year in eight organized churches and six outposts. Mrs. Gentry introduced the Conference Project which is three-fold-Kamakwie Secondary School, Pioneer Pastor's Salary, and World Missions. Rev. Hal Robbins spoke briefly about the Kamakwie School, Rev. Earl Gentry on the Pioneer Pastor's Salary, and Rev. Virgil Mitchell spoke for World Missions Cash and pledges received amounted to \$1,465.06.

Thursday, 7:30 p.m., August 8, 1963

The Ordinatioin Service was under the direction of Rev. Frank B. Dennard. Rev. Raymond Powers, Jr. led the congregation in singing, "Blessed Assurance." Prayer was offered by General Superintendent, V. A. Mitchell. The congregation then sang, "The Cross Is Not Greater." A minister's quartet sang, "All The Way My Saviour Leads Me" after which Rev. Paul A. Wheeler delivered the Ordination Sermon. His subject was, "An Excellent Ministry" using scripture from I Timothy 4: 11-16. Rev. Wheeler stated that the minister is not selling notions, he has far more to offer. He gave three sides of the ministry-public, private, results. The three-fold purpose of the ministry stated by him was reading, preaching, and teaching. At the close of the message Rev. Charles S. King and Rev. Paul W. McKinley were presented for ordination. The father of Rev. Paul McKinley, Rev. O. G. McKinley, prayed the prayer of dedication. General Superintendent V. A. Mitchell participated in the ceremony.

RESOLUTIONS

NO. 1

Resolved, that the board of trustees of each church be composed of three members elected by ballot by the church and three members elected by the Virginia Conference.

Further, that the trustees of the Virginia Wesleyan Methodist Churches together with the president of said conference, be and they hereby are empowered to executive all necessary to papers, mortgage deeds and papers of a like character, when necessary to secure loans to the Virginia Wesleyan Methodist Churches needing funds to liquidate conference, church, or parsonage property indebtedness, provided that the part or parties requesting such action shall set forth the true nature and purpose for which the loan is requested and that the trustees and the President are satisfied that the object for which the loan or loans is sought is both nescessary, legal, and desirable.

Further, the the Virginia Conference require all deeds to buildings for worship, parsonages, and all other buildings, built or purchased, be deeded to the above described board of Trustees, and that all other buildings for conference use be deed to the three (3) Trustess elected by the Virginia Conference. All property held by the Board of Trustees is to be used by our ministry and membership according to our book of discipline.

NO. 2

Resolved, that the President and his Advisory Board be made a deed examining committee for the Board of Trustees and that as soon as a deed is made, before it is recorded, it be sent to this committee for its approval and for the insertion of such disciplinary clauses and/or other clauses to make it safe for our denomination.

NO. 3

Resolved, That all persons under conference appointment be requested to subscirbe to THE WESLEYAN METHODIST.

NO. 4

Resolved, That our pastors and churches prohibit any and all preachers from occupying our pulpits, if said preachers cannot show proper license or credentials from some Church organization, which credentials must be satisfactory to the pastor, that the said preacher is in harmony with our church doctrines.

NO. 5

Resolved, That in order to properly safeguard the welfare and interests of the local churches and conference, no pastor

hold more than two (2) revival meetings away from his appointment during any conference year, without permission from his church; a two-thirds majority vote of those members present and voting on such a request from the pastor shall constitute permission from his church.

NO. 6

That the duties of the Virginia Annual Conference Treasurer be defined as follows:

First: He shall receive all funds paid in for use of the said Annual Conferenc at its regular Annual Session. He shall keep the accounts in a substantial book, in proper form, indicating who paid the money and for what purpose it was paid, and shall turn over the books, together with all money and other values on hand belonging to the Conference, to his successors in office. All money must be paid to the Treasurer and be paid by him to the sub-treasurers where there is such, with the following exceptions: If the pastors pay budget money to the sub-treasurers, the Annual Conference Treasurer shall receive all such receipts and give the pastor credit on such items as are indicated on the receipts issued by the sub-treasurer.

Second: All money received by the treasurer or sub-treasurers shall be paid out as the conference shall order and in accordance with our book of discipline.

Third: On the first day of each month, or as near thereto as possible, the Annual Conference Treasurer shall disburse all monies on hand designated for General Budget items; except such disbursement to be made to the proper denominational departments.

Fourth: He shall pay out all conference funds as directed by the Board of Managers of the Conference and/or upon the receipt of proper warrants.

Fifth: All money coming into his hands by wills or estates, gifts, or other donations, shall be held in trust by him for the Virginia Conference of The Wesleyan Methodist Church of America, until the next session of the Annual Conference; and when such gifts, will, donations, or estates shall be cash, the Treasurer shall deposit this money in a National Bank in his name as Treasurer of the Virginia Annual Conference of The Wesleyan Methodist Church of America.

Sixth: The Treasurer's books shall be submitted to the Auditing Committee of the Annual Conference at each session.

Seventh: The Treasurer of the Conference shall be required to keep the funds of the conference deposited in a bank that insures the deposits of its patrons.

NO. 7

Resolved, That no church property within the bounds of the Conference be encumbered to pay Pastor's salary, current expenses, or budget claims, either General or Conference.

NO. 8

Resolved, That the President and his Advisory Board appoint a Nominationg Committee composed of three (3) elders and three (3) laymen, and that sufficient alternates be appointed.

Second: The members of this committee shall be rotated each year so that no member will serve on it more than once in three (3) years and that consideration also be given to having as many churches represented on the committee as possible.

Third: The President shall call this committee together one day preceding the opening of the Annual Conference session to nominate all conference committees.

NO. 9

Resolved, That all persons receiving Conference appointment be required to practice storehouse tithing and that the license of those who do not comply with this request be not renewed.

NO. 10

Resolved, That every pastor, church, or building committee contemplating making any repairs, erecting new buildings, for either church or investments for buildings, first consult the Committee on Church and Parsonage Buildings and that the Trustees be directed to withhold the signing of papers for loans until the Trustees are satisfied by a written report of the Committee on Church and Parsonage Buildings that their instructions have been complied with. It is recommended that the church so calling on the aforesaid committee pay the expenses of the committee.

This resolution permits repairs to be made to church property, to restore the same to original condition, free of debt, without contacting the Committee on Church and Parsonage Buildings. Authorization must be granted by the proper committee for any repairs which incur debt or any alterations of any kind in landscaping and structures of building and property.

NO. 11

Resolved, That when a charge or charges are placed in the hands of the Judiciary Committee against a Church, Elder, or Conference Preacher, and the matter is brought to trail, that in the event such charges against a Church, Elder, or Conference Preacher are sustained that the conference bear such expenses that may be incurred by the Judiciary Committee in the carrying on the trail and in the event such charges are not sustained after the trial of the case, that the party or parties making such charges bear the expenses of the Judiciary Committee.

Resolved, That the Conference fiscal year be July 1 through June 30th and that each pastor compile all figures for his annual statistical report in triplicate and that one statistical blank be a "scratch copy;" that other two copies be mailed to the Conference Presidents Office not later than July 15.

That the character and checking committee shall examine these two copies, returning one to the pastor and other copy to retained in the Conference files.

That statistical reports not mailed by July 20th shall not be approval by this committee, but shall be referred to the beginning session of the Annual Conference.

(This resolution will replace No's.12 and 15 and succeeding resolutions will be numbered accordingly).

NO. 13

Whereas, Many times appeals are received by pastors and churches for financial assistance on building projects when said pastors and churches do not know whether or not the property is deeded properly, or is in a suitable location or whether the prospects are favorable for a permanent location;

Be it Resolved, That in order that pastors and churches may know when it is safe to make contributions when appeals are made, that said appeals bear the signature of at least one member of the Board on Church and Parsonage Building, and one member of the Board of Trustees.

NO. 14

Resolved, That all Churches, Missions, and Ministers working under the direction of the Conference Board of Managers be required to report monthly to the Chairman of the Board of Managers and that this report be read to the church or Mission before it is sent as above directed, and that the Pastor and the Church Clerk or Secretary sign the above report.

Be it further resolved: That all Churches, Missions, and Ministers working under the direction of the Conference President and his Advisory Board be required to report monthly to the Conference President and his Advisory Board, and that the pastor and Church Clerk or Secretary sign the above report.

NO. 15

Resolved, That all new churches, for a period of two years, be exempt from the paying of 50 per cent of Conference Budget. This to be effective beginning with the Conference of 1960.

Resolved, concerning the Sunday School Enrollment, that . . .

- A. Scholars can be enrolled by attending three out of five Sundays.
- B. That scholars can be dropped from the roll:
 - 1. When they absent themselves for eight consecutive Sundays;
 - 2. After they have been visited.
- C. If taken off the roll, thye be placed on an inactive roll with their addresses.

Be it further resolved: That the average attendance be based on fifty (50) Sundays, rather than 52 Sundays, permitting the school to leave off the two lowest Sundays.

Walter Jeffries gave excellent guidance in his evangelistic emphasis at Wesleyan Youth Camp with as many as 35 youth seeking spiritual help in one service; General Supt. Harold K. Sheets and Dr. W. T. Dayton giving wonderfully to us from their storehouse of things both old and new. Witnesses to reclamation, salvation and sanctification were given.

The church-wide Conference on evangelism held in Indianapolis, Indiana early January, 1963 very definitely set the pace for our Quadrennial thrust. The 1963 General Conference followed the spiritual leadership of our church and set as our theme for the Quadrennium ahead: "EVANGELIZE NOW."

It is hoped that the Virginia churches, each pastor and member will go "all out" to make meaningful this theme for the next four years.

To the success of Christ's kingdom I pledge my best and do

here and now call upon each Wesleyan Methodist in the State of Virginia to answer the challenge of our Theme Chorus:

"... O may this hour be one of beginning
The story of pardon to tell."

OFFICIAL ACTS OF THE PRESIDENT

Earl T. Gentry, President

August 1, 1962 — July 31, 1963

August 10, 1962 — At the time of Annual Conference 1962 negotiations were under way to supply the Second Wesleyan Methodist Church, Roanoke, Virginia and the Farmville Church.

We recommended that Raymond L. Phaup be appointed pastor at Farmville and that the Rev. G. R. Phaup be appointed pastor of the Second Wesleyan Methodist Church, Roanoke, Virginia. The Wesleyan Methodist Church of Lynchburg requested privilege to employ Dr. E. S. Nothstine for Revival in the Fall of 1962. We recommended this request be granted.

August 16, 1962 — We recommended that Ernest L. Shigley's credentials be received as of August 15, 1962 and that he be declared no longer an Elder in the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America.

We recommended that the Conference President be declared interim pastor of the First Wesleyan Methodist Church, Richmond, Virginia until such time as a minister can be secured.

August 19, 1962 — We recommended that a copy of the minutes of the President's Advisory Board and the board members of the First Wesleyan Methodist Church of Richmond, Virginia become a record to be retained in the Virginia Conference files.

September 7, 1962 — We recommended the Rev. Stephen Watkins be appointed pastor of Bailey Memorial Church, Salem, Virginia,

September 13, 1962 — We recommended the Rev. Lester Dix to be appointed to the work of Conference Evangelist.

September 18, 1962 — We recommended that the request be granted the Danville Church to employ an evangelist from outside the denomination.

October 30, 1962 — We recommended that the Stuart Church be given permission to employ an evangelist from outside the denomination.

January 19, 1963 — At the request of the Clement Memorial Church, Altavista, Virginia. We appointed the Rev. Joe Shields, Assistant to the Pastor, until the Annual Conference, 1963.

March 26, 1963 — We recommended that Dr. E. S. Nothstone be received as Elder on Trial for one year from Annual Conferece 1963 subject to qualificatios for Pension and Insurance.

May 29, 1963 — The President's Advisory Board conferred about matters pertaining to Minnies Chapel Church, Stuart, Virginia. We recommended setting a time of meeting between Conference President and leaders of Minnies Chapel Church toward solution of the local church problems which were apparent in the adverse vote on the pastor. Further action is to be recommended by the Conference President if the church congregation, any Board or Committee decline the recommended procedures of the President's Advisory Board.

June 22, 1963 — Received and approval a deed of correction for the Welcome Wesleyan Methodist Church according to Resolution No. 2.

July 31, 1963 — According to Resolution No. 8 of the 1962 Annual Journal of the Virginia Conference, the Conference President appointed the following to serve on the Nominating Committee for the 1963 Annual Conference. Elders: W. Lee Cockerill, Paul Ray, F. B. Dennard, Alternate—Hal G. Robbins, Jr. Laymen: C. T. Wade, Alfred Owens, H. H. Ripley, Alternate, W. R. Mannon. In all actions of the Advisory Board, the President consulted with and permission given in writing or by telephone.

August 6, 1963 — A transfer was issued to the Rev. Michael Terifay to the Kentucky Conference.

Report No. 3

PRESIDENT'S RECOMMENDATIONS

"Evangelize Now" the theme for our new quadrennium must become more than a slogan to Virginia Wesleyan Methodists. The beginning basis of all spiritual endeavor is in prayer. I recommend that the conference renew the plan for "PLEDGED PRAYERS" and that each pastor with his church leaders set a way for prayer and fasting each week in interest of "Evangelizing Now!" THIS EFFORT TO BE PROMOTED THROUGH THE CONFERENCE SECRETARY ON EVANGELISM.

Church Extension: Each pastor should lead his laymen in study of our church extension problems and opportunity in Virgina. I recommend that we unite in the "Card Call" plan for church extension; that we give assurance by our prayers and cooperation to the incoming Executive Scertary of the Church Extension Department, Rev. C. Wesley Lovin: that each Sunday School in Virginia be urged to receive the offering on Easter Sunday for Church Extension to be channeled through the Conference Treasurer for a specified project to be determined by the Board of Managers at their Fall, 1963 meeting. THE CON-FERENCE SECRETARY OF SUNDAY SCHOOLS SHALL HAVE PRIMARY RESPONSIBILITY IN PROMOTION OF EASTER OFFERING IN COOPERATION WITH THE BOARD OF MANAGERS.

Tithing-Stewardship — Friends and members should be encouraged to give at least one-tenth of their earnings to the church. I recommend that each pastor and Board of Stewards be requested to meet monthly, review finances, plan for ways and means to increase our Christian stweardship and disburse the 11% Apportionment and General Budget to the Conference Treasurer by the 15th of each month. THE CONFERENCE TITHING SECRETARY IS REQUESTED TO SET A GOAL FOR THE NUMBER OF TITHERS AND OTHERWISE PROMOTE THIS PROGRAM.

The Virginia Vision: There is a need for a promotional organ within the Conference. I recommend the Conference authorize the publication of the VIRGINIA VISION bi-monthly, that each District Chairman be a contributing Editor, that the paper be financed through the District Preachers and Laymen's Meeting and with free-will offerings; any deficits shall be handled by the Board of Managers. THE CONFERENCE PRESIDENT AND THE BOARD OF MANAGERS SHALL BE PROMOTERS OF THIS PROJECT.

Buckingham Tabernacle: I recommend the Conference approve the plan, "I Pay Twelve A Year" (IPTAY) and request each pastor to encourage each member of his congregation and all the departments within his church to subscribe to this plan of support for our Annual Camp Meeting. Each pastor is urged to attend the week-day services (and Sunday's, if possible) and he is hereby requested to urge his people to attend the week-end meetings (and week-day services, if possible). I recommend that IPTAY be presented at the 1963 Annual Conference and that opportunity be given on Tuesday night for churches, departments within the churches and individuals support this program. THE PRESIDENT OF THE BUCKINGHAM TABERNACLE ASSOCIATION AND THE BUSKINGHAM BOARD SHALL BE PROMOTERS OF THIS PROJECT.

Wesleyan Men: This year has revealed revival among Wesleyan Men. I recommend that each pastor cooperate with the Conference Secretary of Wesleyan Men and that they seek to organize the men of our churches into WESLEYAN MEN groups so that they may too, "Evangelize Now." CONFERENCE SECRETARY OF WESLEYAN MEN WILL PROMOTE THIS CAUSE.

Pastoral Voting — I recommend a more uniform method of voting on the pastor of each church as follows; Prepared ballots of not less than 21/8 inches by 23/4 inches with these words formed into six lines: VIRGINIA CONFERENCE, Wesleyan Methodist Church, BALLOT. No Change-2 Years (), No Change-1 Year (), Change (). These may be printed or mimeographed ballots may be purchased at reasonable cost from the Conference Bookstore in quantities of fifty or multiples thereof. THE BOOKSTORE SHALL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR SUCH A STUDY AND REPORT TO ANNUAL CONFERENCE THEIR FINDINGS.

Notification: I recommend each Board and Committee chairman be responsible for notifying each person on their respective board or committee of their election and duty.

Fire Insurance Committee: I recommend that the Board of Managers be designated the "Fire Insurance Committee" and they be authorized to survey rate, receive estimates and inform local churches where costs may be reduced. All Conference Scheduling Committee: I recommend the continuance of this Committee and their schedule be printed in the Conference Minutes.

A Home For Senior Citizens— There is a definite interest in such a home. I recommend that study be continued in this matter. THE BOARD OF MANAGERS SHALL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR SUCH A STUDY AND REPORT TO ANNUAL CONFERENCE THEIR FINDINGS.

TRUSTEES REPORT

July 1962 - June 1963

August 9, 1962 — Signed the report and Recommendation of the Committee On Church and Parsonage buildings authorizing the Jordantown Wesleyan Methodist Church to remodel their church at an estimated cost of \$1,100.00.

September 12, 1962 — Signed a conditional purchase agreement with representative of the J. G. Sheets ad Sons, Realtors for the purchase of a property to be remodeled and use as a parsonage for the Bailey Memorial Church, Salem, Virginia. This property contained 1.60 acres with four-room, cinder block residence.

September 24, 1962 — Executed two documents for the First Wesleyan Methodist Church, Washington, D. C.

November 8, 1962 — Executed a loan with the First National Bank of Salem, Virginia, in an amount of \$3,000.00 for the purchase of Bailey Memorial parsonage.

(Report and Recommendation of the Committee on Church and Parsonage Buildings was authorized October 30, 1962.

December 1, 1962 — Received papers for a \$12,000.00 loan for the Welcome Wesleyan Methodist Church drawn on the Bank at Dillwyn, Virginia. Upon advice of Conference Attorney these papers were returned for deletion of the waiver of homestead exemptions.

December 6, 1962 — Executed the papers for refinancing the Wesleyan Foundation Investment Foundation Loan No. 194 in the amount \$3,600.00 (Total Loan). Note No. 207 was negotiated in the amount of \$4,414.83 repayable at \$65.00 per month. The original \$3,600.00 was to apply toward purchase of the church building, the additional \$1,000.00 was to finance improvements on the parsonage.

December 22, 1962 — Approved a Deed of Correction for the Welcome Wesleyan Methodist Church covering .23 acres (Twenty-three one hundreds of an acre) which inserted the Conference Trustees according to Par. No. 2 of the Conference Resolutions.

January 7, 1963 — Received the check for \$1,000.00 for the Bailey Memorial parsonage improvements. The President and Treasurer endorsed this check which was forwarded to the pastor, Rev. Stephen Watkins.

February 22, 1963 — Signed the Report and Recommendation of the Committee on Church and Parsonage Buildings and locations approving the purchase of additional land for parsonage and cemetary for the ministry and use of the Five Forks Church, Stuart, Virginia Estimated cost was \$4,500.00 with \$1,000 cash on hand and the balance to be financed by the First National Bank of Stuart, Virginia.

March 2, 1963 — Prepared a contract for the use of Water between the Bailey Memorial Church and Mr. Winton W. Shelor. This contract was signed and witnessed.

April 30, 1963 — Completed negotiations for the First Wesleyan Methodist Church, Richmond, Virginia to secure \$2,200.00 loan from the Wesleyan Investment Foundation to cover the plumbing and heating contract for the newly constructed church.

May 29, 1963 — Executed and signed the papers to refinance the loan for the Baily Memorial Church, Salem, Virginia increasing the amount from \$3,000 to \$4,500.00.

VIRGINIA CONFERENCE APPORTIONMENT

- (A). The Conference Apportionment shall be sent to the Conference Treasurer by the 15th of each month for the previous month.
- (B). Each church shall pay 13% of the total Sunday School and Church tithes and offerings except the amounts paid for buildings, indebtedness and the cost of indebtedness.

EXPANATION OF "the amounts paid for buildings, indebtedness and the cost of indebtedness" which each church is permitted to deduct from total income before determining the 13% Apportionment is as follows:

- 1. "Buildings" are understood to be new buildings or the enlargement of present building.
- "Amounts paid for buildings, indebtedness and the cost of indebtedness" must be funds raised in the current month.
- 3. "Amounts paid for buildings" may include funds placed in a bona fide building fund reserve. (Separate account)
- 4. All other funds are subject to the 13% apportionment.
 (C). We recommend that the Virginia Conference Apportionment be distributed to the several Conference Funds by the Virginia Conference Board of Managers as follows:
 - -% Conference Operation
 - a. President's salary and allowances
 - b. Office expenses
- c. Committee expenses
- d. Entertaining the Annual Conference
- e. Conference property (exclusive of Camp grounds)
- -% Conference Church Extension
- -% Minister's Insurance and Pension
- --- % Camp Meeting (Retirement of loans development)
 - -% Discretionary Funds
- (D). All funds paid by the auxiliaries (W.M.S., W.Y., Y.M.W.B., W.M.S.S.) to apply toward General and Conference Apportionment shall be receipted by the respective treasurers. One copy of the receipt must be sent to the Conference Trasurer and one copy sent to the sender of the funds.
- (E). We recommend that the "Form to Accompany Payment of Apportionment" be supplied to each local treasurer and pastor.

To The Annual Conference

"Evangelism is not an experience, but a way of life and needs to be emphasized more than once or twice per year." With this statement we began our report of last year. We still feel this very strongly. When the thrust of evangelism becomes the driving force in our lives we will begin to catch the heart throb of Christ when He said, "I must needs go through Samaria." Or the burden of St. Paul on his second missionary journey when he felt the call to go into Asia but was forbidden of the Holy Ghost, then they felt the urge to proclaim the message in Bithynia but again they were not given the green light by the Holy Spirit. After they got quiet before the Lord and He had had an opportunity to reveal His will to them, they went into Macedonia. The challenge this passage has to my heart is: Paul was willing to preach the message of full salvation anywhere and was not waiting to be bowled over by the call but was putting into good use the information he had at hand. It seems to me this is the spirit that the Lord harnesses to get His work done. There are many areas of our Conference that need churches and we should be concerned about them, but the upper most of importance is the AREA THAT THE HOLY SPIRIT knows is ripe for the message and ready to receive us. It was not that Asia and Bithynia did not need the Gospel, it was that Macdonia was more ready and the Holy Spirit knew that it would have a more ready acceptance.

Your Committee sponsored the last Sunday afternoon service of Camp as a Church Extension service. It was most heartening to see the good response to the appeal given by Dr. H. K. Sheets for those who would volunteer to be used of God is establishing new churches within the boundrys of the Virginia Conference. By the help and the leadership of the Holy Spirit we as a Conference must press forward into these areas where the need is the greatest.

To make us conscious of these goals and needs, our Conference President has recommended that again this year we promote the "Pledge Pray-er," program and that each church sponsor a "prayer and fast" day per week. You will be hearing more about this throughout the year.

In the language of our General Conference theme, for the coming quadrennium we conclude our report: "Forward with God . . . Evangelize Now."

First Session-Tuesday, August 6, 1963, 1:30 P.M.

Mrs. Ethel Phaup presented opening devotions.

Ecclesiastes 9:10 was the basis for our reports this year, "Whatsoever thy hand findeth to do, do it with all thy might." As each individual came forward to give a report, she received a tool symbolic of some phase of that particular report. The president was handed a yoke as she gave her report. Some announcements and a few items of business were noted before recessing for lunch.

Fifth Session-Thursday, August 8, 1963, 1:00 P.M.

Mrs. Ferne Cooper conducted an excellent panel discussion on how to win and keep our children in church.

Business resumed with the report of the Poster Committee. As an incentive to secure new members, playlet, "Neglected," was presented. After the election of District chairmen, Mrs. Margy King was surprised with a love gift in the amount of \$30 to show our appreciation for the great volume of work she has done.

Literature sales were reported and the Solicitor gave her completed report. With final announcements and reading of minutes, Mrs. Gentry brought to us Closing Meditations. Then all Conference officials and local presidents came to the front for a dedicatory and closing prayer.

W. M. S. PRESIDENT'S REPORT

To delegates, presidents, and friends gathered in this fourth session of the Woman's Missionary Society of the Virginia Conference: we bring you Christian greetings in the name of the Lord who has called us to go into all the world with the gospel.

The past July twenty-third brought to a close four years as a Conference. Not seeing the marked increase one would hope for, we are yet glad the Lord has helped in so many ways and we give Him theh praise. In the General Conference reports, Virginia Conference had only three years to report.

The past Conference year has been one of the busiest, yet seemingly our work has not accomplished what we liked. The reports show a decrease in membership and magazine subscriptions. There is a loss in membership of around sixty. The solicitor will give the final total of subscriptions to the WESLEY-AN MISSIONARY. The past year has seen a shift in our interest. You gave nearly fourteen hundred dollars (\$1400) more for missions and less came through for Other Objects. Note two items of interest in comparion: You gave ten cents more for Mission Equipment Fund and fifty-three cents more for the White Gift Christmas Offering.

The goal for the Conference Project (Marie Evatt's Field Support) was \$1200. According to the treasurer, \$1261.14 came in.

Since the work of the Woman's Missionary Society is primarily to promote His work at home and abroad, we would praise Him for your increased interest in others.

One of the things that has increased our interest in missions is the successful missionary tours during the year. Miss Dorothy Marville, missionary to Haiti, visited most of the churches and gave a good report of her tour. Dr. Marilyn Birch, missionary doctor to Africa, participated in three Conventions and visited a few churches. Her tour was much appreciated by all because of her interest in the youth of our church.

Rev. Crosby was presented as the speaker for the missionary address. His subject was "How beautiful are the feet of them that preach the gospel of peace" mentioned in Romans 10:15. He pointed out that God measures the value of mankind by man's swiftness to do God's will. He gave a brief survey of the Colombian field and then told of several nationals in Colombia who must have beautiful feet in God's sight because of their great courage and ventures for Christ. His closing challenge was "Where are your feet taking you?"

An offering was received for the Crosbys which amounted to \$48.79. Our three-fold project for the year was introduced and discussed by three different individuals, and cash and pledges were received toward it. Our project includes Kamakwie Secondary School, Pioneer Pastor's Salary and World Missions.

Following the service, Rev. Crosby showed slides in the Colombian field.
