STANDING RULES

- 1. All Trustees of the Oklahoma Conference shal the bounds of the conference.
- 2. When a pastor provides his own place of rest from the regular parsonage shall be paid to said pastor
- 3. The Conference Treasurer shall close his boo Tuesday of July and all money received after that tir plied on next year's business.
- 4. The Conference Trustees shall be the Committee on Church and Parsonage Location.
- 5. The Committee on Religious Services shall consist of the Conference President; W. M. S. President; W. Y. P. S. President and Conference President's Advisory Board.
- 6. We recommend that the following order of business be observed in our annual conference sessions:

Tuesday, 3:00 P. M.—Conference Convenes

Tuesday evening—Conference sermon

Wednesday—Election of conference officers at 1:30 P. M.

Tuesday—Orders of the Day

Friday—Reports of Committees

Saturday—W. Y. P. S. business session

- 7. A Nominating Committee be elected composed of three elders, one of which shall be the President of the conference as chairman ex-officio; and the Delegate-elect from two churches designated by the annual conference. This committee shall first examine the credentials of all delegates to the annual Conference. Second, Nominate all sessions committees, not already provided for, and be prepared to report at first meeting of conference.
- 8. The conference fiscal year shall end the second Sunday of July and all statistical reports shall be based on monies received up to and including that date. Budget funds should then be sent immediately to the Conference Treasurer.
- 9. Two copies of each written report shall be given to the secretary of the conference. These shall be typewritten an double spaced. Size 8½ by 20.

- 10. The Conference Treasurer shall be a member of the Finance Board and an honorary member of the conference body with a right to speak but not to vote.
- 11. The annual conference shall elect a Spiritual Life Conference Committee composed of seven members. This committee shall plan for the coming together of Christian Workers of the Oklahoma Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church. This committee includes the president of W. M. S. and president of W. Y. P. S.

Emphasis at this conference shall be given to spiritual quickening, edifying, and fellowship. This committee shall also plan for the coming together of the pastors and their wives, and all interested laymen for a time of prayer and fasting in the interest of the Oklahoma Conference.

- 12. Conference shall convene annually on the Tuesday following the first Monday of August .
- 13. In case of a change of pastors the out going pastor shall be paid a salary for the two Sundays of conference and camp.
- 14. Conference Treasurer and Conference Secretary are to be paid twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) annually for services.
- 15. That the President's of the W.M.S. and W.Y.P.S. serve as members of the Spiritual Life Committee and the Missionary Board, with five other members.
- 16. The treasurers of the various conference funds are to bring their account books, receipts, check book, cancelled checks, and the latest bank statement to conference, and place these books in the hands of the Auditing Committee on the first day of the conference session.
- 17. The conference body recommends that each pastor be given a two weeks vacation, exclusive of the conference session. This vacation is to include two Sundays with pay.

The summary of the action of the Board of Trustee's of the Oklahoma Conference is as follows:

August 9, 1953—A joint meeting with the Missionary Board. Directed the following persons to investigate the Tonkalon Church property at Scranton, Arkansas.

W. C. Brannon, LeVerne Tolle, Glen McMurphy, D. O. Dorr and Alvin D. Royalty.

August 13, 1953—By Motion Alvin D. Royalty was to serve as Secretary for the year.

Discussed the building of a Parsonage at Tulsa and examined the plans of the same.

Recommendation: Remove the Church property at Oklahoma City from the market, and list the parsonage there at \$4,500 net to the Conference and hold funds in trust, as decision of October 2.

April 19, 1954—By correspondence, unanimously authorized the Conference President to grant to the City of Ponca City, a ten foot easement off the rear of lots 1, 2, 3, 22, 23, 24, in block 38, Cross Addition, Ponca City, Okla., for the purpose of alley, to be without cost to the City.

April 29, 1954—Made the final transaction of the sale of the Oklahoma City Mission property, Described as:

Lots Thirteen (13) and Fourteen (14) Block four (4),

West Main Street Addition to Oklahoma City, Okla., To Wesleyan Youth Incorporated, as by action of the Board October 2, 1953, for the sum of \$1,500. May 24, 1954—Meeting held at Alva. Discussed the purchasing of property at 13th and Utah, at Oklahoma City, Okla.. It was decided against.

Motion: The Conference President and Conference Secretary be authorized and empowered to list and sell the Church property at Oklahoma City for \$3,000 net above commission and to draw up the resolution and all legal instruments pertaining to the sale thereof, and to take such action as is necessary to secure a clear and merchantable title.

PLAN OF WORK

We recommend:

- 1. That arrangements be made with the pastor for one missionary prayer service each month, the same to be preceded by fasting, and at which service an offering is taken.
- 2. That a missionary workshop be held one afternoon during the Spiritual Life Conference.
- 3. That we hold twelve meetings during the year in which prayer is given a prominent place, and business is transacted.
 - 4. That we observe the following Six Red Letter Days:
 - a. Harvest Day Educational Day
 - Thanksgiving Program, gifts and offering for Home Missions
 - c. World Day of Prayer
 - d. April Self Denial Month
 - e. May Day Program and offerings for Foreign Missions— Gifts as can be sent with out-going missionaries
 - f. Wesleyan Missionary Day with program to secure subscriptions for our official organ.
 - . That we suggest the use of the Study Book.
- 6. That we read the Conference Plan of Work and Efficiency Standard at least twice each year, and read the Denominational plan of work once a year; referring often to the Standing Rules.

- 7. That we take a definite stand in relation to temperance, working through any church department or the local W.C.T.U.
- 8. That each society sponsor a public program at which time an offering is taken for missions.
- 9. That local societies INQUIRE INTO THE NEEDS OF THE HOME MISSION STATION AND ORPHANAGE BEFORE SEND-ING USED CLOTHING and that no monetary value be placed on same, that such boxes be reported merely as to the number sent, and that boxes of new merchandise be reported as to monetary value and that the sending society evaluate the same, the voucher of evaluation signed by the Missionary be forwarded to the Conference Woman's Society Treasurer for proper receipting.
- 10. That each society contribute posters or curios to the missionary exhibit to be displayed at the annual conference.
- II. That each society plan during the year to bring provisions or cash offering to the annual conference.
- 12. That each society cooperate with the Home Missionary Secretary by subscribing to the Card Call Plan.
- 13. We recommend the formation of Prayer Bands in each society with a Prayer Partner Secretary.
- 14. That we continue the use of "Parliamentary Law at a Glance" by Utter as a text book in parliamenary usage, or "A Compendium and Question Book of Parliamentary Law" by Bethel, with at least one drill during the year.
- 15. That the Secretary of each local society inform the Conference Secretary of any death in their society and the Conference Secretary send words of sympathy to the bereaved.
- 16. That each Society elect a Mission Study Secretary and faithfully promote its interest.
- 17. That there be an organized Y. M. W. B., the Superintendent being elected by the local W. M. S.
- 18. That the Conference adopt as a project for the coming year the Home Missionaries and the new churches of the Conference with each society choosing the workers of one of the fields and correspond with same. Some of the articles to be reserved as samples for enthusiasm to be on display at the annual conference.

EFFICIENCY STANDARD

Ten per cent credit shall be given for each of the following items, unless otherwise stated, making a possible score of 100%. All societies making a grade of eighty per cent shall be placed on the Honor Roll:

- 1. Arrangements be made with the pastor for one missionary prayer meeting each month.
- 2. A minimum of ten meetings be held during the year in which prayer is given a prominent place, and business is transacted, and at least one public meeting (5% credit).
- 3. A prayer partner circle be formed in each society with a Prayer Partner Secretary elected. She shall send a report to the Conference Prayer Partner Secretary not later than sixty days after the sitting of the Annual Conference.
- 4. The President, Secretary, Treasurer, and seventy-five per cent of the active membership be subscribers to THE WESLEYAN MISSIONARY.
- 5. A Solicitor shall be elected for THE WESLEYAN MISSION-ARY, gaining not less than two subscriptions a year.
- 6. A Delegate shall be elected to the Annual Conference Woman's Society, and she shall be instructed by the local society regarding the amount to be pledged by that society at the Annual Conference Session.
- 7. The dues, one dollar per member, shall be sent directly to the Conference Treasurer quarterly, and THE PURPOSE DESIGNATED AS TO WHERE ONE HALF WILL BE SENT, TO BE APPLIED ON HOME, OR FOREIGN MISSIONS, OR THE ORPHANAGE. The local treasurer's books shall be closed on June 30th, and all money and voucher receipts must be sent in and PURPOSE DESIGNATED not later than July 5, and the Annual Report blanks PROPERLY FILLED OUT and sent to the Conference Treasurer not later than July 12. (15% credit).
- 8. That we secure every woman in the Church as a member of the Society, or bring about a fifteen per cent gain in total membership.
- 9. Each local society pay annually an amount equal to twentyfive cents per member to be used as as General Administrative Fund, not to apply on the Church budget.
- 10. The Efficiency Standard be read in the society at least once a year, and the Plan of Work and Standing Rules be referred to often.

STANDING RULES

- 1. Send all money, voucher receipts for cash sent to places other than to the Conference Treasurer, voucher receipts for new clothing and other new merchandise, to the Conference Treasurer quarterly or more often.
- 2. All local treasurers shall close their books June 30th, and all money and receipts must be sent in and PURPOSE DESIGNATED not later than July 5, and the Annual Report blanks properly filled out and sent to the Conference Treasurer not later than July 12.
- 3. Conference shall convene annually on Tuesday following the first Monday of August at 3:00 p.m. The morning sessions shall convene at 9:00, and afternoon sessions at 1:00.
- 4. A Nominating Committee shall be elected composed of one local president and two delegates-elect from the three societies designated by the Annual Conference, with the Conference Prsident as chairman ex-officio. This committee shall nominate session committees and all officers with the exception of those elected by ballot, and be prepared to report at the first session of the Annual Conference.
- 5. Three copies of each written report shall be given to the Secretary of the Conference. These shall be typewritten on typing paper size 8½x11, and double spaced.
- 6. The Conference Bar shall be composed of the Conference Officials, Delegates, newly elected Presidents, Elders, and Pastors' wives.
