A motion prevailed to elect a committee of five on Ministerial Retreat. Those elected to serve on this committee are as follows: C. G. Shirley, Earl J. Hucks, G. Robb French, J. B. Hilson, W. S. Allred.

Adjourned to call of chair.

The President called the Conference into session at 6:05 p. m.

J. B. Hilson introduced to the Conference Mrs. T. A. Spearman, a member of the Ariel Church. Mrs. Spearman is a charter member of the Piedmont Church. It is believed that Mrs. Spearman has been a member of this Conference longer than any other person, which will be seventy years in November of this year. She gave her testimony, declaring her continued faith in Christ and desire to always serve Him.

PASTORAL RELATIONS—The Committee on Pastoral Relations gave its final report. Report adopted. (See Report No. 2)

A motion prevailed to delete Standing Recommendation No. 4 and to renumber the remaining Recommendations.

The minutes were read and approved.

The Conference voted to adopt the minutes of the entire session.

Standing Rules

1. That no member of the Conference shall have his character passed who fails to carry out all the rules and orders of this Conference, unless providentially hindered, except upon a three-fourths vote of the body.

2. That we as a Conference put forth every possible effort through education, pulpit, preaching, voting, and other means to advance the cause of temperance and to secure legislation for abolishing the sale of beer, wine, and whiskey for beverages.

3. That the Trustees of the South Carolina Annual Conference, together with the President of the said Conference, be and they hereby are empowered to execute, all necessary papers, mortgage deeds, and papers of a like character, when necessary to secure loans to the South Carolina Annual Conference or to any church needing funds for an expansion program or to liquidate Conference, church, or parsonage indebtedness, provided that the party or parties requesting such action shall set forth in writing the true nature and purpose for which the loan is requested (this writing is to become a part of the permanent records of the Trustees) and that the Trustees and President of said Conference are satisfied that the object for which said loan or loans is sought is both necessary and desirable. Whenever money is borrowed for use of a local church the local church shall agree to and be responsible for its payment.

4. In case of necessity in order that a duly authorized expansion, building, remodeling or relocating program may be carried out; or in case of the claim of a municipal government, state highway department, or any other governmental agency, the trustees of the South Carolina Conference be and they hereby are duly empowered to sign any or all deeds and papers for the transfer of real property that is now or hereafter may be held in trust by said trustees, provided that the party or parties requesting such action shall set forth in writing the true nature and purpose for which transfer or sale is requested (this writing to become a part of the permanent record of the trustees), and where the sale or transfer of such conference, church, parsonage, or other real estate has been approved or authorized by the President of the Conference with the concurrence of two-thirds of his Advisory Board, and provided further that the trustees and the President of the said Conference are satisfied that the object for which the transaction is sought is both necessary and desirable. (1961)

5. During the interim of Annual Conference the Board of Church Extension and Evangelism shall be duly authorized to draw on the funds for Mountain Missions and Conference Missions, for the purpose for which each was raised, as it deems best for the interest of the Conference, and the Treasurer shall be authorized to make payments from these funds upon written order signed by the

President and at least one-half the other members of the Board on Church Extension and Evangelism, or signed by the President in behalf of the Board on Church Extension and Evangelism.

6. Any church which engages in a building or remodeling project or which purchases a parsonage, church building or a lot on which a church or parsonage is to be constructed, regardless of whether the property is to be owned by the local church or the Conference, is required to have the plans approved by the Conference Board on Church and Parsonage Building and Location.

Any church which secures aid from the Conference must have its property deeded to the Conference Trustees, as is required by our Discipline; and any church which engages in a building or remodeling project must have the plans approved by the Conference Board on Church and Parsonage Building and Location, according to the requirements of our Discipline, if said church is to receive aid from the Conference for these building projects.

7. All officers and committees shall take up their duties at the close of the sitting of conference in which they are elected.

8. Conference shall convene on Monday, after the second Sunday in August. (1963)

9. The books of the Conference Treasurer shall close July 10. (1963)

10. The Conference Secretary shall be the Committee on Credentials.

11. L. L. Jarrard, Treasurer of the South Carolina Conference of The Wesleyan Methodist Church of America, or his successor, is authorized to sign United States bonds held by the South Carolina Conference of The Wesleyan Methodist Church of America.

12. The President and his Advisory Board shall appoint the Auditing Committee, the Statistical Committee, and the Apportionment Committee at a proper time before Conference. (1963)

13. If a pastor desires to resign his work during the interim of Annual Conference, he shall give the President and his Advisory Board notice at least two weeks before the effective date of his resignation. However, if the President and his Advisory Board deem the cause for his desire to resign sufficient, they may accept the resignation immediately.

14. Certificates of Citation are to be presented to ministers who have given 25 years of active ministerial service in God's Kingdom (20 years in case of retirement or death) while he is a member of the South Carolina Conference. At the close of each succeeding ten years the old certificate is to be returned and a new one given; and at retirement or death a certificate is to be given recognizing the total period of active service. An evangelist must hold ten meetings during the year to receive credit for a year of service. The Citation Committee is to be composed of the President and the Secretary. (1953)

15. During the interim of the Annual Conference, the Committee on Finance shall be duly authorized to draw on the funds for Conference Work, Minutes, Conference Entertainment, Conference Parsonage, and President's Salary for the purpose for which each was raised, as it deems best for the

interest of the Conference; and the Treasurer shall be authorized to make payment from these funds upon written order signed by the President and at least one-half the other members of the Committee on Finance or signed by the President by order and in behalf of the Committee on Finance. (1957)

16. The local church officers shall be elected within thirty days of the close of the fiscal year of the local church, and they shall take office at the beginning of the fiscal year. (1958)

17. All pastors shall mail their Statistical Reports by July 25. (1963)

18. Anyone employed by the Board on Church Extension and Evangelism shall not be a member of the Board. (1959)

19. The joint committee composed of the President and his Advisory Board, the Board of Trustees, and the Board on Church Extension and Conference Evangelism are authorized to draw on monies available in the Conference Budget for Church Extension and Evangelism to aid churches which, in the opinion of this joint committee, are faced by dire emergency.

20. The new pastor shall take up his work the Sunday after campmeeting, and the salary of the outgoing pastor shall continue through campmeeting. (1963)

Standing Recommendations

1. That we earnestly urge all our Licentiates not receiving any appointments to pastoral or evangelistic work to preach at least once a month, and to hold if possible a two weeks' revival during the year.

2. That all ministers faithfully tithe their income and that any minister failing to do so shall be considered delinquent in his duty. (1959)

3. That all charges and stations to which the pastor moves pay the moving and transportation expenses of said pastor, the same to be done in addition to his salary.

4. Each charge should give its pastor the privilege of being away from his church, or churches, for two meetings per year, and no pastor is to be away from his charge for more than two meetings per year without a vote of his church, or charge, giving permission; and it is recommended that each church or charge give its pastor a two-weeks vacation, with pay, each year.

5. When a church engages in a building or remodeling project at least one-half of the estimated cost of the project should be on hand before said project is undertaken unless other satisfactory arrangements are made. If other arrangements are made the Board of Trustees must approve them before they are considered satisfactory.

6. A church which is not on a charge with other churches may keep only one record book for church and quarterly records and the Church Clerk serve

as Quarterly Conference Clerk.

7. We urge all pastors to seek earnestly to raise a full budget and that first consideration be given to the Pension Plan Budget. (1959)

8. That we adhere to Paragraph 132 (2) of our Discipline as long as there are ministers in our Conference who are qualified and who are available to take work. (1959)

9. Any pastor, or church, desiring to invite a convention or rally group other than Wesleyan groups should first secure the approval of the President and his Advisory Board. (1959)

10. It is recommended that all church have their treasurers bonded.

REPORTS

REPORT NO. 1

President's Report

To the members of the Seventh-first Annual Session of the South Carolina Conference, greetings:

We acknowledge a debt of gratitude to Almighty God for His marvelous grace and patient care which has been so graciously given. To you whose prayers have undergirded the work of the Conference, those who have given freely of their time, and all who have cooperated in pushing the work, we give thanks.

STATE OF THE WORK

End-time conditions continue to pressure the church in many ways. We must keep spiritually alive and alert and resist every strategy of Satan.

Men of the ministry, as men called of God, there is no time or place in our lives for a single careless moment or act. Our example in all of our relationships must be above reproach. It is our responsibility to cultivate fellowship and to maintain high Christian ethics. All of this can be done without the compromise of personal convictions.

The religious climate of our day does not tend to produce saints. Poor attendance at our Sunday and Wednesday evening services and during revival meetings indicates a Laodicean apathy. As Wesleyan Methodists we have been characterized by fervency. We thank God that a measure of this is still evident among our people. They are sound in doctrine and loyal to the interests of the church. However, we need a rekindling of fervency in the ranks of Wesleyan Methodism.

CHURCH EXTENSION

Allen Mitchell Memorial and Sumter continue to make some progress. Growth has been slow but we feel a foundation is being laid.

Belton has had a good year and has a small building fund started. They have had a substantial increase in Sunday School attendance each quarter this year.

It became necessary during this Conference year to divert some Church Extension funds to Walhalla in order to save our property there. Half of the amount thus used has been replaced. Through the faithfulness of God and the loyalty of our people in addition to the intervention of some friends of the church, the financial situation at Walhalla is at present stabilized. It was the thinking of The Church Extension Committee that it would be unwise to undertake opening a new field while at the same time we were in danger

of losing a valuable property. For this reason assistance was given at Walhalla.

FINANCIALLY

Income from budget askings continue upward. This year fifty churches paid a full budget as compared with thirty-three in 1961 and forty-six in 1962. The percentage of Conference Budget raised in 1963 was 86.10% as compared with 85.35% in 1962. The percentage of Denominational Budget raised in 1963 was 103.56% as compared with 99.46% in 1962.

The Rally Day offering for Walhalla was \$1,030.69 which, I believe, is a new high for Rally Day offerings. On a percentage basis, the South Carolina Conference topped all conferences in the Southern Area in their response to the appeal for the Dormitory Replacement Funds at Central College. On the basis of five dollars per member we had a 134% response.

MATERIAL IMPROVEMENTS

GLENVILLE has put asbestos shingle siding on the Church and it has been painted. One Sunday school room has been sanded and finished and the bedrooms of the parsonage have been painted. All the labor was donated.

SENECA has relocated in an attractive and strategic location and has constructed a beautiful new church edifice. It is of brick construction with rest rooms, nursery, five Sunday school rooms and a five room apartment for the pastor. It is valued at \$35,000.

EDEN has poured a cement floor in the basement of the parsonage and has hard surfaced the parking area at a cost of approximately \$600.00.

GLENWOOD has refinished their basement Sunday school rooms, hard-surfaced the driveway and parking area and purchased a new piano at a cost of \$1,904.00.

CLEMSON has done extensive repairs and remodeling on their church this year. Included was the laying of tile in the basement, putting up aluminum screens, reroofing, adding a steeple, redesigning the roof over the entrance, and painting the exterior of both the church and the parsonage. This was done at a cost of \$4,610.00 with donated labor estimated.

STARTEX has put new windows and floors in the parsonage, new celotex overhead and painted the exterior at a cost of \$1,865.00.

FELLOWSHIP has purchased a lot with the idea of building a parsonage in mind.

OFFICIAL ACTS OF THE PRESIDENT AND HIS ADVISORY BOARD

July 27, 1962—I granted a letter of transfer to Rev. Paul Eger, an Elder, to the Indiana Conference.

August 23, 1962—I appointed David Gregory, a local preacher, pastor at Union.

September 2, 1962—I appointed Mr. Everette Ishman as a lay-missionary at Smoky Mountain Tabernacle.

September 11, 1962—I received the transfer of Rev. R. M. Morgan, an Elder, from the Evangelical Methodist Church. He is referred to the Committee

on Itineracy and Elders Orders for examination and recommendation according to paragraphs 127 and 174 of The Book of Discipline.

November 18, 1962—I received the resignation of John Cole as pastor of the Westminster Church. On November 20, 1962, this resignation was accepted by the Advisory Board.

I dedicated the new church building at Rock Hill. This church is one of our portable tabernacles which was formerly at Seneca. A foundation was built and the building was reroofed and painted.

November 28, 1962—John Cole surrendered his Elder's credentials according to paragraph 408 in the Book of Discipline.

December 7, 1962—An agreement was made with Dr. Roy S. Nicholson to pastor at Westminster until his summer schedule began in June.

December 16, 1962—I dedicated the Seneca church.

June 18, 1963—Gave Catechee permission to vote on Rev. T. C. Childs as pastor for the coming year.

July 10, 1963—I granted transfers to Elders J. A. Giles and G. C. Gilliard to the Georgia Conference.

I appointed Rev. J. C. Byars and Rev. J. F. McCool to audit the books of the Conference Treasurers.

July 12, 1963—I granted a letter of transfer to Rev. W. C. Young, an Elder, to the Georgia Conference.

 - (2) That Belton be permitted to vote on G. C. Gillard as pastor.

REPORT NO. 4

Church Extension And Evangelism

ITEM I

WE RECOMMEND:

1. That when it becomes necessary for the Conference to aid new churches financially, the amount of aid shall be determined by the Church Extension and Evangelism Committee and such aid may be discontinued at the discretion of said committee. We further recommend as long as a church receives aid from

the Conference, it shall consult the Church Extension and Evangelism Committee before calling a pastor.

2. That the pastor of any church securing aid from the Conference shall secure permission from the Committee before he can conduct more than two revivals away from his said church during the year.

3. That a pastor who is serving a church receiving aid from the Conference and who desires to move or to live away from said church or change his relation to the charge in any way must first consult the Committee.

4. That when the Church Extension and Evangelism Committee is making payments on loans or church property, the payments shall be made directly to the mortgagee.

5. That we continue to assist in the payments on the loan on the North Charleston Parsonage.

6. That the Conference President be Sales Manager of the Conference History Book.

3. That a table of contents be placed on the second or third page of each record book. If no space is available, a sheet may be inserted with cloth tape.

4. That the proceedings of each business meeting of the church be recorded in the form of minutes.

5. That the minutes be placed in the book in chronological order.

6. That the church clerks read carefully Paragraph 74 of the Wesleyan Methodist Discipline.

7. That the roll be kept up-to-date and that it include as complete as possible the following information: the names of members, date received, how received, and removal.

8. That if a church fails to send in a record, its grade becomes zero.

9. That all pastors call the attention of their church and quarterly conference clerks to these recommendations.

10. That the following method of grading be used for the church and quarterly conference records: Completeness of records, 20%—divided as follows—For quarterly conference books: Title page, 5%; Completeness of minutes, 15%; For church or combined books: Title page, 5%; Completeness of minutes, 10%; Church roll, 5%; Binding, 10%; Table of Contents, 10%; Permanency of records (ink or typewritten), 10%; Cleanliness and neatness, 10%; Penmanship, 10%; Date at top of page, giving day, month, and year, 10%; Composition and grammar, 10%; Spelling, 10%.

RESOLUTION ON THE RECOGNITION OF GOD IN OUR PUBLIC INSTITUTIONS

Whereas the historic attitude of the United States Government toward the worship of God has been one of friendliness, as may be substantiated by any number of evidences, and

Whereas the American citizenry today, of whatever creed, is overwhelmingly characterized by faith in God and a recognition of our national and personal dependence upon Him, and

Whereas the intent of our founding fathers in forbidding the establishment of religion in the First and Fourteenth Amendments of our Constitution was manifestly not to remove all vestiges of our theistic faith from government-sponsored premises and activities, and

Whereas in recent years there has been a determined effort by an atheistic minority, having every personal privilege of disbelief, to secure judicial decisions purportedly based upon the Constitution to shield themselves from reminder

of their minority status by the banishment of all theistic traces from publicly sponsored activities and premises, notably from our public schools which, because of compulsory attendance requirements, affect the lives of the vast majority of our children, thus undermining the historic foundation of our moral and ethical value system, and

Whereas successive actions of the Supreme Court, occasioned by the persistent appeals of atheists and agnostics, seem to indicate a growing inclination to ban from public life all worship of God, in however broad terms, and all recognition of Him,

Therefore Be It Resolved that this South Carolina Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church, assembled in its 71st annual session in Greer, South Carolina, respectfully petitions our legislative leaders to discover for us and for the great God-fearing majority of our people some adequate lawful redress from the above-described disability. We presume that such may require a Constitutional Amendment recognizing the sovereignty of almighty God for our nation (while granting freedom of conviction and propagation to those who choose not to recognize Him), reaffirming the doctrine that units of our Government are to avoid acts and policies involving the support or establishment of organized religion, but declaring the principle that it is not deemed a contravention of this doctrine that the name of God be honored in state and civic life and that men be encouraged to read the Bible in its various versions and to worship God in accordance with the dictates of their own conscience, not excluding the incidental occurrence of such activities even from premises built or financed in whole or in part by public moneys, that this nation may indeed be a nation under God.

Be It Resolved Further that we urge all our people to circulate petitions after this tenor, these as well as individual communications to be sent to the national legislators from our various areas of residence, endeavoring thus to show the concern of God-fearing peoples in America that the public recognition of God, the Creator of all men, Who is revealed fully in His Son, Jesus Christ, be not destroyed from among us.

In view of the above resolution, we recommend that the President and Secretary of the Conference send the appropriate letters to the state representatives and senators in the National Congress requesting them to promote proper legislative action to permit Scripture reading and prayer in our public schools. Also that the secretary send a copy of the resolution to Associated Press.

Other accusations were made against the accused, but there was no evidence to support the accusations.

We, therefore, recommend that he be censured, placed on probation for a year, and that his appointment be as supply under the supervision of the President and his Advisory Board.

Standing Rules and Recommendations

1. We emphasize the need of much prayer and intercession in these evil days, and that fasting and self-denial be observed as well.

2. The W. M. S. dues for this Conference will be one dollar and fifty cents (\$1.50) per member. Fifty cents (50c) of this is to be retained in the Conference treasury for working fund.

3. Y. M. W. B. dues will be sixty cents (60c) per member for this Conference. Fifty-two cents (52c) is to be used for Foreign Missions, five cents (5c) for desk expense, and three cents (3c) for General Conference travel expense of the Y. M. W. B. Superintendent.

4. All money should be in the hands of the Treasurer two weeks before Conference. The annual report blanks must be in the hands of the Conference Statistician two weeks before Annual Conference.

5. We urge each local society to have an alert Magazine Solicitor, an active Mission Study Group, and a large Women's World Fellowship Circle.

6. The Executive Board will serve as a nominating committee to nominate secretaries and committees as deemed necessary before the opening of Conference.

7. We urge the use of the Standard of Efficiency so that each society may work to be placed on the honor roll.

8. Each district will elect the following officers: Chairman, Secretary, Magazine Solicitor, Mission Study Promoter, and Y. M. W. B. Superintendent.

9. Each district should plan at least three district meetings annually—one each quarter in which workshops will be held for: local presidents, treasurers, magazine solicitors, Women's World Fellowship secretaries, and Y. M. W. B. superintendents.

10. It shall be the duty of each District Superintendent to supervise the interests of the societies in her district. This may be done by visitation, correspondence, the holding of conventions and rallies, the organizing of societies and bands where none exists, and giving of her time as she deems needful. Each society or district is to bear her expense on said visits.
