We have passed through a strenuous year. Depression has been the sad note of the age in which we live. In the industrial and commercial realms, as well as the spiritual, men's hearts are failing them for fear. In such an hour we need to remind ourselves that God is not dead, and that He who is the same yesterday, today and forever still sits on the seat of authority and power. The spirit with with the depression was met by our people has strengthened into an aggressiveness that bids fair to turn serious hardships into distinct victories.

I have endeavoured to do my duties as your President and as Conference Evangelist with diligence and consideration, and to curtail as much as possible the expense of my work.

I have held Evangelistic Services in each Church of the Conference during the year except Ottawa, where I supplied as pastor for two months.

The co-operation of the pastors was most gratifying and a splendid spirit prevails with some special season of grace.

### Religious Services

The Conference sermon was preached by Rev. S. W. Blanchard on Tuesday evening, April 23rd. He took his subject from II Cor. 6, 1. Thursday at 7.30 p.m. Rev. E. W. Tokley brought the message from Joshua 14: 8, last clause. He stressed these truths, Egypt is a type of The World. Sin and Satan may alure us, but they still are our enemies. Caleb wholly followed the Lord out of Egypt, he wholly followed the Lord in the wilderness and because of that he was qualified to enter the Land of Canaan. He wholly followed the Lord into Canaan. Gilgal, the first stopping place in Canaan means circle, stone of testimony. Caleb did not tarry there. He had an up to date experience, testimony and vision, and he kept them up to date by moving on and m.king progress. It was his up to date experience, that gave him a claim to fresh pessessions. He got the possession he was after because he wholly followed the Lord. He passed through Zarcphath, the place of refining. The way to Carnel is wholly to follow the Lord. This was a very helpful message.

Friday at 10.30 a.m. President S. J. Luckey, Houghton, New York brought a good message on educational interests, showing how very necessary an educational programme is for the continuation of the work of the Church.

Friday at 7.30 p.m., the Rev. W. J. Major brought the message from Heb. 12, 14. In which he stressed the importance of being holy, showing that God has promised us holiness and also commanded us to be holy.

Saturday at 7.30 p.m., the Rev. J. A. Bain conducted a testimony meeting which was truly owned and blessed of God. As the brothers and sisters from the different charges testified to God's saving and keeping grace, and His many many blessings, we believe everyone felt encouraged to go all the way with Jesus. When the meeting closed we felt that we had our strength renewed, and that we were no longer tired after the business of the week.

Sunday morning April 28th, Rev. E. F. McCarty brought the message from St. John 7, 37, 38 and 39. "If any man thirst, let him come unto Me and drink." This was a good encouraging message showing that though some thirst for pleasure, riches, honor, etc., God has abundance of living water to quench our every thirst.

Sunday afternoon at 2.30. This was the Missionary meeting held by the W.H. & F.M.S. Sister W. E. Hamilton was in charge. The meeting opened by the singing of Hymn 647, after which Sister D. W. Summers and Rev. J. A. Bain led in prayer. Scripture lesson from John 2, 11 to 18, followed by a song by Bro. and Sister E. Wilson. Rev. E. F. McCarty brought the message from Hebrews, 2, 8, in which he spoke of our duty towards the work in the toreign lands, of remarkable converts in Japan, Africa, China, etc. He reaffirmed the saying of Dr. Pierson "It is the WHOLE duty of the WHOLE Church to give the WHOLE Gospel to the WHOLE World." Pledges were then taken for both Home and Foreign Missions, after which Rev. S. W. Blanchard dismissed the meeting with prayer.
