CONFERENCE RESOLUTIONS

1. All statistical reports shall be filed with the committee not later than the second day.

2. Every pastor shall make a duplicate of his statistical report and shall read the same to his charge at the first meeting after conference.

3. Pastors shall equalize the amounts required for budget before over-reaching any one item and it shall be the pastor's duty to inform his people at the beginning of the year concerning the amount to be raised and he shall at once proceed to raise the amount apportioned to his charge.

4. Inasmuch as the work of the conference demands the attention and the attendance of all its elders and licentiates, therefore we will not employ as pastor or evangelist any elder or licentiate or pass the character of any elder or licentiate except by vote, who does not attend the entire session of conference.

5. Any member leaving conference must present his excuse to conference.

6. The conference treasurer, with all persons introduced to the conference, shall be honorary members of the conference, and shall be accorded a seat within the conference bar.

7. No preacher or licentiate who fails to attend the Ministerial Association, except for just cause, shall have his character passed at the next annual conference except by vote.

8. Any minister accepting work on a charge at the hands of this conference, who resigns or abandons it before the year is out without a good excuse or lawful reason, shall be considered by said conference and it shall take a vote of

conference to pass his character.

9. All candidates taking the conference course of study shall appear before the Committee on Itineracy and Orders, some member of the Committee, or some one whom the Committee may designate.

10. When an elder resides outside the bounds of the conference but retains his membership with a church within the bounds of the conference, a delegate shall be elected from this church to represent said elder, the seating of said delegate in the annual conference depending upon the attendance of said elder at the annual conference.

11. Friday preceding conference shall be set aside as a day of prayer for the conference.

12. Robert's Rules of Order shall be the parliamentary guide of this body.

13. We recommend that pastors, Sunday schools, A.M. & F.M. societies and Y. M. A. B. S. remit all funds raised, quarterly.

14. Pastors shall preach on the subject of church benevolences at least once a year.

15. The first Sunday in October shall be set apart as a day for special prayer to be offered and efforts made to interest and enlist the young people of our church in its work.

16. All charges receiving a new pastor pay the moving expenses, the amount being agreed upon by the pastor and the church.

17. We order that no money be paid from the conference Missionary Fund except by written order of the Missionary Board.

18. Be it required that all pastors of the Ohio Conference attend all sessions of the camp meeting unless providentially hindered.

19. The secretary shall send a statistical blank to the clerk of each charge

having no pastor, requesting that the same be filled out with all available statistics and returned to the conference secretary.

20. We interpret Rule 4 to mean that the Committee on Pastoral Relations shall not give employment to any preacher who does not meet the requirements of this standing rule, without bringing his excuse before the conference for its action in the matter.

21. Inasmuch as the work of the conference demands the attendance of delegates as well as preachers, therefore we discourage the election as delegate to annual conference of any person who does not intend to attend the entire session. Information of the delegate's intentions shall be incorporated in their credentials.

22. The secretary shall prepare blanks for delegate's credentials, including the statement required by the last resolution. Said blanks are to be mailed to the pastors shortly before conference and when filled out by them, to be sent to the chairman of a standing committee on credentials, who, if possible should receive the same at least a week before conference in order that they may be able to inform the chairman of the Board of Trustees as to the number of delegates expected at conference and in order that they may be prepared to report immediately after the opening of conference. Said committee shall be composed of two members appointed by the President.

23. For the future the conference shall observe the disciplinary rule requiring each pastor to read his statistical report of the floor of conference.

24. Wednesday afternoon and evening of conference week shall be designated as Young Peoples' Day.

25. Thursday evening of conference shall be set apart for the public missionary service.

26. Each year there shall be incorporated in the minutes a list of those who have died in the various churches during the year, the pastors being asked to provide the Secretary with the necessary information.

NOTE: The secretary has been unable to find in the record books the resolution authorizing the closing of the treasurer's books ten days before conference.

HISTORICAL SKETCH

The territory of the present Ohio Conference was originally divided between the Allegheny and Miami Conferences, the Scioto river being the boundary line between the two. The first session of the Allegheny conference convened in 1844. Five years later that section of Allegheny territory lying east of the Scioto and west of the present boundary between the Ohio and Allegheny conference, was organized into a separate conference, called the Zanesville conference. Edward Smith was chairman of the organizing convention or conference. This conference held fifteen sessions under this name and after that was called the Central Ohio Conference under which name it first met in 1864. The last session of the Central Ohio Conference was held in 1908.

The original Miami conference covered a large territory from the Scioto river west to the Mississippi or beyond. Its first session was held in 1843. The early record books of this conference are not in possession of the secretary so that the names of the early presidents are not available. A number of conferences were formed

out of the original Miami conference until finally it was reduced to the western half of the state of Ohio. It finally became so small that in 1900 the conference voted to unite with the Indiana conference. But for some reason this arrangement did not last long and the following year the conference met again under the chairmanship of Rev. Eber Teter who was then Connectional Missionary Secretary. At this session the conference declared itself a mission field and as such Rev. Teter took oversight of it. But in 1902 they again elected a President from their own ranks, Rev. Henry Livingston. Finally in 1908 the Miami conference formed a permanent union with the Central Ohio Conference.

The new organization which first met in 1908 was called the Ohio Conference under which name it has held twenty-six sessions.

Report of Conference President
for the year of 1932-33.

At the close of conference last year, Rev. G. B. Clay was granted a letter of standing as he was taking a charge in the Allegheny Conference.

September 5, Rev. Paul Freeze was received to our conference by a letter of standing from the Indiana Conference.

On September 21, I appointed Rev. Dwight H. Ferguson as supply to the Coshocton church.

I also appointed Rev. F. C. Berry to Marion Mission and Rev. Fred Fields to White's Chapel.

On October 4, at the request of Rev. E. C. Kenney, pastor of our mission in Athens we visited the work and found the members ready to organize a church. Seventeen came in as charter members and since then 30 more members have joined making a total membership at present of 47. Bro. Kenney was appointed pastor of the new church. Sister Day, one of the charter members whose heart God has touched, came to the rescue of the new church by paying a note

of \$250 which the church owed the conference.

4th. That we as a conference do stand for the great principle of national prohibition of the liquor traffic and that we are in favor and will stand by the present 18th Amendment to the very last.

5th. That the pastors on all our charges read the rules of John Wesley as given in our discipline at least once a year on his charge.

6th. We urge our people to use scriptural methods only for the raising of church finance as any other method is strictly forbidden in our discipline which holds it as a misdemeanor for those who so indulge.

7th. We urge all our people who have the right of the franchise to make use of the ballot this fall in fighting the repeal of the 18th Amendment and that we pledge ourselves not to support any party that fails to take a definite stand for prohibition.

Report of Work Committee

We, the Work Committee, recommend that each local society be urged to pay the five dollars for Hephzibah Orphanage in addition to the six dollars for the support of Mountain Missions, the amount of each being applied on budget.

We, further recommend that each local society which has not yet attained the efficiency standard, continue to strive to reach that goal; and that the secretary be instructed to send a copy of that efficiency standard to the local societies not having one.

We recommend the following work to be assigned to the various societies;

Athens, Coshocton, Dunkirk, and West View -- Hephzibah Orphanage.

Africa, Fargo, Senecaville, and Shadley Valley -- Blue Ridge Mountain Work.

Dayton, Findlay, Harrison, and Kenton -- Zion Hill Mission.

Greer and Zanesville - Alabama Mission.
