Journal of Daily Proceedings

The Lockport Annual Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Connection (or Church) of America convened for its fifty-eighth annual session in the Levant Wesleyan Methodist Church, April 2, 1919, at 9 A. M.

On the previous evening Rev. W. A. Backus preached a Gospel sermon.

The Conference was called to order by the President, Rev. J. R. Babcock, and devotionals were conducted by Rev. J. J. Coleman.

On account of the absence of thte Conference Secretary, Earl Barrett was elected Secretary pro tem.

The Conference Roll was called and the list of delegates was referred to the Committee on Temporary Organization for correction.

After a brief recess the bar of the Conference was made to include the first six slips across the body of the Church.

The time for opening and closing Conference was fixed as follows: Morning sessions to open at 9 A. M. and to close at 11:30 A. M. The afternoon sessions to open at 1:30 P. M. and to close by vote of Conference.

Rev. Charles Sicard was called to the chair while the President made his official report, which was considered item by item. All items of the report were adopted as read, except Item 2, which was referred to the Board of Trustees for approval.

Rev. James A. Bain and Rev. Francis B. Markell were received into the Conference on letter of transfer from the Canada Conference.

Rev. A. C. Dow was received as an elder from the Champlain Conference.

On motion the election of the Conference officers was made the order of the day for Thursday morning immediately following devotionals.

The report of the Board of Directors of Bethesda Home was read by H. R. Barnett and referred to the Auditing Committee.

Rev. C. E. Bathurst and Clayton F. Ball were elected a Committee on Courtesies.

The Committee elected by the Lockport Conference of 1918 to investigate conditions at Chestnut Ridge read its report.

President Luckey presented a petition in behalf of Chestnut

Ridge appointment, and remarks were made by Rev. Charles Sicard, J. S. Luckey and J. R. Babcock.

No Conference action was taken regarding the report. Conference adjourned by limitation of time.

First Day-Afternoon Meeting-April 2.

The Conference was called to order by the President and devotionals were conducted by Rev. A. D. Fero.

After the calling of the roll, the minutes were read and approved.

The report of the Committee to investigate conditions at Chestnut Ridge was adopted. See Report No. 4.

After brief recess Rev. Maurice A. Gibbs, of the Allegheny Conference, was presented to the Conference.

After this it was made the order of the day that Brother Gibbs speak in the interests of Japanese missions on Thursday afternoon, immediately following devotionals.

Rev. J. S. Willett, Connectional Agent, and President J. S. Luckey and Professor Fancher, of Houghton Seminary, were introduced to the Conference and made appropriate remarks.

The Committee on Religious Services announced as the orders of the day: Connectional interests to be presented by Rev. J. S. Willett, on Saturday, 2:30 P. M.; Educational, President J. S. Luckey, Friday, 2:30 P. M.

The following names were called and their characters passed: G. E. Bathurst, A. D. Fero, C. W. Smith, W. A. Backus.

On motion W. A. Backus was granted a letter of standing.

Other names were presented and characters passed: C E. Woodhead, W. A. Hazlett, J. L. Benton, William Donaldson.

By vote of Conference a letter of transfer to the South Dakota Conference was granted William Donaldson.

Other characters passed were D. A. Scott, E. S. Davidson, Sarah Wilcox, N. E. Heald (deceased), G. W. Cooper (deceased), Charles Sicard, J. J. Coleman, J. R. Babcock, W. W. Rolf, L. C. Mattoon.

Conference adjourned on motion.

Second Day-Morning Meeting-April 3.

The Conference was called to order by the President, and devotional exercises were conducted by Rev. G. E. Bathurst. After the calling of the roll the minutes were read and approved.

On motion the orders of the day were suspended and regular conference business was taken up.

The following names were called and their characters passed: Walter Readett, G. H. Clarke, C. B. Whitaker.

A petition for changing the name of the Eagle Harbor and Yates Charge to the Ashwood Charge was presented to the Conference by Rev. F. C. Adams and was referred to the Committee on Boundaries: H. J. Bullock, G. H. Clarke, Manley Crowell.

The orders of the day having arrived, Walter Readett and Theron Wilder were appointed tellers and Conference proceeded to vote for Conference officers.

The total number of votes cast for President was 29, of which J. R. Babcock received 26 and was declared elected.

The total number of votes cast for Vice-President was 32, of which Charles Sicard received 24 and was declared elected.

The total number of votes cast for Secretary was 32, of which Dean S. Bedford received 25 and was declared elected.

The total number of votes cast for Assistant Secretary was 37. of which Francis B. Markell received 34 and was declared elected.

The total number of votes cast for Treasurer was 36 of which H. R. La Vere received 36 and was declared elected.

On motion Miles Wagner, a duly elected delegate, was seated in Conference. Credentials were lacking.

The following Trustees were elected, each for a term of three years:

Rev. Charles Sicard on first ballot, receiving 31 out of 35 votes cast.

Herbert R. La Vere on second ballot, receiving 27 out of 35 votes cast.

Orval H. Howard on third ballot, receiving 23 out of 36 votes cast.

On ballot for first Ministerial Delegate to the General Conference Rev. J. R. Babcock received 27 votes out of 38 votes cast and was declared elected.

The total number of votes cast for second Ministerial Delegate to the General Conference was 38, of which Rev. Charles Sicard received 29 and was declared elected.

The total number of votes cast for first Lay Delegate to the General Conference was 36, of which E. B. Houghton received 23 and was declared elected.

On motion the time for the election of Delegates was extended. The total number of votes cast for second Lay Delegate was 37, of which James S. Luckey received 20 and was declared elected. Conference adjourned on motion.

Second Day-Afternoon Meeting-April 3.

The Conference was called to order by the President and devotional exercises were conducted by Rev. James A. Bain.

The roll was called and the minutes were read and approved.

Miss Anna Freeman, Matron of Bethesda Home, Bradford; Mrs. Mary Lane Clarke, Y. M. W. B. Superintendent; Rev. F. L. McLeister, Miss Oneida McMillan and Miss Alice Hampe, of the Allegheny Conference, were introduced to the Conference.

The Committee on Religious Services made a partial report and announced a memorial service on Friday from 3:30 to 4.00 P. M. for Rev. G. W. Cooper and Rev. N. E. Heald.

By common consent the time for Rev. Maurice Gibbs to speak on Japanese Missions was deferred until 2:30 P. M.

The Conference proceeded to elect Alternate Ministerial Delegates to the General Conference.

James A. Bain was declared elected on the first ballot and J. J. Coleman on the second ballot.

The order of the day having arrived, Rev. Maurice Gibbs presented the subject of Japanese missions. Miss Alice Hampe also spoke by consent of Conference.

Following the addresses on Japanese missions a collection was taken amounting to \$34.50, of which \$21.50 was given to Mr. Gibbs and \$13.00 to Miss Hampe.

The following Alternate Lay Delegates were elected to the General Conference: Clayton F. Ball on the first ballot, Charles Lindquist on the second ballot.

Miss Florence Yorton, returned missionary from Africa, was introduced to Conference and made a few remarks.

Conference adjourned on motion.

Third Day-Morning Meeting-April 4.

The Conference was called to order by the President, and devotionals were conducted by Rev. J. S. Willett.

The roll was called and the minutes read and approved.

On motion a petition was sent to Hon. H. L. Ames, of Albany, N. Y., protesting against Sabbath desecration. See Report No. 5.

On recommendation of President Luckey the Conference voted to return to the former custom of reading the pastor's statistical reports.

Rev. J. R. Babcock was elected by the Conference to fill the vacancy on the Committee of Itineracy and Orders caused by the resignation of Rev. Charles Sicard, his resignation having been accepted by Conference.

The following names were called and their characters were passed: H. R. La Vere, D. S. Bedford, N. R. Shaffer, May K. Shaffer, R. N. McConnell, B. S. Laughlin, A. J. Taylor, James A. Bain, F. B. Markell.

By vote of Conference, L. C. Mattoon and Clair Baker were excused from Conference.

By vote of Conference a letter of transfer to the Rochester Conference was granted to Rev. A. D. Fero.

On motion Rev. J. J. Coleman was excused from Conference. Conference adjourned for committee work

Third Day-Afternoon Meeting-April 4.

The Conference was called to order by the President and devotional exercises were conducted by Rev. T. W. Murray.

The roll was called and the minutes were read and approved.

Rev. D. H. Scott was excused from Conference after the afternoon session.

Rev. Silvernail, pastor of the Free Methodist Church at Gerry, was introduced to the Conference.

The report of the Committee on Budget was read and adopted after being amended by rating Olean Charge as three-quarters membership.

The report from Bethesda Home was read by Miss Anna Freeman, Matron, and was referred to the Auditing Committee.

W. A. Hazlett was excused by action of Conference.

By vote of Conference the Conference President was instructed to send a letter of condolence from the Conference to Mrs. J. L. Benton relative to the death of her husband.

The subject of Conference entertainment was left in the hands of the Conference officers.

By recommendation of the Conference the Secretary is to be instructed to procure three hundred copies of the Conference Minutes printed and sent pro rata to the different charges.

A memorial service was then held. Rev. Charles Sicard spoke in behalf of Rev. N. E. Heald and Rev. David Scott spoke in behalf of Rev. G. W. Cooper.

A motion prevailed that the Conference approve the Forward Movement Plan of the Executive Board.

By vote of Conference it was recommended that a roll of the honored dead Conference Elders be composed and read at least twice during the Annual Conference.

H. J. Bullock and J. S. Luckey were elected a Committee to compose such a roll.

The repot of the Committee on Boundaries was read and referred back to the Committee.

Conference adjourned on motion.

Fourth Day-Morning Meeting-April 5.

The Conference was called to order by the President and the devotional exercises were conducted by Rev. Walter Readett.

After the calling of the roll the minutes were read and approved as corrected.

The name of James Elliott was called and his character passed. Rev. J. R. Jeffries, Chaplain of the State Institute at Sonyae, was introduced to Conference and made a few appropriate remarks.

On motion President Luckey was excused from Conference.

The report of the Committee on Statistics was read and adopted.

A partial report of the Auditing Committee was read and referred to the Board of the Trustees.

By vote of Conference the surplus of the undivided budget was to be applied to the Conference budget.

By a vote of Conference the President was instructed to request the pastors to send in as undivided budget all money on the budget side of duplex envelopes.

Report of the Committee on Boundaries was read and adopted. See Report No. 10.

Conference adjourned for committee work.

Fourth Day-Afternoon Meeting-April 5.

The Conference was called to order by the President, and devotionals were conducted by Rev. Francis B. Markell.

Following the calling of the roll the minutes were read and approved as corrected.

A motion was carried by which the Secretary was to be in-

structed to compile a list of the active Standing Rules of the Conference.

The order of the day having arrived, President Luckey addressed the Conference in behalf of the educational interests.

Report of the Committee on Thanks was read and adopted. See Report No. 11.

Recess was declared for committee work.

The order of the day having arrived, Rev. J. S. Willett addressed the Conference on the Connectional interests.

Rev. J. R. Jeffries, Chaplain of Sonyae, was received into the Conference as an Elder.

Report of the Committee on Post Office Addresses was read and adopted. See Report. No. 12.

James Elliott and James A. Bain were elected a committee to apportion to the charges their amount of the expenses of the delegates to the General Conference.

The President declared a recess for committee work.

After the calling of the Conference to order, Rev. J. A. Galbraith, pastor of the Frist M. E. Church of Falconer, was introduced to the Conference.

Conference adjourned on motion, to meet at 8:30 P. M.

The evening meeting was called to order by the President, and prayer was offered by Charles Lindquist.

The report of the Committee on Itineracy and Orders was read and adopted. See Report No. 13.

The report of the Board of Trustees was read and adopted. See Report No. 14.

The Committee on Travelling President read its report. The report was adopted. See Report No. 15.

The Committee to whom was assigned the work of apportioning to the charges their share of the expenses of the delegates to the General Conference read its report.

The report was adopted. See Report No. 16.

By vote of Conference the Secretary was instructed to inform, at once, the pastors of the different charges the amount of their apportionment of the expenses to the General Conference.

The Treasurer's report was read and adopted. See Report No. 17.

The report of the Committee on Pastoral Relations was read and adopted. See Report No. 18.

The minutes were read and approved as corrected. Conference adjourned to meet at the call of the Chair.

Report No. 2.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT.

With thanksgiving to the Great Head of the Church for the preservation of life, me meet in the fifty-eighth session of the Lockport Annual Conference.

When we consider the trying circumstances which have surrounded us during the past year, the war conditions and the world wide scourge of influenza, yet through it all so few of our numbers have been stricken down, we look up with grateful hearts to Him who never forgets to care for His own.

As per direction of Conference last year, our entire time has been devoted to the work. Every charge has been visited either for quarterly meetings or special meetings or both. And in these visitations we trust some lasting good has been done.

- 1. The following charges were left in the hands of the President: Chestnut Ridge, Delevan and Machias, and Napoli.
- a. With the exception of a few meetings held by the Rev. W A. Backus, Napoli has been without preaching during the year.
- b. The Rev. Earl Barrett was appointed in charge of the Delevan & Machias charge at first of the year; but afterwards was released from that work and this charge has had no regular preaching since.
- c. Your Committee appointed to investigate the conditions of the Chestnut Ridge Church, suspended said church and the Rev. Earl Barrett was appointed to care for the work. His services have been very satisfactory.
- 2. The Bradford charge was placed in care of Rev. David Green by appointment of the President. On January 26th the Rev. David Greene tendered his resignation and Mrs. Gertrude P. Clocksin, a member of the South Dakota Conference, was appointed pastor for the balance of the year. In the care of this work Mrs. Clocksin has manifested most excellent wisdom, courage and faith.

In my judgment this is a very important field of labor, and I recommend that before this session closes something be done that will permanently aid this class in performing its duties.

- 3. Received by letters of transfer from the Canada Conference: the Rev. Francis B. Markell and the Rev. James A. Bain; from the Champlain Conference, Rev. A. C. Dow.
- 4. Received of Henry R. Barnett \$150.00, amount due Conference by him for support of pastor of Chestnut Ridge Charge for last year.
- 5. Received of William Howlett \$1,500.00, it being the insurance on the Eagle Harbor Church. The amount was turned over to the Chairman of the Board of Trustees.
- 6. The church and parsonage at Delevan have both been rented—the church for school purposes at \$150.00 per year and the parsonage at \$7.00 per month.
- 7. A claim from one Mrs. Edna Bennett was presented against the Church at Short Tract on the ground that her grandfather, Enos Baldwin, who gave the lot on which the church building was erected, inserted a reverting clause in the deed, and that work now being abandoned she demanded her property.

The records were carefully searched, and no such deed being found, the matter was referred to the court for adjustment.

8. The following persons have been authorized to administer

the sacraments and solemnize matrimony: D. H. Scott, A. J. Taylor, James Elliott, E. S. Davidson, William Donaldson.

9. Mr. Charles Lindquist and Clayton Ball were appointed lay members of the Committee on Itineracy and Orders.

Report No. 4.

CHESTNUT RIDGE CHURCH.

The Committee met in the Chestnut Ridge Church on April 30, 1918, and was called to order by the Chairman at 3 o'clock in the afternoon.

Prayer was offered by Rev. Charles Sicard.

A fair representation of the Church being present, the Chairman stated that the Committee was ready to hear any complaints that any one had to make.

The first question asked was concerning the appropriation of funds raised at a donation given for the pastor on October 25, 1917.

This matter was held over for a time and the matter of disbanding the Missionary Society was presented.

Upon motion of G. H. Clarke, seconded by Charles Sicard, the Church Clerk was required to produce the records of the Church dating back to the time when the action in question was taken.

A question was presented concerning the refusal of the Church to correct the minutes of the quarterly meeting of a certain date.

A question was raised concerning the objection of some members of the Church to the reception of Rev. L. C. Mattoon for Church membership.

Henry R. Barnett stated to the Committee that he had acted upon the supposition that the Church had a right to oppose and refuse the privilege of organizing a Woman's Home and Foreign Missionary Society, and a Y. M. W. B., if a majority were opposed to these organizations.

Wallace Barnett stated that he had opposed the organized Bible Class as he did not believe in such organization.

The statement was made to the Committee that when it seemed impossible to carry certain points in the W. H. & F. M. S. by vote, the men were admitted as full voting members and in this way brought about the disbanding of the Society.

The question of misappropriation of donation funds was taken up and fully discussed, with findings as per report.

A portion of the original minutes of a certain Church meeting were presented which the Church Clerk acknowledged as being in his own hand-writing and over his signature. The minutes as entered in the Church record book did not agree with these original minutes. These are the records which the Church refused to correct at a meeting held later.

Testimony was given to prove that the Church voted to pay the expenses of the Delegate to Conference held at Houghton in 1917. No such vote was recorded and the Church refused to correct the record when the matter was taken up later.

On motion the meeting was adjourned until 8:30 in the evening.

The Committee was called to order by the Chairman at 8:30 P. M., and prayer was offered by Brother Washbon.

The matter of the rejection of Rev. L. C. Mattoon from membership in the Church was taken up and Wallace Barnett stated that he had proof that Brother Mattoon had things against him which disqualified him for membership in the Church.

The matter of the payment of telephone bills was taken up and H. R. Barnett stated that the payment of telephone bills had been allowed to become delinquent and that the Telephone Company had been to a great deal of trouble in collecting bills from L. C. Mattoon. He stated that the manager of that branch of the telephone system had so informed him.

H. R. Barnett stated that he would pay the amount of his subscription then due for telephone if the Committee would ask him to do so. This the Committee refused to do, but instead took up an offering among the members of the Committee and paid what was then due.

The Committee adjourned to meet at 9 o'clock on Wednesday morning.

On Wednesday morning the Committee was called to order by the Chairman, and prayer was offered by Ernest Houghton.

Several matters were discussed, but no new evidence of importance was produced.

At ten o'clock a recess was taken, and the Committee formulated its report to the Annual Conference to be held in Levant in the Spring of 1919.

At 10:10 the meeting was again called to order and the findings of the Committee were read to the Church:

I. Misappropriation of donation funds.

II. Illegal disbanding of the W. H. & F. M. S and the Y. M. W. B.

III. Irregular and incorrect recording of Quarterly Conference records.

- IV. Serious reflections upon the character of Rev. L. C. Mattoon by the statements of Wallace Barnett.
 - V. Unwarranted objection to organized Bible Class.

VI. Refusal of certain members to pay pledges made.

In view of the findings of this Committee we consider that the best interests of the Chestnut Ridge Church and surrounding community demand that the Church be suspended until the next session of the Lockport Annual Conference; and we do hereby suspend said Chestnut Ridge Church.

This suspension shall be construed to mean that the care and business incident to the continuance of religious services shall be in charge of the President of the Annual Conference and his Advisory Board.

COMMITTEE ON BUDGET.

- 1. The part of the Budget for Education is \$1,200.00, and all money paid for current expenses of Houghton Seminary, all paid on Educational pledges for Houghton Seminary, and all interest (but not principal) paid on Educational notes for Houghton Seminary, and all money raised on Educational Day by the Y. M. W. B. may count toward this Budget.
- 2. The part of the Budget for Home and Foreign Missions is \$1,600.00, and all money paid for current expenses for Home and Foreign Missions, all money appropriated for this purpose by the W. H. & F. M. Society, and all money paid by the Y. M. W. B. may be counted toward this Budget.
- 3. We recommend that the part of the Budget for Conference be \$1,500.00, that nothing but cash may count toward this Budget, and that this amount shall cover all Conference expenses, except the funds for Superannuated Ministers.
- 4. We recommend that the charges raise all three parts of the Budget as a whole; that this total Budget shall be raised and paid over quarterly; that for all money not paid to the Conference Treasurer a duplicate receipt shall be given, which receipt shall be given to the Conference Treasurer; that it shall be optional with each charge to divide this total Budget or to pay it over undivided, and that undivided parts must be paid to the Conference Treasurer
- 5. If a charge divided its total Budget, we recommend that this rule be followed: All money designed by the donor shall be placed in the fund designated, but all money not designated by the donor shall be so distributed that, so far as possible, each fund including the sums designated for that fund, shall have the same per cent of its apportionment. This rule shall apply until each fund is complete; after that the charge shall divide as it sees fit.
- 6. We recommend that the Conference Treasurer be instructed to remit to the Connectional Treasurer at least quarterly all money received definitely for Educational, or definitely for Missionary work, but that undivided Budget may be retained until it is evident where it will be needed to maintain a balance between the benevolences and should then be distributed so as to maintain this balance.
- 7. We recommend that no charge shall receive credit on its Budget except for cash or receipts sent to the Conference Treasurer.

- 8. We recommend that each pastor shall include in his statistical report these items: Total Budget assigned, the total Budget raised; that the second item shall not be filled in till the pastor has settled with thte Conference Treasurer, and that the account placed in this second item shall be the amount reported to the pastor by the Conference Treasurer.
- 9. We recommend that the Conference authorize each pastor to hand the Budget Committee at the next Annual Conference a list of the members of his charge under sixteen years of age, provided he declares that he knows personally each one on the list is under sixteen. This list shall then be deducted from the number determining Budget apportionment on that charge.
- 10. We recommend that Ellicott, Higgins, Olean, and Wyoming be rated at three-fourths membership; that Bradford, Cameron, and Short Tract be rated at one-half membership; that Delevan and Machias, and Napoli be rated at one-fourth membership, and that the total Budget be then apportioned pro rata. On this basis the apportionment is as follows:

Reports

Report No. 1.

Your Committee on Plan of Work for the coming year would report as follows:

We are hearing the clarion call "Forward" all along the line, and feel that our Conference Missionary Society has also caught the inspiration and means to do its part in the increased effort.

Since we have several arms of the work demanding our attention we must not push one to the detriment of others; but aim to give some attention to them all.

Beginning at our home conference we should first consider our Camp-ground Dormitory and our Rescue Home at Bradford. So far as we now know the only needs of the Dormitory are sash curtains. One or two from each Society would be very acceptable. Please send them to Mrs. Dora W. Sicard, Houghton, N. Y., before July 1st.

Our Rescue Home is in special need of curtains, girls' aprons and small rugs for girls' bed-rooms. Let each Society contribute one or two of each of these. For sizes, etc., consult the Matron.

The annual supply of clothing, fruits and vegetables must always be kept in mind. We would also urge that the ladies of the Missionary Board give special attention to the supplies and furnishings when attending the annual meeting, and make provisions for immediate needs.

The Southern Mountain work is important. We would suggest that each Society make a contribution of \$5,00 or more annually, also send them children's clothing, undergarments for girls being especially needed.

Contributions for our Medical work are also needed, as we firmly believe that God will soon have some one in training for that work, for the need is great.

Our African Hospital is in need of pillows, bed linen and bandages. Let every Society begin at once to make bandages from old muslin from two to five inches in width, the lengths firmly sewed together. Send them to the Wesleyan Methodist Publishing House, that a quantity may be ready for the next out-going missionary party.

India, too, needs household supplies. Can we not send some of these by those who sail in September?

It is desired that this Conference Society assume the support of a Missionary (\$500); that the different Societies make definite pledges, securing as much as possible outside their regular funds, that these may be used in the other channels of work, and that this be the purpose of the appeal at our public meeting.

We would further recommend that the Societies act upon the resolutions of this Society recorded in the Minutes of 1917, regarding the appointment of committees for correspondence with our different missionaries. We believe this to be a most interesting and fruitful plan.

According to Paragraph 207, Article 7, in our Book of Discipline, each Annual Conference Society is requested to send quadrennially to the Treasurer of the General Conference Society a sum equal to ten cents for each member of its auxiliary Societies. Let the Treasurer of each Local Society send their apportionment to the Conference Society Treasurer not later than May 15th.

We must not forget the great need of prayer for each branch of our work and the workers therein. Pray for them both in private and in your regular meetings. Let your President make note of the special requests for prayer by the Mission Workers found in the Wesleyan Methodist and in private letters, presenting them at each meeting that definite prayer be offered for their needs.

We would recommend that the Secretary be instructed to make copies of this report, forwarding one to each Local Society as soon as possible, that they may be thoroughly informed concerning our plan of work for the coming year.
