STANDING RULES

I. The Standing Rules of Conference shall be printed in the Conference Minutes each year.

II. All visiting members of our own, or other Churches in harmony with our principles, shall be invited to honorary seats in the Conference.

III. The Conference President shall receive twenty dollars (\$20) per year for postage and stationery; also any needed traveling expense. At any time the President be required to travel the Conference, his duties and pay shall be defined by the Conference.

IV. The Conference Secretary shall receive twenty-five dollars (\$25) per year for his labor and incidental expenses.

V. The Conference Treasurer shall receive twenty-five dollars (\$25) per year for his services in caring for the funds.

VI. In making his report, the Conference Treasurer is authorized to close his books one week before the Conference session. The Treasurer of the Superannuated Ministers' Relief Association also shall close his books one week before the Conference session.

VII. In our Camp Meeting work, after the expense of the Camp Meeting has been paid by the Camp Meeting Committee, or by the person whom they may designate, any unexpected balance shall be turned over to the Conference Treasurer.

VIII. All monies disbursed by the Conference Treasurer during the interim of Conference shall be upon order of the President, except in case of payment to the President, when such order shall be issued by the Vice-President. It is understood, of course, that any payment ordered by the Conference direct may be paid by the Treasurer without an order as directed above.

IX. No monies shall be loaned by the Conference Treasurer except by order of Conference, or by consent of the President and his Advisory Board.

STANDING RULES-Continued

X. Each elder shall make his engagement as pastor with the understanding that if he be elected Conference President he shall be released in his pastoral engagement.

XI. The first Sunday in each month shall be known as Home Mission Sunday, and the Sunday School offerings shall be given to Home Missions, and should be sent to the Conference Treasurer.

XII. In securing Evangelists for the Camp Meeting work, those of the Wesleyan Methodist Church shall be secured, if this can be done.

XIII. The Camp Meeting Committee shall be composed of the Conference President as Chairman, and three ministers, and three laymen, all to be elected by ballot after the Conference of 1923, the term of office to be three years, the time of one minister and one layman expiring each year.

XIV. Pastors shall state financial items in their statistical reports in even dollars, except in items affecting the Budget, and so far as possible are requested to report all budget items in even dollars. When such rule is not followed, the Statistical Secretaries are authorized to drop decimals, except as provided above.

XV. The offerings for Superannuated Ministers shall be taken within sixty days after Conference, and forwarded to the Treasurer of Superannuate Society.

XVI. That the Preachers in reading their reports at Conference read only items in the aggregate.

Daily Journal of Proceedings

The ninety-fourth session of the Champlain Conference met on the Camp Ground at West Chazy, N. Y., July 9th, 1935. Session was called to order by the President, Rev. A. J. Allen (by the fact of the resignation of the President, Rev. H. N. Robinson). After a song service, opportunity was given for testimony, which was enjoyed by a goodly number, after which the President made some necessary announcements.

Conference was called to order Wednesday a. m. by the President at 8:30. Devotionals were in charge of S. H. Miller. Scripture was read, after which several prayers were offered.

Business—The roll was called. 12 Elders, 2 Conference Preachers, and 10 Delegates answered. Bar of Conference was fixed to include the first five rows of seats in center slips.

President read a letter explaining why he was acting as President. He also offered a program for Conference business which was adopted. See President's Report.

A Committee on Passage of Ministerial Character was elected as follows: Elder, H. R. LaVere, Layman, Mira Hall.

The Committee on Pastoral Relations was then elected: Ministerial, G. D. Jock, Chas. Dayton, C. L. Hill. Laymen, W. G. Olney, Malcom Ross, Rose Forguites.

Time for opening and closing of Conference business meetings was as follows: Opening of morning meeting, devotionals, 8:30; business, 8:45; closing, 11:30. Afternoon, opening, 1:30; closing by vote. This order for first day of Conference. Other days, afternoon meeting at the call of the Chair.

The President's report was called for and given orally. He reported that about December of 1934 he took up the duties of President. April 2nd he called Conference Camp Meeting Committee together at the parsonage at West Chazy, N. Y. for the purpose of planning for the 1935 Conference and Camp. His report was accepted. Conference adjourned by vote.

An Order of the Day was taken up. Meeting of the Superannuate Society of the Conference. See Report.

Wednesday Afternoon

Devotional service was led by R. J. Grayson. Roll was called. Minutes read and approved. Conference Sunday School Secretary gave his report. See Report. Report was accepted.

Committee on Pastoral Relations gave a partial report in the form of a resolution. Motion was made and carried to defer the above recommendation to the next meeting of Conference.

The following names were called and passed: A. J. Allen, Florence Shippee, E. D. Carpenter, Chas. Dayton, Sarah Green, C. L. Hill.

A paper and a letter from President J. S. Luckey was read to Conference pertaining to our school at Houghton. Motion was made and carried that the Secretary of the Conference reply to President Luckey in behalf of the Conference in regard to this paper.

Time for an Order of the Day having come Conference business gave place to the Conference sermon. Chas. Dayton having been elected to preach the Conference sermon, was present and gave the sermon.

Thursday Morning Meeting

8:30, Devotionals by R. J. Grayson.

8:45, Business—The roll was called and the minutes of the preceding meeting were read and approved. Report of Conference Treasurer was given. See Report. Report was accepted.

Unfinished business was then taken up, that of the recommendation of the Committee on Pastoral Relations. Some discussion followed after which the matter was again referred to the Committee on Pastoral Relations. The following names were called and passed: G. D. Jock, H. R. LaVere. Brother LaVere made a request of Conference for \$50 to apply on repairs of Hadley Church. Request was referred to Committee on Pastoral Relations.

Conference voted to hold a Ministerial Institute, October 2 to 4, at the Wesleyan Methodist Church in Glens Falls, N. Y. C. R. Stopp, Chas. Dayton and W. F. Lewis were elected a Committee to arrange for said Institute. Conference voted that this Committee be made a Standing Committee of Conference.

An invitation was given from the Forest Dale Church to hold the Annual Y. M. W. B., Sunday School and W. Y. P. S. Convention there. This invitation was accepted. The time set for said Convention was August 27, 28 and 29, 1935. It was also voted by Conference to invite the Rev. Roy Nicholson, newly elected Connectional Sunday School Secretary, to come as the principle speaker of the Convention. At this time Conference business gave way to hear our Connectional

Representative, Rev. E. F. McCarty. Rev. McCarty gave a very inspiring and helpful address in regard to our Connectional interests. Rev. W. D. Correll, our Camp Meeting Evangelist, was introduced to Conference, and made appropriate remarks.

Conference adjourned by vote. Benediction by C. L. Hill.

Thursday Afternoon Meeting

Meeting was called to order by the President to consider the matter which was referred to the Committee on Pastoral Relations. Conference adjourned without taking action. Benediction by R. Hewett.

Friday Morning Meeting

Devotionals were conducted by Florence Shippee. Business was called at 8:45 with the calling of the roll and reading of the minutes of former meetings. Minutes were approved. The name of Rev. J. J. Davison was called and he made remarks concerning his life and work. A matter of unfinished business was taken up, that of a recommendation offered to Conference, by the Committee on Pastoral Relations, and referred back for consideration.

An Order of the Day was taken up, the election of Conference Officers which resulted as follows: President, A. J. Allen; Vice-President, George D. Jock; Secretary, L. C. Mattoon; Treasurer, H. R. La-Vere; Sunday School Secretary, W. F. Lewis; Tithing Secretary, R. J. Grayson. A. O. Northrup and G. D. Jock assistants to the Sunday School Secretary.

Conference voted to hold next session of Conference at West Chazy, N. Y., June 30th, 1936. Motion was made and carried that C. L. Hill preach the opening sermon of Conference Wednesday afternoon of Conference at three o'clock. O. M. Finch alternate.

Committee on Resolutions gave its report. See Report. Report was accepted. Conference voted that the matter referring to cigarettes and Prohibition in the resolution, be forwarded to the Civic League at Albany, N. Y. Report of Conference Tithing Secretary was given and accepted. Conference adjourned by limitation of time. Benediction by E. D. Carpenter.

Friday Afternoon Meeting

Unfinished business was brought up at a called meeting of Conference Friday afternoon. The recommendation offered to Conference by the Committee on Pastoral Relations was read and discussed item by item. Item 1, That we have a traveling President. Item 1 was approved. Item 2, That the President receive \$15 per week and traveling expense. Item 2 was approved. Item 3, That the Conference Budget be \$1.75. This item was approved.

Saturday Morning Meeting

Devotionals, 8:30. Business, 8:45. Roll call and reading of the minutes of last meeting. Minutes were approved.

The following names were called and passed: H. H. Chapman, O. M. Finch, R. J. Grayson, A. O. Northrup, W. F. Lewis, L. C. Mattoon, S. H. Miller, Dennis Osgood, Mary Robinson.

Motion was made and carried that the Conference be divided into two Districts, to be known as the Northern and Southern, for the purpose of holding District Holiness meetings. Representatives from each district were to get together and nominate Chairmen for their districts. Adjourned by limitation of time. Benediction by E. D. Carpenter.

Saturday Afternoon Meeting

Meeting was called to order by the President at 4 p. m.

The Committee on Itineracy and Orders gave its report. See Report. Report was adopted.

Sunday Morning Meeting

The morning service was begun with a social meeting. There was a good attendance, with many taking part in the testimony service. The sermon of the morning was brought by Rev. E. F. McCarty. This was an ordination service wherein one was ordained to the office and work of an Elder, Rev. Duane Chadwick.

Monday Morning Meeting

Devotion at 8:30, conducted by G. D. Jock. Business was called at 8:45 with the President in the Chair. Minutes were read and approved. Committee on Pastoral Relations read their report. See Report. Report was adopted item by item, as revised.

A. O. Northrup was elected by Conference as Chairman of the Northern District, with R. J. Grayson as Chairman of the Southern District, for the purpose of holding Holiness District meetings. The President nominated L. C. Mattoon and W. G. Olney as his Advisory Board. Conference elected same.

Committee on Budget gave its report. See Report. Report was adopted.

Chas. Dayton was nominated by the Conference W. Y. P. S. and elected by Conference as W. Y. P. S. President. C. L. Hill was elected Educational Secretary for the Conference. Moved and carried that the President appoint the Chairmen of the Conference Committees.

Moved and carried that the churches take an offering soon for the expense of the Y. M. W. B., W. Y. P. S. and Sunday School Convention, and send same or bring to Convention. Same to go to the Sunday School Secretary.

The following names were called and passed: C. R. Stopp, F. C. Taylor, J. F. Wright, F. H. Wright, Duane Chadwick, Pearl Knowlton, Reginald Hewett and Nathan Capen. Conference voted that G. D. Jock write the greetings of the Champlain Conference to Rev. J. F. Wright.

The Sunday School Secretary gave his Annual Report which was accepted. See Report. It was moved and carried that the Conference President be given power of Attorney, and is hereby authorized to act in the matter of conferring a title of the Chazy Church property to F. H. Tyler, per action of Conference of 1934. Moved that Conference adjourn to the call of the Chair. Prayer by E. D. Carpenter. Benediction by H. R. LaVere.

Duties of Conference President

The duties of the Conference President shall be:

To hold one quarterly meeting on each charge during the year unless the work on some of the weaker charges or new fields should so fully take his time and attention as to make this impractical. He shall be allowed two weeks' vacation with pay.

Recommendations

When the Hadley Church raises fifty dollars cash for repairs of property, the Conference shall duplicate the amount.

When the Mill Creek Charge gives evidence of vital interest in the revival of the church and raises fifty dollars cash for repair of the property, the Conference will contribute an equal amount for the same.

The Conference President and his Advisory Board shall have power to act in relation to moving the Popes Mills Church to Heuvelton, and funds from the Conference may be used, not to exceed five hundred dollars (\$500).

1. The President shall travel the Conference.

2. His salary shall be fifteen dollars (\$15) per week, for the time thus spent; the Conference shall pay his traveling expenses.

3. The Conference Budget shall be one dollar and seventy-five cents (\$1.75) per member.

PLAN OF WORK FOR LOCAL SOCIETIES

We recommend the following Plan of Work:

1. That each Local Society shall have some Missionary Study or Program at each meeting to enlighten our minds, broaden our vision and inspire our hearts to pray definitely for our work and workers on each of our mission fields.

2. That each Society shall have a solicitor who will earnestly endeavor to get new subscriptions to The Wesleyan Missionary and keep account of needed renewals.

3. That all goods sent to our mission fields be sent to those in charge of said work. And that proper credit be given for such goods, but not in the column with cash receipts and disbursements.

4. That the use of Thank Offering Boxes be continued in the Local Societies.

5. That we continue the sending of supplies to the Foreign Missionary fields, such as bandages, religious books, pictures or calendars.

6. That each Society sending money for any branch of the work see that the Pastor receives duplicate receipt so that proper credit may be given on the budget.

7. That each Local Society shall have at least one public meeting during the year in which missionary needs shall be emphasized.

8. That each Delegate report to the Local Society at the first meeting after Conference the proceedings at conference and give any needed information concerning the work.

9. That we continue to send clothing or cash for the care of the boys at the Orphanage direct to Brother Jones, and not to Sister Miller. However be sure to send her a statement of what is sent.

10. That each Local Society continue the sending of \$6.00 annually to the Conference Treasurer to be forwarded to the General Treasurer for the Southern Mountain Work. Also \$5.00 annually for the Orphanage which applies on the budget.

11. That \$.25 per member dues be sent to the Conference Treasurer, half of which is to be retained in the Conference for expense and the other to be forwarded to the General Treasurer.

12. Sheets and pillows and pillow cases are needed for the Camp Ground, also fruit and vegetables to help in the entertainment of the Conference.

13. We recommend the observance of special days such as Harvest Day for Educational work; Easter Program for Home Missions, and that we coöperate in observing the World Day of Prayer for the outpouring of the Spirit of God, and an ingathering of souls to extend over the world.

14. That if possible we shall have at least one Missionary Convention during the year in the different districts or, if possible, the Conference as a whole, with a missionary as speaker.

15. That the Plan of Work and Standing Rules be read and emphasized quarterly.
