

DAILY PROCEEDINGS.

The Fifteenth Annual Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Churches of Ohio convened at Greer, Ohio, August 15, 1922.

Rev. H. W. Thompson preached the opening sermon. Text, 2 Corinthians 8:9. Prayer by the President, Rev. A. W. Smith.

Wednesday, August 16th.

Conference opened at 9:30 A. M., with singing. Scripture lesson, by Rev. A. W. Smith, Philippians 2nd chapter. Prayer by Rev. H. R. Smith, followed by congregational singing.

Committee on Credentials—H. R. Smith, Chas. Hill. Partial report was made. Adopted.

Time of services was fixed at 9 A. M., 2:30 P. M., 8 P. M. Conference bar was fixed as follows: First four seats on right of church and first four on left.

A Nominating Committee of three was elected, consisting of Rev. H. W. Thompson and Rev. Chas. Hill, Elders, and Ralph McMillan, lay member.

Recess for thirty minutes.

The Nominating Committee gave the following report. Adopted. See report.

Committee on Credentials presented the names of Mrs. Myrta Taylor and Hugh Hughes, Delegates.

The Conference President, Rev. A. W. Smith, gave his yearly report. Adopted. See report.

The Conference Treasurer was made an honorary member of the Conference body.

Mrs. Edith Lee, Organizer of the W. H. & F. M. Society for the Eastern District, and Prof. J. S. Luckey, President of Houghton Seminary, were introduced to the Conference body. Both expressed the desire that the blessing of God might rest upon the Conference session.

It was agreed that all persons introduced to the Conference body be made honorary members of the same.

Recessed.

Motion prevailed that J. S. Luckey, President of Houghton Seminary, be given Thursday, 2:30 P. M., at which time he might present the Educational interests.

Committee on Examination of Character gave a partial report. Adopted. See report.

Ordered that Friday, 9 o'clock, be the time for Conference

election of officers.

The Conference Treasurer made his report, which was referred

to the Auditing Committee. See report.

Rev. J. W. Boggs, of Zanesville, Ohio, spoke of the need at that place for a house of worship.. He was referred to the Conference Trustees.

Recessed.

The evangelistic service Wednesday, 2:30 P. M., was conducted by Rev. J. W. Boggs. Text, Proverbs 22:28.

Rev. A. W. Smith, Conference President, gave the Conference sermon Wednesday evening, from Jude 3.

Thursday, August 17, 1922.

Conference opened at 9 A. M., in charge of Rev. S. M. Van-Blaricom.

Rev. and Mrs. Folger, Rev. I. F. McLeister, Rev. and Mrs. C. J. Gasdorf were introduced to the Conference.

The transfers of Rev. and Mrs. L. L. Folger from the Indiana Conference were received.

The Committee on Examination of Character passed the following persons: W. B. Whitehead, Samuel Vorhies, H. R. Smith, G. E. Dudgeon, H. W. Thompson, Chas. Hill, E. D. Packer, S. M. VanBlaricom, A. W. Smith, L. A. Smothers, J. W. Boggs, Wm. Mayle.

The Nominating Committee gave a partial report.

Ordered that all candidates taking the Conference Course of Study appear before the Committee on Itineracy and Orders, some member of the Committee, or some one whom the Committee may designate.

President J. S. Luckey had charge of the afternoon service, at which time he brought before the Conference the interests of our Educational work. His subject was, "God's Plan for Every Life." In part he said: "There is a need of being called to any vocation. It is God's plan for all to succeed. It is God's will that all succeed in the vocations in which they are placed. We must pay the price in order to achieve success. There is always a reason for our suc-

cess, namely, Work. Geniuses are not born. Success is within the reach of all. Preparation should be definite in order to succeed. There should be a definite period spent in such preparation, at least eleven years in school. Every boy or girl of today can obtain such schooling. It is their right. We should not hold them back. Our powers should be directed. Without an educated heart, education is a dangerous thing. Where the youth receives his training he will work. Thus we see the necessity of educating our own young people in our own schools."

At the close of his address, President Luckey asked that a Committee of six be selected to investigate his proposed plan for endowing Houghton Seminary. Referred to the Nominating Committee.

Rev. I. F. McLeister was in charge of the Thursday evening service. The subject was, "The Lost Christ." The text was taken from Luke 2:48.

OHIO CONFERENCE PRESIDENT'S REPORT

For the Year 1921 - 1922.

Immediately following our last Conference it was my pleasure to meet with the South Ohio Conference in their annual gathering. While there a special Committee was appointed to meet with me at Zanesville, O. This Committee met and its action will be the subject of a special report.

Early in September a bill of charges, properly drawn and signed, against R. A. Hoffman, Annual Conference Preacher and pastor at Kenton, was received. The charges were served on him and the time of trial fixed for October 4, 1921. On the twenty-fourth day of September your President was taken to his bed with typhoid fever and remained there until the thirteenth of November. In the

meantime Mr. Hoffman was also taken ill and the matter of trial was deferred until February, 1922. The findings of the trial Committee will be presented to this body by the Secretary of that Committee.

On January 12, 1922, I received the resignation of Clarence White, pastor at Findlay, and immediately appointed E. D. Packer to fill the vacancy.

In the month of July I received the resignation of Rev. J. C. Omerod as pastor of the Belfontaine Church.

Owing to my long continued sickness I have visited but a few of the charges but have found them usually in a hopeful spirit and in a good degree of grace. Africa, Belfontaine, Zanesville, Ridge Avenue, were visited. Others I should have visited had not the shortness of time between my recovery and the opening of this Conference prevented.

I wish to express my deepest gratitude to the brethren for their anxiety for my recovery and to the Churches of the Conference for their special prayers in my behalf. Due to the fervent and effectual prayer of the righteous I am here with you today, fully recovered and richer in grace for the affliction which was on me.

My soul longs to see the Kingdom advance and the Conference take her full place in that advancement.

REPORT OF AUDITING COMMITTEE.

The Committee appointed for the auditing of the Treasurer's accounts submit the following report:

All accounts are found to be correct in every particular and in a commendable condition, except in the case of a check of one dollar for stamps, which amount was not entered upon the book. Because of this mistake, we recommend that the Treasurer be reimbursed from the Conference funds, as he had replaced the difference from his own funds. Likewise we found 51 cents in stamps which were not reported in the final balance of \$2,036.67, making a total balance of \$2,037.18.

REPORT OF BUDGET COMMITTEE.

Your Committee to whom was referred the matter of apportioning the Budget reports as follows:

We recommend:

First. That the Budget for Mission shall be \$2,265.00.

Second. That the Budget for Education shall be \$955.00.

Third. That the Budget for Conference Work shall be \$955.00, and that fifty per cent of the amount raised as Undivided Conference Fund shall be set apart to apply on the salary of a traveling President when elected. The other fifty per cent to be divided as follows:

Forty per cent for Conference Incidentals; Twenty-five per cent for Conference Missions; Ten per cent for Superannuated Elders' Fund; Ten per cent for Conference Sunday School work; Ten per cent for Pastors' Moving Fund; Five per cent for General Conference Delegates' Fund.
