Journal of Daily Proceedings

FIRST SITTING, TUESDAY, JULY 16, 2:00 P. M.

The sixty-fifth session of the South Carolina Annual Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America convened in the tabernacle on the grounds of the Wesleyan Camp Meeting Association at Greer, South Carolina, at 2:00 p. m., July 16, 1957. The President, Rev. V. A. Mitchell, conducted devotions using Acts 8:1-25, as a scripture lesson.

The President, Rev. V. A. Mitchell, called the Conference to order.

The roll call revealed that 38 Elders and 12 Conference Preachers were present.

CREDENTIALS—The Committee on Credentials reported and the roll of lay delegates was called with 41 responding. In the absence of both the delegate and the alternate, the Conference voted to seat J. L. McCauley as delegate from North Charleston.

CONFERENCE BAR—The President declared the Conference Bar to consist of the platform and the first seven seats in the three middle tiers of seats. The Vice-President was called to the Chair.

EDUCATIONAL SECRETARY—The Conference elected G. M. Nalley as educational secretary.

The Minutes were read and approved.

The Conference voted to adopt the Minutes of the entire session.

Conference adjourned sine die at 10:30 p. m.

Standing Rules and Resolutions

- 1. That no member of the Conference shall have his character passed who fails to carry out all the rules and orders of this Conference, unless providentially hindered, except upon a three-fourths vote of the body.
- 2. That we earnestly urge all our Licentiates not receiving any appointments to pastoral or evangelistic work to preach at least once a month, and to hold if possible a two weeks' revival during the year.
- 3. That no person be licensed to preach who does not tithe his income; that all our Licentiates be required to faithfully tithe their income; and that the license of no preacher be renewed, who fails to tithe.
- 4. We recommend that all charges and stations to which the pastor moves pay the moving and transportation expenses of said pastor, the same to be done in addition to his salary.
- 5. That we as a Conference put forth every possible effort through education, pulpit, preaching, voting, and other means to advance the cause of temperance and to secure legislation for abolishing the sale of beer, wine, and whiskey for beverages.
- 6. That the Trustees of the South Carolina Annual Conference, together with the President of the said Conference, be and they hereby are empowered to execute, all necessary papers, mortgage deeds, and papers of a like character, when necessary to secure loans to the South Carolina Annual Conference or to any church needing funds to liquidate Conference, church, or parsonage indebtedness, provided that the party or parties requesting such action shall set forth in writing the true nature and purpose for which the loan is requested (this writing is to become a part of the permanent records of the Trustees) and that the Trustees and President of said Conference are satisfied that the object for which said loan or loans is sought is both necessary and desirable. Whenever money is borrowed for use of a local church the local church shall agree to and be responsible for its payment.
- 7. That the Trustees of the South Carolina Annual Conference be and they hereby are empowered to sign any or all deeds and papers for the transfer of real property that is now or hereafter may be held in trust by said trustees, where the sale of Conference, church, or parsonage or other real estate has been approved or authorized by the President of the Conference with the concurrence of two-thirds of his Advisory Board.
- 8. During the interim of Annual Conference the Missionary Board shall be duly authorized to draw on the funds for Mountain Missions and Conference

Missions, for the purpose for which each was raised, as it deems best for the interest of the Conference, and the Treasurer shall be authorized to make payments from these funds upon written order signed by the President and at least one-half the other member of the Missionary Board, or signed by the President in behalf of the Missionary Board.

9. Any church which engages in a building or remodeling project or which purchases a parsonage, church building or a lot on which a church or parsonage is to be constructed, regardless of whether the property is to be owned by the local church or the Conference, is required to have the plans approved by the Conference Board on Church and Parsonage Building and Location.

Any church which secures aid from the Conference must have its property deeded to the Conference Trustees, as is required by our Discipline; and any church which engages in a building or remodeling project must have the plans approved by the Conference Board on Church and Parsonage Building and Location, according to the requirements of our Discipline, if said church is to receive aid from the Conference for these building projects.

- 10. All pastors shall have their Statistical reports in the hands of the Statistical Committee by 8:00 a.m. Wednesday of Conference.
- 11. The salary of the outgoing pastor shall close on Sunday preceding the opening of Annual Conference and the church is required to include the week of Conference in the incoming pastor's salary.
- 12. Each charge should give its pastor the privilege of being away from his church, or churches, for two meetings per year, and no pastor is to be away from his charge for more than two meetings per year without a vote of his church, or charge, giving permission; and it is recommended that each church or charge give its pastor a two-weeks vacation with pay each year.
- 13. All officers and committees shall take up their duties at the close of the sitting of conference in which they are elected.
 - 14. Conference shall convene each year on the Tuesday nearest July 15.
- 15. The books of the Conference Treasurer shall close two weeks before Conference.
 - 16. The Conference Secretary shall be the Committee on Credentials.
- 17. W. T. Hughey, Treasurer of the South Carolina Conference of The Wesleyan Methodist Church of America, or his successor, is authorized to sign United States bonds held by the South Carolina Conference of The Wesleyan Methodist Church of America.
- 18. When a church engages in a building or remodeling project at least one-half of the estimated cost of the project must be on hand before said project is undertaken unless other satisfactory arrangements are made. If other arrangements are made the Board of Trustees must approve them before they are considered satisfactory.

- 19. A church which is not on a charge with other churches may keep only one record book for church and quarterly records and the Church Clerk serve as Quarterly Conference Clerk.
- 20. The President shall appoint an Auditing Committee in time for it to audit the books of the treasurers before conference.
- 21. If a pastor desires to resign his work during the interim of Annual Conference, he shall give the President and his advisory Board notice at least two weeks before the effective date of his resignation. However, if the President and his Advisory Board deem the cause for his desire to resign sufficient, they may accept the resignation immediately.
- 22. Certificates of Citation are to be presented to ministers who have given 25 years of active ministerial service in God's Kingdom (20 years in case of retirement or death) as a member of the South Carolina Conference. At the close of each succeeding five years the old certificate is to be returned and a new one given; and at retirement or death a certificate is to be given recognizing the total period of active service. An evangelist must hold ten meetings during the year to receive credit for a year of service. The Citation Committee is to be composed of the President and Secretary. (See Minutes of 1953)
- 23. During the interim of the Annual Conference, the Committee on Finance shall be duly authorized to draw on the funds for Conference Work, Minutes, Conference Entertainment, Conference Parsonage, and President's Salary for the purpose for which each was raised, as it deems best for the interest of the Conference; and the Treasurer shall be authorized to make payment from these funds upon written order signed by the President and at least one-half the other members of the Committee on Finance or signed by the President by order and in behalf of the Committee on Finance. Reports

REPORT NO. 1

President's Report

With mixed emotions we report to the Sixty-fifth Session of the South Carolina Conference. As per a previous announcement we are asking that you not vote for us as Conference President. We have been elected by the Board of Administration as Executive Assistant Secretary in the Department of Church Extension and Home Missions. In accepting the call of the Church in this new office we ask an interest in your prayers. Let us be prayerful as we elect our new leader. We have a fine group from which to choose. We pledge our fullest support and cooperation to whoever is elected.

A FINAL CHARGE

For eight years you have honored us with this office of Conference President. From the day of our election to the present hour we have not felt worthy of the honor nor capable for the task. Had it not been for your efforts and the special help of God, the accomplishments of the last eight years would not have been possible. Let us give glory to God for all that has been achieved:

- 1. PHYSICALLY—We have spoken 2,078 times or an average of five times a week, without once having to miss an appointment due to ill health on our part and only once due to illness in our family.
- 2. PROVIDENTIALLY—We have traveled by car, train, bus, and plane 180,000 miles (including our trip to the Holy Land) without mishap or major accident.
- 3. NUMERICALLY—In 1949 we reported 2,381 full and associate members. Today we report 2,879 full, associate, and Junior members—a gain of 498. In 1949, we reported an average Sunday School attendance of 3,391. Today, we report 4,522—a gain of 1,131. During this period the following Churches have been organized: Clinton Road (Whitmire), Converse, Sans Souci, and Seneca. Also, substantial financial assistance from Conference missions was given to help conserve and establish the churches at Columbia, Florence, Greenwood, and North Charleston. The average size of our church membership shows a gain of five. We now have two portable tabernacles in use in new field work.
- 4. MATERIALLY—Fourteen new church buildings have been bought or built and seventeen have undergone major improvements. We now have four-

teen more parsonages. Five churches have replaced their parsonages with new ones and two have made major improvements. The total property value increase is almost one million dollars. The Conference parsonage has been replaced with a spacious and convenient parsonage and office. A new tabernacle has replaced the old one and other major improvements have been made to our Camp property pushing the value of our property still higher.

- 5. FINANCIALLY—The total amount contributed for budget has increased \$11,748.00. The total amount contributed for pastoral support has increased \$66,252.00. The total contributed for all purposes increased \$115,967.00, and the total per capita giving has gone from \$113.00 to \$134.00. A Conference paper has been published which has made a valuable contribution to the work.
- 6. SPIRITUALLY—The Holy Ghost anointed us for the task you assigned us. Many times we had this anointing as we preached in your pulpits, presided over the business meetings, counseled with individuals and committees and visited in your homes. We have seen many souls brought to the Lord through our unworthy ministry. This review is given for the Glory of the Lord. Let not man claim the glory. Each of us has only been an instrument in the hands of God. Christ taught us: "When ye shall have done all those things which are commanded you, say, we are unprofitable servants: We have done that which was our duty to do."—Luke 17:10.

FUTURE POSSIBILITIES

The immediate years ahead should be the best years of the Conference. We have some of the finest ministers and laymen in the world. We are a part of what to me is the greatest church found anywhere. Our church is sound in doctrine, sane in standards, spiritual in its program, and serviceable in its mission. This is Wesleyan Methodism's Greatest Hour! Let us, therefore, give to God and the Wesleyan Methodist Church our moral, financial, and spiritual support.

Let us leave this gathering determined to give our Conference and Denominational leaders our cooperation and charity. We must NOT fail them.

In the field of Church Extension we expect a new church building to soon be erected at Sans Souci. This must be done to conserve the gains made there. The Rally Day and Thanksgiving Offerings of 1955 netted \$1,980.39 which is ear-marked to purchase a lot in the Greater Spartanburg area to launch a new church when the Conference is able to sponsor such. Interest has been expressed and some tentative support pledged toward purchasing a lot in the Laurens Road section of Greenville. This should be followed up as soon as possible.

Not only must our borders be extended into new fields but the home base must be broadened. Real revival is the only answer for this. Let us make genuine revival our quest for 1957-1958! Revival will come when we humble ourselves before God; when we confess our faults and failures; when we make right our wrongs to our fellowman; when we pray the prayer of faith; and when we obey God. This revival will improve the spiritual tone of our churches, lift the level of our people's living, help settle the attendance and financial problems,

and improve our church membership both in quantity and in quality. Therefore, the future is as bright as the Promises of God and Victory as near as revival. God is surely trying to break in on us. Let us pledge ourselves to seek revival earnestly.

FUNDAMENTAL PRINCIPLES

Our road ahead, while indeed is promising, is likewise surrounded with perils. We dare NOT miss the way in any direction.

- (1) While grateful for every victory won, we must not become self-satisfied and complacent. More zeal, prayer, and hard labor must be exerted than ever before to gain greater victories for the Lord.
- (2) Proper emphasis must be given to executing a spiritual program. Dead ritualism, nor cold formalism, nor dead informality will achieve our goal. We must have victorious living, vigorous praying and vigilant labors, if we accomplish our work. Holy living, heavenly anointing and hours of praying are needed to accomplish this.
- (3) We must avoid the extremist that would take us down the road of compromise on one hand and to unreasonable and fanatical positions on the other. There should be no place for either in the South Carolina Conference. The extremist is more popular and sensational with those who share his feelings than is the one who takes a sane and scriptural position, but the cause of God is served best by this latter course. We must avoid worldliness and ever speak out against the evils of our day on the one hand and yet avoid making this the sole theme of our witness. We must proclaim a well-rounded message that emphasizes all that the Bible emphasizes and in the same proportion. We must not put secondary emphasis on primary things nor primary emphasis on secondary things.
- (4) We must recognize that "Every man has an inalienable right to private judgment in matters of religion, and an equal right to express his opinion in any way which will not violate the laws of God or the rights of his fellow men." In doing this we must stand for our convictions but do it in the right spirit. We should not become suspicious and critical toward others who may not fully share our feelings in the issue.
- (5) We must esteem highly our Church heritage and pledge to it anew our loyalty and service.

These fundamental principles put in practice will enable us to conserve our gains and to go on to greater accomplishments.

A GOOD YEAR

This has been a good year. A number of valuable gains have been registered. The statistical report reveals gains in most every department.

BUDGET—A total increase of budget contributions of nearly \$3,000.00 over last year was realized with every item except President's salary, Conference work, Conference Missions, and Home Missions sharing a percentage gain. By some special gifts, the Pension Budget was paid in full.

GRAHAM CHAPEL has built a new six-room parsonage with a bath and a half, valued at \$9,500.00.

GOLDEN GROVE has built a new six-room brick veneer parsonage valued at \$11,000.00. They also paid a full budget.

OAKWAY sold their old parsonage and built a beautiful brick veneer eight-room parsonage with two baths, car port, and a large basement, valued at \$17,500.00. Also, they installed new pews in the Church at a cost of \$1,200.00.

UNION sold the old church and purchased another church building in a better location subject to receiving a clear title to said property.

SENECA completed the basement unit of their auditorium. The basement will be used as an auditorium now, but will be converted into seven Sunday School rooms when the auditorium is built later.

EDEN has begun a six-room parsonage with a full basement.

CENTRAL SECOND, WHITMIRE FIRST, EASLEY FIRST, AND COMMUNITY are raising money to launch building programs later.

ARIAIL (Easley) installed a hot-air heating system at a cost of \$3,000.00. CENTRAL SECOND paid off their indebtedness and dedicated their building.

We also suffered some severe losses. On January 15, 1957, fire completely destroyed our Headquarters building in Syracuse, New York. Our people have rallied to the need and plans are under way to soon begin our new building in Marion, Indiana.

On January 18, 1957, Rev. O. B. Stewart, pastor at Golden Grove, died after a brief illness. His ministry was sane, his life spiritual, and his deportment exemplary. This good man has gone to be with the Lord. During the year, Mrs. J. T. Carey and Mrs. J. R. Green, super-annuated widows, went to their reward. Mrs. Maude Youngblood, wife of Rev. John Youngblood, was promoted to her Heavenly inheritance. A number of faithful laymen are now silent in death. Let us labor so as to be able to meet them when we are called from this earth.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- 1. That the Conference trustees be authorized to correct the name of our charter which is listed "The Wesleyan Methodist Conference of South Carolina" to our official title of "The South Carolina Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America."
- 2. That the following be added at the close of Standing Rule No. 6: Whenever money is borrowed for use of a local Church, the local Church shall agree to and be responsible for its payment.
- 3. That a committee of five be elected as a committee on Christian Action whose duties shall be to make recommendations relative to our relationship with the Christian Action Council, cooperate with the Council, and serve as a committee on Christian citizenship and moral reform.
- 4. That at least \$100.00 per year of the Evangelistic Offering turned over to the Conference by the President be ear-marked to purchase office chairs, desk, and equipment for Conference office.

OFFICIAL ACTS OF THE PRESIDENT AND HIS ADVISORY BOARD

January 2, 1957—We approved the sale of the Oakway parsonage, the proceeds from same to be used in building the new parsonage.

January 2, 1957—Upon recommendation of the Conference Pension Board and at his request, Rev. J. M. Hames was appointed to superannuated relations to the Conference.

February 11, 1957—At the request of the Church, we appointed Rev. Sam Hanvey assistant pastor of the Walhalla Church.

February 11, 1957—At the request of the Church, we appointed Rev. Robert Earley pastor of the Golden Grove Church which was made vacant by the death of Rev. O. B. Stewart. Rev. Earley was on this day received as a minister from the Southern Methodist Church.

March 2, 1957—We approved the sale of the Union Church building, the proceeds to be used in purchasing a church building located on West Main Street.

July 8, 1957—I granted a letter of transfer to Rev. T. B. Rhodes to the South Georgia Conference.

July 10, 1957—I appointed Rev. George Nalley and Rev. Charles Shirley to audit the books of the Conference Treasurer.

Standing Rules and Recommendations

- 1. We emphasize the need of much prayer and intercession in these evil days, and that fasting and self-denial be observed as well.
- 2. The W. M. S. dues of one dollar (\$1.00) per member are to be divided as follows: Foreign Missions, \$.25; Home Missions, \$.25; General Fund, \$.25; and Unspecified, \$.25.
- 3. The Y. M. W. B. dues are fifty-five cents (55c) for our Conference. The fifty-two cents (52c) is to be used for foreign missions, one cent (1c) desk expense, and two cents (2c) for General Conference travel expense of Y. M. W. B. Superintendent.
- 4. The annual report blanks must be in the hands of the Conference Statistician by July 1 of each Conference year.
- 5. Each local society should pay annually an amount equal to twenty-five (25c) per active member to be used as a general administrative fund, not to apply on budget.
- 6. We urge each local society to have an alert Magazine Solicitor, an active Mission Study group, and a large Prayer Partner circle.
- 7. It shall be the duty of each District Superintendent to supervise the interests of the societies in her district. This may be done by visitation, correspondence, the holding of conventions and rallies, the organizing of societies and bands where none exists, and giving of her time as she deems needful. Each society or district is to bear her expense on said visits.
- 8. We urge the use of the Standard of Efficiency so that each society may work to be placed on the Honor Roll.
- 9. The Executive Committee will serve as a nominating committee to nominate committees as deemed necessary before the opening of conference.
