JOURNAL OF DAILY PROCEEDINGS

First Meeting-Tuesday A. M.

The Seventy-Fifth Session of the Iowa Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church met on the Camp Grounds at Charles City, Iowa, August the 14th, 1928, at 10:30 P. M.

The President, Rev. C. S. Weigel, called the Conference to order, and Rev. B. J. Hoover led in singing No. 37 and No. 115 in the "Songs

of Perfect Love."

Fervent prayers were offered by the Brethren Carkuff, Hoover and Weigel. The President read and discoursed on the first seven verses of the second chapter of II Timothy, preaching on "What It Means to Be a Soldier of the Cross."

C. H. Barnett was elected Secretary pro tem.

Seven elders and five Annual Conference preachers answered to the roll.

The bar of the Conference was fixed by the President as the first eight seats in the two center rows.

The visiting elders and preachers were invited within the Confer-

rence Bar.

The President appointed B. J. Hoover, W. E. Reeve and A. M. Stephens as the Committee on Credentials. This Committee presented the names of Katrina Ruse of Wyanet, Mrs. Sadie Hoover of West Bureau, Miss Edith Becker of Wyanet, Ross Crook of Charles City, Mrs. Clarence Teter of Tuttle Grove.

The Committee on Nominations was elected, consisting of A. M. Stephens, C. S. Weigel, Stella Wood, Katrina Ruse and Ross Crook.

Adjourned by limitation of time.

Benediction by Rev. Griffin.

Second Meeting-Tuesday P. M.

Conference opened by singing "Jesus is All the World to Me."
Devotionals were conducted by Rev. Dan Smith reading and commenting on the fifth chapter of St. John, and offering prayer.

The roll was called and the minutes were read and approved.

The names of Mrs. Sampson of Fayette, Blanche Atchinson of Independence, James Hunn of South Troy and P. Peterson of West Union were presented as delegates by the Committee on Credentials.

The Committee on Nominations reported. Adopted. See report. R. Wesley Pryor was appointed Committee on Courtesies.

Rev. Titus of the Wisconsin Conference was introduced.

Rev. Wm. Millard of the Kansas Conference was also introduced and made fitting remarks.

Ross Crook was elected Post Master.

R. Wesley Pryor was elected Conference Reporter.

The President appointed Sister Sampson and Sister Ruse as the lay members on the Committee on Itineracy and Orders.

Rev. Conrad was introduced and made remarks.

The President read communications from W. R. Emerson and P. D. Doty.

A motion carried that the President send letters of greetings to these brethren and to others who communicate with the Conference.

Adjourned for Committee work.

Dismissed by Rev. Millard.

Third Meeting-Wednesday A. M.

Opened by Brother Pryor leading in singing "There's Power in the Blood."

The devotionals were in charge of Rev. Millard, he using as a scripture lesson II Kings 2:1-11.

The roll was called and the minutes were read and approved.

The Committee on Credentials presented the names of Mae Brannan of Little Pine, F. B. Andrews of Charles City and Martha Brimer of Fairview.

A recommendation was received from the Charles City Church recommending Fred Conrad to study preparatory to travel.

Brother and Sister Budensiek were introduced to the Conference.
A motion carried that the election of Conference Officers be held
Thursday afternoon immediately following the opening of the session.

The President read a communication from the Wyanet Charge in regard to the Hickory Grove Church, which was turned over to the President to adjust.

The Conference Treasurer read his report. Referred to the Auditing Committee.

The Vice-President in the chair.

The report of the Missionary Board was read and referred to the Auditing Committee.

The President read his first yearly report. It was adopted, save the financial part, which was referred to the Auditing Committee.

It was voted that the money in the Minnesota Building Fund be

turned over to the President to be used for the Little Pine Church as he sees fit.

A motion carried to adjourn.

Dismissal by Rev. Belknap.

Fourth Meeting-Wednesday P. M.

Opened by singing "O, Steal Away Softly to Jesus," led by Brother Ellis.

Brother Hoover had charge of the devotions, reading the 133rd Psalm.

The roll was called and the minutes were read and approved.

The names of Grant Huffman of Rudd, Katrina Ruse and Harry Christiansen of Wyanet were presented to the Conference with recommendations to study and travel. Referred to the Committee on Itineracy and Orders.

The Credentials Committee presented the names of Dorothy Hoover of Hoover, Theodore Morach of Rudd, Geo. Barnett of Bennezette, and Wilbur Kemp of South Troy as delegates.

It was voted to give the Conference Post Master ten gallons of gasoline.

Passed the character of the following: R. W. Pryor, N. K. Long, W. L. Braman, B. J. Hoover, E. E. Anderson, Bert Griffin, Lester Fletcher, A. M. Stephens, G. Edwin Ellis, W. E. Reeve, D. F. Smith, Stella Wood, C. H. Barnett, W. R. Emerson, W. J. Seekins, S. W. Bond, D. W. Bond, P. D. Doty, C. B. Harvey, Bertha Ellis, Lottie Buttermore, W. H. Riley, Ulis Hekel, A. B. Gould, R. Wesley Mack, Clara S. Doty, Delia Howlett, Dr. Ruby Paine, Elizabeth McLaughlin, Bessie Ashton.

A motion prevailed to create a committee to take under consideration a plan to increase the Superannuated Ministers' Fund in order to supply a more adequate support for the aged ministers and their widows. W. E. Reeve, W. L. Braman, W. K. Hughes, W. N. Walton, and Theo. Morach were elected on this committee.

A motion carried that we reimburse the President for his house rent the past year out of the Building Fund. Also carried to pay his house rent for the coming year from this fund.

A motion carried that we have a committee to investigate the purchase of a permanent home for the President. R. Wesley Pryor, W. L. Braman and G. Edwin Ellis were named on this committee.

Adjourned by motion.

Benediction by W. E. Reeve.

Fifth Meeting-Thursday A. M.

Opened by singing "He Leadeth Me," led by Rev. Ellis.

Devotionals in the hands of Sister Wood. She discoursed with helpfulness on Elijah's experiences in faith.

The roll was called and the minutes were read and approved.

The Credential Committee presented the names of Mrs. Tena Sams of Albaton and Floyd Purdy from Emanuel as delegates. Report adopted.

The Committee on Moral Reform read its report. A motion was made to adopt and send to the Wesleyan Methodist for publication. See Report.

The Committee on Sunday Schools reported. Adopted. See report.

A motion in regard to a Committee for ministerial institutes carried and the election of the Committee was laid on the table. (The last day it was taken from the table and rescinded.)

The names of Clarence Budensiek, Mrs Clarence Budensiek and Wilbur Kemp were recommended to the Conference from the South Troy Church to be received to study and travel.

Letters of transfer of Brother and Sister Breneman from the Free Methodist Church were read. Brother Breneman was voted in as an Elder and Sister Breneman and Brother and Sister Budensiek were referred to the Committee on Itineracy and Orders.

Greetings from Delia Howlett were read.

Rev. E. A. Anderson from the Kansas Conference was introduced and he made fitting remarks.

Brother Wilbur Kemp of the South Troy charge was introduced. He tendered greetings.

The Committee on Resolutions reported. Adopted. See report.

The report of the Auditing Committee was read and adopted. See Report.

A matter concerning a parsonage at Rudd was presented and turned over to the Building Committee.

A motion carried to adjourn.

Dismissed by singing the Doxology.

Sixth Meeting-Thursday P. M.

Brother Ellis opened the meeting with singing "Higher Ground."
Devotionals were conducted by Rev. E. A. Anderson reading as
his scripture lesson Isaiah 35 and offering prayer.

The roll was called and the minutes were read and approved. A motion carried to renew Brother Emerson's letter of standing. The Committee on Itineracy and Orders reported the names of W. E. Reeve, Lester Fletcher, N. K. Long, Bert Griffin, and Mrs. Elsie Stephens as eligible to vote in the Conference.

A motion carried to suspend the rules and take up the passage of character before the election of officers. Passed the character of W. K. Hughes, C. P. Carkuff, Albert Johnson, C. R. Belknap, Mrs. A. B. Wilson, Mrs. A. M. Stephens, and C. S. Weigel.

The Orders of the Day were called. We proceeded to the election of officers. The result was as follows:

Sunday School Secretary-Sylvia Sampson.

Sunday School Board—Sylvia Sampson, N. K. Long, Dr. Seymour, Stella Wood.

Tithing Secretary-Mrs. A. B. Willson.

Statistical Secretary-Miss Katrina Ruse.

Member on the Itineracy and Orders Committee—E. E. Anderson. Motion carried that he be Chairman of the Committee.

Camp Meeting Committee—C. H. Barnett, C. S. Weigel, Theo. Morack, F. B. Andrews, Pastor of the Charles City Church, John Howell. A motion prevailed that this committee elect its own Chairman.

Advisory Board-R. Wesley Pryor, F. B. Andrews.

A motion carried that the districting for Sunday School Conventions be left with the new Sunday School Board and be reported at this session.

Motion carried that the Vacational Bible School be left in the hands of the new Sunday School Board.

A motion prevailed to adjourn.

Dismissal by Brother Ross Crook.

Seventh Meeting-Friday A. M.

Opened by singing the "Cleansing Stream."

Rev. Conrad led the devotionals, reading from Acts 20 and speaking on "Lessons From Paul's Life."

The roll was called and the minutes were read and approved.

The third name on the Missionary Board was reconsidered and R. Wesley Pryor was elected.

A motion prevailed that the rules be suspended and that Brother Hughes take his place as Conference Secretary at this time.

By common consent the Sunday School Secretary was released from obligations to travel the Conference in connection with her work.

A motion prevailed that the Conference pay for the publication of the W. H. and F. M. S. minutes in connection with the Conference Minutes.

The Secretary was instructed to have the minutes published by our Publishing House or by one of our own schools. It prevailed that we have the same number of copies published and aportioned as last year.

A motion prevailed that the Treasurer be allowed his expense for postage and remunerated the sum of \$15.00 as an appreciation for his services the past year.

A motion carried to pay the deficit in the Conference from the Camp Meeting Fund. A motion to reconsider carried.

Adjourned by limitation of time.

Benediction by Rev. Huffman.

Eighth Meeting-Friday P. M.

Opened with song.

Devotionals were led by Rev. Henry Weigel reading and commenting from Deut. 28, after which he offered prayer.

The roll was called and the minutes were read and approved.

Sister H. A. Guthrie was received as delegate from the Charles City Church.

The Credentials Committee reported the name of Mrs. Bertha Williams as a delegate from Pleasant Hill. The delegate was seated.

The report of the Statistical Committee was read and adopted. See report.

The Sunday School Board tendered its report. Adopted. See report.

A motion prevailed that the church property at Guthrie Center be offered for sale and the proceeds be turned into the Building Fund. The President was instructed to paint the parsonage before selling it.

A motion carried that the Statistical Secretary be paid his expense of \$2.00 from the Conference Fund.

A motion prevailed that Dr. Seymour in connection with the Sunday School Board be given time at the next Conference to present the Sunday School work.

The Committee on Courtesy introduced Rev. and Mrs. Huffman of the Rudd Church. They greeted the Conference, giving testimony to their experience and burden for souls.

Adjourned for Committee work. Benediction by Sister Ruse.

Ninth Meeting-Saturday A. M.

Opened by singing, after which Rev. Clarence Budensiek read and commented from II Chronicles 25 and besought the blessing of the Lord on the Conference.

The roll was called and the minutes were read and approved.

Brother Shea, our Camp Meeting Evangelist, was introduced. He greeted the Conference with edifying remarks and brought greetings from Sister Whitney.

The Committee on Credentials reported the name of Irvin Heyer as a delegate from the Dundee Church. He was seated.

Rev. E. F. McCarty was introduced to the Conference.

The Committee on Itineracy and Orders reported. Adopted. See report.

Sister Clara S. Doty was introduced to the Conference. She extended greetings.

The Tithing Secretary read her report. Adopted. See report.

The Orders of the Day were called.

Rev. E. F. McCarty presented the Connectional and the Educational Interests in a very able manner. Conditions of this age and the Church were revealed in an interesting way and many helpful suggestions for the success of our denomination were made. His message was spiritual and loyal to God, Church, State, and Home.

Adjourned by limitation.
Benediction by Rev. Hoover.

Tenth Meeting-Saturday P. M.

Opened by singing "Wonderful Words of Life."

Marvin Pryor conducted the devotional exercise, reading and commenting from Acts 22nd Chapter, after which he offered prayer.

The roll was called and the minutes were read and approved.

The report of the Committee on Disbursement of the Superannuated Ministers' Fund was read and adopted. See report.

The special Committee in regard to the Parsonage for the Pres-

ident reported. The report was adopted.

The President read a letter of transfer of Rev. E. A. Anderson, an Elder, from the Kansas Conference to the Iowa Conference. A motion prevailed to receive him as a member of the Conference.

A communication from Rev. A. B. Gould was read and a resolution enclosed by him was adopted and added to the report of the Committee on Resolutions.

A communication from Sister Cora Bromighin of Trommold, Minn., was read.

The Special Committee in regard to plan to raise funds for Superannuated Ministers reported. Amended by apportioning the amount at one dollar per adult member of the church. Adopted.

A motion carried that Brother Barnett be paid \$5.00 from the Conference Fund as an appreciation for his services as Secretary protein.

A motion prevailed that the next Conference begin August 20, 1929. Adjourned to meet at the call of the chair.

Called to order by the chair.

A motion prevailed that the Pleasant Hill appointment be discontinued. The name was ordered stricken from the roll.

The reconsideration of the motion in regard to the deficit in the Conference Fund was called up. In voting the main motion was lost.

A motion prevailed that the names of Kiswaukee and Chelsea be dropped from the roll.

The Committee on Pastoral Relations tendered their report. A motion prevailed that Stella Wood be elected to Elder's Orders. The report was adopted. See report.

The report of the Committee on Post Office Addresses was read and adopted. See report.

Took the matter relating to Committee for Ministerial Institutes from the table. A motion prevailed to rescind the action providing for a Committee.

Adjourned sine die.

STANDING RULES AND REGULATIONS.

- I. On page 3, Vol. 3, of the Conference Records, the following is found: "On motion of Rev. S. A. Gilley, all resolutions of this Conference in annual session so far as adopted at previous meetings are hereby repealed."
- II. Page 158, Vol. 3: "Ordered that until further notice, Annual Conference shall convene on Tuesday and not on Wednesday as heretofore."
- III. Page 272, Vol. 3: "Resolved, (1) That the President of the Conference be continued as permanent chairman of the Committee on Religious Services; (2) That the pastor and the first delegate of the charge at which the next Conference is to be held constitute the remaining members of the Committee for that session."
- IV. Page 274, Vol. 3: "Resolved, That all Sunday Schools under the pastoral oversight of Wesleyan Methodist pastors may be included in the Statistical report of the pastor having such school in charge."
- V. Page 306, Vol. 3: "Resolved, (1) That the time of opening and closing the meetings of the sessions be fixed as follows: Forenoon meetings open at 9:30 and close at 11:30; afternoon meetings at 1:00 and close at the discretion of the body; (2) That the bar of the Conference be fixed and announced by the Conference President; (3) That all visiting brethren and sisters in harmony with our doctrines and principles are invited to honorary seats."
- VI. Page 310, Vol. 3: "Resolved, That the Conference tents be in charge of the Conference President, who shall see that they have proper care and storage. He may rent the same, when not in use, to outside parties as opportunity affords and his judgment directs, and on such terms as he and the desiring parties may agree upon, the rental to be placed in the tent fund."
- VII. Page 73, Vol. 4: "Resolved, That all papers and documents read before this Conference be referred to their respective Committees."
- VIII. Page 78, Vol. 4: "Resolved, That the Missionary Board is hereby authorized to pay out all moneys to be paid from the Conference Fund."

- IX. Page 115, Vol. 4: "Resolved, That all reports of Committees be made in writing, complete and ready for the printer, and handed to the Secretary at the earliest possible date after such report is made."
- X. Page 124, Vol. 4: "Resolved, That the Conference Officers be not seated until the close of the Conference session at which they are elected."
- XI. Page 119, Vol. 4: "Resolved, (1) That the Conference President be required, authorized and appointed to travel the Conference as President, having general supervision of the spiritual interests and benevolences thereof, holding at least one service at each of the churches during the year, under such date as he may announce in advance; (2) He shall raise funds to meet the demands of the Conference work, receive contributions for missions, education and superannuated ministers, where there are no pastors, and assist the pastors in raising the same where desired; (3) He shall have general supervision of the Church property within the bounds of the Conference, and shall inquire into the titles of the same to see that no property is loosely held, and shall look after the rental of Conference property, and see the rent is placed in the Conference treasury; and shall investigate the possibility and feasibility of the sale of Conference property not in use, and report his findings at the next annual Conference; (4) He shall devote as much time as possible and as occasion may afford in evangelistic and other meetings; (5) That he may engage such help from time to time as may be available and that he may consider properly qualified to assist in holding evangelistic and quarterly meetings. Such help to be renumerated from Evangelistic Fund; (6) That the pastors assist the President in raising money for Conference Budget; (7) (As amended in 1919) He shall be paid from the Conference Budget the sum of one thousand dollars (\$,1000.00) and expenses of travel and correspondence per year for his services, the same to be paid in advance quarterly."
