Standing Rules.

1. The clerk of each local society is to place the deed of his church property in the hands of the Conference president, who is custodian of the deed and who is empowered to rent a safety deposit space for the preservation of deeds, abstracts, and other valuable Conference papers. The Conference shall pay rent on space.
2. The President and his Advisory Board are designated a deed examining committee. Deeds for churches, parsonages, or other Conference property to be submitted to them for examination before recorded, to make sure that such disciplinary clauses are included as are needed to make such property secure to the Conference.
3. That each pastor is to bring his statistical report in full ready to be read the first day of Conference.
4. All pastors are required to report number of calls at the time of reading their reports.
5. Our members are solicited to faithfulness in tithing and our churches are to consider the storehouse plan.
6. The Campmeeting and Conference are to be held together with the date of Conference to be set by the Board of Administration. If possible, it shall be incorporated at the beginning or at the close of campmeeting.

7. The Annual Conference Body shall elect a Committee on Committees whose duty is to nominate the Session and Standing Committees.

8. The following item's of the Pastor's Statistical report shall be read each year on the Conference floor: Pastor's calls, Wesleyan Methodist, Wesleyan Missionary, Wesleyan Youth subscriptions, Present membership, gain or loss, Average Sunday School attendance, No Church Bldg, value and insurance, Item IV Complete, Total Contributed for Church, Item VIII complete, Total Benevolence, Contributed totals.

9. That each local church be responsible for paying the moving expenses of the pastor whom they have called.

10. Conference Secretary and Treasurer be paid ten dollars annually from the Conference treasury.

11. The Conference Treasurer's books be closed one week before the opening session of the Annual Conference.

12. No Treasurer be allowed to pay out funds without proper authorization.

13. The Standing Rules of the Conference are to be included in the Conference minutes from year to year.

14. The Superannuate Pension Fund Treasurer be a member of the Superannuate Pension Plan Committee.

Report No 1, Conference President.

To the members of the Oregon Conference.
Greetings in the Master's Name.

The Conference year is now history. It is with great gratitude to God for His mercy and grace that this report is presented. As we meet for this annual gathering, and I look back over the past year a few verses of Scripture come to mind that we believe fitting to this occasion. The verses are from the Book of Lamentations, chapter 3, verses 22 through 26, "It is of the Lord's mercies that we are not consumed, because his compassions fail not. They are new every morning great is thy faithfulness. The Lord is my portion, saith my soul; therefore will I hope in Him. The Lord is good unto them that wait for him, to the soul that seeketh him. It is good that a man should both hope and quietly wait for the salvation of the Lord." Truly we can say, "Great is thy faithfulness."

This has been a good year. Some gracious revivals have been held in the various churches, which is always an encouragement, however, we believe more of our churches ought to plan special revival meetings. The hope of our Conference is to keep the revival fires burning.

Your president has visited each of the churches twice during the year, conducting the first and fourth quarterly meetings, besides other contacts.

October 15th we dedicated our church at Lebanon. In this service I was assisted by Frank Betzer, J.H. Hinchsliff, Donald H. Cline and the pastor, Frank Wing.

During the year we transferred Clarence E. Mills to the Oklahoma Conference.

During the year I received from the President of the Kansas Conference, the transfer of W.A. Kaufmann, an Elder in good standing.

In April I attended the Miltonvale Area Ministerial Institute at Miltonvale, Kansas.

In May I attended the Conference President's Leaders Conference at Miltonvale, Kansas.

The President and his Advisory Board appointed the Reverend Atwood J. Cool pastor of the Emmanuel Church, to fill the unexpired term of Rev. E.M. Peabody who resigned.

The action of the Conference last year placed the Central Church in the hands of the Conference President and his advisory Board. A number of meetings were held to determine the course to follow. After lengthy deliberations and much prayer the Advisory Board recommended to the Conference Board of Trustees at a meeting held Oct. 18, 1951, the disbanding and sale of the Church.

This body voted to accept the report of the President and his Advisory Board. For various reasons any further action regarding the sale of the church was dropped until in May when an attempt to sell was made. A number of prospects have been received, but as yet no further action has been considered.

Since the middle of December the First Free Methodist Church in Portland has been renting the church for \$40.00 per month.

All of the remaining members of Central Church were granted letters of standing.
