DAILY PROCEEDINGS

The Twelfth Annual Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of Ohio convened at Fargo, Ohio, August 26, 1919, in charge of Rev. A. W. Smith, President.

Election of Committee on Credentials: Elder, J. M. Williams; lay member, C. O. Bosworth.

Rev. A. W. Smith, President of Conference, read the following report for the year:

President's Report-Year 1918-1919.

Under the blessing of the Lord it has been the pleasure of your President to perform the few duties falling to him during the year past.

October 15, 1918, organized the Oak Grove Wesleyan Methodist

Church, near Nelsonville, Ohio. This Church is the outgrowth of the evangelistic work of Rev. Chas. Hill, and gives considerable promise. Its charter members are men and women of character, grace, and intelligence. They have been under the pastoral charge of Rev. E. W. Cole.

In May, Rev. Geo. Dudgeon was relieved of the pastorate at Findlay, and this point separated from Dunkirk, with which it had been associated under his pastoral care so far this year.

. J. W. Boggs, a licentiate of Zanesville, was appointed pastor at Findlay.

August 18, 1919, granted a transfer to Rev. O. G. McKinley from the Ohio Annual Conference to the Indiana Conference.

At such time as this body may see fit to set, I desire to make certain recommendations which appear to be vital to our work in spreading holiness and vital piety throughout our borders.

The President also presented the following recommendations:

As your President and after an exhaustive study of the needs of this Conference, it seems good to make the following recommendations:

I. That this Conference take steps to arrange for Holiness Conventions according to the Discipline, Paragraph 246. This is vital because of much false teaching and some prejudice which arises from a harsh and fault-finding exposition of Perfect Love as the fruit of a holy life. Our territory has been invaded in places with a so-called brand of holiness so bitter as not to measure up to Bible regeneration. Again, biblical regeneration has been minimized that sanctification might be exalted. This should not be, for both are essential and neither in itself complete. Let us take the Word and abide with its along these lines.

A committee of pastors and laymen to act on lines suggested in Paragraph 246 of the Discipline seems good to me.

II. Inasmuch as there is in some quarters an insistent demand for a traveling President or a Conference Evangelist to cover our territory, I recommend that public discussion of this matter and the financial phase of the question precede the annual election of officers, and that the whole matter receive the careful and prayerful attention it ought to receive, either in a Committee whose finding shall be reported to this body, or by the body itself.

III. Pastoral Support.—Recent investigation shows that living costs have in six years past advanced eighty-three and one-sixth per cent. There has been some advance in pastoral support, but it is not adequate, and many of our pastors are seriously handicapped by this lack. Our people must rise to the necessity if our work prosper. It is suggested that this Conference elect a Committee to present for consideration a working plan to meet this need.

Again, all our benevolences suffer by reason of the diminished purchasing power of money. This ought to be considered.

IV. Our Budget: The Most Vital of Our Needs.—The sinews of the Church are supplied through this channel, and we can not extend our borders at home or abroad without the funds coming through the Budget.

There are many fields we may enter on this fall, and soon see churches built, as a result of our labors, if the needed finances be secured. The coal fields of Ohio are a field white for harvest. Towns of 300 and 1,000 people have no form of religious service or Sunday School. God will not hold us guiltless if we withhold from them His Word.

Our denomination is broadening its work. New missions and extension of the old call for our utmost sacrifice.

The time is short. Jesus is coming. Shall we be ready?

Every Pastor and every Delegate must extend himself to the utmost if we raise our Budget in 1919-1920. It can be done.

Resolved that the recommendations be adopted.

Rev. J. M. Williams, George Dudgeon, and Rev. W. H. Mayle were eletted as a Nominating Committee for the purpose of selecting four Committees to act on the recommendations of the President. Adjourned.

A motion prevailed to the effect that a Church Extension Society be formed, it being a privilege of this Society to give one dollar per member to build new churches.

George Dudgeon, Rev. J. M. Williams, C. O. Bosworth were appointed a Committee to formulate and present a plan to the Conference.

Recess at the call of the Chair.

Conference called to order by the President, 3 P. M. Committee on Traveling President presented the following: We favor the supervision of our Church by Conference officials, and recommend that the President, Vice-President and Conference Evangelist-elect be required to travel as much as may be practicable, and that this Conference fix the compensation according to work done, as we are unable to formulate a workable financial plan.

Rev. A. W. Smith, in a short address, told of the pressing need we are facing of filling the vacancies in our Conference, and asked that a day each year be set aside that prayer be offered and a special effort be put forth to interest the young of our Church in its work. A motion prevailed to the effect that the President be empowered to appoint a day when such a service should be held. October 1st was the day set apart for this occasion.

Committee on examination of character presented the following names: J. O. Omerod, W. B. Whitehead, Chas. Hill, L. A. Smothers, George Dudgeon, S. C. Wycoff, R. A. Hoffman, J. W. Boggs, H. R. Smith. Passed.

Committee on Budget presented the following report:

We recommend:

First. That the total Budget for Connectional and all Conference work shall be \$3,085. Of this forty-five per cent shall be for Home and Foreign Missions; twenty-eight per cent for Education; twenty-three per cent for Conference work; two and one-half per cent for General Conference work, and one and one-half per cent for Connectional Sunday School work.

The various needs of the Conference shall be taken from this Conference fund.

Second. That all that is contributed for the current expenses of Houghton Seminary and of Wesleyan Methodist Home and Foreign Missions, for the General Conference and the Connectional Sunday School, and of the Wesleyan Methodist Church and for the work of the Ohio Conference shall count toward this Budget.

Third. That the Conference recommends that the pastors shall raise as much as possible for specific interests by the various mehods that have originated for these purposes, such as the W. H. & F. M. Society, the Y. M. W. B., the L. S. U., etc.; but that, in addition to this, each pastor shall obtain, if possible, a pledge or a cash contribution from each person of his congregation, for the Budget as a whole, and the fund so obtained shall be known as the Undivided Budget.

Fourth. That the Conference recommends that the pastors shall not divide the Undivided Budget, but shall remit it at least quarterly to the Conference Treasurer. He shall retain the Undivided Budget until it is evident where it is needed to maintain a balance among the various interests, and shall then divide it in such a way as to maintain this balance.

Fifth. That the apportionment shall be as follows:

Committee on Traveling President, Vice-President, and Conference Evangelist submits the following report:

First. We recommend that each Evangelist be required to visit each charge and hold a quarterly meeting this conference year, and also hold at least two ten-day meetings on the weaker charges during the year.

Second. We recommend that these Evangelists get together and make out their own slate.

Third. We recommend that the President shall be made the Conference Educational Secretary, and shall represent the Educational interests on each charge.

Fourth. And that the Conference Evangelist shall represent the Missionary phase of the work on each charge.

Fifth. We recommend that these Evangelists hold meetings in

needy and open fields, organize churches, and raise funds to employ, if need be, others to assist in their labors.

Sixth. We further recommend that each charge shall elect a Steward to raise their salary.

Seventh. We recommend that their salary shall be fixed at two hundred and fifty dollars; that they raise as much as possible on each charge visited, and that any deficit shall be paid out of the Conference Fund, or any surplus paid into the Conference Fund.

The Committee on Church Extension submit the following report:

First. That the Conference shall elect a Church Extension Secretary, who shall have the oversight of this work.

Second. That all pastors shall be his agents to solicit membership.

Third. That all members shall pledge one dollar or more for each new church or parsonage built or bought.

Fourth. That all moneys received shall be turned into the Conference Treasury Church Extension Fund.

Fifth. The Church Extension Secretary shall keep a record of all names thus pledged.

Sixth. No money to be given away, but to be loaned without interest.

Seventh. No money shall be used out of this treasury except as above mentioned.

Eighth. The Trustees of the Ohio Conference shall be the governing body.

First. That the Conference be divided into three districts, known and consisting of the following charges:

I. Eastern-Africa, Greer and Shadley Valley, West View, Harrison, Fargo, and Oxford.

II. Western-Findlay, Dunkirk, Kenton, Bellefontaine, Marion and Paulding.

III. Southern-White's Chapel, Zanesville, Cutler, Senecaville, and Curtis Ridge.

Second. We recommend that the Conference at this time elect a President, Vice-President, Secretary and Treasurer for each District. Hereafter each District to elect its own officers.

Third. That each District hold its meetings at least semi-annually.

Fourth. That each District cover its expenses by a free-will offering.

Report adopted.

Committee on Pastor's Salary wishes to make the following recommendations:

Inasmuch as all living expenses have so increased, making it difficult and almost impossible for our pastors to live on salaries received heretofore; we, therefore recommend the following plans to bring up their salaries to proper basis:

First. That stewards increase their efforts, by visiting or writing every member of their Church, both young and old, urging them to assume their responsibility to the Lord's cause by giving as He has prospered them, remembering His servants are worthy of their hire.

Second. That all be requested to pledge and contribute weekly, if possible, remembering pastors have weekly expenses as well as laymen.

We recommend the "Envelope System," and that every member be presented with envelopes.

The old plan of giving once or twice a year is a poor one, and has caused much financial embarrassment and actual suffering.

Friday afternoon President Luckey, of Houghton Seminary, ably presented the Educational interest. He spoke of the necessity of educating our young people in our own schools, that they may not only be the foundation of our Church as laity, but also Christian leaders.

He mentioned the fact that no partiality is shown among the students; all are shown the same interest regardless of their respective callings.

He spoke of the danger our young people are facing when they enter some of the colleges that are doing away with the high principles of the Gospel of Christ; some even denying the inspiration of the Scriptures.

He pleaded that all parents send their children to our own schools.

He spoke of the "Forward Movement" as the hope of obtaining a charter for Houghton. He hoped that as the people were catching the vision, and the harvest was ripe, the people at Conference would take some action in regard to the matter.

A motion prevailed to express our appreciation to President Luckey for the splendid address, and to place ourselves on record as being heartily in accord with the "Forward Movement," and pledging ourselves to assist in the raising of desired sum.

Treasurer's report was given and referred to the Auditing Committee.

Rev. W. A. Markee, having charge of the evening service, preached a warm, spiritual sermon, at the close of which eight earnest seekers found their way to the altar.

As retiring Conference Sunday School Secretary, I wish to thank the people of the Ohio Conference for their loyal support during the past two years. What I have accomplished has been as a result of their prayers and co-operation and Divine grace. For them and the incoming Secretary, I beseech God's guiding power and His richest blessings on this great work. I wish to express my heartfelt appreciation for the confidence you have placed in me and realize a lasting obligation to you. I assure you that as I

go forth into the new work into which God has called me I shall ever have a warm feeling in my heart for the people of Ohio, and shall continue to be interested in the work here and shall continue to pray for you.

In order that our Sunday Schools may become better acquainted with the various needs of the work and support them accordingly, I recommend that the Conference Sunday School Secretary and the Sunday School Board shall designate certain days which shall be known as Mission Day, Temperance Day, Conference Day, and Connectional Day, and that the regular Educational Day shall be observed in all the schools.

Second. That the collection for that day shall be given to that arm of the work.

Third. That the pastors of the various charges shall co-operate with the Secretary and Board in arranging and carrying out this program.

Fourth. That Pastors and Superintendents shall co-operate with the Secretary and Board in bringing the schools up to the Efficiency Standards.
