## STANDING RULES

- I. The Standing Rules of Conference shall be printed in the Conference Minutes each year.
- II. All visiting members of our own, or other churches in harmony with our principles, shall be invited to honorary seats in the Conference.
- III. The Conference President shall receive twenty dollars (\$20) per year for postage and stationery; also any needed traveling expense. At any time the President be required to travel the Conference, his duties and pay shall be defined by the Conference.
- IV. The Conference Secretary shall receive twenty-five dollars (\$25) per year for his labor and incidental expenses.
- V. The Conference Treasurer shall receive twenty-five dollars (\$25) per year for his services in caring for the funds.
- VI. In making his report, the Conference Treasurer is authorized to close his books one week before the Conference session. The Treasurer of the Superannuated Ministers' Relief Association also shall close his books one week before the Conference session.
- VII. In our Camp Meeting work, after the expense of the Camp Meeting has been paid by the Camp Meeting Committee, or by the person whom they may designate, any unexpected balance shall be turned over to the Conference Treasurer.
- VIII. All monies disbursed by the Conference Treasurer during the interim of Conference shall be upon order of the President, except in case of payment to the President, when such order shall be issued by the Vice-President. It is understood, of course, that any payment ordered by the Conference direct may be paid by the Treasurer without an order as directed above.
- IX. No monies shall be loaned by the Conference Treasurer except by order of Conference, or by consent of the President and his Advisory Board.

#### STANDING RULES-Continued

- X. Each elder shall make his engagement as pastor with the understanding that if he be elected Conference President he shall be released in his pastoral engagement.
- XI. The first Sunday in each month shall be known as Home Mission Sunday, and the Sunday School offerings shall be given to Home Missions, and should be sent to the Conference Treasurer.
- XII. In securing Evangelists for the Camp Meeting work, those of the Wesleyan Methodist Church shall be secured, if this can be done.
- XIII. The Camp Meeting Committee shall be composed of the Conference President as Chairman, and three ministers, and three laymen, all to be elected by ballot after the Conference of 1923, the term of office to be three years, the time of one minister and one layman expiring each year.
- XIV. Pastors shall state financial items in their statistical reports in even dollars, except in items affecting the Budget, and so far as possible are requested to report all budget items in even dollars. When such rule is not followed, the Statistical Secretaries are authorized to drop decimals, except as provided above.
- XV. The offerings for Superannuated Ministers shall be taken within sixty days after Conference, and forwarded to the Treasurer of Superannuate Society.

# Work of Conference President

- 1. We recommend that the President travel the Conference, with duties as follows:
- 2. To hold one quarterly meeting on each charge during the year, unless the work on some of the weaker fields or new fields should so fully take his time and attention that this could not well be done. In such case the holding of such meeting on the strongest fields may be omitted, but this would not release any charge from paying their proportion of the Conference Budget.
- 3. To spend the time of our annual Camp Meeting at the Meeting, and if necessary in order to perfect arrangements for the Camp Meeting more time is needful to be given to that work, it shall be so devoted.
- 4. To open in some place or places new work, if possible and feasible.
- 5. To spend as much time as he may find available in helping to build up the work on some of our weaker fields, such as Stony Creek, Acorn Hill and Burke.
- 6. The amount of salary to be twenty dollars (\$20) per week, and traveling expenses for the year, and have three weeks' vacation.

We, as a Conference, will pray that the gracious blessing of the Lord may rest on our President, giving him health, strength and wisdom, and we will co-operate with him in a united effort to make 1929-1930 the best year in upbuilding results in our history, and to God we will give the glory.

## DAILY PROCEEDINGS

#### Tuesday Evening

On Tuesday evening, July 2nd, the Champlain Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Connection met at West Chazy, N. Y., Camp Ground for the first service of its eighty-eighth session. Rev. A. J. Allen, President, was in charge.

"Lead Me Higher"—the opening song—is a prayer and expresses the keynote of the Christian's aspiration. It is also particularly fitting as the prevailing spirit of a Holiness Conference.

President Allen read part of the tenth chapter of the Acts and Rev. E. D. Carpenter, President of the Connectional General Conference, led in a period of prayer. This was an hour of inspiration in fellowship with God. We feel constrained to take as our motto "Emmanuel—God With Us." Following this, sixteen gave testimony to the experimental blessing of the God of grace. Verses of songs added inspiration to the occasion.

Rev. Walter McPherson offered a closing prayer.

#### Wednesday Forenoon

Devotional Service.—Rev. Harry Miller was in charge of the devotional service. After the singing of a hymn the scripture lesson was read from Matthew 18:1-14. Prayer followed.

Business.—President A. J. Allen called the Conference to order Roll call: 7 elders, 2 licentiates in attendance.

Partial report of the Committee on Delegates' Credentials was accepted by vote. See roll of delegates. Roll call of delegates: 10 in attendance.

Voted that other names be added as received.

It was voted that the first six seats—front center tiers—constitute the bar of the Conference.

It was voted that the order of services be as follows: Morning—Devotional service, 8:30; Business, 9:00; Adjournment, 11:30. Afternoon—Devotional service, 1:30; Business, 2:00; Preaching, 3:00; Adjournment by vote.

The following Committee on the Passage of Character was elected: Rev. O. G. Wyman, Ministerial member; Frank Mattoon, Lay member. Vice-President.—L. M. Hayes took the chair and President A. J. Allen read his annual report with resolutions. The report was accepted as read. See Report No. 1.

#### Wednesday Afternoon

Devotional Service.—Myron B. Wells was in charge of this service and after congregational singing he read 1 Thessalonians 5. Pertinent comments accompanied the reading. The time was then given to prayer.

Business.—Roll call: 13 elders, 4 licentiates, 1 deaconess and 14 delegates were in attendance. Minutes of the previous session read and adopted.

It was voted to adopt as read the financial report of the Sunday School Secretary. See Report No. 2.

Vice-President L. M. Hayes took the chair and President Allen gave a report of the Conference work and prospects. His character was passed.

Names called and characters passed were as follows: Rev. Carpenter, Mrs. S. A. Green, W. F. Lewis, A. E. and T. A. Moses. A letter received from them was read and adopted.

The theme may be stated as "Our Inheritance in God Through Jesus Christ." God gave a very gracious message through our brother.

After service a partial report from the Committee on Pastoral Relations was given in the form of a resolution. Motion was made that the resolution be adopted. The resolution was lost.

# Report No. 2 PLAN OF WORK FOR LOCAL SOCIETIES

We recommend that the following Plan of Work be followed:

- 1. That each Local Society have some Missionary study or program at each meeting, not only to enlighten our minds, but to inspire our hearts to pray definitely for the missionary work, for without knowledge we cannot have the vision.
- 2. That each Society make full proof of their missionary zeal by being 100% subscribers to the Wesleyan Missionary, and that a Committee be elected whose duty it shall be to earnestly endeavor to get new subscribers and keep account of renewals.
- 3. That we shall not forget to send annually \$6.00 to the Conference Treasurer for the Southern Mountain Work, same to be forwarded to the General Conference Treasurer, this work being supported by the Woman's Society. Also that ten cents per member be sent to the Conference Treasurer for the running expense of the same.
- 4. To remember that the Woman's Home and Foreign Missionary Society is not an Aid Society, and money should be used for Missionary work, and no money is to be paid out without a vote of the Society.
- 5. It is most important that careful attention be given the filling out of two Statistical Reports which will be sent to each Society annually. One is to be filled out and given to the Statistical Committee at the beginning of the Conference, the other to be retained by the Delegate and later read to the Local Society. Receipts and disbursements must be made to balance before sending to the Conference.
- 6. That in order to get credit in our Treasurer's Report for money received during the year, all money or receipts must be sent to the Treasurer and must be in her hands not later than one week before Conference convenes.
- 7. Also that all Missionary Boxes or furnishings for Camp Ground or Houghton Dormitory be given proper credit; but not in the column with cash receipts and disbursements.
- 8. That Thank Offering Boxes having been so great a help and blessing to some Societies, we recommend that they be used in each Local Society. Same may be obtained from Mrs. Mabel Perrine, 301 Lathrop St., Lansing, Mich., for 2 cents each.

- 9. That as the Conventions have been a source of inspiration and help to others, we recommend that we have at least one as a Conference or in Districts as seems most feasable, and that a leader or leaders be elected to take charge of the same.
- 10. Also that we keep in mind the furnishing of the bed in the Houghton Dormitory by each Local Society. Also the sending of supplies to the Missionary fields, such as bandages, religious books, pictures or calendars.
- 11. That the Plan of Work which has been adopted by the Conference Society shall be read and kept in mind as a sort of guide during the year.
- 12. That as Local Societies or individuals we can some fruit or vegetables to help out at the Boarding House in feeding the people at Conference and Camp Meeting.
