DAILY PROCEEDINGS**Tuesday, July 17, 2:00 p. m.**

The fifty-third session of the South Carolina Annual Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Connection (or Church) of America convened in the tabernacle on the grounds of the Wesleyan Camp Meeting Association at Greer, South Carolina, at 2:00 p. m., July 17, 1945. The devotions were in the form of a communion service with the President in charge.

The conference was called to order by the President, Rev. R. C. Mullinax, who declared the Conference Bar to consist of the platform and the first five benches in the three middle tiers of seats.

Special Orders—A motion prevailed to make it a special order of the day to have Rev. Cecil F. Clifton, Director of Radio "Wesleyan Hour," address the Conference at 3:15 this afternoon, regarding the radio work.

Resolutions to General Conference—The following resolution was adopted and ordered sent to Rev. F. R. Eddy, President of the General Conference:

Resolved, That the South Carolina Annual Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Connection (or Church) of America, in session this 18th day of July, 1945, hereby petitions the General Conference next to be held in June, 1947, that since, the word 'Connection' in the Church name has ceased to have a clear meaning and is burdensome in legal papers,

Therefore, we do petition the General Conference to change the name of the denomination to read,

THE WESLEYAN METHODIST CHURCH OF AMERICA,

And that the General Conference instruct the Trustees of the Corporate Body to take necessary steps to correct the Articles of Incorporation in harmony with this action and,

That in the revision of the Discipline all parts of the same shall be made to agree with this action."

The President called the Conference to order.

An offering of \$30.77 was received for Rev. Cecil F. Clifton's (Director of radio "Wesleyan Hour") traveling expenses.

Apportionment—The committee on Apportionment reported,

recommending that the Conference endorse the Connectional Budget as set by the General Conference, which is as follows per member: Foreign Missions, \$2.00; Home Missions, \$1.00; Educational, \$1.50; Orphanage, \$0.25; Connectional Sunday School Work, \$0.05 per member for enrollment in main school; and that the Conference Budget be as follows: President's Salary, \$1.35; Conference Work, \$0.40; Conference Missions, \$1.00; General Conference Travel, \$0.05; Superannuated Ministers Fund, \$0.50 (later increased to \$1.00 by the Conference); Minutes, \$0.15; Conference Entertainment, \$0.15. Report adopted. See Report No. 13.

It was voted that the Conference elect a Radio Secretary and urge each church to elect a Radio Secretary.

Rev. J. R. Swauger was called to the chair.

Radio Secretary—V. A. Mitchell was elected Radio Secretary.

The Conference gave Misses Farmer, Stamey, and Elrod a rising vote of appreciation for their services.

A motion prevailed to transfer the \$25.02 held in the Treasury for building fund to the Conference Mission fund and that in case the Pellam Church is ever reorganized, this and all other money received from sale of Pellam Church property (\$56.50 more has already been received for the sale of chairs and stove) is to be refunded to the Church.

The Secretary read a letter from Rev. S. Irving Keeler.

Unfinished Business—A motion prevailed to allow the President and his Advisory Board to take care of any unfinished business upon adjournment of Conference.

Audit Minutes—A motion prevailed to instruct the Secretary to audit the minutes.

Tithing—The Tithing Secretary of the Western District gave a verbal report which was accepted.

A motion prevailed to instruct the Secretary to write letters of greeting and best wishes to Rev. I. O. Gray and S. Irving Keeler.

A motion prevailed that in case the Conference holds a Conference Ministerial Institute, Rev. J. R. Swauger be secured as the main speaker, if he is available.

Stationing Committee—The Committee on Pastoral Relations gave its third reading. Report was adopted. See Report No. 2.

The minutes were read and approved.

A motion prevailed to adopt the minutes of the entire session.

A motion prevailed that Conference adjourn sine die.

STANDING RULES AND RESOLUTIONS

1. That no member of the Conference shall have his character passed who fails to carry out all the rules and orders of this Conference, unless providentially hindered, except upon a three-fourths vote of the body.

2. That we affirm our faith in the soundness of the position taken by the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America in denying any of its members membership in any secret society. Hence we as a Conference require that our pastors and churches shall not elect, or suffer to be elected, superintendents or teachers of any Sunday schools that are held in our churches if they hold membership in secret societies.

3. That we earnestly urge all our Licentiates not receiving any appointments to pastoral or evangelistic work to preach at least once a month, and also to hold if possible a two weeks revival during the year.

4. That the Committee on Public Worship consist of the President of the Conference, the pastor of the charge where the Conference is held, and the pastor's delegate.

5. That no person be licensed to preach who does not tithe his income; that all our licentiates be required to faithfully tithe their income; and that the license of no preacher be renewed, who fails to tithe.

6. That it is the sense of this Conference that our houses of worship should not be opened to any evangelist or minister of any other Church to hold a series of meetings or to maintain a regular appointment for another congregation; provided, however, that usual denominational courtesies be extended to other ministers in occasional appointments.

7. We recommend that all charges and stations to which the pastor moves pay the moving and transportation expenses of said pastor, the same to be done in addition to his salary.

8. That the pastors be required to raise their Minute Money and send to the Conference Treasurer within sixty days after they receive their Minutes.

9. That this Conference elect a Tithing Secretary, as provided for in our Discipline, whose duty it shall be to visit each charge at least once a year, if possible. Each church visited shall raise at least the traveling expenses of the Secretary at the time of his visitation.

10. That each local church or charge elect a Tithing Secretary, whose duty it shall be to thoroughly canvass the membership of the church or charge each quarter and labor most earnestly to induce each member to strictly tithe his income and to place the same in the church treasury for the purpose of meeting all the claims of the church, both locally and generally. This Secretary shall report at each Quarterly Conference the percentage of the membership who are tithing in keeping with this plan, the percentage who are giving in other ways, and the percentage who not giving at all. Each pastor and church shall co-operate with these Secretaries in every possible way in order to make the entire membership of this Conference strict tithers.

11. That we as a conference put forth every possible effort through education, pulpit preaching, voting, and other means to advance the cause of temperance and to secure legislation for abolishing the sale of beer, wine, and whiskey for beverages.

12. That the Trustees of the South Carolina Annual Conference, together with the President of the said Conference, be and they hereby are empowered to execute all necessary papers, mortgage deeds, and papers of a like character, when necessary to secure loans to the South Carolina Annual Conference or to any church needing funds to liquidate Conference, church, or parsonage indebtedness, provided that the party or parties requesting such action shall set forth in writing the true nature and purpose for which the loan is requested (and this writing is to become a part of the permanent record of the Trustees), and that the Trustees and President of said Conference are satisfied that the object for which said loan or loans is sought is both necessary and desirable. And the Trustees of said South Carolina Annual Conference are also hereby empowered to sign any or all deeds and papers for the transfer of real property that is now or hereafter may be held in trust by said trustees, where the sale of Conference, church, or parsonage or other real estate has been approved or authorized by the President of the Conference with the concurrence of his entire Advisory Board.

13. During the interim of Annual Conference the Missionary Board shall be duly authorized to draw on the funds for Conference Work, Church Extension and Conference Evangelism, and General Conference Travel, as it deems best for the interest of the Conference, and the Treasurer shall be authorized to make payment from these funds upon written order signed by the President and at least one half the other members of the Missionary Board, or signed by the President in behalf of the Missionary Board.

14. Any church which secures aid from the Conference must have its property deeded to the Conference Trustees, as is required by our Discipline; and any church which engages in a building or remodeling project must have the plans approved by the Conference Board on Church and Parsonage Building and Location, according to the requirements of our Discipline, if said church is to receive aid from the Conference for these building projects.

15. Any Superannuated Elder shall receive not more than one dollar (1.00) per month for each year of service he has given in the Conference. The widow of an Elder or Conference Preacher shall receive not more than fifty cents .50 per month for each year of service which she and her husband have rendered together in the Conference. It is understood that these are the maximum amounts and dependent of course upon whether or not sufficient money may be available from the fund for Superannuated Ministers.

16. All pastors shall have their Statistical reports in the hands of the Statistical Committee by 8:00 a. m. Thursday of Conference.

17. The salary of the outgoing pastor shall close on Sunday preceding the opening of Annual Conference and the church is required to include the week of Conference in the incoming pastor's salary.

18. Each charge is to give its pastor the privilege of being away from his church, or churches, for two meetings per year, and no pastor is to be away from his charge for more than two meetings per year without getting the consent of his church, or charge.

19. In the ordination of ministers to Elder's Orders, it shall be the policy of this Conference to ordain only those ministers who have passed the course of study as required by our discipline.

REPORTS

Report No. 1

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

To the fifty-third Annual Session of the South Carolina Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Connection (or Church) of America now assembled at Greer, South Carolina, I respectfully submit the following report:

Under the providence and mercy of God we have completed another year in the history of our conference. Again it has been a year of laboring under the handicaps and inconveniences of an all-out war. Our Sunday School rolls have been depleted by the absence of many of our young men who are in the service of their country, and our attendance at church services has likewise suffered. Many of our people are away in defense work. But so far as the writer is able to discern, our attendance has held up well under the circumstances. The financial condition of the churches has never been better.

We are thankful to God that this is one year death has not invaded the ranks of our ministry. Several of our good laymen have been transferred from the Church Militant to the Church Triumphant and more than one of our Sunday School scholars have given their lives in defense of their country.

As to our program of church extension this has been a year of building up our young churches and of providing for a future program rather than a year of the birth of new classes. During the year two of our new classes have acquired building lots and have constructed churches on them while a third is now in the process of buying a place of worship. Though the battle has not been easy, each of our new classes has made progress in some ways.

The Rev. W. D. Correll proposed that he would be one of ten men who would give \$100.00 for the purpose of putting an evangelist in the pioneer field full time. After prayerful deliberation, the Missionary Board decided to accept the challenge and went to work toward raising the funds. After some months of effort we went beyond our goal, raising \$1,500.00 in cash and pledges. Though many efforts have been put forth, we have not been able to secure an evangelist who has had experience in that type of work. Earnest prayer is hereby requested that we may be able to secure such a person and put him in the field as soon as possible.

New field meetings have been sponsored at Calhoun Falls, Leesville, Madison and at Beaumont Mill of Spartanburg.

Improvements

Several of our churches have taken forward steps in the matter of improving their church property.

Tucapau, Spartanburg, and Chesnee have finished paying off the indebtedness on their church buildings.

Greenville First has done some remodeling in the auditorium, put a new roof on the parsonage and made other improvements.

Greenville Second has purchased a lot on Woodside Avenue and

constructed an attractive auditorium of concrete block and ceiled over head with celotex.

Florence has finished the church inside with sheet rock and celotex and is now ready to veneer with brick when material is available.

Charleston has purchased two lots at a cost of \$800.00 in a desirable location next door to a modern grammar school on Durant Avenue and has constructed the first unit of a church edifice. There is practically no indebtedness.

Greenwood is in the process of purchasing a brick church on First Street at Panola Mill.

Whitmire has installed attractive new pews and pulpit furniture at a cost of \$1,200.00. They set a fine example by donating their old pews to Greenwood Church. Whitmire has also remodeled their parsonage and refinished inside with sheet rock and celotex. The cost of these improvements was about \$1,000.00

Laurens has refinished the church inside with wainscoating, sheet rock and celotex and installed new lights and electric fans in the auditorium.

Central Second has built several attractive Sunday School rooms at the rear of their church.

Glendale has remodeled their church and put in Sunday School rooms. The inside has been finished with sheet rock and celotex.

Mountain View has refinished the church with sheet rock and made other improvements.

The following churches have several hundred dollars in their building funds for the purpose of remodeling or building churches or parsonages in the near future: Anderson, Carlisle, Eastatoe, Florence, Graham Chapel, Knighton Chapel, Miller Memorial, Piedmont, Pickens View, and Williamston.

Other churches deserve commendation in the matter of improvements on church property, but we cannot mention all.

MISSIONARY BOARD
