The First Wesleyan Methodist Church of Spartanburg feels that there is an important psychological advantage in having the deeds of the local church property held in trust by the local trustees. Inasmuch as the South Carolina Conference has no funds invested in the said property, the Spartanburg Church feels that it is within her moral and constitutional rights to have the property held in trust by the local trustees. Since the Conference rights will be fully secured by a protective clause, we feel that the status we are requesting will be superior to the status that many other churches in the Conference have whose deeds are held by local trustees without any protective clause, and that granting this request can result in no harm or loss to the Conference now or in the future.

"That the Committee on Ministerial Character for each session of the Annual Conference be elected at the preceding session; that pastors be required to have one copy of their statistical reports in the hands of the Conference President not less than seven days before the beginning of the Conference session, and that where it is deemed advisable the Committee on Character counsel with pastors and delegates early in the Conference session in an effort to correct weaknesses revealed in the reports." A motion with support was made to adopt it. A motion prevailed to refer this matter to the President and his Advisory Board for study and report to the next session of Conference.

A motion prevailed to elect a Committee on Ministerial Retreats with power to act. The Committee elected is W. C. Young, J. B. Hilson, Jack Funderburk, A. C. Parker, Earl J. Hucks.

The Board of Trustees stated to the Conference that Rev. James Barefoot,

who is now using the Smokey Mountain Tabernacle, requested that the Smokey Mountain Tabernacle property be transferred to the Indian Mission Organization under which he works. A motion prevailed that the Trustees be authorized to lease to him the property for five to ten years, as in their judgment may be best, but that the Conference retain title to the property.

EDUCATIONAL SECRETARY—G. M. Nalley was elected Educational Secretary.

BOARDS ON CHURCH AND PARSONAGE BUILDING AND LO-CATION—The President nominated and the Conference elected the following as Boards on Church and Parsonage Building and Location:

Central District: K. W. Johnston (Ex-Officio), J. D. Evatt, G. C. Summey. Columbia District—K. W. Johnston (Ex-Officio), E. L. Alexander, W. T. Hughey.

Greenville District: K. W. Johnston (Ex-Officio), P. C. Lusk, Ross Gilstrap. Spartanburg District: K. W. Johnston (Ex-Officio), A. D. Horton, J. T. Chandler.

PRESIDENT'S ADVISORY BOARD—The President nominated and the Conference elected the following as the President's Advisory Board: Elders—E. L. Gunby, C. T. Bryant, L. L. Jarrard; Laymen—Dan H. Gambrell, W. T. Hughey, R. A. Taylor.

PASTORAL RELATIONS—The Committee on Pastoral Relations gave its final reading. Report adopted. (See Report No. 2)

The minutes were read and approved.

The Conference voted to adopt the minutes of the entire session.

Conference adjourned sine die at 5:15 p. m.

Standing Rules

- 1. That no member of the Conference shall have his character passed who fails to carry out all the rules and orders of this Conference, unless providentially hindered, except upon a three-fourths vote of the body.
- 2. That we as a Conference put forth every possible effort through education, pulpit, preaching, voting, and other means to advance the cause of temperance and to secure legislation for abolishing the sale of beer, wine, and whiskey for beverages.
- 3. That the Trustees of the South Carolina Annual Conference, together with the President of the said Conference, be and they hereby are empowered to execute, all necessary papers, mortgage deeds, and papers of a like character, when necessary to secure loans to the South Carolina Annual Conference or to any church needing funds for an expansion program or to liquidate Conference, church, or parsonage indebtedness, provided that the party or parties requesting such action shall set forth in writing the true nature and purpose for which the loan is requested (this writing is to become a part of the permanent records of the Trustees) and that the Trustees and President of said Conference are satisfied that the object for which said loan or loans is sought is both necessary and desirable. Whenever money is borrowed for use of a local church the local church shall agree to and be responsible for its payment.
- 4. In case of necessity in order that a duly authorized expansion, building, remodeling or relocating program may be carried out; or in case of the claim of a municipal government, state highway department, or any other governmental agency, the trustees of the South Carolina Conference be and they hereby are duly empowered to sign any or all deeds and papers for the transfer of real property that is now or hereafter may be held in trust by said trustees, provided that the party or parties requesting such action shall set forth in writing the true nature and purpose for which transfer or sale is requested (this writing to become a part of the permanent record of the trustees), and where the sale or transfer of such conference, church, parsonage, or other real estate has been approved or authorized by the President of the Conference with the concurrence of two-thirds of his Advisory Board, and provided further that the trustees and the President of the said Conference are satisfied that the object for which the transaction is sought is both necessary and desirable. (1961)
- 5. During the interim of Annual Conference the Missionary Board shall be duly authorized to draw on the funds for Mountain Missions and Conference Missions, for the purpose for which each was raised, as it deems best for the interest of the Conference, and the Treasurer shall be authorized to make payments from these funds upon written order signed by the President and at least one-half the other members of the Missionary Board, or signed by the President in behalf of the Missionary Board.

6. Any church which engages in a building or remodeling project or which purchases a parsonage, church building or a lot on which a church or parsonage is to be constructed, regardless of whether the property is to be owned by the local church or the Conference, is required to have the plans approved by the Conference Board on Church and Parsonage Building and Location.

Any church which secures aid from the Conference must have its property deeded to the Conference Trustees, as is required by our Discipline; and any church which engages in a building or remodeling project must have the plans approved by the Conference Board on Church and Parsonage Building and Location, according to the requirements of our Discipline, if said church is to receive aid from the Conference for these building projects.

- 7. All officers and committees shall take up their duties at the close of the sitting of conference in which they are elected.
- 8. Conference shall convene on Monday, following the third Sunday in July. (1960)
- 9. The books of the Conference Treasurer shall close two weeks before Conference.
 - 10. The Conference Secretary shall be the Committee on Credentials.
- 11. L. L. Jarrard, Treasurer of the South Carolina Conference of The Wesleyan Methodist Church of America, or his successor, is authorized to sign United States bonds held by the South Carolina Conference of The Wesleyan Methodist Church of America.
- 12. The President shall appoint an Auditing Committee in time for it to audit the books of the treasurers before conference.
- 13. If a pastor desires to resign his work during the interim of Annual Conference, he shall give the President and his Advisory Board notice at least two weeks before the effective date of his resignation. However, if the President and his Advisory Board deem the cause for his desire to resign sufficient, they may accept the resignation immediately.
- 14. Certificates of Citation are to be presented to ministers who have given 25 years of active ministerial service in God's Kingdom (20 years in case of retirement or death) while he is a member of the South Carolina Conference. At the close of each succeeding ten years the old certificate is to be returned and a new one given; and at retirement or death a certificate is to be given recognizing the total period of active service. An evangelist must hold ten meetings during the year to receive credit for a year of service. The Citation Committee is to be composed of the President and the Secretary. (1953)
- 15. During the interim of the Annual Conference, the Committee on Finance shall be duly authorized to draw on the funds for Conference Work, Minutes, Conference Entertainment, Conference Parsonage, and President's Salary for the purpose for which each was raised, as it deems best for the interest of the Conference; and the Treasurer shall be authorized to make payment from these funds upon written order signed by the President and at least one-half the other members of the Committee on Finance or signed by the

President by order and in behalf of the Committee on Finance. (1957)

- 16. The local church officers shall be elected within thirty days of the close of the fiscal year of the local church, and they shall take office at the beginning of the fiscal year. (1958)
- 17. All pastors shall have their Statistical Reports in the hands of the Statistical Committee by 1:00 p. m. Tuesday of Conference.
- 18. Anyone employed by the Board on Church Extension and Evangelism shall not be a member of the Board. (1959)

Standing Recommendations

- 1. That we earnestly urge all our Licentiates not receiving any appoint ments to pastoral or evangelistic work to preach at least once a month, and to hold if possible a two weeks' revival during the year.
- 2. That all ministers faithfully tithe their income and that any minister failing to do so shall be considered delinquent in his duty. (1959)
- 3. That all charges and stations to which the pastor moves pay the moving and transportation expenses of said pastor, the same to be done in addition to his salary.
- 4. The salary of the outgoing pastor should close on Sunday preceding the opening of Annual Conference and the church is requested to include the week of Conference in the incoming pastor's salary.
- 5. Each charge should give its pastor the privilege of being away from his church, or churches, for two meetings per year, and no pastor is to be away from his charge for more than two meetings per year without a vote of his church, or charge, giving permission; and it is recommended that each church or charge give its pastor a two-weeks vacation, with pay, each year.
- 6. When a church engages in a building or remodeling project at least one-half of the estimated cost of the project should be on hand before said project is undertaken unless other satisfactory arrangements are made. If other arrangements are made the Board of Trustees must approve them before they are considered satisfactory.
- A church which is not on a charge with other churches may keep only
 one record book for church and quarterly records and the Church Clerk serve
 as Quarterly Conference Clerk.
- 8. We urge all pastors to seek earnestly to raise a full budget and that first consideration be given to the Pension Plan Budget. (1959)
- 9. That we adhere to Paragraph 132 (2) of our Discipline as long as there are ministers in our Conference who are qualified and who are available to take work. (1959)
- 10. Any pastor, or church, desiring to invite a convention or rally group other than Wesleyan groups should first secure the approval of the President and his Advisory Board. (1959)

Reports

REPORT NO. 1

President's Report

Through the mercies of God we are permitted to gather for the Sixty-Ninth Session of the South Carolina Annual Conference. We come to review the progress and purpose of our Church in this day and to receive a fresh enduement and vision for the task before us.

Grateful thanks are due to God for His unfailing help. We have leaned hard upon Him and upon the prayers of His people. The Divine Presence has been our support in eyery difficult hour. We freely admit our human frailties and limitations and are grieved that our service has not been better.

STATE OF THE WORK

This has been a year beset with problems and yet God has given definite progress in some areas.

SPIRITUALLY

Our outreach, our impact upon our communities, our loyalty to great truths, and our fulfilling of our mission will be determined by the measure of genuine spiritual life. Therefore, we, both pastors and people, need to deepen our spiritual lives.

In order to do this, we need a clearer understanding of the Biblical basis for the Wesleyan message. Bible-based truth needs to be brought to bear upon current issues of our day. Preaching that is well buttressed with the Scriptures will produce stable and spiritual people.

Also, we should avoid giving the impression that we are endorsing erroneous doctrine. This is often done by employing singers or preachers who embrace error. It may be an expression of charity toward those of other beliefs but there is danger in fellowshipping with error.

Unregenerated members cannot possibly add spiritual life to a congregation and they are a source of potential trouble. We should be quick to invite into membership people who show signs of and give testimony to the new birth. On the other hand, it will prove our downfall, to become careless in examining candidates for membership in the Wesleyan Methodist Church.

The Youth Camp of 1961 was outstanding from a spiritual standpoint. There seemed to be a depth in the seeking after God. A number of our churches have felt the impact of this Youth Camp. There are indications that God is getting to us in some areas. We pray that this moving of the Spirit will spread.

CHURCH EXTENSION

A new church was organized at Sumter on July 2, 1961, with nineteen members. Rev. P. B. Pullin is the pastor. We have been in touch with this group for more than a year. They are thoroughly Wesleyan in doctrine and they face the challenge of their community with zeal and enthusiasm. This gives an increasing foothold in the lower part of the state where our churches are few.

At the last session of our Annual Conference we voted to launch a program that would lead to the eventual establishment of an Allen Mitchell Memorial Church. During the year an investigation was made of several possible locations for this project. The Board on Church Extension and Evangelism chose a section in the Spartanburg area known as Knollwood Acres. This is a new and growing residential area. We have purchased slightly more than an acre of land for \$3,600.00 and the Board has employed a man to work in this area, subject to the approval of the Annual Conference. We expect a small nucleus from the Spartanburg church for this project—just how many we do not know. God, we believe, has led step by step in this project thus far. However, the real test is ahead. It takes money, people, and property to start a new church but it takes more. God alone, can supply that additional need.

MATERIAL IMPROVEMENTS

WELCOME has built a new steeple, purchased a new piano, and laid carpet in the aisles and at the front of the church. The increased value is estimated at approximately \$2,000.00.

BETHANY has underpinned the parsonage, built new porches at the parsonage and plastered the Sunday School rooms.

CENTRAL, SECOND has constructed a new Education Building with eight Sunday School rooms, pastor's study, and rest rooms. They also built a new choir loft, and redecorated the sanctuary and installed new pulpit furniture. The cost was about \$10,000.

PICKENS VIEW has built a beautiful new parsonage. It is a seven-room, brick veneered building, with a full basement, and with electric heat. It is valued at \$15,000.

GREENVILLE, FIRST has constructed an attractive Auxiliary Building which is valued at \$18,000. It is of brick construction. They also have installed a new, concealed-speaker, public address system in the church.

ANDERSON has done extensive work on their parsonage. They lowered the ceilings, sanded and refinished the floors, painted it throughout and installed a gas-fired, forced air furnace. They also purchased an organ for the church. This was done at a cost of approximately \$2,500.

STARTEX put a new roof on and brick veneered their church. They paved the parking area. The cost was about \$3,000.

LYMAN has moved their church building to a new and beautiful location. They are in an extensive remodeling program which is resulting in almost a totally new church. They have put a basement under it with ten rooms including rest rooms, pastor's study, and classrooms. They have enlarged the sanctuary,

brick veneered the building, and put a new roof on. They also have installed new cathedral glass windows. The total cost was approximately \$17,000 and much work was donated.

LAURENS has added a room and remodeled the kitchen at the parsonage at a cost of \$2,000.

KNIGHTON CHAPEL has constructed a beautiful new church edifice at an approximate cost of \$30,000. It has a spacious sanctuary, ten Sunday School rooms, a pastor's study, and rest rooms.

For other improvements we refer you to "The Challenger."

NUMERICALLY

There are too few reports in for the fourth quarter for us to have an accurate picture of the membership item. Reports would indicate that unless there is an unusual loss reported for this last quarter that there will be a substantial gain for the year. The first three quarters witnessed an unusual number of new members received.

FINANCIALLY

A look at the Treasurer's report will reveal the need of increasing Budget payments. The work suffers when the Budget is so far below a full payment. Over all we paid 87.15 per cent of the Assigned Budget. Two items of Budget give us special concern. We lack almost 6% of paying the Superannuate Pension Budget and almost 19% of the Conference Missions Budget. We commend each church that did its best to bring in a full Budget. Let's be faithful in this area of our Stewardship.

OFFICIAL ACTS OF THE PRESIDENT AND HIS ADVISORY BOARD

July 29, 1960—Rev. Douglas Heffner resigned as pastor of the Easley, Alice church, and his resignation was accepted on September 7.

July 29, 1960—At the request of the churches we appointed Rev. Emerson Reymer, pastor at Buck Creek and Rock Bridge.

August 1, 1960—At the request of the church we appointed Rev. Lamont Hess, pastor at Community.

September 7, 1960—We gave Easley, Alice permission to vote on Rev. Miss Bertha E. Stamey and they extended her a call on September 12.

October 17, 1960—We appointed William Ward to General Evangelism.
October 17, 1960—We granted a letter of transfer to Rev. Douglas Heffner, an Elder, to the Tennessee Conference.

January 14, 1961—I granted a letter of transfer to Rev. William Ward, an Elder, to the Allegheney Conference.

March 7, 1961—Upon recommendation of the Conference Pension Board and at his request, Rev. G. L. Stewart was appointed to superannuated relations to the Conference.

March 17, 1961—I received the transfer of Rev. Mrs. Catherine Bloom, an Elder, from the Indiana Conference.

June 12, 1961—I received Rev. P. B. Pullin, from the Evangelical Methodist Church. He is referred to the Committee on Itineracy and Elders Orders for

examination and recommendation according to paragraphs 127 and 174 of the Book of Discipline.

June 12, 1961—We authorized the organization of a church at Sumter, S. C. On July 12 this church was received into the South Carolina Conference and Rev. P. B. Pullin was appointed pastor.

June 26, 1961—I appointed Rev. W. E. Payne and Mr. Ned Hunnicutt to audit the books of the Conference treasurers.

LOSS BY DEATH

We are grateful that none of our preachers have died during the year. One of our preachers, Rev. C. V. Marchbanks, Sr., suffered the loss of his wife. Also, Mr. Talmadge Evatt, who for many years was Treasurer of the Conference, was taken by death.

REPORT NO. 3

Church Extension And Evangelism (Retiring)

The following items were voted and approved by the Church Extension and Evangelism Board:

- (1) That in the event the pastors at Buck Creek and Tuckasegee, Rev. Emerson Reymer and Rev. Frank McCool, decide to return to these churches, a conditional vote of approval is given.

- (2) That Rev. G. C. Gilliard serve Belton work for the remainder of the year under Rev. Mack Thompson, and approval given that Rev. Mack Thompson be away from Belton work due to illness.
- (3) That we approve the request of the Belton Pulpit Supply Committee that Rev. G. C. Gilliard be voted on for the year 1961-1962.
- (4) That a vote of appreciation by letter be sent to Rev. Mack Thompson for work in pioneer field and such be conveyed by the Conference President.

REPORT NO. 4

Church Extension And Evangelism

ITEM I.

We RECOMMEND:

- That when it becomes necessary for the Conference to aid new churches financially, the amount of aid shall be determined by the Church Extension and Evangelism Committee and such aid may be discontinued at the discretion of said committee. We further recommend as long as a church receives aid from the Conference, it shall consult the Church Extension and Evangelism Committee before calling a pastor.
- That the pastor of any church securing aid from the Conference shall secure permission from the Committee before he can conduct more than two revivals away from his said church during the year.
- 3. That a pastor who is serving a church receiving aid from the Conference and who desires to move or to live away from said church or change his relation to the charge in any way must first consult the Committee.
- 4. That the salary of the pastor at Sans Souci Church be supplemented in the amount of \$20.00 per week, living quarters, and pay utilities.
 - 5. That we pay the amount due monthly on the Sans Souci parsonage.
- That when the Church Extension and Evangelism Committee is making payments on loans on church property, the payments shall be made directly to the mortgagee.
- 7. That we continue to assist in the payments on the loan on the North Charleston Church.

- 8. That the Conference President be Sales Manager of the Conference History Book.
- 9. That we pay the Belton pastor \$50.00 per month for rental allowance and utilities.
- 10. That by a concurring vote of the Committee on Church Extension and Evangelism, the Conference Board of Trustees, and the President's Advisory Board, moneys in the Conference Church Extension and Evangelism fund, if available, may be used temporarily to aid churches which, in the opinion of the committees, are faced by dire emergency.
- 11. That we pay the pastor of Buck Creek \$30.00 per month from the Mountain Mission Fund.
- 12. That the pastor's salary of the Allen Mitchell Memorial project be \$40.00 per week and that the local group pay as much of this as possible.

Board Of Trustees

In November, 1960, we agreed to extend the lease on the Smokey Mountain Tabernacle to two years instead of one.

December 6, 1960, we signed a mortgage to secure a note for a loan of \$8,000.00 from Easley Home Building and Loan Association for building a parsonage for the Pickens View Church.

REPORT NO. 8

Committee On Records

WE RECOMMEND:

- 1. That whenever possible the church use a well-bound book which will be suitable for permanent records, of a size not less than 8 inches by 10 inches.
- 2. That a title page appear in the front of each book, giving the name of the church, and also designating whether it is a church record book or quarterly conference book. If both records are combined in one book, please state this on title page. If it is only a roll book, designate this.
- 3. That a table of contents be placed on the second or third page of each record book. If no space is available, a sheet may be inserted with cloth tape.
- 4. That the proceedings of each business meeting of the church be recorded in the form of minutes.
 - 5. That the minutes be placed in the book in chronological order.
- 6. That the church clerks read carefully Paragraph 74 of the Wesleyan Methodist Discipline.
- 7. That the roll be kept up-to-date and that it include as complete as possible the following information: the names of members, date received, how received, and removal.
 - 8. That if a church fails to send in a record, its grade becomes zero.
- 9. That all pastors call the attention of their church and quarterly conference clerks to these recommendations.
 - 10. That the following method of grading be used for the church and

quarterly conference records: Completeness of records, 20%—divided as follows—For quarterly conference books: Title page, 5%; Completeness of minutes, 15%; For church or combined books: Title page, 5%; Completeness of minutes, 10%; Church roll, 5%; Binding, 10%; Table of contents, 10%; Permanency of records (ink or typewritten), 10%; Cleanliness and neatness, 10%; Penmanship, 10%; Date at top of each page, giving day, month, and year, 10%; Composition and grammar, 10%; Spelling, 10%.

We, the Committee on Finance, recommend that the Conference endorse the following Denominational Budget: Education, \$3.00; World Missions, \$2.00; Australia, \$.25; Brainerd Indian School, \$.25; Church Extension and Evangelism, \$1.50; Superannuate Pension Plan, \$2.25; Church Administrative Fund, \$1.00; Hephzibah Home, \$.35; General Conference Expense, \$.50; Board Meeting Expense, \$.25; General Sunday School Work, \$.20 per member in Main School; also that the Conference Budget be as follows per member: Conference Church Extension and Evangelism, \$2.50; President's Salary, \$2.25; Conference Entertainment, \$.40; Conference Minutes, \$.35; Mountain Missions, \$.25; Conference Parsonage, \$1.00; Conference Work, \$.50.

We further recommend:

- 1. That the Conference President receive \$80.00 per week salary, one-half social security tax, parsonage rent, utilities, and seven cents per mile traveling expense, and he is to choose his own mode of travel, and that he be given two weeks vacation with pay.
- That he be given the privilege of holding two meetings outside the Conference and retain offerings from two meetings.
- 3. That he hold one quarterly meeting or visit each charge at least once during the year, and at other times as often as he is able.
- 4. That he advise with the stewards of local churches for the purpose of encouraging and devising plans for the better payment of pastors and that he shall also counsel with the board of stewards relative to the superannuate budget item.
- 5. That the Statistical Committee be paid \$10.00 each from the Conference Work Fund.
- 6. That the Treasurer's salary be \$200.00 and the Secretary's salary be \$150.00 to be taken from the Conference Work Fund.
- 7. That the President be authorized to draw on funds of Conference Work for secretarial help, printing blanks, other such items and also for flowers for the funeral of a minister or a minister's wife or widow.
- 8. That the President have the privilege of representing the Conference at the meetings of the N. A. E. and N. H. A. with the expense being paid by the Conference.
- 9. That the Finance Committee meet during the Conference Ministerial Institute with time to be designated by the Conference President.
- 10. The Finance Committee recommends, the Superannuate Pension Board concurring, that superannuate pension funds now on hand be placed in the General Pension Fund; thereby making them available to pay the deficit in the pension budget.

Standing Rules and Recommendations

- 1. We emphasize the need of much prayer and intercession in these evil days, and that fasting and self-denial be observed as well.
- 2. The W. M. S. dues for this Conference will be one dollar and fifty cents (\$1.50) per member. Fifty cents (50c) of this is to be retained in the Conference treasury for Conference working fund.
- 3. The Y. M. W. B. dues will be fifty-six cents (56c) per member for this Conference. Fifty-two cents (52c) is to be used for Foreign Missions, two cents (2c) for desk expense, and two cents (2c) for General Conference travel expense of the Y. M. W. B. Superintendent.
- 4. The annual report blanks must be in the hands of the Conference Statistician by July 1, of each Conference year.
- 5. We urge each local society to have an alert Magazine Solicitor, an active Mission Study Group, and a large Women's World Fellowship Circle.
- We urge the use of the Standard of Efficiency so that each society may work to be placed on the honor roll.
- 7. The Executive Board will serve as a nominating committee to nominate secretaries and committees as deemed necessary before the opening of Conference.
- 8. Each district will elect the following officers: Chairman, Secretary, Magazine Solicitor, Mission Study Promoter, and Y. M. W. B. Superintendent.
- Each district should plan at least three district meetings annually—one each quarter in which workshops will be held for: local presidents, treasurers, magazine solicitors, Women's World Fellowship secretaries, and Y. M. W. B. superintendents.
- 10. It shall be the duty of each District Superintendent to supervise the interests of the societies in her district. This may be done by visitation, correspondence, the holding of conventions and rallies, the organizing of societies and bands where none exists, and giving of her time as she deems needful. Each society or district is to bear her expense on said visits.
