STANDING RULES:

- 1. The clerk of each local society is to place the deed of the local church property in the hands of the Conference President, who is custodian of the deed and who is empowered to rent a safety deposit space for the preservation of deeds, abstracts, and other valuable papers. The Conference shall pay for rent on space.
- The President and Advisory Board are designated a deed examining committee.
 Deeds for churches, parsonages, or other Conference property are to be submitted
 to them for examination before recorded, to make such property secure to the
 Conference.
- 3. The Conference shall convene annually on Monday following the last Sunday of July, subject to the approval of the Board of Administration. The Conference sermon shall be preached Monday night, with the business session beginning Tuesday morning. Campmeeting shall begin on the following Thursday evening, continuing through two Sundays.

4. The local church fiscal year shall end June 30th. Pastors shall report membership as of this date. All conference treasurer's books shall be closed July 10th. The pastoral year shall end with the closing of Camp Meeting.

5. Near the end of the fiscal year the Conference Secretary shall forward one copy of each pastor's statistical blank to the Conference Treasurer, who after closing his books will fill in Item No. IX "Disbursed for Budget," forwarding the same to each pastor. The pastor shall complete the report in full, make a second copy and be ready to read it the first day of Conference. The pastor shall forward his statistical report to the statistical committee chairman at least 10 days prior to the convening of Conference.

6. Pastors are required to report number of calls at the time of reading their rpt.

- 7. The following items on the Pastor's statistical report shall be read each year on the Conference floor; Pastor's calls; Wesleyan Methodists, Wesleyan Missionary, and Wesleyan Youth subscriptions; present membership, gain or loss; Average Sunday School attendance; number of Church Buildings, Value and Insurance; Item VII Complete; Total Contributed for Church; Item IX Complete; Total Benevolences; and the Contributed totals.
- 8. Each local church is responsible for paying the moving expense of the pastor whom they have called.
- 9. The Conference Secretary and Conference Treasurer shall each be paid ten dollars (\$10) annually from the Conference Treasury.
- 10. No Treasurer is allowed to pay out funds without proper authorization.
- 11. The Standing Rules of the Conference are to be included in the Conference Journal from year to year.
- 12. The Superannuate Pension Fund Treasurer shall be a member of the Superannuate Pension Fund Committee.
- 13. The Camp Meeting Board shall consist of seven members; the President of the Annual Conference, W.M.S.President, W.Y.President, and Camp Meeting Treasurer who will be members by virtue of their offices; and that the other members be elected from the floor after the election of Conference Officers.
- 14. The Conference W.Y.President and the Conference Treasurer and the Conference W.M.S. President will be members of the Conference Board of Church Extension and Evangelism, by virtue of their offices.
- 15. The pastor of each charge shall send to the Conference President written notice of the names of each delegate-elect from his church, said notice to be sent immediately following the official election of said delegate or delegates.
- 16. All who are taking the Course of Study shall acquaint themselves with the requirements thereof, and the Conference officials and all pastors shall keep these regulations in mind in helping their young people plan this important preparation for service.

It is with joy that we greet the members of the 72nd session of the Oregon Anmual Conference. How good God has been to us. Brethren, we are behind in our praise! May God grant that from our lives shall come forth praise to His Glory!

We have had the privilege of preaching 84 sermons. Three revival meetings and two Holiness Conventions have been preached. Three funerals have been conducted. Twenty business meetings and twenty two preaching services have been held in quarterly meeting visitation to the churches.

The Leader's Conference at Marion, Indiana was attended and a subsequent visit made to headquarters to meet with the Board of Administration and the General Superintendents. Travel in the interest of the Lord's work exceeded 35,000 miles.

Many phone calls, letters and personal contacts were made in an effort to interest laborers in this corner of the Master's vineyeard. The Holgate property was sold and the sale of the Lebanon property was consumated. All of our conference debts are now paid and a balance remains in the bank. We have a contract which will pay us 66.62 per month for the next ten years as the balance due us, with interest, on the Lebanon property.

The new building at Aumsville has been completed and dedicated. Emmanuel has started construction on their new addition and remodeling project.

We confess our unprofitableness and "nothing in our hands we bring, simply to the cross we cling." The Blood is our confidence! Thank God it covers our soul. His Spirit sanctifies just now and fills us with love for the brethren and a desire to be used of Him to bring lost men to Jesus.

Disbursed - - 941.62 This gives us a balance of:

Balance - - 43.37

You may think that this balance is small compared to last year's. It is, but due to last year's youth society we see that they did not put as much into missions, area dues, and educational fund. Also, we had the rare privilege of sending our conference youth president back east to a special youth meeting. Otherwise, we would have had nearly the same balance as last year's records showed.

For the records, I would address this paragraph to the Conference Apportionment Committee. This year we took in a total of \$123.35 for conference dues. To World Missions we sent

We sent to Headquarters in Indiana (gen. dues) 194.50

and to our area representative in Nebraska (area

dues) 17.90

Also there was an education fund sent to Miltonvale College. This accounts for the majority of our disbursements.

The auditing committee is going to have the unfortunate job of straightening the books out for the previous years. It was my misfortune to change banks and discover the mishap. We put the account into the St. Johns branch of the Security Bank of Oregon transferring it from the Midland Branch of the Oregon Bank. When I transferred the balance on hand, I found that there was still some money left in the Oregon Bank. We received \$.64 credit from them when I had Tom write me a check for \$61.93. Due to a mistake of my own I found this error. Because according to the correct figures we really only had \$61.29 in that bank. I believe there is still approximately \$.35 in the Oregon Bank. I would suggest contacting Thomas Porter Jr. for the exact amount. Gentlemen, someplace in the past there has been an error (chuckle).

. The bar of the Conference shall consist of the first four rows of seats in the tabernacle and the platform.

• The annual Conference shall meet for business and organization on the opening day from 9:00 to 10:00 a.m. and then recess for committee work to allow the W.M.S. and the W.Y. Conferences to convene and transact business.

• The time for hearing the Conference President's and Treasurer's Reports be set for 9:00 a.m. the first Wednesday of Conference and the election of Conference of-

ficers to immediately follow these reports.

There shall be a Nominating Committee whose duties shall be to present nominations for all the regular session committees of the Conference. This committee shall consist of the Conference President as chairman, and three Elders elected annually by the conference. The Conference shall, each year, designate two churches whose delegates shall also be a part of this committee. Said committee shall meet prior to the opening of each annual Conference at a time and place designated by the President. It shall nominate session committees and may serve to nominate special committees as the Conference may request.

. Churches shall give consideration to the payment of pastor's utilities and a gasoline allowance. When these are paid they shall be reported in Item VII of the pastor's Statistical report on separate lines. When the parsonage is used for Sunday School and other church activities, the pastor and board of stewards shall agree on

the proportion of the total utilities to be reckoned as used by the pastor.

. The Ministerial Institute Committee be comprised of three members elected with terms of office to expire on alternating years similar to that of trustees. (Min. 1962) . It shall be the duty of the Conference President and Secretary to arrange for the

printing of the Conference Minutes and Reports.

• The publication of a Conference Paper shall be placed in the hands of a committee consisting of the Conference President and two persons elected by the Conference. This committee shall select an Editor and Publisher and arrange for the financing of said paper.

. The Conference President's report shall include a statement of all official acts, a summary of church business meetings held, personel and phone consultations, and a financial statement listing gifts, marriage and funeral fees received and travel and office expense.

. The C.C.E&E. Committee shall be designated as a Board of Managers.

The President and Secretary of the Annual Conference, upon proper authorization by the Conference Board of Trustees of the Oregon Annual Conference in session, shall be empowered to sign any notes, mortgages, and any instruments of acquisitions or conveyances of property of and for the Oregon Annual Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America.

All property that is held by the Conference shall be deeded to the Oregon Annual Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America Inc. (Not to the Trustees of the Oregon Annual Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America, Inc.)

Each church shall elect its delegates to the Annual Conference at the third quart-

erly business meeting.

The Apportionment Committee (2 Members), Committee on Religious Services (2 members plus Conf. President), Statistical Committee (2 members), and Auditing Committee (2 members) be designated "standing committees". These committees will function prior to and during the conference session following their election, whether their members are seated in the conference bar as delegates or not.

When a committee member is unable to attend the session or act on his particular committee, he shall notify the Committee on Vacancies and that Committee shall designate a replacement. The standing committees shall do as much work as feasible prior to the convening of conference. The above named committees to be elected from the floor during the election of conference officers.
