By-Laws

Section 1: The Conference fiscal year shall close June 30 of each year and that of the local church on May 31. All money for which credit is to be given must be postmarked not later than June 15. Each pastor shall submit to the Conference Treasurer, prior to the close of the Conference year, his statistical blank completed, except for the budget section; the Conference Treasurer, upon completion of the budget section, shall forward the statistical forms to the Statistical Secretary—said form not to be returned to the pastors until the Conference Session. Any pastor not complying with the above ruling will fail to have his character passed by the Character Committee.

Section 2: The principal office of the Conference shall be located in the City of Eau Claire, Eau Claire County, Wisconsin.

Section 3: The President of the Woman's Missionary Society and the President of the Wesleyan Youth shall be members of the Missionary Board by virtue of their office.

Section 4: A Nominating Committee composed of four elders and the President, ex-officio, shall be elected by ballot and this group upon arrival at the Conference shall select 2 properly elected delegates elect to serve with them; and they shall bring their report at the first session of the ensuing annual conference.

Section 5: The Annual Conference of The Wisconsin Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America shall convene on the Third Tuesday in July at 9:00 a.m. in the Tabernacle of the Burr Wesleyan Methodist Campground located 7 miles west of Hillsboro, Wisconsin, on Highway 33.

Section 6: The time for election of the Conference Officers shall be Wednesday morning, 10:00 of Conference Week.

Section 7: The Superannuate Ministers' Board shall be elected for a term of three years. The first member to be elected for one year, the second member for two years, and the third member for three years. Succeeding terms shall be for three years.

Section 8: The Board of Trustees (or the President and Secretary of the Conference when authorized as hereinafter set forth) of the Wisconsin Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America are authorized to buy, sell, lease, and mortgage real and personal property of The Wisconsin Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America and to borrow money for and on behalf of said Conference and to execute the necessary deeds, contracts, notes and mortgages and

other necessary documents to effectuate the purposes of this section; the President and the Secretary of the said Conference are given full power to act for and on behalf of said Conference when authorized by said Trustees by motion duly passed by said Trustees and certified to in writing by the Secretary of said Board of Trustees.

Section 9: Camp Meetings of the Conference shall be supervised and conducted by a Camp Meeting Board of the Conference to be known as "Burr Wesleyan Methodist Camp Meeting Board of The Wisconsin Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America."

(a) Said Board shall consist of the following members: Conference President, Conference Secretary, Conference Treasurer, Maintenance Superintendent, and five members elected annually by the Conference. All members of said Board shall have equal vote and voice. At least three of the members of the Board shall be laymen. All members of the Board shall be members of The Wisconsin Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America.

(b) President: The Conference President, by virtue of his office, shall be the President of the said Board. He shall act as chairman of the Board and have general oversight of the Camp Meeting, and of all the business pertaining thereto. He may appoint someone to act as temporary chairman in his discretion.

(c) Secretary: The Conference Secretary, by virtue of his office, shall be the secretary of the said Board. He shall keep all records and care for all correspondence relative to the business of the said Board.

(d) Treasurer: The Conference Treasurer, by virtue of his office, shall be the treasurer of said Board. He shall receive all funds and disburse the same at the direction of the Camp Meeting Board or the Executive Committee of said Board, as the case may be.

(e) Maintenance Superintendent. The Maintenance Superintendent shall be elected annually by the Conference from a list of two names submitted by the nominating committee. His duties shall be: The oversight of the building and grounds at the Camp Meeting grounds; he shall have charge of all repairs and maintenance and of the upkeep of buildings and grounds under the direction of the Conference or of said Board as the case may be. He shall be foreman of all building projects.

(f) Duties and Powers of the Camp Meeting Board: Said Board shall secure the workers for Camp Meetings, i.e., Evangelists, singers, children's workers and all other help necessary for the carrying on of Camp Meetings. The Board shall also take care of all business of the

Camp Meeting between meetings of the Annual Conference. The Camp Meeting Board shall have authority to borrow money for Camp Meeting purposes and to bind The Wisconsin Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America therefor and to execute the necessary agreements and promissory notes to effect such borrowing. However, the Camp Meeting Board shall not have authority to mortgage or encumber any of the property, real or personal, of The Wisconsin Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America. The Camp Meeting Board shall have authority to rent Camp Meeting property out for such periods of time as will not interfere with the use of the camp grounds by the State Conference and its auxiliary organizations. The Board shall have the authority to enter into agreements with private individuals who have or may in the future construct cottages or other buildings on said camp grounds regarding construction, use and removal of such buildings but shall have no authority to convey a fee interest in, or deed any such land. The Camp Meeting Board shall submit a summary report and accounting each year at the annual meeting of the Conference. Said Camp Meeting Board shall at times be subject to directions and limitations placed on it by the Annual Conference of The Wisconsin Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America.

(g) **Executive Committee:** The Executive Committee of said Board shall consist of the Conference President, the Conference Secretary, and the Maintenance Superintendent, and shall have full authority to act for and on behalf of said Board when authorized by said Board by motion duly passed by the Board and certified to in writing by the Secretary of said Camp Meeting Board.

Section 10: The By-Laws may be amended at any regularly called session of the Annual Conference by a two-thirds vote of those present at said session and entitled to vote.

Standing Rules

1. Each church shall permit its pastor a two weeks vacation with pay, to be absent on vacation over two Sundays.

2. Pastors' reports shall be read and the statistical reports be posted on a bulletin board at the Annual Conference Session.

3. All money to be applied toward payment of Budget shall be remitted undivided monthly by the local church treasurer to the Conference Treasurer, and only money thus remitted will be budget credited. All other will be considered benevolence.

4. The Bar of Conference shall be the first ten rows of seats in the center section and the rostrum of the main tabernacle.

5. The time of Conference shall be from 9:00-12:00 noon and 1:00-4:30 p. m.

6. That the first ballot for Conference President shall be a nominating ballot.

7. That the pastoral vote shall be taken on each charge of the first Sunday in May unless permission is received from the Conference President and his Advisory Board to do otherwise.

8. All preachers taking work at the hands of the Conference shall either join the Pension Plan or Social Security, or both, within one year.

9. The Conference Sermon shall be left in the hands of the President and his Advisory Board.

10. The Conference shall pay the moving expense of a newly-elected President from the Conference Administrative Fund.

11. The Conference Trustees shall be responsible for the bonding of the Conference Treasurer.

12. The Nominating Committee shall appoint the chairman of the Resolutions and the Finance Committees one year in advance.

13. Each charge shall pay the moving expense of the incoming pastor within the Conference bounds.

14. Each pastor shall attend the Camp Meeting and the responsibility of the enforcement of this rule shall be in the hands of the Character Committee.

15. The Conference Secretary shall be the Credential Committee and each pastor shall instruct his church clerk to send the delegates' credentials to him immediately after they are elected.

16. No elective member shall serve on the Nominating Committee two years in succession.

17. All conference treasurers' books be closed and ready for auditing, and placed in the hands of the Auditing Committee at the first session of the conference.

18. That offerings of the first Sunday of Camp be designated for the Conference Administrative Fund.

19. A time of fasting and prayer for the conference and campmeeting shall be observed during the week preceding the conference and campmeeting by each local church, and that an announcement be made in the **Wesleyan Methodist** with the announcement of the campmeeting, and that the Conference Secretary notify each pastor concerning this action preceding this date.

20. Each outgoing pastor shall be responsible for the services of his church until the closing of campmeeting; and he shall begin receiving salary the first Sunday after the close of campmeeting from his new charge.

21. The Nominating Committee shall submit to the Conference floor, to be voted on by ballot, two names for each office, except the office of President, Vice-President, Secretary and Treasurer; and a list of names consisting of one more than the required number for each Committee, where it does not conflict with the requirements of the **Discipline**.

Journal of Daily Proceedings

The ninety-third annual session of the Wisconsin Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America convened on July 19, 1960, at 9:00 a.m. in the main tabernacle on the Burr Wesleyan Methodist Camp Grounds.

The congregation was led in singing, "Count Your Blessings" by the Rev. Robert Girard, with Mrs. Beulah Heavilin at the piano. Rev. Girard also sang a special song.

The Conference President, Rev. Loring H. Peterson, read I Timothy 3:1-7 from the J. B. Phillips translation. General Superintendent H. K. Sheets was called to the platform and led in prayer. We then sang together, "Amazing Grace."

Ministerial Roll Call—27 present

The Credentials Committee Report was read and accepted and 27 delegates were seated.

Motion carried that resolution No. 6 of the 1959 Resolutions Committee Report be made a Standing Rule, which reads as follows: "The Nominating Committee shall submit to the Conference floor, to be voted on by ballot, two names for each office, except the office of President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer; and a list of names consisting of one more than the required number for each Committee, where it does not conflict with the requirements of the Discipline."

Motion passed unanimously that the rules be suspended and the election for president be held immediately.

Motion carried that the tellers retire to canvas the ballot.

Tellers appointed by the Conference President—Robert Girard, Dale Peterson and Benjamin Drown.

Correspondence was read from J. B. Clawson.

Motion carried that the Conference Secretary communicate to Rev. Clawson our loss in his absence from this session of conference.

Tellers Report on nominating ballot for president.

Motion carried that Dr. Sheets be given an honorary seat in the Bar of Conference.

Secretary was instructed to prepare a news release for the Hillsboro paper.

President Elected—David D. Peterson.

Prayer for our new president was offered by the Rev. H. S. Bennett.

Adjourned for Nominating Committee to complete their work.

Called to order by the President.

Nominating Committee partial report read and accepted.

Adjourned by motion for committee work.

Tuesday p.m.

Congregational song led by the Rev. Donald Berry with Mrs. Floyd Titus as pianist.

Prayer by the Rev. Thomas Bailie.

Roll Call — Ministers 25 - Laymen 25

Motion carried that the Pastoral Relations Committee and the Finance Committee be combined for the purpose of recommending to the Conference the support and responsibilities of the Conference President.

Motion carried that Loring H. Peterson be the chairman of this committee.

Adjourned by the chair for committee work.

Conference called to order by the President.

Motion carried to set aside the hour of adjournment for this session.

Report of Joint Committee recommending part time president read and rejected after considerable debate.

Adjourned by motion.

Tuesday, 8:00 p.m.

The Conference Sermon was preached by the Rev. Clarence Titus of Valton. He took his text from I Samuel 15:13. He spoke of the importance of following God's will as follows:

"Most important for the believer is found in I Thes. 4:3-4 telling us that it is the will of God that the believer be sanctified. This is God's way of keeping the believer free from the power of sin, such as holds the sinner without Christ. We should preach sanctification in such a way as to convey the idea that this step must be taken first before the believer can do the whole will of God. And that spiritual life depends upon this constant relationship between the Spirit and the heart of the believer.

As revealed daily. The will of God that meets my particular needs of life as I must live it today is revealed to me daily by the Spirit of God that dwells in me.

Disciples request. Teach us to pray. In answer Jesus said, 'Holy Father, thy will be done—in me, as is planned in heavin.' The question for this hour is, have I come here with the firm belief that God knows what He wants and that He knows how to get it, and is my faith great enough to really believe these scriptures? How can I say I have performed the commandments of the Lord if I manifest the attitude of disbelief or disobedience in my heart. When I really believe I have no need to manifest carnal traits as feeling hurt, pouting, complaining, for I have faith that God is really getting what He wants and plans for."

Motion carried that the first Vice Presidential ballot be a nominating ballot.

Important Motions of the WMS Conference

1. The motion carried to continue support of Edna Johnson in Japan, underwrite Lorelei's support in case of a deficit, and give the balance in the fund to the work in Alaska.
2. The motion carried to delete all unnecessary material from the WMS Minutes, before submitting them for printing in the Church Minutes.
3. Inasmuch as there was not enough in the treasury to pay the YMWB Supt. and the WMS Treasurer, the motion carried that \$20.00 from the treasury be divided between them now.
4. The motion carried that each society send \$1.00 to Mrs. Jane Titus within two weeks, to supplement the deficit in the payment to the WMS Treasurer.
5. The motion carried to divide equally between the YMWB superintendent and the WMS treasurer whatever monies may be in the treasury at Conference time, July, 1961, up to the amount of \$30.00.
6. Standing Rule

PLAN OF WORK

We, the Plan of Work Committee, submit the following:

1. All local books must close May 31. All money and voucher receipts for which credit is to be given must be sent to the Conference WMS Treasurer, postmarked not later than June 15. The statistical reports should be sent to the Conference WMS Treasurer by July 6.
2. The dues for active members are \$1.25; for honorary members, \$1.00.
3. Each society shall endeavor to send the following:

4. Each society observe Harvest Home Day and take an offering for Miltonvale Wesleyan College.
5. Each society take a special offering for the American Bible Society and send same to the Conference WMS Treasurer.
6. Each society take a special offering for Service Men's Commission.
7. Continue to send new and used clothing to our mission fields.
8. Continue to:
 - a. Collect coupons for Hephzibah.
 - b. Use Penny-a-Meal Plan for World Missions.
 - c. Use Foot-of-Dimes Plan for Mission Equipment.
 - d. Stress Honorary Enrollment to Miltonvale College.
 - e. Respond to the Card Call Plan.
 - f. Observe World Day of Prayer.
 - g. Collect used postage stamps for Women's World Fellowship.
9. Each society promote the YMWB and have a monthly report from its Supt.

10. We recommend that each society be responsible for the cleaning and upkeep of their assigned rooms; if unable to attend clean-up day, send \$1.00 per room to the Conference WMS Treasurer, to be used for room improvement; each society send the amount designated for camp kitchen equipment, the same to be sent by Jan. 1, 1961.

11. Each society seek to foster a missionary spirit among its members by:
- Encouraging study of the Bible and reading of good missionary books, especially those of the Reading Course, and the Wesleyan Missionary magazine.
 - Maintaining a spirit of prayer, observing prayer and fast days, and praying especially for our missionaries in Japan and Australia.
 - Observing Tuesday as a special day of prayer for other women of the world.
 - Using the audio-visual aids from Wesley Film Service.

12. Each society promote a program of community mission work by:
- Visitation of the ill, aged, needy people, under the direction of the vice-president.
 - Relief work in emergencies, under direction of work director.
 - Evangelism by individual witnessing.

13. Each society shall strive for 100% rating under the following Efficiency Standard.

STANDARD OF EFFICIENCY

We recommend:

1. That the Efficiency Standard be read in the society the first meeting after Conference (5% credit) and that arrangement be made for one missionary prayer meeting each month (5% credit.)

2. That a minimum of ten meetings be held during the year, at which time prayer requests are presented and remembered and business transacted (5% credit) and at least one public meeting (5% credit.)

3. That a Women's World Fellowship Secretary be appointed by the local WMS Executive Board, who shall promote the program of the General Women's World Fellowship (5% credit.) That a Women's World Prayer Circle be formed under the direction of the W.W.F. secretary, and that the report be sent to the conference W.W.F. secretary within sixty days after the annual conference (5% credit.)

4. That a solicitor be elected for the WESLEYAN MISSIONARY, gaining not less than two subscriptions a year, and that she use the conference-church key combination on all subscriptions (5% credit.) That the President, Secretary, Treasurer and the equivalent of 75% of the active members be subscribers to the WESLEYAN MISSIONARY (5% credit.)

5. That a Mission Study Secretary be elected and she report to the Conference Mission Study Secretary by January 15th (5% credit.) That 10% of the active members read at least four of the recommended books (5% credit.)

6. That a delegate be elected to the annual conference WMS and that she be instructed by the local society regarding the amount to be pledged by that society at the annual conference session (5% credit), and that the YMWB Superintendent be seated in the annual session and be granted the privilege of speaking, and provision be made by her society for such representation (5% credit)

7. That the \$1.00 membership dues be sent to the Conference WMS Treasurer and be forwarded to the General WMS Treasurer for the general fund.

8. That we secure every woman in the church as a member of the society, or achieve a 10 per cent gain in total membership.

9. That each local society pay annually into the Conference Working Fund the amount assessed by the Conference WMS Executive Board.

10. That the local President (or Vice-President) attend the conference session and provision be made by her society for such representation. (Ten per cent shall be given for each of the above items, except those otherwise specified, and all societies making a grade of 80% shall be placed on the Honor Roll.)
