Opening—The forty-sixth annual session of the Oklahoma Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America assembled in the Enid Wesleyan Church at 916 E. Maine St., August 2, 1949, at 3:00 p. m. with Rev. G. C. Cockrell, President of the Conference, in the Chair.

The service opened with songs led by Rev. Leon Jackson. Devotions were given by Rev. Dudley Dorr, and prayer was offered by Rev. W. C. Brannon.

Roll was called. Twelve Elders and four Conference Preachers were present to answer the roll.

Credentials—Moved and carried that Rev. Paul Batman and Rev. Leon Jackson be the Committee on Credentials. A Nominating Committee be elected, composed of three Elders: one of which shall be the President of the Conference as Chairman exofficio, and the Delegates-elect from two churches designated by the Conference. This committee shall: First, examine the credentials of all Delegates to the Annual Conference. Second, nominate all session committees, not already provided for, and be prepared to report at the first meeting of Conference.
- 8. The Conference fiscal year shall end the second Sunday before the opening day of Conference, and all statistical reports shall be based on monies received up to and including that date. Budget funds should then be sent immediately to the Conference Treasurer.
- 9. Two copies of each written report shall be given to the Secretary of the Conference. These shall be typewritten and double spaced.
- 10. The Conference Treasurer shall be a member of the Finance Board and an honorary member of the Conference body with a right to speak but not to vote.
- 11. The Annual Conference shall elect a Spiritual Life Conference Committee, composed of five members. This committee shall plan for the com-

ing together of Christian Workers of the Oklahoma Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church.

Emphasis at this Conference shall be given to spiritual quickening, edification, and fellowship. This committee shall also plan for the coming together of the pastors and their wives, and all interested laymen, for a time of Prayer and Fasting in the interest of the Oklahoma Conference.

- 12. Conference shall convene annually on the Tuesday following the first Monday of August.
- 13. In the case of a change of pastors, the outgoing pastor shall be paid a salary for the two Sundays of Conference and Camp.

# Report No. 6 FINANCE COMMITTEE

We submit the following:

- 1. We recommend that 5% of the CASH DISBURSEMENTS paid for all purposes by each local charge and the TITHE OF THE PASTOR'S CASH SALARY paid through the local church treasurer, be paid to the Conference Treasurer monthly for Conference President's Salary and Church Extension.
  - a. That the plan of 5% of all cash disbursements paid by the local church, and the tithe of the pastor's cash salary be a budget item. That no budget be considered as paid in full until this is met.
- 2. We recommend that the President's Home be retained by the Conference, and we further recommend that \$1.50 per member be raised for the payment of this property. This is a budget item. (See Item 4.)
- 3. That the Conference Treasurer and the Conference Secretary be paid \$25.00 each for services rendered.
  - 4. That the following are budget items:
    - a. Conference Budget: Conference General Fund, \$1.30; Conference Extension, \$2.00 per member; Permanent President's Home, \$1.50.

- b. Connectional Budget: Foreign Missions, \$2.00; Home Missions, \$1.00; Education, \$2.00; Superannuated Ministers' Fund, \$1.50; Orphanage, 25 cents; Administrative Budget, 25 cents; General Conference Entertainment Fund, 20 cents.
- c. Connectional Sunday School Assessment 5 cents per member based on the total members in the main school.
- 5. That the Conference Sunday School Secretary be paid \$6.00 from the Conference General Fund for Promotional Work. Also that an offering be taken for the Sunday School Secretary for expense by each church visited.
- 6. That all Conference and General Evangelists who are members of the Oklahoma Conference shall pay at least one half of the tithe of their cash salary to the local church where they hold their membership.
- 7. We recommend for our churches as a general financial plan, the Scriptural Storehouse Plan of Tithing as instructed in Mal. 3:10. Let each pastor be diligent in presenting this on his charge.
- 8. That the Conference President's Salary be set at \$50.00 per week, plus four cents per mile for use of car in Conference duties, also that his rent be paid for residence while on pioneer. All monies received as offerings on pioneer fields be turned back to the Conference Treasurer to apply on the Pioneer Project Expenses.
- 9. We recommend that the President report annually to the Conference, his salary, parsonage rent, and gifts received within the bounds of the Oklahoma Conference.
- 10. We recommend that the pastor and the trustees of each local church secure sufficient insurance on all local church property.

The proposal was made by the joint committee to offer Meade Stevenson that the Oklahoma Conference would assume the responsibility of paying \$55.00 each quarter on the lots, and would give a maximum of \$400.00 on the completion of the building.

If accepted by Mr. Meade Stevenson, that Mr. Stevenson would be responsible in paying the remainder of the cost of the building, both labor and materials and that he would deed the property to the Oklahoma Conference.

Rev. G. C. Cockrell was to make the offer to Mr. Stevenson, and report his findings to the boards.

June 15, 1949—Board of Trustees Authorization.

The Board of Trustee were contacted by Conference President Rev. G. C. Cockrell in person and by telephone and approved the purchase of lots adjoining the Tulsa Church for the sum of \$500.00 (five hundred dollars) the amount to be added to present loan on Tulsa Property.

Miss Erma Steinacker spoke to us of the work in South America. She told of the family life and customs of the people and then gave opportunity for questions to be asked.

Helen Hollen, delegate from the Area Convention, brought a very interesting report of the services she attended and brought some of the inspiration to us that she had received.

Rev. Leon Jackson led the congregation in song after which Rev. R. J. Eling offered prayer. A ladies trio consisting of Sisters Vivian Batman, Grace Groves, and Rachel McMurphy sang "The Name of Jesus." We were greatly privileged to have a returned missionary from South America, Miss Erma Steinacker, speak to us in our public service. Since the Enid church has taken the responsibility of her support while she was on the field she seemed a part of our own Conference, although she is from Michigan.

For a scripture lesson Miss Steinacker read John 4:35 and 41. As she spoke to us of the great need of South America the burden was heavy upon her heart. It was challenging to us as she told of the new open

field, but as yet no workers for the place. Pictures were shown of our missionaries and their families and some of the people among whom they work.

- 2. I recommend that this Conference Body elect a committee of three, one of which shall be the President, as chairman, to arrange for the social activities for Youth Day at Conference.
- 3. That each local society send or bring a picture of the local group to the Conference.
- 4. That each local society send in a financial and other informational report monthly, to the Conference President. Blanks for this report will be provided.

### Report No. 2 STEWARDSHIP COMMITTEE

We recommend:

- 1. That \$25.00 be paid from the Conference Treasury toward the expense of printing the Conference Minutes.
  - 2. That dues be \$1.00 per member a year, each Society remitting

quarterly to the Conference W. Y. P. S. Treasurer. The dues to be divided as follows: 50 cents per member a year for Connectional W. Y. P. S. and 50 cents per member a year for Conference W. Y. P. S.

- 2-A. That the W. Y. P. S. Conference Fund (50 cents per member) be distributed by vote of the Executive Council.
- 3. That each Society have at least one subscription to the Card Call Plan of the Home Missionary Department of the Church for every ten members or fraction thereof.
- 4. That each Society raise \$1.00 per member for a Youth Worker at the Annual Camp Meeting.
- 5. That each Society take one offering per month for Foreign Missions. This may be designated as follows: one-half Foreign Missions, one-fourth Home Missions, one-fourth Education. If not designated it will be divided by the Treasurer.

# Report No. 3 COMMITTEE ON GOALS AND METHODS

#### We Recommend:

- 1. That each member of the W. Y. P. S. be assured of the Spirit as to their acceptance of God, and they heed the admonition in Romans 12:2, "Be not conformed to this world: but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what is that good, and acceptable, and perfect will of God."
- 2. That there be an organized society, with certificate of organization, on every charge.
- 3. That each society sponsor a weekly young people's prayer meeting, one evening each month be designated as a time of fasting and prayer, and at this time a self-denial offering be taken equal to the amount of the meal.
- 4. That the local president of each society be responsible in promoting the following:
  - a. Definite time be set aside to study the Discipline, the Wesleyan Catechism, placing special emphasis on the study of the constitution and by-laws of the W. Y. P. S. and other doctrinal books such as "Perfect Love" and "Foundations of Doctrine."
  - b. That each Society through its Devotional and Program Committees endeavor this next year to create greater enthusiasm by membership drives and contests, and that we extend a sincere welcome to all visitors and friends.

- c. That each member be a subscriber to the Wesleyan Youth and that we strive to attain the goal of 100 subscriptions. Also that each member support our other church periodicals.
- 5. That our young people take advantage of our Church schools in preference to other schools and that we make use of the W. Y. P. S. Student Loan Fund. Loans to be recommended by the Student's pastor and paid by the Conference W. Y. P. S. Treasurer after consultation with the Executive Committee. Interest on the W. Y. P. S. Loan is 4%.
- 6. That there be a youth rally in every church in the conference and an endeavor made for quarterly district rallies this year and more often if possible.
- A. We further recommend that the Conference W. Y. P. S. President be invited to attend these rallies and that his transportation shall be paid at the rate of four cents per mile.
- 7. That each Committee Chairman prepare two copies of their report, these reports to be typewritten and double-spaced.
- 8. We recommend that the secretary be instructed to send copies of the reports of the committees of Stewardship, Goals and Methods and the Efficiency Standard to each local president at the beginning of the year, these reports to be read and studied in each society.
