## JOURNAL OF PROCEEDINGS

Burr Campground, July 17, 1945.

The first sitting of the Seventy-Fifth session of the Wisconsin Annual Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America convened in the Tabernacle on the Burr Campground at 9:00 A.M. Tuesday, July 17, 1945.

Rev. Carl Olander led the conference in a song service with

Rev. Kenneth Hintz as pianist.

Rev. Clarence Mason and Rev. Mrs. Grace Kauffman led in prayer followed by others. Then we sang 'All Hail the Power of Jesus Name."

The Conference Sermon was delivered by Rev. Orval C. Butcher, Pastor of the Appleton Church. His message, blessed by the Holy Spirit, was on the threefold aspect of the Church. Scripture used was Romans 12. The first point brought to our attention was the "function" of the church, emphasizing the spreading of scriptural holiness as the issue of the church and the fact that we ought to be organized to be successful at our job. The second aspect "fervency" brought to our attention that we must be fervent in spirit, having the burden for lost souls. The third aspect dealt with "fire" as a type of the Holy Spirit, who is needed to melt, warm, burn out, purify, and energize our churches.

The message was followed by the singing of "There is a Foun-

tain Filled With Blood."

The conference business session was called to order by the President, Rev. J. B. Clawson.

R'oll call of the ministers showed 22 ministers present.

Rev. Ernest Friebel, Jr. was selected as the Committee on Credentials.

The report of the Committee on Credentials was accepted with the amendment that a roll call be taken from the credentials accepted. The delegates were seated by the Conference and roll call showed 23 delegates present.

The bar of the conference was voted to be the first eight seats

in the center section of the tabernacle.

By vote the time of the conference was set as follows: 9 A.M. to 12 noon and 2 P.M. to 5 P.M. with permission for committees to withdraw for committee work, allowing the conference session to continue its work.

Rev. F. R. Birch, Foreign Missionary Secretary, was chosen as speaker for the Tuesday evening service by vote of the conference.

A reading of the action of the Book Committee concerning the changing of the name of the church from Wesleyan Methodist Connection (or Church) of America to Wesleyan Methodist Church of America, was given.

We adjourned to await the report of the Committee on Nomina-

ions.

The conference was recalled by the chairman at 11:30 A.M.

The report of the Nominating Committee was read as a whole and men item by item. By vote Orval C. Butcher was chosen to

replace G. M. Hahn on the Committee on Conference Minutes. The report was then accepted as a whole.

The courtesy Committee presented visitors to the Conference. The Committee on Credentials presented the credentials of Mrs. Gladys Stockwell of the Spooner charge, which credentials were accepted.

A recommendation concerning the aforementioned change of

name of our denomination was passed.

The report of the Conference President was read and accepted.

We were adjourned upon motion.

#### Tuesday Afternoon

The session was opened with a song service led by Rev. Robert Thrasher. The devotions were led by Mrs. G. M. Hahn. Prayer was offered by Rev. Charles H. Butcher, Rev. G. M. Hahn, and Mrs. G. M. Hahn.

The roll call showed 21 ministers and 22 delegates present.

The minutes of the last session were read and approved as read Rev. Carl Olander of Hayward and Rev. Kenneth Hintz of

Baraboo read their respective statistical reports.

Reports from Rev. S. S. Hotchkiss of Nehalem, Oregon; Rev. George Nofsinger of Marble Falls, Arkansas; Rev. J. D. Crandell, Chetek, Wisconsin; and David Peterson of Eau Claire were read by the secretary.

The conference adjourned for committee work subject to the call

of the chair.

#### Wednesday Morning

The session was opened with a song service led by Miss Edna Mae Marquart. The devotions were led by Rev. I. J. Butcher, Rev. O. C. Butcher led in prayer.

The roll call showed 24 ministers and 27 delegates present.

The minutes of the last session were read and approved as read. The Committee on Courtesy presented Rev. F. R. Birch, Foreign Missionary Secretary and our Connectional Representative. Bro. Birch responded with words of greeting.

The following statistical reports were given: Rice Lake, Eau Claire, Mill Creek, Superior, Hillsboro, Spooner, Valton, Beloit.

A report of the Committee on Religious Services and Orders of

the Day was read and accepted.

The Committee on Credentials reported the credentials of Mrs. Oscar Hovland from Beloit and Clara Bell from Tripville. The delegates were accepted.

The following co-pastors reported: Josephine King and Hazel

Butcher.

The reports of Wilma Bakke and Esther Johnson were read by

the secretary.

By vote a committee was called for to be appointed by the President to draw up a resolution, against the use of alcoholic beverages on the trains, to be published in our minutes and in newspapers.

Rev. Orval Butcher and Rev. Mrs. Grace Kauftman were appointed as the committee to draw up the resolution.

A resolution was passed that the first item of business for The Wednesday afternoon session be the election of conference officers. By vote it was decided that a compensation be paid to those working in the kitchen.

A motion was passed that those not delegates or ministers and

wives pay board during conference.

By vote it was decided to take a special offering following the election of officers for the kitchen help.

The conference adjourned for committee work subject to the call of the chair.

#### Wednesday Afternoon

The session was opened with a song service led by Wayne Mortimer. The devotions were led by Harry Johnson.

The roll call showed 25 ministers and 29 delegates present.

The minutes of the last session were read and approved as read. We then proceeded with the orders of the day — the election of officers.

Wayne Mortimer and Lloyd King were appointed by the Presi-

dent as tellers.

A motion was passed that the first ballot for President be a nominating ballot.

By ballot Rev. G. M. Hahn was elected as President of the

Conference.

A motion was passed that the first ballot for Vice-President be a nominating ballot.

By ballot Llyod W. King was elected as Vice-President.

After balloting for Secretary, Mrs. Orval C. Butcher receiving the majority vote, a motion was passed instructing the President to cast a unanimous ballot for Mrs. Butcher as secretary. The ballot was cast.

By ballot Mrs. John Mortimer was elected as Treasurer.

Miss Sylvia Lee was elected as Assistant Secretary upon motion. The Sunday School Board of the Conference was elected as follows: Mrs. G. M. Hahn, S. S. Secretary; Daren Durey and Josephine King.

Rev. Lloyd King was elected as a member of the Judiciary Com-

mittee to succeed himself for a period of four years.

Rev. Clarence E. Mason was elected as Conference Trustee for

a period of 5 years.

A motion was passed that the remaining votes be by acclimation. Mrs. Grace Kauffman was elected to succeed herself as member of the Committee on Itineracy and Orders for a period of four years.

The Conference Missionary Board was elected as follows: Orval C. Butcher, Carl Olander, J. B. Clawson, and following the passing of a motion for a fourth member, Dr. G. E. Wesche.

Rev. Charles H. Butcher was elected as Conference Tithing

Secretary.

Mrs. J. B. Clawson was elected to succeed herself as member of the Conference Camp Meeting Board for a period of four years. Rev. Ernest Friebel, Jr., was elected to the Northern Camp Meeting Board for a period of three years.

The Superannuated Minister's Board was elected as follows:

Chairman, Henry Clark; Kenneth Hintz, secretary; Rev. I. J. Butcher, treasurer.

A motion was passed that a member be elected to take G. M. Hahn's place on the Committee to Fill Vacancies and that the rest of the Committee succeed itself. Lloyd King was elected to take his

Rev. Kenneth Hintz and Rev. Ernest Friebel, Jr., were elected as the Statistical Committe for the following year.

Chester Finley and Chester Klampe were elected as the Auditing Committee for the following year.

A motion was passed that an offering be taken for the Secretary and Treasurer Thursday morning.

A motion was passed that Rev. F. R. Birch, our Connectional Representative, be made an honorary member of the conference.

Another motion was passed that Rev. Birch be given the chair while committees were allowed to retire for work.

Rev. Birch took the chair and the following statistical reports were read: Appleton, Stone Lake, Gull Lake, Chittamo, Burr and Valley and Tripville. Appleton's co-pastor, Mrs. O. C. Butcher, reported.

We were adjourned by limitation of time.

#### Thursday Morning

The session was opened by a song service led by Miss Edna Mae Marquart. The devotions were led by Charles Bakke.

The roll call showed 23 ministers and 25 delegates present.

The minutes of the last session were read, corrected and approved as corrected.

The following were given introduction to the conference by the Courtesy Committee: Rev. Lester Buckman of Oaklawn, Illinois; Bro. Scott, student of C.E.I., Chicago; and Bro. Harold Craker of Baraboo.

Upon motion Bro. Scott and Bro. Harold Craker were given

honorary seats in the conference.

Bro. Lester Buckman gave a brief oral report of his work in Oaklawn.

A partial report of the Committee on Religious Services and Orders of the Day was accepted item by item.

The report of the Conference Evangelists' work was given by both Rev. and Mrs. Charles Butcher.

A motion was passed that the conference purchase an adding machine. Bro. G. M. Hahn and Dr. Gerald Wesche were elected as the committee to purchase the adding machine.

Upon motion Bro. F. R. Birch took the chair to hear Pastor's Reports while committees were dismissed for work.

The following Pastor's Reports were given: Angelo Missionary Charge, Beulah, Oakridge, Selden Sunday School, and Mrs. G. M. Hahn as co-pastor at Valton.

A motion of appreciation for the work of the Selden Sunday

School near Superior was passed.

The conference adjourned to the call of the chair.

#### Thursday Afternoon

The session was opened with a song service led by Miss Edna Mae Marquart. The devotions were led by Chester Finley.

The conference was called to order by the President, Rev. J. B.

Clawson.

The Courtesy Committee presented Rev. and Mrs. Keith Peckham

of the Wisconsin Free Methodist Conference.

The Tithing Secretary, Rev. Charles H. Butcher, then took charge. Kev. F. R. Birch was given time to speak on the Storehouse Tithing Plan. His talk was followed by a question box concerning the subject.

Following Bro. Birch, Rev. Keith Packham, Superintendent of the Wisconsin Free Methodist Conference and fraternal delegate from that body, brought greetings to our conference and spoke concerning the possible union of our two denominations.

Rev. Charles H. Butcher was elected as fraternal delegate to the

Free Methodist Conference to convene in August.

Th report of the Conference Treasurer was read and accepted. after the acceptance of the report of the Auditing Committee that the books were correct.

A motion was passed that the amount of the cost of the conference tent be taken from the Tent Fund to reimburse the Conference Mis-

sions for Evangelism Fund.

A motion was passed that the Trustees be authorized to look into the matter of the Butcher and Lathrop notes and that a settlement be made if possible.

A motion was passed that an item concerning the General Conference delegate's expenses be inserted in the Conferenc Calendar.

The Treasurer of the Superannuated Minister's Board reported, acceptance subject to the report of the Auditing Committee at a later time.

A motion was passed that the second half of the note to the Superannuated Minister's Board be paid by the Trustees of the Conformac Publisher First

ference from the Conference Building Fund.

The report of the Conference Sunday School Secretary was read and accepted, after the report of the Auditing Committee that the books were correct was accepted.

By vote the Budget Committee was asked to iron out the question concerning the Superannuated Minister's Fund Budget and the

Ministers' 1%.

The report of the Budget Committee was read and accepted with the item of Education to be increased to \$1.75.

An oral report of the Seymour Sunday School near Eau Claire

was given by Bro. Harry Johnson.

The report of the Resolutions Committee was read and accepted item by item with the following amendment to the item concerning pastors' reports: That the Statistical Reports of the Pastors' be posted on a bulletin board following the election of committees in the first session and that the pastors merely give a brief summary of their work and a personal testimony before the conference body. A motion was made that the last item be referred to the Committee on the Liquor Resolution to be reworded, but not to be published in the paper.

Rev. Lloyd King reported as representative of Miltonvale

Wesleyan College. His report was accepted.

A motion was passed that the Sunday Morning offering be divided as follows: one-half for Conference President's salary; onefourth for Conference Incidentals; and one-fourth for Conference Missions or Evangelism.

The conference adjourned by limitation of time.

#### Friday Afternoon

The conference session was preceded by the Connectional Address by Rev. F. R. Birch, Foreign Missionary Secretary.

At the request of Bro. Hahn, Bro. Birch took the chair for the

session.

Roll call showed 18 ministers and 15 delegates present.

The minutes of the last session were read and corrected and approved as corrected.

The report of the Conference Calendar Committee was read and

approved.

The report of the Committee on Statistics was read and accepted The report of the Committee on Itineracy and Orders was given

and accepted.

The Auditing Committee reported that the books of the Treasurer of the Superannuated Minister's Board had been audited and were found to be correct. The report was accepted and the Treasurer's books were then accepted.

The Courtesy Committee presented Dale Peterson of Eau Claire, and Prof. Garl Beaver and Walter Titus, representatives of Miltonvale

Weslevan College.

The resignation of Daren Durey from the Conference Sunday

School Board was accepted upon motion.

Miss Esther Johnson of Rice Lake was elected to take Bro. Durey's place on the Conference Sunday School Board.

The report of the Committee on Conference Minutes was read

and accepted.

A motion was passed that due to the fact that the minutes would be delayed to some extent that the Conference Secretary send a mimeographed copy of the report of the Budget Committee, the Conference Calendar, and the Conference Officers and Committees, to the pastors.

A motion was passed that all reports of the conference be in the hands of the Secretary by or before the last Sunday of Camp.

A motion was passed that the Roll of Honor be continued in Conference Minutes and be brought up to date.

We adjourned to the call of the chair.

#### Friday Evening

The conference was called to order by the President, Kev. G. M. Hahn

The roll call showed 20 ministers and 13 delegates present. The minutes of the last session were read and approved as read Upon request of the President, Rev. Birch took the chair.

Dr. G. E. Wesche gave a report of a self-appointed committee concerning personal differences of certain members of the conference. A motion was passed that this report be kept on record on the secretary's book, but not to be published in the minutes. The report was accepted by motion.

Upon motion a rising vote of thanks was given the above men-

tioned committee.

Upon motion it was decided to take \$1.00 from the Conference Evangelists' Budget and add it to the Conference Missions for Evangelism Fund.

The report of the Conference Missionary Board was read and

accepted.

#### REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

1. The Young People's Conference shall begin at the close of the Annual Conference.
2. The election of officers and committees be the order of the

day following the seating of delegates.
3. The Conference W. Y. P. S. be divided into two districts, the Northern and the Southern.

There be an attempt to have at least two conventions in each district.

The officers of each district are to be elected at the first district convention for the conference year.

6. The W. Y. P. S. set a goal of 50 new subscriptions to the

7. The society paying their budget quarterly will have their name published in the "W. Y. P. S. Outlook."

8. Each local society president shall read before the members of that society, Article No. 398 in the Wesleyan Discipline, "The Local Society.

fund — 2c per mile if by car, railroad fare if by train.
20. Each society have 2 delegates and any officer may be elected. The pastor from each church having a Young People's Society shall be permitted to vote.

21. Our societies shall be radiating centers of Christian character

and the beauty of holiness.
