DAILY PROCEEDINGS

The Thirty-eighth Session of the South Carolina Annual Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Connection, or Church, of America met in the Glenwood Wesleyan Church at Easley, South Carolina, November 11th, at two P. M.

Devotional Exercises were conducted by Rev. J. T. Carey. The Sacrament of the Lord's Supper was observed.

After a few appropriate remarks the Conference was called to order by the President, Rev. W. D. Correll. C. H. Boggs, the Conference Secretary, being unable to attend, the Conference elected Rev. L. F. Lance to act until the regular election of officers.

On motion Mrs. Laura Durham was seated as delegate from the Greenville Charge.

The Roll was called, and thirteen Elders and five Conference Preachers answered to their names.

Committee on Conference Bar reported, suggesting the four front seats in the center, three upon the right of the Chairman, five upon the left, and the Amen Corner. Report adopted.

The Committee elected on Courtesy: J. T. Carey, D. O. Powers and A. J. Tant.

George Hilson was elected Conference Reporter.

R. C. Kendrick was re-elected to the Committee on Itineracy and Orders. G. E. Crenshaw was elected to fill the vacancy caused by the death of L. H. Kelly. The Committee now stands: Elders—R. C. Kendrick, four years; W. D. Correll, three years; G. E. Crenshaw, two years; D. G. Matheny, one year. Laymen—J. H. Cobb and J. P. Hollis.

Hours for business sessions of the Conference were fixed as follows: To meet at 8:30 A. M. and close at 11:30 A. M. Meet at 1:30 P. M., and close on motion. Night services at 7:30 P. M.

Rev. C. H. Sullivan, Pastor of the Glenwood Methodist Church, and Rev. T. P. Baker, Home Missionary Secretary of the Wesleyan Methodist Connection, were presented to the Conference. On motion they were made honorary members of the Conference, with the privilege of speaking to all questions.

On motion the Conference voted to endorse the holding of a Y. M. W. B. Convention under the direction of the Woman's Home and Foreign Missionary Society.

On motion the President was to appoint a Committee of three to bring in a definite report to the Conference concerning the young people's work of the Conference. The President appointed Rev. R. C. Mullinax, Rev. F. B. Williams and James Hilson.

If at any time he should hold meetings outside of the Conference, he is to release it from all financial obligation for that period spent elsewhere, unless circumstances warrant such action.

REPORTS

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

To the faithful members of the South Carolina Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church, I beg leave to submit the following report:

Dear Saints:—I trust that I come to you again in the tenderness of the Holy Spirit, and hope to find you again in the spirit of coöperation as we make our annual reports. This year has rapidly passed and our records are left to be read by those who follow. God has kept vigilance over us during the year and has blessed the work in various ways.

The shadows of death have hung over us all through the year. Three of our faithful pastors have answered the summons from above and have crossed the eternal divide into the state of the dead. The records have for many years borne the names of Revs. J. R. Davis and L. H. Kelly. That of Rev. W. C. Simmons is of a more recent date. Their names will now pass to the Roll of the Honored Dead. This solemn fact should soften our very heart and bring an holy awe into our midst.

This year has been peculiar to itself. We have passed through some strong and trying circumstances. The cry of distress has been nation-wide. The spirit of oppression has been felt throughout the state. The financial reverses have affected us somewhat. The acid test has come to some, but the courage and loyalty of others have not been daunted. Their consecrations were too thorough to raise the white flag.

Some can say with St. Paul, "I have fought a good fight and have kept the faith." The ranks are still united, in spite of all the conflicts. Success has come to those who have faithfully coöperated with the leaders. The Spirit has set His seal upon the efforts and given some gracious revivals, and the annual camp meeting was one of the best in our history.

I trust that this session will be known for the wonderful manifested presence of God, and that our business will run with divine smoothness during the entire session. Let us by our broadmindedness, brotherly spirit and honest and unbiased minds seek to make this so.

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Appointments

Rev. L. H. Kelly's death made vacant his charge. That consisted of Central Second Church and Cateechee. Rev. J. R. Garrett was appointed as pastor of Central Second Church and Rev. D. G. Matheny was appointed as pastor of Cateechee.

The death of Rev. J. R. Davis made vacant the Golden Grove Circuit. Rev. O. R. Stewart was appointed to fill this vacancy.

Rev. R. C. Mullinax was relieved of two of his churches, Graham's Chapel and Clifton on Sept. 1, 1930. The former church was added to Rev. G. E. Crenshaw's circuit, Greenville, and Rev. J. C. Nunnally was appointed as pastor for the latter.

The Glenwood Church has been built this year. The dedicatorial service was held Sept. 7, 1930.

There were thirty-eight names presented to me by Rev. O. B. Stewart. He asked that they be organized into a class at the Alice Mill. This was done October 5, 1930. After Rev. R. C. Kendrick approved this action it was declared a church on November 9, 1930. Twenty-eight came in by furnishing certificates and twelve by confession of faith.

RESOLUTIONS

Resolutions Adopted in 1898

Resolved, 1st. That as a body in Conference assembled, we will not allow our pulpits or churches to be used by those who do not give evidence of being sound in the doctrines of the Wesleyan Methodist Church and true to our polity.

2nd. That as ministers and laymen we will use our best endeavors to prevent the promulgation of doctrines or usages not in accord with the Wesleyan Methodist faith.

Resolutions Adopted in 1905

Resolved, 1st. That the law with regard to complaints or violations of orders and resolutions found on page 37 of our Discipline, and beginning with the words, "When the President," shall apply to all cases of the violators of our Discipline, and no charges shall be entertained by the Judiciary Committee without said previous investigation and labor.

2nd. That no member of the Conference shall have his character passed who fails to carry out all the rules and orders of this Conference, unless providentially hindered, except upon a three-fourths vote of the body.

Resolutions Adopted in 1907

Resolved, 1st. That we affirm our faith in the soundness of the position taken by the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America in denying any of its members membership in any secret society.

2nd. That we believe that the preaching of Holiness that does not include a clear and distinct opposition to all secret societies is seriously lacking in the essential elements and must be more or less displeasing to God.

3rd. That we believe that the right type of Holiness preaching and teaching is the most effective means by which to induce men to separate themselves from all lodge entanglements; therefore, we will do our best to double our diligence in this line of effort.

WESLEYAN METHODIST CHURCH

4th. That we affectionately admonish our people to avoid all compromise with secrecy. Hence we as a Conference require that our pastors and churches shall not elect, or suffer to be elected, superintendents or teachers of any Sunday Schools that are held in our churches if they hold membership in secret societies; furthermore, those belonging to secret orders shall not be allowed to hold services in our churches.

5th. That we seriously urge upon all our brethren and sisters that they may be careful to maintain a consistent, but radical, attitude of opposition to all organizations, secret or open, which are opposed to Jesus Christ and His doctrine and principles of righteousness.

Resolutions Adopted in 1914

Resolved, 1st. That all of our Licentiates not receiving any appointments to pastoral or evangelistic work be required to preach at least once a month, or twelve times during the Conference year.

2nd. That in addition to the above resolution, we earnestly request all preachers not receiving a regular appointment by the Conference, except those attending school preparatory to the ministry, to hold, if possible, a two weeks' revival during the year.

3rd. That all preachers unemployed by the Conference during the coming year be urged to select a fellow-laborer with whom they can work harmoniously, and go out and try to build up new works as they may have opportunity, and revive the desert places.

4th. That in order that the foregoing resolutions may have the greatest effect possible, and that each preacher may have a higher estimation of the dignity of his calling, and that the burden for souls may be increased, and that they may feel the sympathy of the Church to which they belong, we urge each charge to pass like resolutions.

5th. That it is not only the duty, but binding on each Circuit preacher of our Conference, to receive whomsoever the Conference may designate as Quarterly Meeting Evangelist, and give him their hearty support and coöperation.

Resolution Adopted in 1919

Be it Resolved, That the Committee on Public Worship consist of the President of the Conference, the pastor of the charge where the Conference is held, and the pastor's delegate.

Resolution Adopted in 1922

Regarding Tithing

Resolved, That no person be licensed to preach who does not tithe his income; that all our licentiates be required to faithfully tithe their income; and that the license of no preacher be renewed, who fails to tithe.

Resolutions Adopted in 1923

Resolved, 1st. That it is the sense of this Conference that our houses of worship should not be opened to any evangelist or minister of any other church to hold a series of meetings or to maintain a regular appointment for another congregation; provided, however, that usual denominational courtesies be extended to other ministers in occasional appointments.

2nd. We recommend that all charges and stations to which the pastor moves pay the moving and transportation expenses of said pastor, the same to be done in addition to his salary; provided this shall not interfere with previous arrangements between pastor and charge.

Resolution Adopted in 1926

Resolved, That the pastors be required to raise their Minute Money and send to the Conference Treasurer within sixty days after they receive their Minutes.
