The revised Article as it is proposed to have it read:

- V. The Sufficiency and Full Authority of the Scriptures
- 12. The Holy Scriptures contain all things necessary to salvation; so that whatsoever is not read therein, nor may be proved thereby, is not to be required of any man, that it should be believed as an article of faith, or be thought requisite or necessary to salvation. In the name of the Holy Scriptures, we do understand the books of the Old and New Testaments. These Scriptures we do hold to be the inspired and infallibly written Word of God, fully inerrant in their original manuscripts and superior to all human authority.

Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, Deuteronomy, Joshua, Judges, Ruth, I Samuel, II Samuel, I Kings, II Kings, I Chronicles, II Chronicles, Ezra, Nehemiah, Esther, Job, Psalms, Proverbs, Ecclesiastes, The Song of

Solomon, Isaiah, Jeremiah, Lamentations, Ezekiel, Daniel, Hosea, Joel, Amos, Obadiah, Jonah, Micah, Nahum, Habakkuk, Zephaniah, Haggai, Zechariah and Malachi.

The canonical books of the New Testament are:

Matthew, Mark, Luke, John, The Acts, The Epistle to the Romans, I Corinthians, II Corinthians, Galatians, Ephesians, Philippians, Colossians, I Thessalonians, II Thessalonians, I Timothy, II Timothy, Titus, Philemon, Hebrews, James, I Peter, II Peter, I John, II John, III John, Jude, Revelation.

Psalm 19:7; Luke 24:27; John 17:17; Acts 17:2, 11; Rom. 1:2; 15:4; 16:26; Gal. 1:8; I Thess. 2:13; II Tim. 3:15-17; Heb. 4:12; James 1:21; I Peter 1:23; II Pcter 1:19-21; Rev. 22:14, 19.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Part I

Dear Brother Swauger Chairman:

To the members of the Florida Annual Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America now in session at Tampa, Florida, March 18, 1952, Greetings.

To bring you another report is a privilege. We want to thank and praise our Heavenly Father for His wonderful love and protecting hand that has been over us this Conference year. Also for the co-operation and interest of our Home Missionary Secretary, Rev. J. R. Swauger.

We are grateful for the pastors and lay members that have worked nobly for the advancement and building up of the cause of Christ and our Conference in the south land, there has been some advancements in the Conference this year, one new church added and another church and parsonage under construction.

By the help of the Holy Spirit I have endeavored to do my best this year in the work assigned to me by the last Annual Conference.

Part II

Official Acts of the year, with approval of the Advisory Board.

1. March 8, 1951, plans were made to build a church at Daytona Beach, Florida. Our Home Missionary Secretary, Rev. J. R. Swauger sent us \$500.00 through the Card Call Plan. A set of plans were secured, a building permit granted, according to city laws a contractor was hired, the foundation started, when two men who owned lots near by got an injunction against us and because of the pressing need and request made we thought best to sell, so we made them an offer, if they would reimburse us dollar for dollar we would sell to them. They agreed and paid us \$1575.00 which we thought would cover the cost.

Brother Swauger recalled the \$500.00 he sent Balance on hand (given by two parties)	35 00

- 2. March 10, 1951, we bought \$346.00 worth of electrical equipment for \$142.00 (just what we need to equip a campground) we took wire down and took my truck and brought the material home and stored it away. This material was paid for out of the Conference Treasury.
- 3. March 26, 1951, Brother Swauger informed me a Brother and Sister L. A. Clark from New York State would loan a pioneer church \$500.00 without interest. This money was borrowed for the Clearwater church.
- 4. December 1951, with the consent of the Trustees and the majority of the Mission Board, because of a pressing need, we asked the Treasurer, Foster Piatt to send the Clearwater Church \$150.00 out of the Treasury. This was granted.
- 5. Nearly two years ago we visited the Church at Steinhatchee, Florida, we found a nice cement block church and a fine group of people that stood for old fashioned gospel preaching, we held services there several times, and on November 2, 1951, we completed the organization of the Wesleyan Methodist Church with 17 members. I appointed Rev. T. J. Knight as pastor. We recommend this church be received and placed on our list to be known as the Steinhatchee Church.
- 6. January 28, 1952, received the transfer of Rev. Raymond S.Taylor and Margaret B. Taylor from the Middle Atlantic States Conference, Elders in good standing.
- 7. March 12, 1952, received the transfer of Rev. Bertha Chapman, Ohio Conference, an Elder in good standing.
- 8. March 17, 1952, received the name of Rev. James Myers an Elder in good standing in the Ohio Conference, who desires to become a member of the Florida Conference. We recommend that he be received as an Elder pending the reception of his Credentials.
