PRESIDENT 'S REPORT

Dear Brothers and Sisters of the Wisconsin Annual Conference; Greatings to you once more in the name of our blessed and conquoring Saviour.

Another Conference year is in history. How quickly it has gone and how little there seems to have been done and yet we are so grateful for the good that there has

been accomplished.

We have many things to be encouraged over. There have been many good meetings reported on the different charges over the conference, new members have been added and the churches built up in the faith. I think too that there has never been greater harmony in the conference in the years that I have presided.

I began the work that was assigned me immediately after conference. I have preached near 220 times, have held a number of special meetings. A number have knelt at the altar, seeking either pardon or sanctifying grace.

I received a letter from the Rev.Wm.Markee from the Free Methodist Church and advised him to open up a new work, which he has done. I would be glad if the Comm, on Itineracy & Orders would accept his standings

I am ready to do anything the Lord would have me do to help build up His kingdom.

The Annual Conference of the W.H.& F.M.S. met at the Burr Camp ground for the 1941 session, July 16, 1:00 P.M. Our president Mrs.J.B.Clawson presided and opened the meeting with the song; "A Charge to Keep I Have", she then read from Eph. 6:10-18. after which Mrs. Hahn led in prayer.

Credentials; Mrs. Ben Kohlhepp.
To Grade Y.M.W.B.; Mrs. Jones, Esther Johnson.
Resolutions; Mrs. King, Mrs. Hoveland.
Magazine Solicitor; Mrs. Kauffman.

Plan of Work; Coral Butcher, Mrs. Clawson, Mrs. Hotchkiss. Committee on Credentials presented the credentials of; Sylvia Lee, Hillsboro, Iva Nofsinger, Burr; Esther Johnson, Rice Lake, Mrs. Olson, Carrvalley, Sadie Spry, Beulah; Mrs. Budde, Mt. Pisgah, Mrs. Emery, Baraboo; Mrs. Lindholm, Hayward; Mazie Hole, Stone Lake; Hazel Butcher, Spooner; Lillie Campbell, Rockbridge; Mrs. Graham, Gull Lake; Mrs. Hoveland, Mill Creek; Mrs. Hahn, Valton. By motion, the election of the foregoing committees was endorsed.
