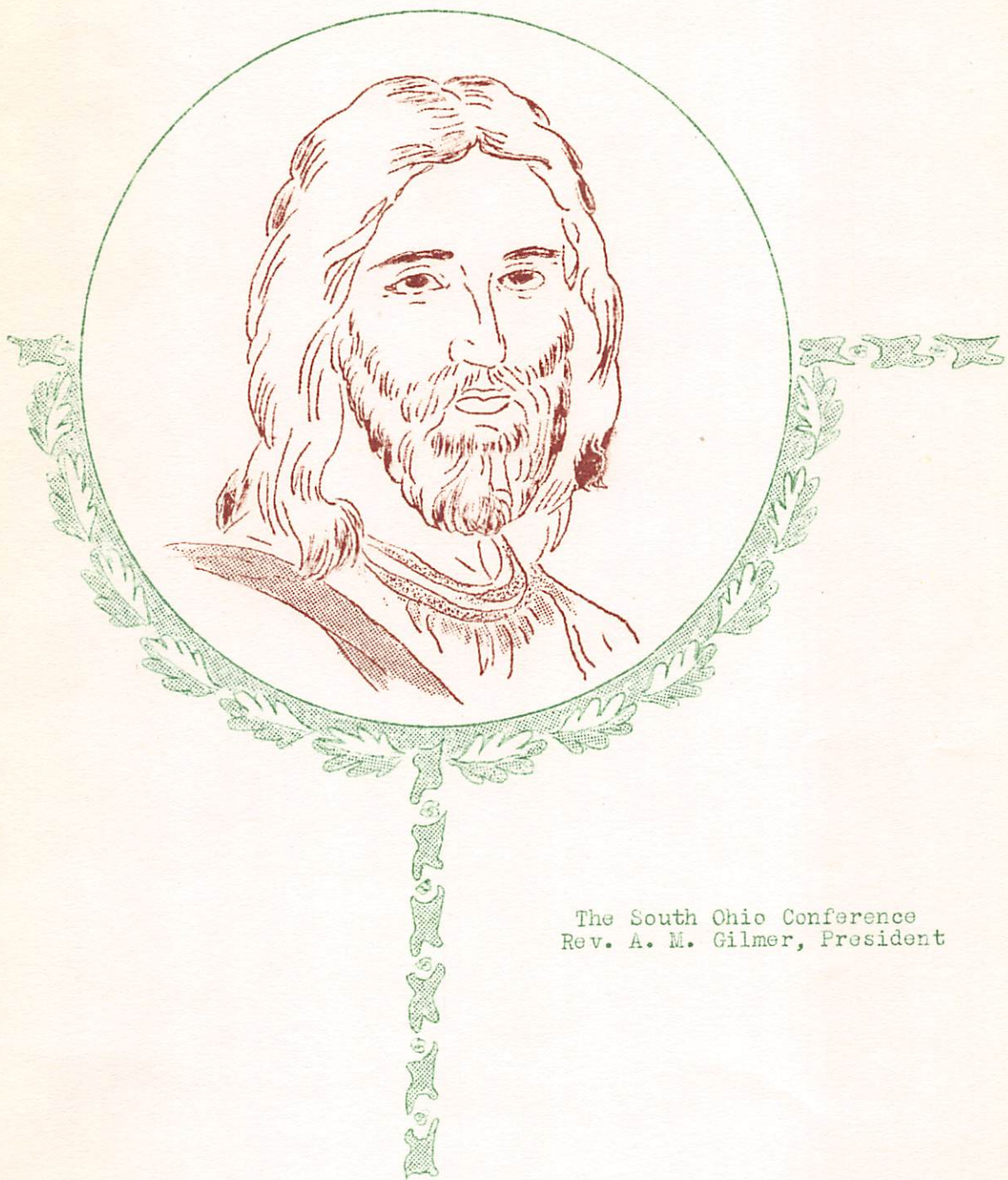

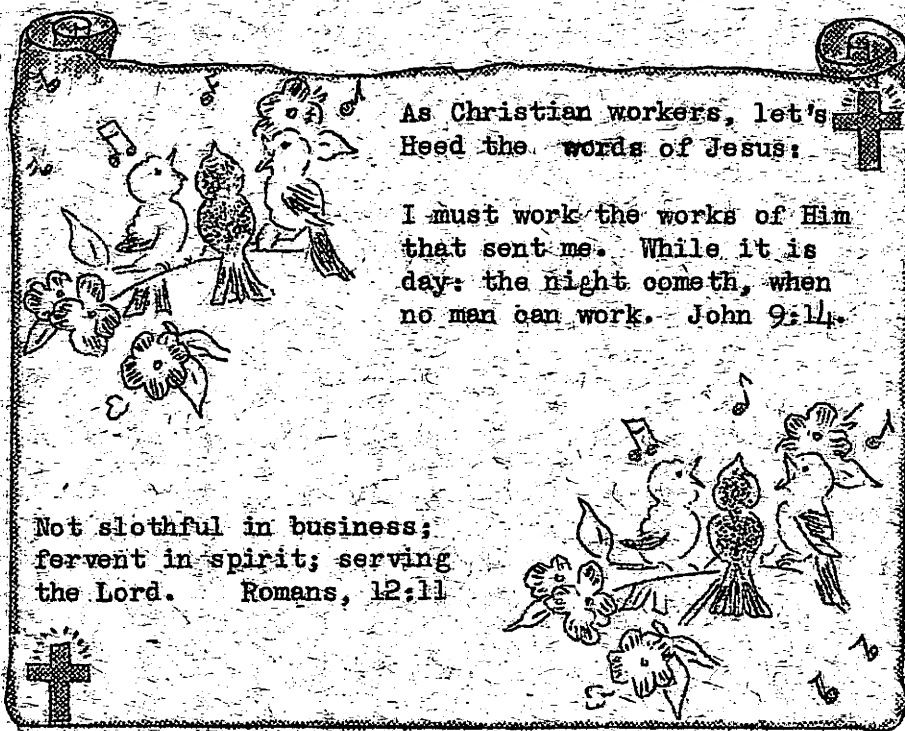

Thursday, August 30, 1951 - 9:00 A. M.

Devotional Service was then conducted. Songs - "Pass Me Not" and "All To Jesus". The 4th chapter of 1st. Peter was the theme for the scripture lesson, followed by some very timely comments.

Brother Hershel Williams led the prayer for the opening of the Consecration Service. Song - "I Need Thee".

The business session was adjourned at eleven fifteen to prepare for the Annual Conference Sermon. This was preceded by a Devotional Service, led by Rev. Jesse Lester.

Songs - "Leaning On Jesus" and "Give Me That Old Time Religion". The 4th chapter of Corinthians was read by, Brother Hershel Williams.

1st. Cor. 4:20 as his Text and "Kingdom of God" as a Theme; Rev. Dagger gave us a very powerful and stirring sermon. Through the word of God, he gave us much food for thought. "The building of the kingdom of God is not in words but in power" was the main thought left with us.

The President read the announcements and we were dismissed.

Report of the Conference Aid Society, formerly the Home Missionary Convention, was read and received.

A Committee on Thanks was appointed.

Sister Gertrude Harris, Conference Evangelist from District No. 1, gave her report. It was received.

District No. 2 Conference Evangelist, Sister Rita Lee, report was read and received.

Report of Evangelist Anna Gilmer, assistant to Rev. A. M. Gilmer, was read and received.

Brother Hershel Williams, licentiate, report was read and received.

Sister C. M. Cooke paid dues of one dollar (\$1.00); a report was not given.

A motion prevailed that the time be extended to complete reading of two additional reports.

The report of the Superannuated Committee was read and received. It was moved and seconded that the Superannuated Elders be exempted from dues.

Verbal report of Rev. Eugene Ramsey was received by a motion. Brother Welker dismissed us for the day in order for the Woman's Missionary Society of the Wesleyan Methodist Church to hold their sessions.

FRIDAY - 1:30 P.M.

Woman's Missionary Society of the Wesleyan Methodist Church was assembled.

FRIDAY - 8:00 P.M.

Public Missionary Meeting in charge of President - Mrs. Janet Smith.

SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 1, 1951 - 10:00 A.M.

The meeting was called to order by the President.

The minutes of the last session were read and received.

Rev. C. A. Pauley, Conference Treasurer, read his report for the year. The report was received by motion.

Sister Rita H. Lee, Sunday School Secretary, read her report. It was received by motion.

The Committee on Pastoral Relations gave a partial report which was received.

It was moved and seconded that the Conference purchase a typewriter. Sister Lucille Morrow, Rev. Rita Lee, and Rev. Pauley were appointed as the committee to do the buying.

Rev. A. M. Gilmer gave his reports; as delegate to the General Conference; as President of the South Ohio Conference; and a report of the Area Conference held in The Northridge Church of Dayton, Ohio.

It was reported that the South Ohio Conference has been moved to be an independent conference from a Missionary Conference.

It was moved and seconded that the report of the President be received.

By motion we dispensed with the Memorial Service at eleven o'clock. At that time Brother Welker presented to us "God's Own Plan of Tithing."

Tithing is planned in the Old Testament and beloved by Christ in the New. He spoke of the two fundamental laws - Psalm 24:1 - reading of God's possessions; Lev. 27:30 - How we can do the plan of God. He asked for the Church to adopt God's Plan of Tithing.

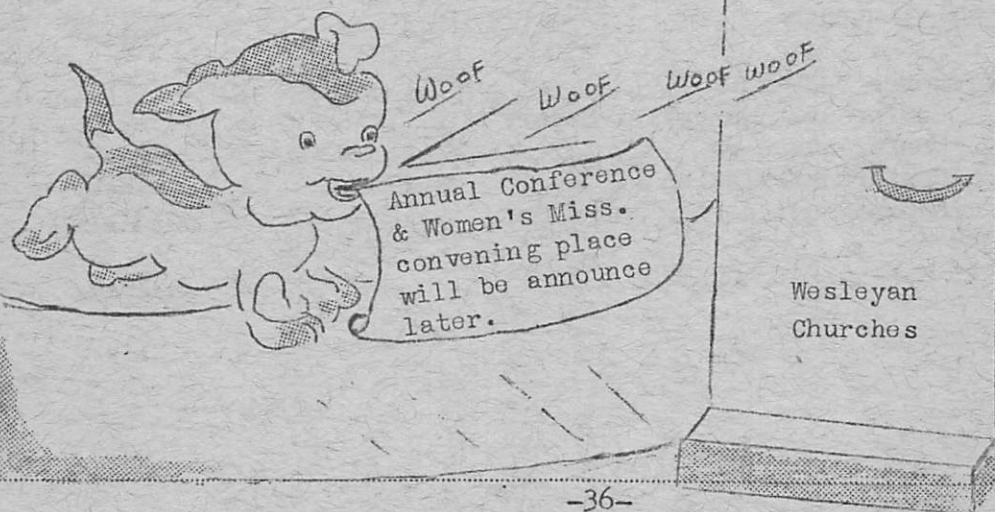

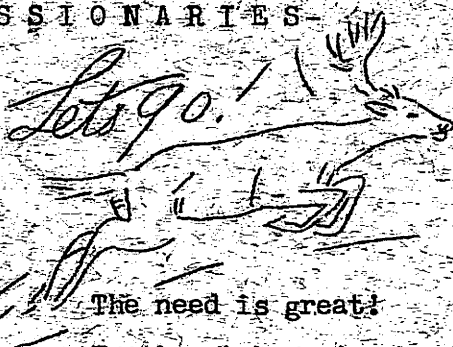

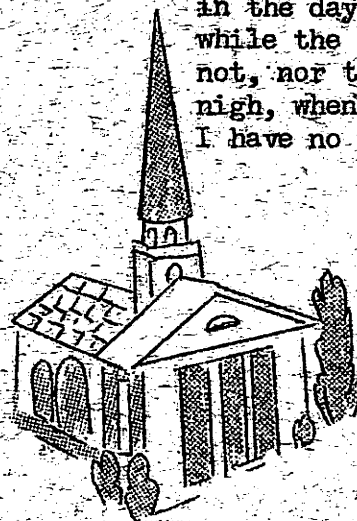
