JOURNAL OF DAILY PROCEEDINGS

Opening.—The twenty-eighth session of the Oklahoma Annual Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Connection, or Church, of America convened with the Enid Church, Enid, Oklahoma, Thursday, 9:00 A. M., August 27, 1931, with the President, Rev. P. H. Hodge in the Chair.

P. H. Hodge led devotional services. All joined in singing "The Last Mile of the Way." Brother Hodge then read the thirteenth chapter of First Corinthians. M. S. Litell led in prayer.

At the request of the President, Rev. T. P. Baker, Home Missionary Secretary, and Connectional Representative, took the Chair to preside throughout the Session. Upon taking the Chair, Brother Baker made a few appropriate remarks.

Brother Brown was given the floor, and he brought a short message of greeting to the Conference. He was given honorary privileges within the Bar of the Conference, together with all other visiting Brethren that should be introduced to the Conference.

J. W. Martin, of Alton, Kansas, was introduced to the body. He spoke a few words of testimony.
