# STANDING RULES

- 1. The clerk of each local society is to place the deed of his church property in the hands of the Conference President, who is custodian of the deed and who is empowered to rent a safety deposit space for the preservation of deeds, abstracts, and other valuable Conference papers. The Conference shall pay rent on space.
- 2. The President and his Advisory Board are designated a deed examining committee. Deeds for the churches, parsonages, or other Conference property to be submitted to them for examination before being recorded, to make sure that such disciplinary clauses are included as are needed to make such property secure to the Conference.
- 3. That each pastor is to bring his statistical report in full ready to be read the first day of Conference.
- 4. All pastors are required to report number of calls at the time of reading their reports.
- 5. Our members are solicited to faithfulness in tithing and our churches are to consider the storehouse plan.
- 6. The Campmeeting and Conference are to be held together with the date of the Conference to be set by the Board of Administration. If possible, it shall be incorporated at the beginning or at the close of Campmeeting.
- 7. The Annual Conference body shall elect a Committee on Committees whose duty is to nominate the Session and Standing Committees.
- 8. The Mid-year Convention Committee be composed of three ministerial members, the President of the W. M. S. and the President of the W. Y. P. S., whose duty is to arrange for a Mid-year Convention with day meetings for considering the various interests of Missions, Sunday School, Church problems and Youth work. The evening services shall be evangelistic with emphasis on Holiness.
- That each local church be responsible for paying the moving expenses of the pastor whom they have called.
- 10. Conference Secretary and Treasurer each be paid ten dollars annually from the Conference Treasury.
- 11. The Conference Treasurer's books be closed one week before the opening session of the Annual Conference.
- 12. No treasurer be allowed to pay out funds without the proper authorization.
- 13. The standing rules of the Conference are to be included in the Conference minutes from year to year.
- 14. The Superannuate Pension Fund Treasurer be a member of the Superannuate Pension Plan Committee.

# JOURNAL OF DAILY PROCEEDINGS

The fifty-eight Annual Session of the Oregon Conference met Monday evening July 23rd, 1951, at 8:00 P.M. for the opening service. We stood for prayer as Arthur T. Vessey thanked God for His mercies and goodness and asked His blessing upon our Conference and Campmeeting. Donald H. Cline led in congregational singing. Prayer was then offered by Dr. Roy S. Nicholson, General Conference President. Special number in song by Donald H. Cline. Our Conference President, Henry B. Aarhus brought the message, reading the scripture Acts 1:1-11 and John 16:67-68. He spoke on the subject "The Imperative Need of the Hour" which is the baptism of the Holy Ghost. He especially challenged the Ministry but brought to all that unless individuals are filled and empowered with the Holy Ghost and live and preach the second work of grace the Church will lose its purpose and souls will not be saved. The service was closed with a season of prayer around the altar.

# JULY 24, TUESDAY, 9:00 A.M.

Devotions were in charge of A. G. Yates. He read the scripture 11 Corinthians 4 after which several led in prayer.

The Conference President greeted the Conference Body then read the Resolutions of the 1950 session. He introduced Dr. Roy S. Nicholson, General Conference President, and asked him to take the chair. After a few words of greeting the Conference was called to order.

Roll was called and eleven elders responded.

A rising vote of thanks was given to those pastors who have made sacrificial labors in the work, Rev. and Mrs. J. H. Hinchsliff, Rev. and Mrs. Clarence B. Mills, Rev. and Mrs. Donovan Dahlgren, Rev. and Mrs. Frank Wing and Kathleen Kelsven.

The secretary was instructed to send greetings from the Conference to Helmer Danielson assuring him of our prayers.

The motion was carried to pass the character of Helmer Danielson and L. W. Melton.

The report of Mrs. Elsie Ward, Conference Preacher, was given. Motion carried that the time of meeting be 8:00 A.M. instead of 9:00 A.M.

Adjourned by motion.

#### JULY 27, FRIDAY, A.M.

Devotions were conducted by Mary A. Robinson.

Roll was called and the minutes were approved.

The report of the Sunday School Secretary was read and adopted by motion. (Report No. 6.)

The Sunday School Secretary nominated E. M. Peabody, and Donovan Dahlgren as members of the Sunday School Board. These nominees were elected.

The Missionary Board gave its report and it was adopted by motion. (Report No. 7)

The motion carried that the Campmeeting Treasurer report to the Conference President and his Advisory Board and that the report be included in the Conference Minutes. (Report No. 8)

The report of the Committee on Thanks was adopted by motion. (Report No. 9)

The Superannuate Minister's Fund Treasurer's report was read by the Conference President. It was received by motion, and referred to the Auditing Committee. (Report No. 10)

The Conference President nominated Frank Betzer, and Arthur T. Vessey as his Advisory Board. These nominees were elected.

A communication was read from L. W. Melton, Conference Evangelist.

The report of the Statistical Committee was adopted by motion. (Report No. 15)

The recommendation of the Statistical Committee that there be four members on this committee was adopted by motion.

The W. Y. P. S. Treasurer's report was read and adopted by motion. (Report No. 11)

The Auditing Committee reported all books audited except the Superannuate Minister's Fund book. The motion was accepted that the report of the audit of this book be given to the Conference President and his Advisory Board. (Report No. 12)

The report of the Unionmeeting Committee was accepted by motion. (Report No. 13)

The final report of the Committee on Pastoral Relations was read and adopted by motion. (Report No. 14)

The secretary was instructed to write to the Superintendent of the Free Methodist Conference conveying the thanks of this body for permitting the use of these grounds for our Annual Conference and Campmeeting.

The minutes were read and approved.

The Minutes of this Conference Session as they have been read and corrected from time to time were adopted by motion as the official minutes of this Conference body.

Dr. Roy S. Nicholson, Denominational Representative, turned the Chair back to the Conference President. The President expressed gratitude in behalf of the Oregon Conference to Dr. Roy S. Nicholson for his leadership and faithful ministry.

Motion carried to adjourn.

3. That in addition to the regular monthly missionary meetings a missionary project be undertaken as: (a) sending missionary

boxes. (clothing, supplies, bandages, etc., (b) writing letters to missionaries (c) adopt a missionary each year as a prayer partner.

- 4. That a conference rally be held semi-annually.
- 5. That two district rallies be held per year.
- 6. That the quarters be divided as follows:
  1st quarter August 13 including October 29
  2nd quarter November 5 including January 28
  3rd quarter February 4 including April 29
  4th quarter May 6 including July 22
- 7. That we use the Efficiency Standard written up by General Conference.
