Journal of Daily Proceedings

The Lockport Annual Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Connection (or Church) of America convened for its fifty-sixth annual session in Houghton Wesleyan Methodist Church, April 4, 1917, at 9 A. M.

On the previous evening a gospel sermon was preached by

Rev. J. R. Babcock.

The Conference was called to order by the President, Rev. Chas. Sicard, and the devotional exercises were conducted by Rev. J. J. Coleman.

Rev. Noah Shaffer was made Committee on Credentials.

Committee on Credentials made a partial report and names were placed on the roll.

In the absence of credentials from Cameron charge, Mrs. Jennie

Craven was seated as a delegate from that charge.

The President was authorized to appoint a Committee on nominations for the temporary organization. A. D. Fero, J. S. Luckey and J. R. Babcock were appointed, and a recess was taken for this committee to arrange its work.

Conference having been again called to order the Committee on nominations for temporary organization reported through J. S. Luckey. The report was considered item by item, and adopted as

read. See Report No. 1.

The bar of Conference was made to include the first five slips

across the body of the church.

The time of opening and closing Conference meetings was fixed as follows: Morning meetings to open at 9 A. M. and close at 11:30 A. M.; the afternoon meetings to open at 1:30 P. M. and close by vote.

The Vice-President, Rev. J. R. Babcock, was called to the chair while the President made his official report, which was considered

item by item, and adopted as read. See Report No. 2.

Rev. L. C. Mattoon, formerly of the Champlain Conference,

was introduced.

E. S. Davidson presented a petition from the Hamburg charge concerning a change of the name of said charge. The petition was referred to the Committee on Boundaries.

Conference adjourned for Committee work.

First Day-Afternoon Meeting-April 4th.

Conference was called to order by the President.

The devotional exercises were conducted by William Donaldson.

After the calling of the roll, the minutes were read and proved.

James Elliott was elected reporter.

Rev. E. Teter, Missionary Secretary, was introduced to the Conference.

Rev. J. Robert Jeffrey, Protestant Chaplain at Sonyea, Craig Colony, was introduced and made appropriate remarks.

On motion the election of Conference officers was made the order of the day for Thursday morning immediately following devotional exercises.

The following names were called and their characters passed: William Donaldson, D. S. Bedford, E. S. Davidson, Noah R. Shaffer, George E. Bathurst.

Conference adjourned by vote. Benediction by H. R. LaVere.

Second Day-Morning Meeting-April 5th.

The Conference was called to order by the President.

Devotional exercises were conducted by H. R. LaVere.

After the calling of the roll the minutes were read and approved.

Rev. W. L. Northam, of the Indiana Conference, and Rev. J. S. Willett, Connectional Agent, were introduced to the Conference.

The President appointed as tellers H. J. Bullock and F. G. Dougiass.

The whole number of the votes cast for President was forty, of which j. R. Babcock received twenty-one and was declared elected.

The whole number of votes cast for Vice-President was fortythree, of which A. D. Fero received forty-three and was declared elected.

The whole number of votes cast for Secretary was forty-five, of which D. S. Bedford received forty-four and was declared elected.

On motion the Secretary cast the ballot of the Conference for H. R. LaVere for Treasurer and he was declared elected.

On motion the Secretary cast the ballot of the Conference for Miss Millie Whitten for Assistant Secretary and she was declared elected.

On motion the Secretary cast the ballot of the Conference for H. R. Parnett for Tithing Secretary and he was declared elected.

The whole number of votes cast for Trustee was forty-one, of which Clayton F. Ball received thirty-nine, Won S. Crandall one, Noah R. Shaffer one. Clayton F. Ball was declared elected.

The whole number of votes cast for second Trustee was fortytwo, or which Marshall C. Cronk received six, Won S. Crandall four, Ernest L. Carnahan thirty-two. Mr. Carnahan was declared elected.

The whole number of votes cast for third Trustee was forty, of which John R. Babcock received thirty-three, Chas. B. Whitaker seven. John R. Babcock was declared elected.

On motion Rev. Chas. Sicard was elected to fill the vacancy on the Committee on Pastoral Relations caused by the election of J. R. Babcock to the Presidency.

The nominations for standing committees were referred to the Committee on Nominations.

The following names were called and their characters passed: F. C. Adams, J. R. Babcock, W. W. Rolf, D. H. Scott, J. L. Benton, G. W. Cooper, May K. Shaffer, N. E. Heald.

Rev. W. W. Rolf presented financial reports for White Dove Mission at Olean. See Report No. 3.

Adjourned by limitation of time.

Second Day-Afternoon Meeting-April 5th.

Conference was called to order by the newly elected President, Rev. J. R. Babcock.

Devotional exercises were conducted by Chas. Sicard.

After the calling of the roll the minutes were read and approved. Appropriate remarks were made by the President.

Rev. S. R. Waldron, of the Free Methodist Church, Brooklyn, N. Y., was introduced to the Conference.

Chas. Sicard and E. B. Houghton were constituted the President's Advisory Board.

Invitations for the next session of the Annual Conference were received from the Hess Road and Levant charges. Conference voted by roll call to accept the invitation from the Hess Road charge.

A committee was chosen to consider the matter of a traveling President. Chas. Sicard was named as chairman, the other members to be H. J. Bullock, J. S. Luckey, C. F. Ball, A. D. Fero.

Rev. Mr. Anderson, an evangelist of the Methodist Episcopal Church, was introduced to the Conference.

The following names were called and their characters passed: Walter Readett, L. C. Mattoon, C. B. Whitaker, A. D. Fero, H. R. LaVere, A. J. Taylor, H. W. McDowell, J. J. Coleman, C. E. Woodhead, C. W. Smith, N. F. Robb, G. H. Clarke, W. A. Hazlett.

The Secretary was instructed to send the greetings of the Conference to Rev. H. W. McDowell in reply to his letter.

The Statistical Committee was instructed to record the membership of charges not reporting the same as last year.

A communication from Rev. S. I. Smith was referred to the Judiciary Committee.

A Committee on Resolutions concerning the state of the country was constituted as follows: J. L. Benton, Chas. Sicard, and J. J. Coleman.

W. W. Rolf, Jennie Craven and M. A. Harris were excused from Conference.

Tithing Secretary H. R. Barnett addressed the Conference.

The order of the day having arrived, the following ministers addressed the Conference in behalf of the Camp Meeting Interests: H. J. Bullock, D. H. Scott, Chas. Sicard, J. R. Babcock, and J. L. Benton.

Conference adjourned by limitation of time. Benediction by Rev. A. D. Fero.

Fourth Day-Afternoon Meeting-April 7th.

Conference was called to order by the President.

Devotional exercises were conducted by Rev. A. D. Fero.

After the calling of the roll the minutes were read, corrected and approved.

Committee on Boundaries presented their report, which was adopted. See Report No. 10.

The report of Conference Statistics was received and adopted. After a brief recess, business was resumed and the Committee on Pastoral Relations made a partial report, which was adopted.

Rev. H. E. Shipman, of the Rochester Conference, was introduced.

The order of the day was to hear the Educational Interests. Addresses were made by Professors J. S. Luckey, H. R. Smith and H. L. Fancher. An offering of fifty-two dollars was taken to apply on the purchase of additional farm land for Houghton Seminary farm.

It was moved and carried that when we adjourn we adjourn to meet at 7 P. M. in the Seminary.

The report of the Treasurer, H. R. LaVere, was received and adopted. See Report No. 13.

The report of the Committee on Thanks was received and adopted. See Report No. 14.

The report of the Treasurer of the Missionary Board was received and adopted. See report No. 15.

The committee to draft resolutions on the state of the country presented a report, which was adopted as read and copies ordered sent to the President of the United States and to the Wesleyan Methodist. See Resolution No. 2.

The name of E. H. Johnson was called and his character passed. Adjourned by vote.

Fourth Day-Evening Session-April 7th.

Conference was called to order by the President.

After prayer by H. R. Barnett, the roll was called, the minutes read, corrected and approved.

The report of the Board of Trustees was read and adopted. See Report No. 16.

The Committee on Traveling President presented their report, which was adopted. See Report No. 17.

The report of the Committee on Ministerial Institutes was read and adopted. See Report No. 18.

The adoption of Report No. 18 required the appointment of a committee, which was constituted as follows: J. S. Luckey, J. J. Coleman, Chas. Sicard.

The report of the committee to whom was referred the matter of Conference Sunday School Work was received and adopted. See Report No. 19.

A committee was formed to canvass the matter of the sale of Conference properties, J. R. Babcock, E. B. Houghton and H. R. Barnett to be such committee.

The report of the Committee on Pastoral Relations was received and adopted. See Report No. 20.

The report of the Judiciary Committee was referred back to the committee with power to act and return Rev. S. I. Smith's credentials in case he satisfies the committee that he no longer holds the

doctrinal views because of which his parchments were surrendered and that the report of the committee shall indicate that they were returned on account of such a change.

The Secretary was ordered to secure the publication of three hundred copies of the Conference Minutes and distribute on the same basis as formerly.

On motion the minutes of the W. H. & F. M. Society were ordered to be included in the published minutes free of charge.

The report of the Committee on Post Office addresses was received and adopted. See lists.

The minutes were read and approved. Conference adjourned by vote. Benediction by Rev. J. R. Babcock.

Report No. 2.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT.

1. According to Report No. 17 in our last year's minutes the Conference voted to have the President devote the whole of his time to traveling the Conference if he could arrange to do so; if not,

that he should devote such a portion of his time as might be found possible. Having failed after considerable effort to secure a pastor for Levant, we were able only to comply with the second provision of the report. In doing this work we have labored eight Sundays and forty-two and one-half week days.

- 2. The following charges were left in the hands of the President: Delevan and Machias, Holland, Napoli and Smethport. Delevan has been without preaching except for a few Sabbaths at the beginning of the year. Machias has been acceptably supplied by Rev. J. J. Coleman and Rev. Francis B. Markell. Holland, Napoli, and Smethport not being able to sustain regular services have been left unsupplied.
- 3. The Chestnut Ridge charge called the Rev. L. C. Mattoon, of the Champlain Conference, and he was appointed pastor.
- 4. The Rev. C. E. Woodhead has been received on his transfer from the Rochester Conference.
- 5. The Rev. L. C. Mattoon has been received on his transfer from the Champlain Conference.
- The Rev. J. J. Coleman has been received on his transfer from the Indiana Conference.
- 7. On account of failing health the Rev. E. H. Johnson resigned from the pastorate of the Allegany charge, and Rev. H. J. Bullock was appointed to fill the vacancy.
- 8. The Rev. A. D. Fero was appointed pastor of the Roulette Mission, to conclude the work of the Conference year.
- The Rey. W. J. Seekins having been ordained an Elder in the Lockport Conference, and having lost his Elder's parchment, requested a duplicate. His request was granted.
- 10. On February 26th a Wesleyan Methodist Church was organized at Roulette, Pa. This church has been duly received into the Lockport Conference.
- 11. The following licentiates have been authorized to administer sacraments and solemnize matrimony: D. H. Scott, A. J. Taylor, Wm. Donaldson and E. S. Davidson.

COMMITTEE ON SUNDAY SCHOOLS AND HOLINESS CONVENTIONS.

- 1. We recommend that the districts remain as they were last year, viz: First District, Westons Mills, Smethport, Bradford, Driftwood, Olean, Delevan, Cameron and Roulette. Second District—Cattaraugus, East Leon, Napoli, Forestville and Levant. Third District—Allegany, Fillmore, Houghton, Higgins, Short Tract and Wyoming. Fourth District—Holland, Chestnut Ridge, Eagle Harbor, Hess Road, Ransomville and Ellicott.
- 2. We recommend that at least one convention be held in each district during the year.
- 3. We recommend that each district elect their own chairman and such officers as they may choose, arranging for conventions in their respective districts.

Said election and arrangements to be made, as far as possible, before final adjournment of conference, the present incumbent to see that this recommendation is carried out.

- 4. We further recommend that each chairman and pastor where a convention is to be held have full charge of arranging for the convention and have the oversight of same.
- 5. We also recommend that each district through their chairman shall report the convention to the next Annual Conference.

COMMITTEE ON BUDGET.

- 1. The part of the budget for Education is \$1,000.00, and all money paid for current expenses of Houghton Seminary, all money paid on Educational pledges for Houghton Seminary, and all interest (but not principal) paid on Educational notes for Houghton Seminary may count toward this budget.
- 2. The part of the budget for Home and Foreign Missions is \$1,000.00, and all money paid for current expenses for Home and Foreign Missions, all money appropriated for this purpose by the W. H. & F. M. Society, and all money paid by the Y. M. W. B., may be counted toward this budget.
- 3. We recommend that the part of the budget for Conference be \$1,000.00; that nothing but cash may count toward this budget, and that this amount shall cover all Conference expenses, except the funds for Superannuated Ministers.
- 4. We recommend that the charges raise all three parts of the budget as a whole; that this total budget shall be raised and paid over quarterly; that for all money not paid to the Conference Treasurer a duplicate receipt shall be given, which receipt shall be given to the Conference Treasurer; that it shall be optional with each charge to divide this total budget or to pay it over undivided, and that undivided parts must be paid to the Conference Treasurer.
- 5. If a charge divides its total budget, we recommend that this rule be followed: All money designated by the donor shall be placed in the fund designated, but all money not designated by the donor shall be so distributed that, so far as possible, each fund, including the sums designated for that fund, shall have the same

per cent of its apportionment. This rule shall apply until each fund is complete; after that the charge shall divide as it sees fit.

- 6. We recommend that the Conference Treasurer be instructed to remit to the Connectional Treasurer at least quarterly all money received definitely for Educational, or definitely for Missionary work, but that undivided budget may be retained until it is evident where it will be needed to maintain a balance between the benevolences, and should then be distributed so as to maintain this balance.
- 7. We recommend that no charge shall receive credit on its budget except for cash or receipts sent to the Conference Treasurer.
- 8. We recommend that each pastor shall include in his statistical report these items: Total budget assigned, and total budget raised; that the second item shall not be filled in till the pastor has settled with the Conference Treasurer, and that the account placed in this second item shall be the amount reported to the pastor by the Conference Treasurer.
- 9. We recommend that the Conference authorize each pastor to hand the Budget Committee at the next Annual Conference a list of the members on his charge under sixteen years of age, provided he declares that he knows personally each one on the list is under sixteen. This list shall then be deducted from the number determining budget apportionment on that charge.
- 10. We recommend that Allegany, Hamburg, and Olean be rated at three-fourths membership; that Bradford, Cameron, Higgins, Wyoming and Short Tract be rated at one-half membership; that Delevan and Machias, Holland, Napoli, and Westons Mills be rated at one-fourth membership, and that the total budget be then apportioned pro rata. On this basis the apportionment is as follows:

SUNDAY SCHOOL BOARD.

We, your Committee on Sunday Schools, would respectfully submit the following report:

We know of no department of the Church that is of greater importance than that of the Sunday School. Here we have the child of today who will be the man or woman of tomorrow, and the training of the child is the making of the man.

That our Sunday Schools are all that could be desired is useless to claim, for we are yet far from perfection in this department.

The great question that confronts us is, how can they be improved. We understand that the modern idea of the Sunday School is, first, The church engaged in the study of the Bible. This relates to the work of the hour during which the school is gathered in the classroom. Second, the aim of the Sunday School is, in the language so often quoted, "To lead men to Christ, train them up in Christ, and send them out for Christ." This may involve many other services and means besides those used during the regular Sunday School hour. Third, a still further idea of the modern Sunday School work is that of "Community Betterment." This involves all of the other activities and adds those which look to municipal reforms, cleanliness, health, moral and social interests of the community. As a Church, we may not yet be ready for all that is outlined, but we ought, at least, to be aggressive in developing the best methods of teaching the Scriptures and of getting the unsaved to God.

We believe the time has come when we ought to strengthen the general as well as the local work of this department in our own Church by placing a definite financial support back of the Connectional and Conference officials who are expected to operate in this department of the church work. To this end we recommend the following items for your consideration:

- 1. That all our schools begin at once to bring themselves to the standard of efficiency required by our denomination, and especially would we recommend the organization of a teacher's training class in each school.
- 2. That the pastors and superintendents give more care to the furnishing of quarterly reports to the Conference Sunday School Secretary, as they are required to do in Section 242 of the Discipline.
- 3. That the various Sunday Schools of the Conference be urged to contribute more largely for the Connectional supervision of our schools.
- 4. That this Conference provide an adequate sum by which its Sunday School Secretary may be able to perform the duties prescribed for him in the Discipline. (Item No. 4 referred to a committee. See Report No. 19.)
