JOURNAL OF DAILY PROCEEDINGS

Opening—The forty-third annual session of the Oklahoma Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church assembled in Enid Wesleyan Methodist Church at 916 East Maine St., August 13, 1946, at 3:00 p. m. with Rev. G. C. Cockrell, President of the Conference, in the Chair.

The service opened by songs led by Rev. James Harris. These were "The Blood Will Never Lose Its Power" and "I Will Sing of My Redeemer." Prayer was offered by Rev. Robert Hollen. Rev. W. C. Brannon led devotions, reading from the fifth chapter of Ephesians, verses 1 to 20 inclusive.

Roll was called. Ten Elders, five Conference Preachers, and one Deaconess were present to answer the roll.

Credentials—Moved and supported James Harris and Paul Batman be the Committee on Credentials. Rev. G. C. Cockrell, Conference President, gave his report and on motion it was adopted. The financial part was referred to the Auditing Committee.

Character—Rev. Floyd Kaiser of the Alva church gave his statistical report. Character was passed.

Tellers—LeVerne Tolle and Robert Hollen were elected to this position for the Conference session.

Report—Missionary Treasurer's report was received by vote of the Conference body.

Motion carried to adjourn for committee work.

Wednesday Morning

Song service led by Rev. Paul Batman. Prayer and devotionals were by Rev. William Washburn.

Roll was called. Minutes were read and approved after correction.

Report—The Courtesy Committee presented Rev. William Washburn and Rev. Roy S. Nicholson to the Conference body. Rev. Nicholson gave words of greeting and testimony.

Motion was made and carried that Rev. Roy S. Nicholson, Connec-tional Representative, be invited to preside during the remainder of the Conference session.

In the absence of Rev. J. M. Batman a motion carried that William Washburn act on the Ministerial Character Committee and H. V. Brannon act on the Memorial Committee to fill these vacancies of committees.

Report—Committee on Vacancies report was adopted by vote of the Conference. (See Report No. 12 following.)

Words of greeting were given by Rev. G. C. Cockrell for Rev. John E. McGraw. Character of Rev. McGraw was passed on motion.

Moved and supported to adjourn for committee work until the eleven o'clock "Orders of the Day." Carried.

The motion carried.

Moved and supported the following resolution be placed in the permanent resolutions. Motion carried. "Two copies of each written report shall be given to the Secretary of the Conference. These shall be typewritten and double spaced."

Moved, supported and carried that the Member of the Local Board of Miltonvale Wesleyan College be elected. Results of the voting by ballot G. C. Cockrell was elected. Term 1947-1951.

Moved to adjourn for committee work. Carried.

Moved and supported that Rev. G. C. Cockrell preach the Conference Sermon for 1947 Annual Conference. Motion carried.

Moved, supported and carried that the Conference accept the invitation of the Enid church to hold its next Annual Conference of the Oklahoma Wesleyan Methodist Church in the Enid church.

Motion properly carried that Conference begin the first Tuesday in August, 1947. (Date: August 5, 1947.)

Motion to adjourn for committee work was carried.

Benediction was given by Rev. Rufus Reisdorph.

Conference called to order by the Chair.

A recommendation to make the Conference Treasurer a member of the Finance Committee and an honorary member of the Conference body with a right to speak but not to vote was made a motion, supported and carried.

Motion supported the above motion be placed in the Permanent Resolutions. Carried.

Report—The report of the Finance Committee on items 3, 4, 12, 13, 14, 15, which were not included in the previous reading was properly voted upon and carried.

Moved and supported that Mary Croft's resignation as Educational Secretary be accepted. Carried.

Miss Dollie Gum was elected on vote of the Conference to fill this vacancy.

Report—(Third reading of the Pastoral Relations Committee's report.) On motion with its support the report was adopted.

(Note: The ordination of Miss Pearl Ratcliffe was duly carried out on Sunday, August 18, 1946, as recommended by the Committee on Itineracy and Elders Orders.) Time for this service was 2:30 p. m.

PERMANENT RESOLUTIONS

1. All Trustees of the Oklahoma Conference shall reside within the bounds of said Conference.

2. When a pastor provides his own place of residence, all rent from the regular parsonage shall be paid to said pastor.

3. The Conference Treasurer shall close his books one week before the opening day of Conference and all money received after that time shall be applied on the next year's business.

4. The Conference Trustees shall be the Committee on Church and Parsonage Location.

5. The Committee on Religious Services shall consist of the Conference President and the Pastor and Delegate of the church entertaining the Conference.

6. We recommend that the following orders of business be observed in our Annual Conference sessions:

Tuesday, 3:00 p. m.—Conference convenes.

Tuesday evening—Conference sermon.

Wednesday—Election of officers.

Thursday—Examination of characters.

Friday—Reports of Committees.

Saturday—W. Y. P. S.

7. A Nominating Committee be elected, composed of three elders; one of which shall be the President of the Conference as Chairman ex-officio, and the delegates-elect from two churches designated by the Conference. This committee shall: First, examine the credentials of all delegates to the Annual Conference. Second, nominate all session committees, not already provided for, and be prepared to report at the first meeting of Conference.

8. The Conference fiscal year shall be from August first to the next July 31st inclusive, and all statistical reports shall be based on monies received and disbursed during that period, except when Conference shall convene before August 10th, in which case the Conference year shall end ten days before the opening day of Conference. In order to eliminate errors and to expedite the business of the Conference, it is recommended that each pastor send a COPY of the BUDGET section (item VIII) of his statistical report together with receipts to the Conference Treasurer not later than one week before the opening day of the Conference.

9. Two copies of each written report shall be given to the Secretary of the Conference. These shall be typewritten and double spaced.

10. The Conference Treasurer shall be a member of the Finance Board and an honorary member of the Conference body with a right to speak but not to vote.

Report No. 1

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Women of the Oklahoma Conference:

Greeting in the eloquent name of Him who hears our prayer, meets us in His word and gives us refreshment and rest; rest in listening to His words of Eternal Life, in reposing our souls on it, taking the mold and fashion it gives to every thought, affection, faculty and desire. Rest in being changed into His image, reflected in every part of that bright mirror—"Changed from glory to glory by the Spirit of the Lord." What a wonderful Christ! But a sense of sadness grips the heart when we are reminded that so few in the world are actually enjoying this rich experience and that a large majority may never know its delights. Our responsibility to a lost world is beautifully expressed in the words of another who wrote: "We are debtors to all men to give them the gospel in the same measure as we have received it."

How gracious the Lord has been to us this year! Since the close of our last Conference session, we have witnessed the end of the bloodiest world conflict in all history. Many of our loved ones have safely returned from overseas service and many wartime restrictions and inconveniences which have hindered the advancement of God's kingdom have been removed, for which we praise the Lord.

With the close of the war, we are giving vent to the Missionary and Evangelistic spirit. As a Conference we have been lifting our eyes to behold the whitened harvest fields, waiting for the sickle of the reapers. We are pleased to note the enthusiasm of our dear women in reference to the forward plans of the Home and Foreign Missionary Departments of the Church in entering new mission fields and in meeting the demands of enlarging fields. In the execution of these plans, we are each privileged to have a part. Thank God! Indirectly their success depends upon us. Sacrifice and intercession are potent factors in the success of every missionary enterprise. Shall we not faithfully discharge this holy obligation?

Looking toward the new Conference year with its unknown problems and toils, losses and crosses, battles and victories, we are reminded of the Apostle Paul's attitude toward both the past and the future, which is described in his letter to the Philippian church in these words: "This one thing I do, forgetting those things which are behind and reaching forth unto those things which are before, I press toward the mark for the prize of the high calling of God in Christ Jesus." May we too, adopt this bit of the great Apostle's religious philosophy, of forgetting the past with its joys and sorrows, failures and successes, defeats and victories, and pressing forward to more devoted and efficient service and greater victories for Christ, being assured of the invisible presence of Him who said: "Lo I am with you alway, even unto the end of the world." Report No. 7 PLAN OF WORK

The Committee on Plan of Work submits the following plan of work:

1. That we send to Mrs. Ava Tolle, Treasurer, the specified budget, together with all receipts for gifts and boxes to home and foreign work.
2. That the Conference Society be divided into three districts:

District No. 2—New Hope, Carwile, Wesleyan Chapel and Oklahoma City.
District No. 3—Blackwell, Enid, and Ponca City.
The President to choose one person from each district at Conference to be responsible for arranging the rally.
District No. 1—Chairman, Sallie Richey.
District No. 2—Chairman, Pearl Ratcliffe.
District No. 3—Chairman, Erma Brannon.
3. That we hold one convention in the Conference during the year to be held jointly with the Ministerial and W. Y. P. S. Conventions.
4. That we arrange with the pastor for our missionary prayer service, the second week of each month, the same to be preceded by fasting.
5. That we hold twelve meetings during the year in which prayer service and business is conducted.

6. That there be five Red Letter Days:
 - (a) Harvest Day—Educational Day.
 - (b) Thanksgiving—Programs, gifts and offerings for Home Missions.
 - (c) World Day of Prayer—That we observe the World Day of Prayer.
 - (d) April—Self-Denial Month.
 - (e) May Day—Gift Day. Bandages and such as can be sent with outgoing missionaries or used in our Home Mission Field.
7. That we use the Study Book.
8. That we read the Conference Plan of Work and Efficiency Standard twice each year, and read the Connectional Plan of Work once each year.
9. That we take a definite position against the use of tobacco and alcoholic beverages and their advertisements.
10. That we pay twenty-five cents per member for General Delegate Fund, to be based on 1946-47 membership, for the expense of our representatives to General Conference, one of whom is expected to visit each local Society later, her traveling expense to be borne by the Conference.
11. That each Society render a public program at which time an offering is taken for Missions.
12. That we support an Educational improvement fund for Abbot Hall at Miltonvale Wesleyan College.
13. That the Conference Treasurer pay the registration fee for the Conference Officials out of the Oklahoma General Fund.
14. That the local Delegate shall check the statistical report with the Conference Treasurer before the same is read publicly.

15. Each Society appoint a representative to attend the Mid-Year Convention.
